Bid package shall include Proposal sheets (Bidder's Declaration, Proposal, Bid Security and Non-Collusive Bidding Certificate), Qualifications of Bidder sheets (QB), Approval of Subcontractor sheets (ASSL), Iranian Investment Activities Certification, and the New York State Uniform Contracting Questionnaire.

All bids must be submitted on the bid form provided. Any and all exceptions to the Specifications must be listed on a separate sheet of paper, bearing the designation "EXCEPTIONS TO THE SPECIFICATIONS" and be attached to the bid form.

PLANS AND SPECIFICATIONS

Specifications may be examined and obtained on or after November 12, 2020 by visiting the Town of Riverhead website: www.townofriverheadny.gov and click on "Bid Requests".

All contractors must leave their names, phone numbers and correct mailing addresses upon receipt of the Specifications.

VERBAL ANSWERS

The Town Board, its agents, servants or employees, or the Engineer, will not be responsible in any manner for verbal answers to any inquiries regarding the meaning of the contract drawings or

Specifications given prior to the awarding of the contract.

EXAMINATION OF SITE

Bidders must satisfy themselves by personal examination of the location of the proposed work and of the actual conditions and requirements of the work and shall not, at any time after the submission of a proposal, dispute or complain of such estimate or assert that there was any misunderstanding in regard to the depth or character of excavation to be made or the nature of the work to be done.

Electrical work will be performed at the Riverhead Water District well plant, water storage tank and booster plant sites. Bidders shall be generally familiar with conditions that may be encountered.

PROPOSAL

The Proposal contained herein shall be used in making out bids. Any proposal not in accordance with these instructions or containing bids not asked for may be rejected. While separate prices are required for various items under this contract, it is understood that the contract will be awarded as a whole.

As the estimates of quantities of items stated in the Proposal are approximate only, bidders are required to submit their proposal upon and in the following express conditions, which shall apply and become part of every proposal received.

Bids will be compared by total amounts, said total amount being the sum of the products of the quantities multiplied by the unit price bid for the various items, with due consideration being given to the lump sum prices bid for any contingent or optional items. Unbalanced bids will not be accepted.

Each bidder shall fill out in ink, in both words and figures, in the spaces provided, its unit or lump sum bid, as the case may be, for each item in said Proposal for which it is submitting a bid. If there is any discrepancy between the prices in words and figures, the prices in words shall govern as unit and lump sum prices.

A bid may not be considered valid which does not include bids for all items in the Proposal.

If the contract is not awarded by the Town Board within ninety (90) days after the receipt of bids, the obligation of the bidder under this Proposal may terminate at its option and it shall thereupon be entitled to a refund of its certified check or release of its bid bond furnished by it as security with its proposal.

BID BOND OR CERTIFIED CHECK

Each proposal from a Contractor shall be accompanied by a bid bond or certified check on a solvent bank of the STATE OF NEW YORK, in the amount of five percent (5%) of the total bid. Such check shall be made payable to TOWN OF RIVERHEAD, RIVERHEAD, NEW YORK, and the amount thereof shall be the measure of liquidated damages which the Town may sustain by failure, neglect or refusal of the bidder to execute and deliver the contract, should the contract be awarded to it. The checks of all unsuccessful bidders will be returned upon the rejection of bids and the awarding of the contract; also, the check of the successful bidder will be returned upon the execution of the contract and the furnishing of the required bond.

NAME OF BIDDER

Each bidder must state, in its proposal, its full name and business address, and the full name of every person, firm or corporation, interested in same, and the address of every person or firm, or president and secretary of every corporation, interested with it.

QUALIFICATIONS OF BIDDERS

(1) The Town Board reserves the right to waive any informalities in, or reject any and all bids. The Board reserves the right to reject any and all bids which do not conform to the Proposal.

(2) All bidders must prove to the satisfaction of the Town Board that they are reputable, reliable and responsible, and that they possess the necessary qualifications (financial, labor, equipment and otherwise) to complete successfully the proposed work.

(3) In determining the qualifications of a bidder, the Town Board will consider its record in the performance of any contracts entered into by it for the work contemplated or of similar nature, may make such investigation as it deems necessary to determine the ability of the bidder to perform the work, and the bidder shall furnish to the Board all such information and data for this purpose as the Town Board may request.

(4) The Town Board shall be the sole judge of the qualifications of the bidders and of the merits thereof and reserves the right to reject any bid if the record of the bidder in the performance of contracts, payment of bills and meeting of obligations to subcontractors, materialmen or employees is not satisfactory to the Town Board, or if the evidence submitted by, or the investigation of, such bidders fails to satisfy the Town Board that it is properly qualified to carry out the obligations of the contract and to complete the work contemplated therein.

MAINTENANCE BOND

The Contractor shall furnish a one (1) year Maintenance Bond in an amount equal to one hundred (100%) percent of the total yearly final contract price as security for its faithful performance of this contract, for the payment of all persons performing labor or furnishing materials in connection with this contract. Such bonds shall also cover any penalties, interest charges and assessments levied by any governmental unit for failure to comply with laws and/or regulations governing public work. The Maintenance Bond shall be an assurance that all work and materials provided under this contract shall be maintained for a minimum period of one (1) year after the end of each year of the contract. The Maintenance Bond shall be furnished following each final annual completion, and annual final payment under the contract. The Contractor shall be required to furnish all guarantees and warranties of manufacturers of products in connection with this contract, but no manufacturer's limitation of time shall act to limit the responsibility of the contractor or its surety hereunder.

The surety must be licensed in the State of New York and have a BEST A rating, or the surety shall present information satisfactory to the TOWN/DISTRICT to permit the TOWN/DISTRICT to accept the bond.

At the time of submission of bonds or at any time thereafter, the TOWN/DISTRICT may evaluate the surety or sureties proposed, and demand a change of surety if it determines that the financial position of such surety does not provide for a proper protection of the interests of the TOWN/DISTRICT. The TOWN/DISTRICT shall be guided by its legal counsel, and insurance industry consultants in determining

proper sureties for TOWN/DISTRICT public works contracts. If the TOWN/DISTRICT notifies the contractor in writing that a surety is unacceptable for any reason, then the contractor shall replace the surety and the bond in question within five (5) business days with a surety and bond deemed suitable by the said TOWN/DISTRICT. The premiums charged for all such bonds shall be a cost of the contractor and not the TOWN/DISTRICT. Upon notice to change surety being forwarded to a contractor, no further payments shall be made until a new bond in proper form naming an acceptable surety is provided.

SIGNATURE OF CONTRACTOR

The bidder to whom a contract may be awarded shall attend at the office of the Town Board, with the sureties offered by it, within seven (7) days, Saturdays and Sundays excepted, after date of notification of the acceptance of its proposal, and there sign the contract in quadripartite for the work and furnish approved security for its performance.

In case of failure to do so, the bidder shall be considered as having abandoned the same, and the check accompanying its proposal shall be forfeited to the Town Board, or the penalty of the bid bond shall be invoked.

CONTRACTOR'S INSURANCE

The Contractor shall not commence any work until it has obtained and had approved by the Town all of the insurance specified and required by the Contract.

The Contractor shall not permit any subcontractor to commence any operation on the site until satisfactory proof of carriage of the above required insurance has been posted with, and approved by, the Town Board.

RESPONSIBILITY OF BIDDER

Attention is hereby particularly directed to the provisions of the contract whereby the Contractor will be responsible for any loss or damage that may happen to the work or any part thereof during its progress; and also whereby the Contractor shall make good any defects or faults that may occur during the progress of the work or within twelve (12) months after date of the Engineer's approval of the final payment request.

LABOR RATES

The Contractor shall pay not less than the minimum hourly wage rates on this contract as established in accordance with Section 220 of the Labor Law, as shown on the Wage Schedule and Prevailing Rate Schedule, either shown on the following pages or the current prevailing rates paid at the time of construction. This project has been registered with the New York State Department of Labor under PRC# 2014007290.

COMPLETION OF WORK

Work is required to be completed to the satisfaction of the Engineer, and in substantial accordance with the Specifications hereunto annexed and the Plans therein referred to and the Change Orders amended to the Contract.

RESPONSIBILITY OF CONTRACTOR

Attention is hereby particularly directed to the provisions of the contract whereby the Contractor will be responsible for any loss or damage that may happen to the work or any part thereof during its progress; and also whereby the Contractor shall make good any defects or faults that may occur during the progress of the work or within twelve (12) months after its completion and acceptance. Any progress payments made by the Town during the completion of this contract by the Contractor shall not be a waiver of the foregoing provision.

2.0 - LIMITATION OF LIABILITY

The Contractor and all subcontractors agree to limit the liability of the Owner and the Engineer due to the Engineer's professional negligent errors or omissions such that the total aggregate liability of the Engineer to those named shall not exceed Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000) or five percent (5%) of the Contract award amount, whichever is greater.

CONTRACT D SCOPE OF WORK AND PROPOSAL

I. Location of Work

Various locations across the service area of the Riverhead Water District, including plant and water storage tank sites, public right-of-ways, easements, private communities, etc. within the Town of Riverhead, New York.

II. Scope of Work

1. Perform scheduled and emergency distribution system maintenance, repair, and restoration services for the Riverhead Water District in accordance with the requirements stipulated herein and all prevailing federal, state, and local safety and labor regulations.
2. Services may include but not be limited to water main break repair, installation and repair of service lines, valve replacement, hydrant replacement, water main replacement, installation of water service lines, installation of new water main and pavement repairs.
3. ***Work will be performed on an as-needed basis when authorized by the Water District in writing.*** The District will fax or e-mail a work order outlining the location and nature of work to be performed.
4. Scheduled maintenance or repair is non-emergency work and will be scheduled by the District at least 48 hours in advance of the start of the work.
5. Emergency service shall be provided to the Water District on a request basis. For emergency service the Contractor shall report to the site in need of service within three (3) hours after notification from the Water District.
6. Notification from the Water District may also be via phone call (for emergency work) and a fax/email transmission of the work order for the service requested. A copy of the work order form is included in Appendix A.
7. Contractor will be required to maintain the proper insurance as specified herein. Contractor shall guarantee workmanship and materials for a period of one (1) year upon completion of the work on equipment repairs, maintenance or replacement.
8. The Contractor shall arrange for all mark outs related to the work.
9. Contractor shall provide District with dimensional sketch of all work performed for the District's records prior to payment authorization.

III. Specifications

This contract is for the provision of water distribution maintenance and service, both scheduled and emergency in the Town of Riverhead.

1. Work and materials authorized by the Water District, shall conform to District standards.

2. The Contractor shall have sufficient qualified personnel and equipment to provide emergency service within three (3) hours of notification.
3. Scheduled maintenance must be completed in a timely fashion.
4. Contractor shall be required to provide written notification on the number of hours worked and a description of the work within 48 hours of providing service. Failure to provide this written account may subject the Contractor not being reimbursed for a portion or all of the claimed effort.
5. Routine and emergency service is expected to center around, but not be limited to, the repair of the District's water distribution system in public right-of-ways, roadways and on plant sites. Work shall be performed on water main, fire hydrants, valves, water services, meter pits and the like. Work may also include the installation of new water service stubs and/or the furnishing and installation of new water mains within the existing distribution system.
6. Invoices submitted to the District for payment must be itemized to show hourly labor rate, total labor hours, and material charges. When any single item of material costs in excess of \$250.00, the Contractor must include a copy of the Contractor's original material invoice. An additional percentage of this cost for handling, profit, and overhead may be added to that item's cost in accordance with the respective bid item. **Invoice payment will not be made without this information.**
7. Contractor shall comply with all OSHA regulations relative to safe operations for his work, the safety of his workers, District / Town personnel, inspectors, and pedestrians. All employees must have completed the OSHA 40 hour course.
8. Certain facilities may require contractor to enter confined space to perform the work required. The contractor shall employ personnel trained in confined space safety and shall be responsible for supplying all equipment necessary for entering and working within a confined space.
9. Contractor shall abide by the New York State Department of Transportation standards and the Manual of Uniform Traffic Control Devices in establishing the maintenance and protection of traffic on all public roadways. In some instances a traffic control plan and details may be required by the governing road agency. In these cases these details shall be provided by the contractor at no additional costs to the Town/District.
10. Road opening permits for scheduled work shall be secured by and in the name of the contractor. All costs for securing of said permits to be the responsibility of the contractor.
11. The contractor is responsible for the establishment of meetings between themselves, the Water District and local road agency prior to final restoration. Limits of the final restoration shall be agreed upon prior to completion. The contractor risks forfeiture of a portion of payment for any final restoration performed without prior agreement of Water District.
12. By December 31 of each calendar year, the bidder shall provide the Town with a Maintenance Bond equal to one hundred percent (100%) of the total value of the work performed in the prior year. The Maintenance Bond shall remain in full force and effect for a period of one (1) year after the date of the bond
13. The bond, which shall be executed by the Contractor and issued by a reliable, solvent surety company authorized to do business in the State of New York shall guarantee to the Town that the Contractor shall promptly remedy any defects or faults that may occur within twelve (12) months

IV. Duration of Contract

Contract duration is from January 1, 2021 through December 31, 2021 with options for two (2) successive one (1) year periods (January 1, 2022 through December 31, 2022 and January 1, 2023 through December 31, 2023) at the discretion of the Town Board.

V. Payment

1. The Contractor, when authorized in writing by the Water District, will only be reimbursed for the actual labor and equipment provided and actual materials furnished and installed.
2. Payment will be made in accordance with the unit pricing schedule established in Section VI of this document.
3. Labor and equipment reimbursement (where hourly rates are applied) will be based on the actual time spent at the work location.
4. Mobilization to the work site shall be paid in accordance with the lump sum amount under either Item 1A (non-emergency) or Item 2A (emergency). The item shall include all costs associated with labor transportation to and from the work site, tools and small equipment necessary to perform the work and any other related mobilization costs. Items 1A and 2A shall only be billed once per project. If additional days are required for work the appropriate hourly rates will be utilized for billing. Chargeable time will be documented time on-site only.
4. The contractor shall provide the District with an invoice for work performed within 30 days of completion of service.
5. The Riverhead Water District / Town of Riverhead will not compensate the contractor for fuel surcharges.
6. The cost of the Maintenance Bond shall be reimbursed to the contractor upon its acceptance from the Town. The contractor shall not be eligible for overhead or profit to be paid on the bond and shall provide the Town with copies of invoicing from its Surety upon submission of reimbursement. The cost of the Maintenance Bond will be reimbursed with no mark-up assessed.
5. **Failure of the contractor to provide appropriate billing to the District within sixty (60) days of completion of service may subject contractor to forfeiture of payment without notice from the Town/District.**
7. The Contractor shall pay not less than the minimum hourly wage rates on this contract as established in accordance with Section 220 of the Labor Law Rates shall be in accordance with the current prevailing rates paid at the time of construction. This project has been registered with the New York State Department of Labor under PRC# 2017012158.
8. Contractor shall provide District with dimensional sketch of all work performed for the District's records prior to payment authorization.

- ◆ The total sum reported in Section F is for comparison purposes only. All prices for bid items and escalators will be considered in awarding the contract in the best interest of the Town/District. The contractor reporting the lowest total bid under Section F is not guaranteed award of the contract.
- ◆ Quantities provided are estimates only and will vary. Actual equipment and material cost will vary based on work authorized in writing by the Water District. The Water District will issue a purchase order for each specific work order.
- ◆ The qualified bidder will be required to provide the appropriate references (5 minimum) and documentation of qualifications.
- ◆ The Town Board reserves the right to award work that serves in the best interest to the Riverhead Water District. **Unbalanced bids will be rejected.**
- ◆ The Town Board / Water District reserves the right to award this contract to multiple entities based on what is in their best interest. If awarded to multiple entities, it is at the District's discretion as to which entity they elect to perform selected work orders and will act in their best interest.
- ◆ The option to extend the contract an additional year (from January 1, 2022 through December 31, 2022) or two (from January 1, 2023 through December 31, 2023) can be exercised solely at the discretion of the Riverhead Town Board. Should the Town Board decide to renew the contract for an additional period, written authorization will be provided by the Riverhead Water District.
- ◆ The Water District reserves the right to do some of the work with its own personnel, and this contract is only for the additional work it cannot or will not handle.
- ◆ Where work is requested by the District that it is not included under the bid items provided, the District will request a separate proposal. This District is under no obligation to accept this proposal and reserves the right to perform the work themselves or secure the services of an outside contractor.
- ◆ The Water District retains the discretion to develop and separately bid other projects with an element of the type of work under this contract.

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- ◆ Emergency service is defined as work requiring a response from the contractor within three (3) hours of request by the District. The emergency service charge will be paid once per emergency service request. A minimum service charge shall not be eligible on scheduled services.
- ◆ The District will reimburse the contractor for the expense of the maintenance bond. The cost of the maintenance bond (dollar for dollar) will be reimbursed by the District upon receipt under Item 30. The maintenance bond will cover all work performed in that year and will be dated to begin coverage at the end of current contract term.
- ◆ Within ten (10) days (weekends and legal holidays excepted) after acceptance of this bid by the Town/District, the bidder shall execute the contract. The bidder shall furnish the required bonds and insurances to the water district's attorney within the same time frame.
- ◆ The bidder represents herewith that he is aware of the working conditions, has carefully reviewed the proposal and specifications, has checked and certifies the accuracy of the bid.
- ◆ The contractor shall coordinate all work with the District to minimize disturbances to District operation
- ◆ The basic service charge (Item 1A and 2A) shall be billed for each scheduled or emergency service once per project and shall include labor charges for the first two hours on-site. Scheduled service is defined as all non-emergency work and any days subsequent to the date of an emergency required to complete the work requested. Emergency Service is defined as work requiring a response from the Contractor within three (3) hours of request by District. The service charge will be paid once per project for work requiring less than two (2) man-hours of time on-site, instead of contractor time spent on-site. For work requiring two (2) man-hours or more, the District will pay the applicable service charge **once per project**, plus man-hours in excess of two (2) as per the hourly rates bid above. If additional days are required on-site after time will be paid based upon the appropriate hourly billing rates. Chargeable time for these additional days will be documented on-site time only, no travel or mobilization charges will apply to these additional days. On-site is defined as any property owned and operated by the Riverhead Water District. One (1) service charge shall be billed, regardless of whether contractor visits one site or multiple sites.

WITNESSETH, that the TOWN DISTRICT and the CONTRACTOR, in consideration of the premises and of the mutual covenants, considerations and agreements herein contained, agree as follows:

1. CONTRACT DOCUMENTS AND DEFINITIONS

The Notice to Bidders, Information for Bidders, Proposal, Contract, together with any Addenda, shall form part of this Contract, and the provisions thereof shall be as binding upon the parties hereto as if they were herein fully set forth. The titles, headings, headlines and marginal notes contained herein are solely to facilitate reference to the various provisions of the contract documents and in no way affect, limit or cast light upon the interpretation of the provisions to which they refer. Whenever the term "contract documents" is used, it shall mean and include this Contract, any Addenda, and the Notice to Bidders, Information for Bidders, and Proposal. In case of any conflict or inconsistency the provisions of the Contract shall govern.

WORK: The term WORK, as used herein, refers to all of the work proposed to be accomplished at the site of the project and all such other work as is in any manner required to accomplish the completed project, and includes all plant, labor, materials, supplies, equipment and other facilities and acts necessary or proper for or incidental to the carrying out and completion of the terms of this Contract. The term WORK PERFORMED shall be construed to include material delivered to and suitably stored at the site of the project.

EXTRA WORK: The term EXTRA WORK, as used herein, refers to and includes all work required by the TOWN DISTRICT which with the Town's approval, involves changes in or additions to work required.

SUBCONTRACTOR: The term SUBCONTRACTOR, as used herein, shall mean any person, firm or corporation applying labor and material for work at the site of the project, but not including the parties to this Contract.

NOTICE: The term NOTICE, as used herein, shall mean and include written notice. Written notice shall be deemed to have been duly served when delivered to, or at the last known business address of, the person, firm or corporation for whom intended or to his, their, or its duly authorized agents, representatives or officers, or when enclosed in a postage prepaid wrapper or envelope addressed to such person, firm, or corporation at his, their, or its last known business address and deposited in a United States Mail Box.

DIRECTED, REQUIRED, APPROVED, ACCEPTABLE: Whenever they refer to the work, or its performance, "directed", "required", "permitted", "ordered", "designated", "prescribed", and words of like import shall imply the direction, requirement, permission, order, designation or prescription of the Engineer, and "approved", "satisfied", or "satisfactory", "in the judgment of", and words of like import, shall mean approved or acceptable to, or satisfactory to, in the judgment of the Town/District.

2. SCOPE OF THE WORK

The Contractor will furnish all plant, labor, material, supplies, equipment and other facilities and things necessary or proper for or incidental to, the work contemplated by this Contract as required by, and in strict accordance with, Town/District standards and/or required by and in strict accordance with, such changes as are ordered and approved pursuant to this Contract, and will perform all other obligations imposed on him by the Contract.

3. COMPENSATION TO BE PAID TO THE CONTRACTOR

A. Agreed Prices: It is understood and agreed that the Contractor will accept as payment in

full the summation of products, of the actual quantities in place upon the completion of the work, as determined by the unit prices bid, no allowance being made for anticipated profit or for reason of variations from the estimated quantities set forth in the Proposal.

B. Extra Work and/or Changes: The TOWN DISTRICT may, at any time, by a written order, and without notice to the sureties, require the performance of such extra work or changes in the work as it may find necessary or desirable. The amount of compensation to be paid to the Contractor for any extra work, as so ordered, shall be determined as follows:

- (1) By such applicable unit prices, if any, as set forth in the contract; or
- (2) If no such unit prices are set forth, then by unit prices or by a lump sum mutually agreed upon by the TOWN DISTRICT and the Contractor; or
- (3) If no such unit prices are set forth, and if the parties cannot agree upon unit prices or a lump sum, then by actual net cost in money to the Contractor of the materials, permits, wages, or applied labor, premium for Workers' Compensation Insurance, payroll taxes required by law, rental for plant and equipment used (excluding small tools) to which total cost will be added 15 percent as full compensation for all other items of profit, costs and expenses, including administration, overhead, superintendence, insurance, insurance other than Workers' Compensation Insurance, material used in temporary structures, allowances made by the Contractor to subcontractors, additional premiums upon the Contractor and the use of small tools.

4. TIME OF ESSENCE

Inasmuch as the provisions of this Contract relating to the time for performance and completion of the work are for the purpose of enabling the TOWN DISTRICT to proceed with the construction of a public improvement, in accordance with a predetermined program, such provisions are of the essence of this Contract.

5. COMMENCEMENT OF WORK

The Contractor agrees that he will commence work in accordance with contract periods described herein.

6. TIME FOR COMPLETION

The time for completion of this Contract shall be in accordance with contract periods described herein. The TOWN DISTRICT reserves the right to order the Contractor to suspend operations when improper weather conditions make such action advisable, and to order the Contractor to resume operations when weather and ground conditions permit.

7. PENALTY FOR DELAY

~~The Contractor shall be penalized for not completing the work within the agreed to time frame set in the work order. Penalty may include overhead charges, services, inspector's wages, that the TOWN DISTRICT will suffer by reason of such delay, for each and every day during which the aforesaid work~~

~~may be incomplete over and beyond the time herein stipulated for its completion, provided, however, that the TOWN DISTRICT shall have the right to extend the time for the completion of said work.~~

8. EXTENSIONS OF TIME - NO WAIVER

If the Contractor shall be delayed in the completion of his work by reason of unforeseeable causes beyond his control and without his fault or negligence, including but not restricted to Acts of God or of any public enemy, acts or neglect of the TOWN DISTRICT, acts or neglect of any other Contractor, fires, floods, epidemics, quarantine restrictions, strikes, riots, civil commotion or freight embargoes, the period herein for completion of his work shall be extended by such time as shall be fixed by the TOWN DISTRICT.

No such extension of time shall be considered a waiver by the TOWN DISTRICT of its right to terminate the Contract for abandonment or delay by the Contractor as hereinafter provided or relieve the Contractor from full responsibility for performance of his obligations hereunder.

9. CONTRACT SECURITY

At the completion of each contract year, the Contractor shall deliver to the TOWN DISTRICT a Maintenance Bond equal to one hundred percent (100%) of the total value of work performed under this contract. This Maintenance Bond shall remain in full force and effect for a period of one (1) year after the date of the Engineer's approval of the annual final payment request and such bond, which shall be executed by the Contractor and issued by a reliable, solvent surety company authorized to do business in the State of New York shall guarantee to the TOWN DISTRICT that the Contractor shall promptly remedy any defects or faults that may occur within twelve (12) months after completion and acceptance of the work performed by the Contractor pursuant to this Contract.

10. INSURANCE

The Contractor shall not commence any work until he has obtained and had approved by the TOWN DISTRICT all of the insurance required under this Contract as enumerated herein:

- Workers Compensation Insurance
- Commercial General Liability
- Contractor's Protective Liability and Property Damage Insurance
- Owner's (TOWN, DISTRICT) Protective Public Liability and Property Damage Insurance
- Automobile Liability Insurance

The Contractor shall not permit any subcontractor to commence any operation on the site until satisfactory proof of carriage of the above required insurance has been posted with, and approved by, the TOWN DISTRICT.

- A. Workers' Compensation Insurance - The Contractor shall take out and maintain, during the life of this Contract, Workers' Compensation Insurance for all of his employees employed at the site of the project, and in any case of

any of the work being sublet, the Contractor shall require the subcontractor similarly to provide Workers' Compensation Insurance for all of the latter's employees, unless such employees are covered by the protection afforded by the Contractor.

B. Commercial General Liability and Insurance - The Contractor shall take out and maintain during the life of this Contract such insurance as shall protect him and any subcontractor performing work covered by this Contract for claims for damages for personal injury, including accidental death, as well as from claims for property damage which may arise from operations under this Contract, whether such operations be by himself or by any subcontractor, or by any one directly or indirectly employed by either of them, and the amounts of such insurance shall be as follows:

- (1) Comprehensive General Liability Insurance in the amount not less than ONE MILLION DOLLARS (\$1,000,000.) each occurrence and TWO MILLION DOLLARS (\$2,000,000.) general aggregate.
- (2) Umbrella Liability for bodily injury and property damage in an amount not less than FIVE MILLION DOLLARS (\$5,000,000.).

C. Commercial General Liability and Umbrella Liability - The above policies for commercial general liability and umbrella liability insurance must be so written as to include Contractor's Protective Liability Insurance to protect the contractor against claims arising from the operations of any subcontractor.

The above policies for Commercial General Liability insurance must name the Town of Riverhead, The Riverhead Water District, its employees, public officials, officers, agents, etc., as additional insureds on a primary and non-contributory basis for General Liability, Automobile Liability and/or Excess Umbrella Liability. That additional insured status must be evidenced by a copy of endorsement CG 20 10 10 01, "additional insured – owners, lessee or contractors – scheduled person or organization" endorsement (see attached sample) or its equivalent and copy of endorsement CG 20 37 10 01, "additional insured – owners, lessees or contractors - completed operations" endorsement (see attached sample), or its equivalent.

D. Blanket Waiver of Subrogation – The above policies for workers' compensation insurance as well as comprehensive general liability insurance, automobile insurance, and excess umbrella liability insurance shall include waiver of transfer of rights of recovery against the Town of Riverhead, The Riverhead Water District, et.al. Such waiver of subrogation shall be evidenced by certificate of insurance or copy of endorsement to the appropriate policy.

E. Owner's Protective Liability Insurance – (TOWN DISTRICT, and/or TOWN BOARD, TOWN OF RIVERHEAD as OWNER) – If the Town of Riverhead, Riverhead Water District deem necessary, the Contractor shall furnish to the TOWN DISTRICT with respect to the operations he or any of his subcontractors perform, a regular Owner's Protective Liability Insurance Policy for and in behalf of the TOWN DISTRICT and/or TOWN BOARD, TOWN OF RIVERHEAD as OWNER, providing for a limit of not less than ONE MILLION DOLLARS (\$1,000,000.) each occurrence, a total limit of TWO

MILLION DOLLARS (\$2,000,000.) general aggregate for all damages arising out of bodily injuries to, or death of, two or more persons in any one accident; and regular Protective Property Damage Insurance providing for a limit of not less than ONE HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$100,000.) for all damages. The insurance must fully cover the legal liability of the TOWN DISTRICT and/or TOWN BOARD, TOWN OF RIVERHEAD as OWNER. The coverage provided under this policy must not be affected if the TOWN DISTRICT performs work in connection with the project either for, or in cooperation with, the Contractor or as an aid thereto, whether the same be a part of the Contract or separate therefrom, by means of its own employees or agents, or if the TOWN DISTRICT directs or supervises the work to be performed by the Contractor.

F. Commercial Automobile Liability - The Contractor shall take out and maintain during the life of the Contract such automobile public liability insurance as shall protect him and any subcontractor performing work covered by this Contract from claims for damages for personal injury, including accidental death as well as from claims for property damage which may arise from operations under this Contract, whether such operations be by himself or by any subcontractor, or by any one directly or indirectly employed by either of them and the amounts of such insurance shall be as follows:

- (1) Automobile Public Liability Insurance in an amount not less than ONE MILLION DOLLARS (\$1,000,000.) for bodily injuries, including wrongful death per occurrence.
- (2) Umbrella Liability for bodily injury and property damage in an amount of not less than FIVE MILLION DOLLARS (\$5,000,000.).

FUEL SURCHARGES: The Town/District will not pay any type of fuel surcharge. Any fuel surcharges added will be deleted from any payments made to the vendor.

11. PROOF OF CARRIAGE OF INSURANCE

The Contractor shall furnish the TOWN DISTRICT with certificates of each insurer insuring the Contractor or any subcontractor under this Contract, except with respect to subdivision D. of paragraph 10. In respect to this paragraph, the Contractor shall furnish the TOWN DISTRICT with the original insurance policy and a copy to the Engineer.

Both certificates, as furnished, and the insurance policy, as required, shall bear the policy numbers, the expiration date of the policy and the limit or limits of liability thereunder. Both the certificates and the policy shall be further endorsed to provide the TOWN DISTRICT and Engineer with any notice of cancellation at least thirty (30) days prior to the actual date of such cancellation.

12. COMPLIANCE WITH LABOR AND PENAL LAWS

The Contractor hereby expressly agrees to comply with all the provisions of the Labor Law and any and all amendments thereto, insofar as the same are applicable to this Contract. The Labor Laws, as amended, provide that no laborer, worker or mechanic in the employ of the Contractor, subcontractor or other person doing or contracting to do the whole or a part of the work contemplated by this Contract, shall be permitted or required to work more than eight (8) hours in any one calendar day, except in cases of extraordinary emergency caused by fire, flood, or danger to life or property; that

no such person shall be employed more than eight (8) hours in any day or more than five (5) days in any week, except in such emergency; that the wages to be paid for a legal day's work as hereinbefore defined, to laborers, workers, or mechanics upon the work called for under this Contract, or for any materials used upon or in connection therewith shall not be less than the prevailing rate for a day's work in the same trade or occupation in the locality within the State where such work is to be done and each laborer, worker, or mechanic employed by the Contractor, subcontractor, or other person about or upon the work shall be paid the wages herein provided; that employees engaged in the construction outside the limits of cities and villages are no longer exempt from the provisions of the Labor Laws which required the payment of the prevailing rate of wages and the eight (8) hour day.

Section 220A of the Labor Law, as amended by Chapter 472 of the Laws of 1932, provides that before payment is made by or on behalf of the State or any City, County, Town or Village or other civil division of the State, of any sums due on account of a contract for a public improvement, it is the duty of the Comptroller or the financial officer of the Municipal Corporation to require the Contractor and each and every subcontractor to file a certified statement in writing, in satisfactory form, certifying to the amounts then due and owing to any and all laborers for daily or weekly wages on account of labor performed upon the work of the Contract, setting forth therein the names of the persons whose wages are unpaid and the amount due each, respectively.

Section 2208 of the Labor Law, as amended, provides that any interested person who shall have previously filed a protest in writing objecting to the payment to any Contractor or subcontractor to the extent of the amount or amounts due or to become due to him for daily or weekly wages for labor performed on the public improvement for which the Contract was entered into, or if, for any other reason, it may be deemed advisable, the Comptroller of the State or other financial officer of the Municipal Corporation may deduct from the whole amount of any payment on account thereof the sum or sums admitted by any Contractor or subcontractor in such statement or statements so filed to be due and owing by, him on account of labor performed and may withhold the amount so deducted for the benefit of the laborers for daily or weekly wages, whose wages are unpaid as shown by the verified statements filed by any Contractor or subcontractor and may pay directly to any person the amount or amounts so shown to be due for such wages.

Section 220C of the Labor Law, as amended, provides the penalty for making of a false oath or verification.

Section 220D of the Labor Law provides that the advertised specifications for every Contract for the construction, reconstruction, maintenance and/or repair of highways to which the State, County, Town and/or Village is a party shall contain the provision stating the minimum rate of hourly wage that can be paid, as shall be designated by the Industrial Commissioner, to the laborers employed in the performance of the Contract, either by the Contractor, subcontractor or other person doing or contracting to do the whole or part of the work contemplated by the Contract, and the Contract shall contain a stipulation that such laborers shall be paid not less than such hourly minimum rate of wage. Any person or corporation that willfully pays after entering into such Contract less than such stipulated minimum hourly wage scale shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction, shall be punished for a first offense by a fine of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.) or by imprisonment for not more than thirty (30) days, or by both fine and imprisonment for a second offense by a fine of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.) and, in addition thereto, the Contract on which the violation has occurred shall be forfeited; and no such person or corporation shall be entitled to receive any sum or nor shall any officer, agent or employee of the State pay the same or authorize its payment from the funds under his charge or control to any person or corporation for work done upon any contract, on which the Contractor has been

convicted of second offense in violation of the provisions of this Section.

The minimum wage rates are established by the Industrial Commissioner, State of New York, for this Contract. It is the contractor's responsibility to ensure wages are paid in accordance with latest revision.

All excavation shall be done in compliance with Article 36 of the General Business Law and notices given as provided by GBL Section 761.

13. PAYMENT OF EMPLOYEES

The Contractor and each of his subcontractors shall pay each of his employees engaged in work on this project under this Contract in full (less deductions made mandatory by law) in cash and not less often than once each week.

14. ESTIMATES AND PAYMENTS

- A. Scheduled or Emergency Work: Upon completion of the work required under each work order, the Contractor shall submit to the District a payment request with the appropriate invoicing. In consideration of the work done and the materials furnished, the TOWN DISTRICT will pay or cause to be paid to the Contractor the amount due to him. The making of any such estimate or payment made thereon shall not be taken or construed as an acceptance by the TOWN DISTRICT of any work so estimated and paid for. All payments are subject to correction in any subsequent payment.
- B. Preventive Maintenance Assessment: Upon completion of the work required under the Preventive Maintenance Assessment, the Contractor shall submit to the District a payment request with the appropriate invoicing. In consideration of the work done and the materials furnished, the TOWN DISTRICT will pay or cause to be paid to the Contractor the amount due to him. The making of any such estimate or payment made thereon shall not be taken or construed as an acceptance by the TOWN DISTRICT of any work so estimated and paid for. All payments are subject to correction in any subsequent payment. Partial payments will be accepted.
- C. Maintenance Bond: At the end of each contract period, the contractor shall submit to the Town a one year Maintenance Bond for the full value of the work performed during the contract period. The TOWN/DISTRICT will reimburse the Contractor for said bond based on a dollar for dollar value.

15. ACCEPTANCE OF FINAL PAYMENT CONSTITUTES RELEASE

The acceptance by the Contractor of the final payment for each work order shall be, and shall operate as a release to the TOWN DISTRICT from all claims and all liabilities to the Contractor for all things done or furnished in connection with this work, and for every act and neglect of the TOWN DISTRICT and other relating to, or arising out of, this work, excepting the Contractor's claims for interest upon the final payment, if these payments be improperly delayed. No payment, however, final or otherwise, shall operate to release the Contractor or his sureties from any obligations under this Contract.

16. INSPECTION AND TESTS

All material and workmanship shall be subject to inspection, examination and test by the TOWN DISTRICT or their representative at any time during the construction and at any and all places where manufacturing of materials used and/or construction is carried on.

Without additional charge, the Contractor shall furnish promptly all reasonable facilities, labor and materials necessary to make tests so required safe and convenient.

If, at any time, before final acceptance of the entire work, the TOWN DISTRICT's considers necessary or advisable an examination of any portion of the work already completed, by removing or tearing out the same, the Contractor shall, upon request, furnish promptly all necessary facilities, labor and materials for such examination. If such work is found to be defective in any material respect, due to the fault of the Contractor or any subcontractor, whether or not the same shall be defective, the Contractor shall be liable for the expenses of such examination and of satisfactory reconstruction.

If, however, such approval and consent shall have been given, and such work is found to meet the requirements of this Contract, the Contractor shall be recompensed for the expense of such examination and reconstruction.

The selection of laboratories and/or agencies for the inspection and tests of supplies, materials or equipment shall be subject to the approval of the Town/District. Satisfactory documentary evidence that the material has passed the required inspection and test must be furnished the Town/District prior to the incorporation of the material in the work.

Any rejected work shall be removed from the site of the project completely at the expense of the Contractor.

17. CONTRACTOR'S TITLE TO MATERIALS

No material or supplies for the work shall be purchased by the Contractor or by any subcontractor subject to any chattel mortgage or under a conditional sale or other agreement by which an interest is retained by the seller. The Contractor warrants that he has good title to all materials and supplies used by him in the work.

18. SUPERINTENDENCE BY CONTRACTOR

Contractor shall designate a contact person to whom emergency calls and work orders shall be directed. At the site of the work the Contractor shall designate a mechanic who shall have full authority to act for the Contractor.

19. PROTECTION OF WORK, PERSONS AND PROPERTY

Precaution shall be exercised at all times for the proper protection of all persons, property and work. The safety provisions of applicable laws, building and construction codes shall be observed. Machinery equipment and all hazards shall be guarded or eliminated in accordance with the safety provisions of the Manual of Accident Prevention in Construction, published by the Associated General Contractors of America, to the extent that such provisions are not in contravention of applicable law. The Contractor shall furnish entirely at his own expense any and all additional safety measures deemed necessary by the TOWN DISTRICT to adequately safeguard the traveling public. The Contractor shall give notice to the owners of all utilities which may serve the area and request their assistance in pre-determining the location and depth of the various pipes, conduits, manholes and other underground facilities.

The Contractor shall, at all hours of the day, safely guard and protect his own work and adjacent property from any damage and shall replace or make good any such damage, loss or injury unless such be caused directly by errors contained in the contract documents, or by the TOWN DISTRICT or its duly authorized representatives.

The Contractor shall provide and maintain such watchers, barriers, lights, flares and other signals, at his own expense, as will effectively prevent any accident in consequence of his work for which the TOWN DISTRICT might be liable. The Contractor shall be liable for all injury or damage caused by his act or neglect, or that of his employees.

20. PATENT RIGHTS

As part of his obligation hereunder and without any additional compensation, the Contractor will pay for any patent fees or royalties required in respect to the work or any part thereof and will fully indemnify the TOWN DISTRICT for any loss on account of any infringement of any patent rights, unless prior to his use in the work of a particular process or a product of a particular manufacturer, he notifies the TOWN DISTRICT in writing that such process or product is an infringement of a patent.

21. REPRESENTATIONS OF CONTRACTOR

The Contractor represents and warrants:

- A. That he is financially solvent and that he is experienced in and competent to perform the type of work involved under this Contract and able to furnish the plan, materials, supplies and/or equipment to be furnished for the work; and
- B. That he is familiar with all Federal, State and Municipal Laws, ordinances and regulations which may in any way affect the work of those employed hereunder, including but not limited to any special acts relating to the work; and
- C. That such work required by these contract documents as is to be done by him can be satisfactorily constructed and used for the purpose for which it is intended and that such construction will not injure any person or damage any property; and
- D. That he has carefully examined the Contract and that from his own investigation he has satisfied himself as to the nature and location of the work, the character, location, quality and quantity of surface and subsurface materials, structures and utilities likely to be encountered, the character of equipment, and other facilities needed for the performance of the work, the general local conditions which may in any way affect the work or its performance.

22. SURVEYS

The Contractor shall provide all layouts, measurements, lines, and grades necessary for the execution of the work, and will furnish the necessary stakes and spikes for laying out such lines and grades and the unskilled labor necessary to place same and/or assist in measuring.

23. CHANGES AND ALTERATIONS

The TOWN DISTRICT reserves the right to make alterations in the location, line, grade, plans, form or dimensions of the work, or any part thereof, either before or after the commencement of the construction. If such alterations diminish the amount of work to be done, no claim for damages or anticipated profits will be warranted on the work which may be dispensed with. If such alterations increase the amount of work, such increases shall be paid for according to the quantity of work actually done and at the unit prices for such work as contained in the schedule of prices.

24. CORRECTION OF WORK

All work and all materials, whether incorporated into the work or not, all processes of manufacture and all methods of construction shall be, at all times and places, subject to the inspection of the Engineer who shall be the final judge of quality, materials, processes of manufacture and methods of construction suitable for the purpose for which they are used. Should they fail to meet his approval they shall be forthwith reconstructed, made good and replaced and/or corrected as the case may be, by the Contractor at his own expense. Rejected materials shall immediately be removed from the site.

If, in the opinion of the Town/District, it is not desirable to replace any defective or damaged materials or to reconstruct or correct any portion of the work injured or not performed in accordance with the contract documents, the compensation to be paid to the Contractor hereunder shall be reduced by such amount as shall be equitable.

The Contractor expressly warrants that his work shall be free from any defects in materials or workmanship, and agrees to correct any defects, settlements, or shrinkages which may appear within one (1) year following the date of the final payment request. Neither the acceptance of the completed work nor payment therefor shall operate to release the Contractor or his sureties from any obligations under or upon this Contract.

25. WEATHER CONDITIONS

The Contractor will and will cause his subcontractors to protect carefully his and their work and materials against damage or injury from the weather. If any work or materials shall have been damaged or injured by reason of the failure on the part of the Contractor or any of his subcontractors to protect his, or their work, such work and materials shall be removed and replaced at the expense of the Contractor.

26. THE TOWN DISTRICT'S RIGHT TO WITHHOLD PAYMENTS

The TOWN DISTRICT may withhold from the Contractor so much of any approved payments due him as may, in the judgment of the TOWN DISTRICT, be necessary:

- A. To assure the payment of just claims then due and unpaid of any persons supplying labor or materials for the work;
- B. To protect the TOWN DISTRICT from loss due to defective work not remedied; or
- C. To protect the TOWN DISTRICT from loss due to injury to persons or damage to the work or property of other contractors or subcontractors or others, caused by the act or neglect of the Contractor or any of his subcontractors. The TOWN DISTRICT shall have the right, as agent for the Contractor, to apply any such amount so withheld in such manner as the TOWN DISTRICT may deem proper to satisfy such claims or to secure such protection. Such application of such money shall be deemed payments for the

account of the Contractor.

27. THE TOWN DISTRICT'S RIGHT TO STOP WORK OR TERMINATE CONTRACT

If:

- A. The Contractor shall file for any form of bankruptcy relief or make an assignment for the benefit of creditors; or
- B. A receiver or liquidator shall be appointed for the Contractor for any of his property and shall not be dismissed within twenty (20) days after such appointment, or the proceedings in connection therewith shall not be stayed on appeal within the said twenty (20) days; or
- C. The Contractor shall violate any provision of this Contract; or
- D. The Contractor shall fail or refuse to regard laws, ordinances, regulations, or the instructions of the TOWN DISTRICT; or
- E. The Contractor is deemed non-responsive

then, and in any such event, the TOWN DISTRICT without prejudice to any other rights or remedy it may have, and after seven (7) days written notice to the Contractor and Contractor's Surety may terminate the employment of the Contractor and take possession of the premises and all material, tools and appliances therein, and complete the work by contract or otherwise, as the TOWN DISTRICT solely may deem expedient. In such case, the Contractor shall not be entitled to receive any further payment until the work is finished.

If the unpaid balance of the compensation to be paid the Contractor hereunder shall exceed the expense of so completing the work (including compensation for additional managerial, engineering, administration, legal, testing and observation services and any damages for delay), such excess shall be paid to Contractor.

If the expense shall exceed the unpaid balance, the Contractor and his sureties shall be liable to the TOWN DISTRICT for such excess.

28. CONTRACTOR'S RIGHT TO STOP WORK OR TERMINATE CONTRACT

If the work shall be stopped by order of the Court or any public authority, Federal or State agency, for a period of three (3) months through no act or fault of the Contractor or any of his agents, servants, employees, materialmen, or subcontractors, the Contractor may, upon ten (10) days notice to the TOWN DISTRICT, discontinue his performance of the work and/or terminate the Contract.

Upon termination by the Contractor the TOWN DISTRICT may take possession of the work and complete the work by Contract or otherwise, as the TOWN DISTRICT solely may deem expedient.

If the Contract is terminated by the Contractor, the liability of the TOWN DISTRICT to the Contractor shall be for all work executed and for any proven loss sustained upon any materials,

equipment, tools, construction equipment, including reasonable profit and damages.

29. RESPONSIBILITY OF WORK

The Contractor agrees to be responsible for the entire work embraced in this Contract until its completion and final acceptance, and that any unfaithful or imperfect work that may become damaged from any cause, either by act or commission or omission to properly guard and protect the work that may be discovered at any time before the completion and acceptance shall be removed and replaced by good and satisfactory work without any charge to the TOWN DISTRICT and that such removal and replacement will be performed immediately on the requirement of the Town/District Engineer, notwithstanding the fact that it may have been overlooked by the proper inspector, and partial payment made thereon. It is fully understood by the Contractor that the inspection of the work shall not relieve him of any obligation to do sound and reliable work as herein prescribed, and that any omission to disapprove of any work by the Engineer at or before the time of a partial payment or other estimate shall not be construed to be an acceptance of any defective work.

30. USES OF PREMISES AND REMOVAL OF DEBRIS

The Contractor expressly undertakes at his own expense:

- A. To take every precaution against injury to persons or damages to property;
- B. To store his apparatus, materials, supplies and equipment in such orderly fashion at the site of the work as will not unduly interfere with the progress of his work or the work of any of his subcontractors, or other contractors;
- C. To place upon any of the completed work only such superimposed loads as are consistent with the safety of that portion of the work;
- D. To frequently clean up all refuse, rubbish, scrap materials and debris caused by the operations to the end that at all times the site of the work shall present a neat and orderly and workmanlike appearance;
- E. To remove all surplus material, temporary structures, plants of any description and debris of any and every nature resulting from his operations and to put the site in a neat and orderly condition.

31. POWER OF THE CONTRACTOR TO ACT IN AN EMERGENCY

In case of an emergency which threatens loss or injury to property and/or safety to life, the Contractor will be permitted to act as he sees fit without previous instructions from the TOWN DISTRICT. He shall notify the TOWN DISTRICT thereof immediately thereafter and any compensation claimed by the Contractor due to extra work made necessary because of his acts in such emergency shall be submitted to the TOWN DISTRICT for approval and Change Order executed by the TOWN DISTRICT and the Contractor.

Where the Contractor has not taken action but has notified the Town/District of an emergency indicating injury to persons or damage to adjoining property or to the work being accomplished under this Contract, then upon authorization from the Town/District to prevent such threatened injury or damage, he

shall act as instructed by the Town/District. The amount of reimbursement claimed by the Contractor on account of any such action shall be determined in the manner provided herein for the payment of extra work and shall be incorporated into a Change Order executed by the TOWN DISTRICT and Contractor.

32. SUITS AT LAW

The Contractor shall indemnify and save harmless the TOWN DISTRICT from and against all suits, claims, demands or actions for any injury sustained or alleged to be sustained by any party or parties in connection with the construction of the work or any part thereof, or any commission or omission of the Contractor, his employees or agents or any subcontractors and in case any such action shall be brought against the TOWN DISTRICT, the Contractor shall immediately take care of and defend the same at his own cost and expense.

33. PROVISIONS REQUIRED BY LAW DEEMED INSERTED

Each and every provision of law and clause required by law to be inserted in this Contract shall be deemed to be inserted herein and the Contract shall be read and enforced as though it were included herein, and, if through mistake or otherwise, any such provision is not inserted or is not correctly inserted, then upon the application of either party, the Contract shall forthwith be physically amended to make such insertion.

34. SUBLETTING, SUCCESSOR AND ASSIGNS

The Contractor shall not sublet any part of the work under this Contract, nor assign any money due him hereunder without first obtaining the written consent of the TOWN DISTRICT. This Contract shall inure to the benefit of and shall be binding upon the parties hereunder and upon their respective successors and assigns, but neither party shall assign or transfer his interest herein in whole or in part without consent of the other.

General Provisions of Laws Covering Workers on Article 8 Public Work Contracts

Introduction

The Labor Law requires public work contractors and subcontractors to pay laborers, workers, or mechanics employed in the performance of a public work contract not less than the prevailing rate of wage and supplements (fringe benefits) in the locality where the work is performed.

Responsibilities of the Department of Jurisdiction

A Department of Jurisdiction (Contracting Agency) includes a state department, agency, board or commission: a county, city, town or village; a school district, board of education or board of cooperative educational services; a sewer, water, fire, improvement and other district corporation; a public benefit corporation; and a public authority awarding a public work contract.

The Department of Jurisdiction (Contracting Agency) awarding a public work contract MUST obtain a Prevailing Rate Schedule listing the hourly rates of wages and supplements due the workers to be employed on a public work project. This schedule may be obtained by completing and forwarding a "Request for wage and Supplement Information" form (PW 39) to the Bureau of Public Work. The Prevailing Rate Schedule MUST be included in the specifications for the contract to be awarded and is deemed part of the public work contract.

Upon the awarding of the contract, the law requires that the Department of Jurisdiction (Contracting Agency) furnish the following information to the Bureau: the name and address of the contractor, the date the contract was let and the approximate dollar value of the contract. To facilitate compliance with this provision of the Labor Law, a copy of the Department's "Notice of Contract Award" form (PW 16) is provided with the original Prevailing Rate Schedule.

The Department of Jurisdiction (Contracting Agency) is required to notify the Bureau of the completion or cancellation of any public work project. The Department's PW 200 form is provided for that purpose.

Both the PW 16 and PW 200 forms are available for completion [online](#).

Hours

No laborer, worker, or mechanic in the employ of a contractor or subcontractor engaged in the performance of any public work project shall be permitted to work more than eight hours in any day or more than five days in any week, except in cases of extraordinary emergency. The contractor and the Department of Jurisdiction (Contracting Agency) may apply to the Bureau of Public Work for a dispensation permitting workers to work additional hours or days per week on a particular public work project.

There are very few exceptions to this rule. Complete information regarding these exceptions is available on the ["Request for a dispensation to work overtime" form \(PW30\)](#) and ["4 Day / 10 Hour Work Schedule" form \(PW 30.1\)](#).

Wages and Supplements

The wages and supplements to be paid and/or provided to laborers, workers, and mechanics employed on a public work project shall be not less than those listed in the current Prevailing Rate Schedule for the locality where the work is performed. If a prime contractor on a public work project has not been provided with a Prevailing Rate Schedule, the contractor must notify the Department of Jurisdiction (Contracting Agency) who in turn must request an original Prevailing Rate Schedule form the Bureau of Public Work. Requests may be submitted by: mail to NYSDOL, Bureau of Public Work, State Office Bldg. Campus, Bldg. 12, Rm. 130, Albany, NY 12240; Fax to Bureau of Public Work (518) 485-1870; or electronically at the NYSDOL website www.labor.ny.gov.

Upon receiving the original schedule, the Department of Jurisdiction (Contracting Agency) is REQUIRED to provide complete copies to all prime contractors who in turn MUST, by law, provide copies of all applicable county schedules to each subcontractor and obtain from each subcontractor, an affidavit certifying such schedules were received. If the original schedule expired, the contractor may obtain a copy of the new annual determination from the NYSDOL website www.labor.ny.gov.

The Commissioner of Labor makes an annual determination of the prevailing rates. This determination is in effect from July 1st through June 30th of the following year. The annual determination is available on the NYSDOL website www.labor.ny.gov.

Payrolls and Payroll Records

Every contractor and subcontractor MUST keep original payrolls or transcripts subscribed and affirmed as true under penalty of perjury. As per Article 6 of the Labor law, contractors and subcontractors are required to establish, maintain, and preserve for not less than six (6) years, contemporaneous, true, and accurate payroll records. At a minimum, payrolls must show the following information for each person employed on a public work project: Name, Address, Last 4 Digits of Social Security Number, Classification(s) in which the worker was employed, Hourly wage rate(s) paid, Supplements paid

or provided, and Daily and weekly number of hours worked in each classification.

The filing of payrolls to the Department of Jurisdiction is a condition of payment. Every contractor and subcontractor shall submit to the Department of Jurisdiction (Contracting Agency), within thirty (30) days after issuance of its first payroll and every thirty (30) days thereafter, a transcript of the original payrolls, subscribed and affirmed as true under penalty of perjury. The Department of Jurisdiction (Contracting Agency) shall collect, review for facial validity, and maintain such payrolls.

In addition, the Commissioner of Labor may require contractors to furnish, with ten (10) days of a request, payroll records sworn to as their validity and accuracy for public work and private work. Payroll records include, but are not limited to time cards, work description sheets, proof that supplements were provided, cancelled payroll checks and payrolls. Failure to provide the requested information within the allotted ten (10) days will result in the withholding of up to 25% of the contract, not to exceed \$100,000.00. If the contractor or subcontractor does not maintain a place of business in New York State and the amount of the contract exceeds \$25,000.00, payroll records and certifications must be kept on the project worksite.

The prime contractor is responsible for any underpayments of prevailing wages or supplements by any subcontractor.

All contractors or their subcontractors shall provide to their subcontractors a copy of the Prevailing Rate Schedule specified in the public work contract as well as any subsequently issued schedules. A failure to provide these schedules by a contractor or subcontractor is a violation of Article 8, Section 220-a of the Labor Law.

All subcontractors engaged by a public work project contractor or its subcontractor, upon receipt of the original schedule and any subsequently issued schedules, shall provide to such contractor a verified statement attesting that the subcontractor has received the Prevailing Rate Schedule and will pay or provide the applicable rates of wages and supplements specified therein. (See NYS Labor Laws, Article 8 . Section 220-a).

Determination of Prevailing Wage and Supplement Rate Updates Applicable to All Counties

The wages and supplements contained in the annual determination become effective July 1st whether or not the new determination has been received by a given contractor. Care should be taken to review the rates for obvious errors. Any corrections should be brought to the Department's attention immediately. It is the responsibility of the public work contractor to use the proper rates. If there is a question on the proper classification to be used, please call the district office located nearest the project. Any errors in the annual determination will be corrected and posted to the NYSDOL website on the first business day of each month. Contractors are responsible for paying these updated rates as well, retroactive to July 1st.

When you review the schedule for a particular occupation, your attention should be directed to the dates above the column of rates. These are the dates for which a given set of rates is effective. To the extent possible, the Department posts rates in its possession that cover periods of time beyond the July 1st to June 30th time frame covered by a particular annual determination. Rates that extend beyond that instant time period are informational ONLY and may be updated in future annual determinations that actually cover the then appropriate July 1st to June 30th time period.

Withholding of Payments

When a complaint is filed with the Commissioner of Labor alleging the failure of a contractor or subcontractor to pay or provide the prevailing wages or supplements, or when the Commissioner of Labor believes that unpaid wages or supplements may be due, payments on the public work contract shall be withheld from the prime contractor in a sufficient amount to satisfy the alleged unpaid wages and supplements, including interest and civil penalty, pending a final determination.

When the Bureau of Public Work finds that a contractor or subcontractor on a public work project failed to pay or provide the requisite prevailing wages or supplements, the Bureau is authorized by Sections 220-b and 235.2 of the Labor Law to so notify the financial officer of the Department of Jurisdiction (Contracting Agency) that awarded the public work contract. Such officer MUST then withhold or cause to be withheld from any payment due the prime contractor on account of such contract the amount indicated by the Bureau as sufficient to satisfy the unpaid wages and supplements, including interest and any civil penalty that may be assessed by the Commissioner of Labor. The withholding continues until there is a final determination of the underpayment by the Commissioner of Labor or by the court in the event a legal proceeding is instituted for review of the determination of the Commissioner of Labor.

The Department of Jurisdiction (Contracting Agency) shall comply with this order of the Commissioner of Labor or of the court with respect to the release of the funds so withheld.

Summary of Notice Posting Requirements

The current Prevailing Rate Schedule must be posted in a prominent and accessible place on the site of the public work project. The prevailing wage schedule must be encased in, or constructed of, materials capable of withstanding adverse weather conditions and be titled "PREVAILING RATE OF WAGES" in letters no smaller than two (2) inches by two (2) inches.

The "Public Work Project" notice must be posted at the beginning of the performance of every public work contract, on each job site.

Every employer providing workers' compensation insurance and disability benefits must post notices of such coverage in the format prescribed by the Workers' Compensation Board in a conspicuous place on the jobsite.

Every employer subject to the NYS Human Rights Law must conspicuously post at its offices, places of employment, or employment training centers, notices furnished by the State Division of Human Rights.

Employers liable for contributions under the Unemployment Insurance Law must conspicuously post on the jobsite notices furnished by the NYS Department of Labor.

Apprentices

Employees cannot be paid apprentice rates unless they are individually registered in a program registered with the NYS Commissioner of Labor. The allowable ratio of apprentices to journeyworkers in any craft classification can be no greater than the statewide building trade ratios promulgated by the Department of Labor and included with the Prevailing Rate Schedule. An employee listed on a payroll as an apprentice who is not registered as above or is performing work outside the classification of work for which the apprentice is indentured, must be paid the prevailing journeyworker's wage rate for the classification of work the employee is actually performing.

NYSDOL Labor Law, Article 8, Section 220-3, require that only apprentices individually registered with the NYS Department of Labor may be paid apprenticeship rates on a public work project. No other Federal or State Agency or office registers apprentices in New York State.

Persons wishing to verify the apprentice registration of any person must do so in writing by mail, to the NYSDOL Office of Employability Development / Apprenticeship Training, State Office Bldg. Campus, Bldg. 12, Albany, NY 12240 or by Fax to NYSDOL Apprenticeship Training (518) 457-7154. All requests for verification must include the name and social security number of the person for whom the information is requested.

The only conclusive proof of individual apprentice registration is written verification from the NYSDOL Apprenticeship Training Albany Central office. Neither Federal nor State Apprenticeship Training offices outside of Albany can provide conclusive registration information.

It should be noted that the existence of a registered apprenticeship program is not conclusive proof that any person is registered in that program. Furthermore, the existence or possession of wallet cards, identification cards, or copies of state forms is not conclusive proof of the registration of any person as an apprentice.

Interest and Penalties

In the event that an underpayment of wages and/or supplements is found:

- Interest shall be assessed at the rate then in effect as prescribed by the Superintendent of Banks pursuant to section 14-a of the Banking Law, per annum from the date of underpayment to the date restitution is made.
- A Civil Penalty may also be assessed, not to exceed 25% of the total of wages, supplements, and interest due.

Debarment

Any contractor or subcontractor and/or its successor shall be ineligible to submit a bid on or be awarded any public work contract or subcontract with any state, municipal corporation or public body for a period of five (5) years when:

- Two (2) willful determinations have been rendered against that contractor or subcontractor and/or its successor within any consecutive six (6) year period.
- There is any willful determination that involves the falsification of payroll records or the kickback of wages or supplements.

Criminal Sanctions

Willful violations of the Prevailing Wage Law (Article 8 of the Labor Law) may be a felony punishable by fine or imprisonment of up to 15 years, or both.

Discrimination

No employee or applicant for employment may be discriminated against on account of age, race, creed, color, national origin, sex, disability or marital status.

No contractor, subcontractor nor any person acting on its behalf, shall by reason of race, creed, color, disability, sex or national origin discriminate against any citizen of the State of New York who is qualified and available to perform the work to which the employment relates (NYS Labor Law, Article 8, Section 220-e(a)).

No contractor, subcontractor, nor any person acting on its behalf, shall in any manner, discriminate against or intimidate any employee on account of race, creed, color, disability, sex, or national origin (NYS Labor Law, Article 8, Section 220-e(b)).

The Human Rights Law also prohibits discrimination in employment because of age, marital status, or religion.

There may be deducted from the amount payable to the contractor under the contract a penalty of \$50.00 for each calendar day during which such person was discriminated against or intimidated in violation of the provision of the contract (NYS Labor Law, Article 8, Section 220-e(c)).

The contract may be cancelled or terminated by the State or municipality. All monies due or to become due thereunder may be forfeited for a second or any subsequent violation of the terms or conditions of the anti-discrimination sections of the contract (NYS Labor Law, Article 8, Section 220-e(d)).

Every employer subject to the New York State Human Rights Law must conspicuously post at its offices, places of employment, or employment training centers notices furnished by the State Division of Human Rights.

Workers' Compensation

In accordance with Section 142 of the State Finance Law, the contractor shall maintain coverage during the life of the contract for the benefit of such employees as required by the provisions of the New York State Workers' Compensation Law.

A contractor who is awarded a public work contract must provide proof of workers' compensation coverage prior to being allowed to begin work.

The insurance policy must be issued by a company authorized to provide workers' compensation coverage in New York State. Proof of coverage must be on form C-105.2 (Certificate of Workers' Compensation Insurance) and must name this agency as a certificate holder.

If New York State coverage is added to an existing out-of-state policy, it can only be added to a policy from a company authorized to write workers' compensation coverage in this state. The coverage must be listed under item 3A of the information page.

The contractor must maintain proof that subcontractors doing work covered under this contract secured and maintained a workers' compensation policy for all employees working in New York State.

Every employer providing worker's compensation insurance and disability benefits must post notices of such coverage in the format prescribed by the Workers' Compensation Board in a conspicuous place on the jobsite.

Unemployment Insurance

Employers liable for contributions under the Unemployment Insurance Law must conspicuously post on the jobsite notices furnished by the New York State Department of Labor.

Social Security Numbers on Certified Payrolls:

The Department of Labor is cognizant of the concerns of the potential for misuse or inadvertent disclosure of social security numbers. Identity theft is a growing problem and we are sympathetic to contractors' concern regarding inclusion of this information on payrolls if another identifier will suffice.

For these reasons, the substitution of the use of the last four digits of the social security number on certified payrolls submitted to contracting agencies on public work projects is now acceptable to the Department of Labor. This change does not affect the Department's ability to request and receive the entire social security number from employers during its public work/ prevailing wage investigations.

Construction Industry Fair Play Act: Required Posting for Labor Law Article 25-B § 861-d

Construction industry employers must post the "Construction Industry Fair Play Act" notice in a prominent and accessible place on the job site. Failure to post the notice can result in penalties of up to \$1,500 for a first offense and up to \$5,000 for a second offense. The posting is included as part of this wage schedule. Worker Notification: (Labor Law §220, paragraph a of subdivision 3-a)

This provision is an addition to the existing wage rate law, Labor Law §220, paragraph a of subdivision 3-a. It requires contractors and subcontractors to provide written notice to all laborers, workers or mechanics of the *prevailing wage rate* for their particular job classification *on each pay stub**. It also requires contractors and subcontractors to *post a notice* at the beginning of the performance of every public work contract *on each job site* that includes the telephone number and address for the Department of Labor and a statement informing laborers, workers or mechanics of their right to contact the Department of Labor if he/she is not receiving the proper prevailing rate of wages and/or supplements for his/her job classification. The required notification will be provided with each wage schedule, may be downloaded from our website www.labor.ny.gov or be made available upon request by contacting the Bureau of Public Work at 518-457-5589. *In the event the required information will not fit on the pay stub, an accompanying sheet or attachment of the information will suffice.

Public Work Enforcement Fund

effective date December 7, 2005

1. Purpose and Scope:

This Item describes the Public Work Enforcement Fund (the Fund, PWEF) and its relevance to State agencies and public benefit corporations engaged in construction or reconstruction contracts, maintenance and repair, and announces the recently-enacted increase to the percentage of the dollar value of such contracts that must be deposited into the Fund. This item also describes the roles of the following entities with respect to the Fund:

- New York State Department of Labor (DOL),
- The Office of the State of Comptroller (OSC), and
- State agencies and public benefit corporations.

2. Background and Statutory References:

DOL uses the Fund to enforce the State's Labor Law as it relates to contracts for construction or reconstruction, maintenance and repair, as defined in subdivision two of Section 220 of the Labor Law. State agencies and public benefit corporations participating in such contracts are required to make payments to the Fund.

Chapter 511 of the Laws of 1995 (as amended by Chapter 513 of the Laws of 1997, Chapter 655 of the Laws of 1999, Chapter 376 of the Laws of 2003 and Chapter 407 of the Laws of 2005) established the Fund.

3. Procedures and Agency Responsibilities:

The Fund is supported by transfers and deposits based on the value of contracts for construction and reconstruction, maintenance and repair, as defined in subdivision two of Section 220 of the Labor Law, into which all State agencies and public benefit corporations enter.

Chapter 407 of the Laws of 2005 increased the amount required to be provided to this fund to .10 of one-percent of the total cost of each such contract, to be calculated at the time agencies or public benefit corporations enter into a new contract or if a contract is amended. The provisions of this bill became effective August 2, 2005.

IMPORTANT NOTICE REGARDING PUBLIC WORK ENFORCEMENT FUND

OSC will report to DOL on all construction-related ("D") contracts approved during the month, including contract amendments, and then DOL will bill agencies the appropriate assessment monthly. An agency may then make a determination if any of the billed contracts are exempt and so note on the bill submitted back to DOL. For any instance where an agency is unsure if a contract is or is not exempt, they can call the Bureau of Public Work at the number noted below for a determination. Payment by check or journal voucher is due to DOL within thirty days from the date of the billing. DOL will verify the amounts and forward them to OSC for processing.

For those contracts which are not approved or administered by the Comptroller, monthly reports and payments for deposit into the Public Work Enforcement Fund must be provided to the Administrative Finance Bureau at the DOL within 30 days of the end of each month or on a payment schedule mutually agreed upon with DOL.

Reports should contain the following information:

- Name and billing address of State agency or public benefit corporation;
- State agency or public benefit corporation contact and phone number;
- Name and address of contractor receiving the award;
- Contract number and effective dates;
- Contract amount and PWEF assessment charge (if contract amount has been amended, reflect increase or decrease to original contract and the adjustment in the PWEF charge); and
- Brief description of the work to be performed under each contract.

Required Notice under Article 25-B of the Labor Law

**Attention All Employees, Contractors and Subcontractors:
You are Covered by the Construction Industry Fair Play Act**

The law says that you are an employee unless:

- You are free from direction and control in performing your job, **and**
- You perform work that is not part of the usual work done by the business that hired you, **and**
- You have an independently established business.

Your employer cannot consider you to be an independent contractor unless all three of these facts apply to your work.

It is against the law for an employer to misclassify employees as independent contractors or pay employees off the books.

Employee Rights: If you are an employee, you are entitled to state and federal worker protections. These include:

- Unemployment Insurance benefits, if you are unemployed through no fault of your own, able to work, and otherwise qualified,
- Workers' compensation benefits for on-the-job injuries,
- Payment for wages earned, minimum wage, and overtime (under certain conditions),
- Prevailing wages on public work projects,
- The provisions of the National Labor Relations Act, and
- A safe work environment.

It is a violation of this law for employers to retaliate against anyone who asserts their rights under the law. Retaliation subjects an employer to civil penalties, a private lawsuit or both.

Independent Contractors: If you are an independent contractor, **you must pay all taxes and Unemployment Insurance contributions required by New York State and Federal Law.**

Penalties for paying workers off the books or improperly treating employees as independent contractors:

Requirements for OSHA 10 Compliance

Article 8 §220-h requires that when the advertised specifications, for every contract for public work, is \$250,000.00 or more the contract must contain a provision requiring that every worker employed in the performance of a public work contract shall be certified as having completed an OSHA 10 safety training course. The clear intent of this provision is to require that all employees of public work contractors, required to be paid prevailing rates, receive such training "prior to the performing any work on the project."

The Bureau will enforce the statute as follows:

All contractors and sub contractors must attach a copy of proof of completion of the OSHA 10 course to the first certified payroll submitted to the contracting agency and on each succeeding payroll where any new or additional employee is first listed.

Proof of completion may include but is not limited to:

- Copies of bona fide course completion card (*Note: Completion cards do not have an expiration date.*)
- Training roster, attendance record or other documentation from the certified trainer pending the issuance of the card.
- Other valid proof

**A certification by the employer attesting that all employees have completed such a course is not sufficient proof that the course has been completed.

WICKS

Public work projects are subject to the Wicks Law requiring separate specifications and bidding for the plumbing, heating and electrical work, when the total project's threshold is \$3 million in Bronx, Kings, New York, Queens and, Richmond counties; \$1.5 million in Nassau, Suffolk and Westchester counties; and \$500,000 in all other counties.

For projects below the monetary threshold, bidders must submit a sealed list naming each subcontractor for the plumbing, HVAC and electrical and the amount to be paid to each. The list may not be changed unless the public owner finds a legitimate construction need, including a change in specifications or costs or the use of a Project Labor Agreement (PLA), and must be open to public inspection.

Allows the state and local agencies and authorities to waive the Wicks Law and use a PLA if it will provide the best work at the lowest possible price. If a PLA is used, all contractors shall participate in apprentice training programs in the trades of work it employs that have been approved by the Department of Labor (DOL) for not less than three years. They shall also have at least one graduate in the last three years and use affirmative efforts to retain minority apprentices. PLA's would be exempt from Wicks, but deemed to be public work subject to prevailing wage enforcement.

The Commissioner of Labor shall have the power to enforce separate specification requirements on projects, and may issue stop-bid orders against public owners for non-compliance.

Other new monetary thresholds, and similar sealed bidding for non-Wicks projects, would apply to certain public authorities including municipal housing authorities, NYC Construction Fund, Yonkers Educational Construction Fund, NYC Municipal Water Finance Authority, Buffalo Municipal Water Finance Authority, Westchester County Health Care Association, Nassau County Health Care Corp., Clifton-Fine Health Care Corp., Erie County Medical Center Corp., NYC Solid Waste Management Facilities, and the Dormitory Authority.

Contractors must pay subcontractors within a 7 days period.

Introduction to the Prevailing Rate Schedule

Information About Prevailing Rate Schedule

This information is provided to assist you in the interpretation of particular requirements for each classification of worker contained in the attached Schedule of Prevailing Rates.

Classification

It is the duty of the Commissioner of Labor to make the proper classification of workers taking into account whether the work is heavy and highway, building, sewer and water, tunnel work, or residential, and to make a determination of wages and supplements to be paid or provided. It is the responsibility of the public work contractor to use the proper rate. If there is a question on the proper classification to be used, please call the district office located nearest the project. District office locations and phone numbers are listed below.

Prevailing Wage Schedules are issued separately for "General Construction Projects" and "Residential Construction Projects" on a county-by-county basis.

General Construction Rates apply to projects such as: Buildings, Heavy & Highway, and Tunnel and Water & Sewer rates.

Residential Construction Rates generally apply to construction, reconstruction, repair, alteration, or demolition of one family, two family, row housing, or rental type units intended for residential use.

Some rates listed in the Residential Construction Rate Schedule have a very limited applicability listed along with the rate. Rates for occupations or locations not shown on the residential schedule must be obtained from the General Construction Rate Schedule. Please contact the local Bureau of Public Work office before using Residential Rate Schedules, to ensure that the project meets the required criteria.

Payrolls and Payroll Records

Contractors and subcontractors are required to establish, maintain, and preserve for not less than six (6) years, contemporaneous, true, and accurate payroll records.

Every contractor and subcontractor shall submit to the Department of Jurisdiction (Contracting Agency), within thirty (30) days after issuance of its first payroll and every thirty (30) days thereafter, a transcript of the original payrolls, subscribed and affirmed as true under penalty of perjury.

Paid Holidays

Paid Holidays are days for which an eligible employee receives a regular day's pay, but is not required to perform work. If an employee works on a day listed as a paid holiday, this remuneration is in addition to payment of the required prevailing rate for the work actually performed.

Overtime

At a minimum, all work performed on a public work project in excess of eight hours in any one day or more than five days in any workweek is overtime. However, the specific overtime requirements for each trade or occupation on a public work project may differ. Specific overtime requirements for each trade or occupation are contained in the prevailing rate schedules.

Overtime holiday pay is the premium pay that is required for work performed on specified holidays. It is only required where the employee actually performs work on such holidays.

The applicable holidays are listed under HOLIDAYS: OVERTIME. The required rate of pay for these covered holidays can be found in the OVERTIME PAY section listings for each classification.

Supplemental Benefits

Particular attention should be given to the supplemental benefit requirements. Although in most cases the payment or provision of supplements is straight time for all hours worked, some classifications require the payment or provision of supplements, or a portion of the supplements, to be paid or provided at a premium rate for premium hours worked. Supplements may also be required to be paid or provided on paid holidays, regardless of whether the day is worked. The Overtime Codes and Notes listed on the particular wage classification will indicate these conditions as required.

Effective Dates

When you review the schedule for a particular occupation, your attention should be directed to the dates above the column of rates. These are the dates for which a given set of rates is effective. The rate listed is valid until the next effective rate change or until the new annual determination which takes effect on July 1 of each year. All contractors and subcontractors are required to pay the current prevailing rates of wages and supplements. If you have any questions please contact the Bureau of Public Work or visit the New York State Department of Labor website (www.labor.ny.gov) for current wage rate information.

Apprentice Training Ratios

The following are the allowable ratios of registered Apprentices to Journey-workers.

For example, the ratio 1:1:1:3 indicates the allowable initial ratio is one Apprentice to one Journeyworker. The Journeyworker must be in place on the project before an Apprentice is allowed. Then three additional Journeyworkers are needed before a second Apprentice is allowed. The last ratio repeats indefinitely. Therefore, three more Journeyworkers must be present before a third Apprentice can be hired, and so on.

- B. The terms "Contractor" and/or "Prime Contractor" where used shall refer to the individual or company who has entered into an agreement with the Owner to perform the work contained within these Contract Documents. The lack of word capitalization shall be incidental.
- C. The CONTRACTOR may be referred to as the "General Contractor", "Prime Contractor" or similar wording. The lack of word capitalization shall be incidental.
- D. Routine maintenance shall refer to work deemed by the District that is not of an urgent nature. Routine maintenance may include the following: rebuilding of damaged fire hydrants or valves; removal and replacement of damaged fire hydrants or valves; removal and replacement of short sections of water main (20' to 500'); incidental pavement, sidewalk, curb or pavement repairs or similar work. This work shall be scheduled at least 48 hours prior to the start of the work.
- E. Emergency repairs shall refer to work that is deemed by the District to be of an urgent nature. Emergency repairs may include the following: repairs to leaking mains, ruptured mains, damaged fire hydrants or similar work. This work shall be scheduled on a 3-hour notice to the Contractor 24 hours/day, 7 days/week, 365 days/year.
- F. The term "crew", where used, shall refer to a two-man team of a mechanic or foreman and a laborer. See Section 012900 – Payment Procedures for increasing crew size.

1.03 - ABBREVIATED SUMMARY OF WORK

- A. Furnish all labor, equipment, materials, tools, means, methods, and incidentals necessary to complete the Work as required by the Contract Documents for this Contract.
- B. This following abbreviated summary is provided in order to briefly describe the work covered by the Contract Documents for this Contract. It is not all inclusive of the work under the Contract.
- C. The work includes, but is not limited to, all labor, equipment and material costs necessary to complete the work in accordance with the Contract and Specifications.
- D. All other work shown and specified within the Contract Documents.

1.04 - PARTIAL LISTING OF SPECIFIC CONTRACT REQUIREMENTS

- A. The Contract Documents detail the work included in the Contract. Related requirements and conditions covered by the Contract Documents include, but is not limited to, the following:

These plans may or may not show certain information that has been obtained by the Owner and various utilities regarding the location of various pipelines, utilities, and structures that exist at the location of the project both below and above grade.
- B. The Owner and the Engineer/Architect expressly disclaims all responsibility for the accuracy or completeness of the information given on the Drawings with regard to existing facilities.
- C. In the case where the Contractor discovers an obstruction not indicated on the Drawings or not described via specification reference, then the Contractor shall immediately notify the Engineer/Architect of the obstructions' existence.
- D. The Engineer/Architect will determine if the obstruction is to be relocated or removed.
- E. Compensation for this extra work will be paid for in accordance with the provisions in "General Specifications" and "Contract" section of the Contract and Specifications booklet "Change Orders".

1.02 – SITE ACCESS AND CONTROL

- A. The Contractor shall not close any road for any period in time unless approved ahead of time by appropriate road agency. The Contractor shall take whatever measures are necessary to not cause any inconvenience to the area's residents.
- B. The Contractor is responsible to employ methods to prevent construction materials and/or debris from leaving the work areas. The Contractor is responsible to routinely monitor the areas surrounding the site during the day as well as at the end of the work-day and to immediately clean-up any area to its previous condition.
- C. The Contractor shall employ methods to prevent the transmission of dirt from vehicles driving on exposed areas of the work area from reaching the surrounding roadways. The Contractor will be responsible to immediately clean the roadway, should the measures being taken by the Contractor not satisfactorily control the transmission of any dirt to the roadway.
- D. Any damages to areas outside the site, spills of soil, liquid, or any other material shall immediately be repaired, cleaned and restored to its previous condition.
- E. The Contractor shall comply with all state and local requirements for allowable weight limits of vehicles on all roads.
- F. The Owner reserves the right to back charge the Contractor for all costs associated with maintaining areas outside the work area, which may be disturbed by the Contractor should the Contractor fail to maintain or repair the aforementioned in a condition acceptable to the Owner.
- G. The Contractor shall maintain the premises in a safe condition throughout the construction period. Compliance with OSHA regulations and site safety shall be the responsibility of the Contractor as

it relates to work of the Contract. The posting of all applicable OSHA safety signs shall be the responsibility of the Contractor.

- H. Contractor shall be responsible for protecting private property. All existing buildings, structures, shrubs, trees, lawn fixtures, sculptures and misc. equipment shall be protected at all times. Any removals or relocation of said objects, if allowed shall be as directed by the Engineer or District. Contractor shall protect all of the physical structures, property and improvements from damage by their Work and shall immediately repair or replace damage caused by construction operations, employees or equipment employed by the Contractor. All labor, materials and equipment and outside contractors that are employed by the Owner to repair damage caused by the Contractor shall be billed to the Contractor directly or withheld from money due the Contractor for work already completed.
- I. Keep all existing driveways, roads, and parking areas free and clear of materials and equipment. Do not unreasonably encumber the work area with materials and equipment.
- J. Immediately remove excess excavated material or relocate to areas on the site requiring placement of fill. Do not stockpile excess material.
- K. The Contractor is responsible for cleaning up the work area. Failure to maintain a clean work site daily, will result in others performing the work and the contractor being back charged for the cleaning cost plus construction administration fees.
- L. Do not discard or dispose of any waste on-site.
- M. The Contractor shall be responsible for managing dust.

1.03 – WORK HOURS, EMPLOYEE CONDUCT AND EMPLOYEE REQUIREMENTS

- A. The Contractor will be permitted to schedule working days and hours as specified in the Contract, if no times are specified therein then the work hours for scheduled maintenance shall be **Monday – Friday 8:00 am to 4:30 pm** unless otherwise noted on the contract plans or applicable permits. Emergency maintenance or repairs will be performed on an as-needed basis.
- B. Employees are to act in a professional manner. Any employee using inappropriate language or who is disruptive to the work environment will be banned from the site. Proper work attire is required. Shirts are to be worn at all times and no short pants are permitted.
- C. Any employee found under the influence of any drug or alcohol will be banned from the site.

1.04 - CONTRACT REQUIREMENTS RELATED TO MAINTAINING OWNER'S CURRENT OPERATIONS AND EXCESS INSPECTION REQUIRED

- A. The Contractor shall schedule routine maintenance working days and hours as specified. The Contractor shall pay all excess costs for inspection services provided by the Owner/Engineer/Architect for working beyond the times specified.
- B. The Owner will provide inspection during all emergency repairs. Work that is either routine maintenance or new installation maybe inspected either by the Owner or the Engineer.
- C. The Contractor will be allowed to work early morning hours if a planned tie-in must be performed. Provide 72 hours advanced notice to the Engineer for all early morning work together with a written plan as to the steps necessary to construct the work. The overtime salary costs for early morning tie-in work associated with having the operations staff of the Owner present shall be paid by the Contractor.

2. If the Contractor deems that the crew requires additional manpower, he shall advise the Owner/Engineer in advance and obtain approval.
3. Payment will be made based upon the hourly rates indicated in the proposal.

- B. Materials/Equipment:

1. Payment for materials and equipment incorporated into the project shall be at Contractor's cost, less all taxes, plus 15% (not to exceed) mark up for handling, overhead and profit.
2. The Owner reserves the right to provide parts and materials from its own stock to the Contractor for installation, with no mark up. See Page P-B for list of materials to be provided by Owner.

C. Contractor's Tools & Equipment:

1. No payment will be made for any small tools or power equipment necessary for the Contractor to perform the work.
2. No payment will be made for any expendable tools, fuel or lubricants (i.e., saw blades, drill bits, etc.).

D. Subcontractors:

1. The use of subcontractors requires approval in advance from Owner/Engineer.
2. No more than 25% of the value of any individual work order shall be permitted to be contracted out without prior approval.
3. Payment for subcontractors shall be at the Contractor's cost, less all taxes, plus a maximum 15% mark up for coordination, overhead and profit.
4. The requirements of Sections 1.03 A, B and C shall apply to all subcontractors.
5. Contractors and subcontractors shall maintain appropriate insurances.

- A. Utility Work, either overhead or underground, within the boundaries of the Town right-of-way, shall conform to procedures set forth by the applicable permits.

PART 1 - GENERAL**1.01 - SCOPE**

- A. Furnish all labor, materials, equipment and appliances necessary to maintain both vehicular and pedestrian traffic.
- B. Protect the public from all damage to person and property.
- C. Minimize inconveniences to the residences and businesses adjacent to the work area for the duration of the work.

1.02 – REFERENCES

- A. Manual of Uniform Traffic Control Devices (MUTCD).

1.03 – WORK CONDITIONS

- A. The Contractor shall maintain traffic over a reasonably smooth travelway which shall be so marked by signs, delineations and/or other methods so that a person who has no knowledge of conditions can safely, and with a minimum of discomfort and inconvenience, ride, drive or walk over all or any portion of the roadway under construction.
- B. Provide maintenance of temporary pavement in accordance with the appropriate temporary pavement specifications.
- C. If required by the roadway agency, the Contractor shall prepare and submit a plan to the Engineer, outlining a schedule of operations for the maintenance, protection and detouring of traffic, showing in complete detail the methods, sequences, procedures and facilities he proposes to install. If required, the Contractor shall also submit a detailed maintenance and protection of traffic scheme to the appropriate local roadway agency and shall secure written approval from that agency prior to beginning work.
- D. For work on State highways, the Contractor will be required to prepare and submit a detailed maintenance and protection of traffic plan to the New York State Department of Transportation (NYSDOT) for approval before a road opening permit can be issued and work can begin. All detour schemes and maintenance details shall conform to the requirements of the latest edition of the MUTCD and Section 619 of the New York State Standard Specifications latest edition.

- E. The Contractor is placed on notice that the maintenance and protection of traffic during construction is considered as important and necessary an item of work as is the actual construction itself. The Contractor shall at all times conduct his operations in a manner to ensure the safety of motorists, pedestrians and his own employees.
- F. The Contractor shall protect the user from damage to person and property by reason of any construction operation (i.e., painting, paving, excavation, demolition, etc.) by such protection screens, devices or methods as are approved by the appropriate governing agency.
- G. Throughout the course of the work, the health and welfare of the abutting residents shall be provided for. The Contractor shall ascertain the specific needs of individuals whose homes or places of business may be inaccessible for periods of time while required construction work is in progress. Advance notification, where practical, of construction activities shall be given to the affected local residents.

PART 2 - PRODUCTS

- A. All materials used shall comply with the requirements for the various items or materials as established in the specifications or the contract plans.
- B. All temporary signs, delineators, barricades, lighting and other warning and guiding devices shall be as approved by the Engineer, and will remain the property of the Contractor.

PART 3 - EXECUTION

- A. The Contractor shall generally provide a travelway suitable for maintaining a minimum of two lanes of traffic. This travelway shall be kept well-drained and reasonably smooth and hard at all times and free of potholes, bumps, irregularities and depressions that hold or retain water.
- B. The Contractor shall erect barricades, detour signs, warning lights and other facilities approved by the State or appropriate agency at the beginning, end and for the entire length of any detours to adequately warn the traveling public that the road is closed and indicate the direction and route of the detour. He shall conduct his operations to ensure a minimum of delay to traffic.
- C. The Contractor shall furnish, erect and maintain proper reflectorized signs, indicating to motorists the status of the highway under construction.
- D. All signs shall be kept clean, mounted at the indicated height and so placed as to be effective both day and night. Signs, warnings, delineators and barricades shall be used to adequately inform the motorist of any unusual or unsafe condition and to safely and clearly guide him through

the work area. Such signs, barricades, warning or devices shall be so place and lighted as to give timely warning and permit the motorist to take the necessary action to traverse the area safely. Barricades and signs shall be lighted when and as required.

- E. The Contractor shall delineate areas where there is a drop-off near the edge of the travel lanes and areas of which it is unsafe to travel.
- F. All signs, markers and other facilities shall indicate actual conditions existing and shall be moved, removed or changed immediately as conditions require.
- G. The Contractor shall furnish materials, labor and equipment at any time, day or night, to immediately repair, remedy and prevent washouts, formation of holes, ruts and depressions, sunken trenches and the destruction of sinking of temporary pavements. This applies when the work is underway and when the work is temporarily suspended for any period of time. Special attention shall be given to maintenance of a satisfactory travelway over weekends, holidays and during the winter season.
- H. Whenever it is necessary to maintain traffic, the Contractor shall employ a sufficient number of competent flagmen during the time traffic is to be maintained. The Contractor shall also provide a sufficient number of competent flagmen in areas where traffic is congested, particularly where construction equipment is operating.
- I. The Contractor shall maintain at all times, adequate ingress and egress for pedestrian and vehicular traffic to and from private driveways, business and commercial establishments or for main street intersections and heavily traveled crossings.
- J. The Contractor will be required, after the installation of all pipes and necessary appurtenances thereto, to immediately backfill all trenches; compact same with the surface of the fill graded off; and install temporary pavement to permit the resumption of traffic without delay. The surfaces of all trenches shall be maintained continually by the Contractor to carry traffic smoothly, safely and without interruptions or slowdowns until the permanent pavement has been restored.
- K. The existing highway signs and supports within the work limits are to remain under the control and jurisdiction of the roadway agency, and are to be properly maintained for the duration of the work by the Contractor.
- L. Signs or markers lost or damaged because of negligence on the part of the Contractor shall be replaced at the Contractor's expense.

M. If the contractor fails to maintain and protect traffic adequately and safely for a period of 24 hours, the Owner may correct the adverse conditions by the use of such means that he may deem necessary and augmented by such other equipment and personnel as it may be necessary to hire from outside sources, and the entire cost of this work by such forces, materials and equipment shall be deducted from any monies due the Contractor.

1.04 - QUALITY ASSURANCE

- A. Perform work in accordance with the Water District's requirements.
- B. All brass valves and fittings installed on a potable water supply line shall be made of "low-lead" materials and have a maximum lead content of 0.25 percent by weight. All low lead brass fittings

shall be stamped or embossed with a mark indicating that the product is manufactured from low-lead alloys.

PART 2 - PRODUCTS

2.01 - COPPER PIPING AND ACCESSORIES

- A. All underground copper piping, for potable water shall be soft annealed Type "K" ANSI H-23.1 with fittings per ANSI A-40.2.
- B. Straight couplings shall be as manufactured by MUELLER COMPANY No. H-15403 or specifically approved equal and be used only to connect new copper to existing. Couplings shall not be used between the corporation stop and reconnection point unless the length of copper exceeds one hundred feet for $\frac{3}{4}$ or 1 inch or 60 feet for 1- $\frac{1}{2}$ or 2 inch.
- C. Insulated adaptor shall be installed on the outlet side of the meter yoke on 1 inch water services only. Insulated adaptor shall be as manufactured by MUELLER COMPANY No. H-35428 or specifically approved equal.

2.02 - CORPORATION STOP

- A. Corporation stops shall be MUELLER COMPANY No. H-15008 for 1-inch and No. H-15023 for 1- $\frac{1}{2}$ and 2 inch. Ball valve type corporation stops may be utilized if pre-approved by Water District. Specifically approved equal shall be as manufactured by the FORD METER BOX COMPANY.
- B. Water service bronze body with AWWA standard thread inlet and copper AWWA outlet, complete with straight coupling nuts.
- C. A service saddle shall be utilized on all taps greater than 1-inch. Service saddle shall be Type F3202 as manufactured by FORD METER BOX CONMPANY or MUELLER COMPANY, No. DR-2-S-XXXX-CC-150/200.

2.03 - CURB STOPS

- A. All curb stops shall be by MUELLER COMPANY, No. H-15202. Ball valve curb stops may also be utilized if pre-approved by the Water District. Specifically approved equal shall be as manufactured by the FORD METER BOX COMPANY.
- B. All metal parts shall be constructed of water service bronze. The curb stop shall have a combined tee and cap and an inverted tapered key with 1/4-inch hole drilled in cap for attaching a stationary rod. The valve shall open to the left (counterclockwise).

2.04 – EXTENSION SERVICE BOXES

- A. Extension service boxes with stationary rod (for 1-inch curb stop) to be Buffalo/Gardiner style extension size 94-E or 94-F or specifically approved equal. Heavy duty extension service boxes with heavy duty rods shall be used on all 1-1/2 and 2 inch water services.
- B. Extension service boxes shall be constructed of extra grade gray iron cover and base, steel extension pipe, with a small arch pattern base for 1/2-inch through 1-inch curb stops; adjustment between 4 and 5 feet; complete with stationary inside stop rod; one-piece lid for removal with spanner wrench.

2.05 – METER PITS & COVERS

- A. The meter pit shall be 24 inch diameter by 48 inches tall with a tapered top to 21 inches for 1 inch water services and for 36 inches and 48 inches tall for 1-1/2 and 2 inch water services. All pits shall be constructed of Thermoplastic, notched (3 x 4 inch) 180 degrees with anti setting flanges. In addition, pit wall thickness shall be no greater than 0.7 inches and no less than 0.3 inches.
- B. The pit cover shall be constructed of ductile iron and shall have a 1-3/4 inch drilled hole capable of accepting the remote read pad.
- C. Meter pit covers and lids for 24 inch diameter pits shall be as manufactured by FORD METER BOX COMPANY, Model No. A4-T for covers and Model No. WA3L-T for the lids (11-1/2 inch opening). Meter pit covers and lids for 36-inch diameter pits shall be as manufactured by FORD METER BOX COMPANY, Model No. MC-36-MB-T for covers and Model No. RML-11T for the lid.
- D. Each meter pit shall be equipped with a plastic inner liner for increased freeze protection by FORD METER BOX COMPANY Model W3PD or W3BPO.

2.06 – YOKE BARS & METER SETTERS

A. 1-Inch Water Service:

1. The 1 inch yoke bar shall be installed at a height that will allow for 15 to 18 inches of clearance between the top of the meter and the meter pit lid, or 22 to 25 inches of clearance between the top of the yoke and the meter pit lid. The 1 inch yoke bar shall be as manufactured by FORD METER BOX COMPANY, No. Y504. Yoke bar shall contain expansion coupling as manufactured by FORD METER BOX COMPANY, No. EC-4. Expansion couplings shall not be installed at the time of installation and instead delivered to the Water District office.

2. A 90 degree angle valve as manufactured by FORD METER BOX COMPANY, No. AV92-444W shall be installed on the inlet side of the yoke bar.
3. A 90 degree angle check valve as manufactured by FORD METER BOX COMPANY, No. HA91-444D shall be installed on the outlet side of the yoke bar.

B. 1-1/2 Inch Irrigation Service:

1. The 1-1/2 inch copper meter setter shall be as manufactured by MUELLER COMPANY, Catalog No. B-2423-2, or specifically approved equal. Riser height, dimension "B" shall be 24 inches unless otherwise stated. Adjustable dimension "A" shall be 13 inches. A bypass is not required or permitted.

C. 2-Inch Water Service:

1. The 2 inch copper meter setter shall be as manufactured by MUELLER COMPANY, Catalog No. B-2423-99000, or specifically approved equal. Riser height, dimension "B" shall be 24 inches unless otherwise stated. Adjustable dimension "A" shall be 15-1/4 inches. A 1 inch elevated bypass with lockable ball valve is required. Meter Setter shall be specially ordered with a 2 inch angle dual check valve with meter flange on the outlet side of the setter.

2.07 – WATER METER

- A. The 1-inch water meter shall be as manufactured by SENSUS TECHNOLOGIES, INC., SR2 Displacement Type with Touch Read System equipment. The meter shall utilize AWWA standard meter flanges.
- B. The 1-1/2 inch water meter shall be as manufactured by SENSUS TECHNOLOGIES, INC., Model OMNI T2 with Touch Read System equipment. The meter shall utilize AWWA standard meter flanges. The meter and AMR hardware shall be supplied by the Contractor.
- C. The 2 inch water meter shall be as manufactured by SENSUS TECHNOLOGIES, INC., Model OMNI C2 with Touch Read System equipment. The meter shall utilize AWWA standard meter flanges. The meter and AMR hardware shall be supplied by the Contractor.

PART 3 - EXECUTION

3.01 - INSTALLATION

- A. Notify all consumers before reconnection (if required) and also immediately prior to shutdown. The actual shutdown shall be kept to a minimum. Before tapping, the pipe shall be thoroughly

cleaned by removing all dirt and scale. The main shall be tapped on the side facing the house. All copper service pipes shall be installed at 4'-6" minimum cover with slack left at the corporation stop.

The Contractor shall furnish and install all materials and incidentals as outlined herein including the copper tubing, complete from the new corporation stop up to and through the meter pit. The new installation shall include the corporation stop, saddle, 'K'-copper, curb stop with box & extension rod, meter pit with cover, meter (1-1/2 and 2 inch only) and all appurtenances, including all types of restoration within roadway and on private property.

- B. The curb box shall be centered over the curb stop and shall be plumb with the cover slightly above grade.
- C. In making cuts in copper service pipe, the most modern equipment shall be used to produce a square cut. The tubing, after cutting, shall be cut square, burrs removed and reamed. Fittings, sockets and tube ends shall be thoroughly cleaned to a bright finish. All solder joints shall be fluxed using either 95/5 tin/antimony or silver solder. NO LEAD SOLDER WILL BE PERMITTED.
- D. On completion of the service connection, the corporation stop shall be left on.
- E. All new copper service piping crossing existing drain lines shall be installed at a 4'-6" minimum cover wherever possible. In areas where 4'-6" cover cannot be maintained, the Contractor will be allowed to cross the drain line with an absolute minimum cover of 3'-6", otherwise the new service shall be installed under the drain, etc. All new services installed with cover between 3'-6" and 4'-6" due to drain interference, etc., shall be wrapped with felt wrapping and tar paper or other approved frost wrap protection. A minimum of ten-foot horizontal separation shall be maintained between the new water service and any sanitary sewer facilities including; pipes, tanks and pools.
- F. The Contractor shall take all necessary precautions to minimize damage to any underground utility. Damage to any utility shall be immediately repaired and the cost of such repair shall be the responsibility of the Contractor. No water service shall be accepted which has been installed through any storm drain, etc.

3.02 - FIELD QUALITY CONTROL

- A. Perform work in accordance with the local water utility company requirements.
- B. The tone-out, mark-out, locating and verification of existing utilities on private property and within public Right-of-Ways are the responsibility of the Contractor. All known utilities and facilities shall be verified by test holes or other means prior to commencing water main installation. No compensation will be paid to the Contractor for lost time due to improper or inadequate utility investigation.
- C. The Contractor shall conform to the standard traffic requirements of the New York State Manual of Uniform Traffic Control Devices for work in Public Roadways.

2.02 – SPECIAL CASTINGS

- A. Material & Manufacturers
 - 1. Fittings: ANSI/AWWA C110/C153
 - 2. Ductile iron fittings will be utilized on this project unless indicated otherwise on the Drawings.
 - 3. Ductile iron fittings shall have a pressure rating of 350 psi.

4. All fittings shall be manufactured by TYLER UNION, SIGMA, or specifically approved equal.
- B. Mechanical Joint: mechanical joint fittings shall be used with "push-on" joint pipe with the joint conforming to ANSI Specification A21.11-2007 or latest revision or AWWA Specification C111-07 or latest revision.
 1. Rubber gaskets shall be used at each end for joining mechanical joint pipe. Rubber gaskets shall be vulcanized styrene butadiene rubber that is free of porous areas, foreign materials and visible defects. No reclaimed rubber shall be used. The size, mold number, gasket manufacturer's mark, the letters "MJ" and the year of manufacture shall be molded in the rubber.
 2. Retainer glands shall be required for all mechanical joints and shall be as manufactured by TYLER UNION, SIGMA, EBAA IRON, INC. or specifically approved equal. Wedge type joint restrainers may also be utilized.
 3. Concrete blocking shall be applied on all pipe lines 4-inch in diameter and larger at all hydrants, tees, plugs, caps, and at bends deflecting 22-1/2 degrees or more. Blocking shall be placed between solid ground and the fitting to be anchored. The blocking shall be so placed that the pipe and fitting joints will be accessible for repair.
 4. Concrete for Thrust Blocks: Normal Portland Cement Concrete; air entrained; 4,000 psi (27.5 MPa) minimum strength at 28 days.
 5. The Contractor shall install 3/4-inch steel tie rods on mechanical joint fittings. The tie rods shall be threaded through the bolt holes in the flange and secured by nuts attached to the rod using spacers. More than one length of pipe on each side of the fitting may require restraint. For all vertical bends, 3/4-inch diameter tie rods and pipe clamps or retainer glands shall be provided in addition to the concrete blocking specified above for bends deflecting 22-1/2 degrees or more.

- B. Acceptable Butterfly Valve Manufacturers (greater than 12")
 - 1. MUELLER COMPANY Lineseal XP II, Catalog No. B-3211-20.
 - 2. Specifically approved equal.
- C. All vertical gate valves up to and including 12-inch diameter shall conform to AWWA Specification C509-01 or latest revision, and shall be specified as follows:
 - 1. Material: Iron body, bronze mounted.
 - 2. Pressure: 250 psi minimum working pressure.
 - 3. Wedge: Cast iron wedge with urethane rubber coating (encapsulated). The rubber/metal bond shall be tested to meet ASTM D429-73.
 - 4. Stem: Forged bronze, non-rising stem with two "O" ring seals.
 - 5. Wrench Nut: Two-inch square (at base) wrench nut opening to the left or counterclockwise.
 - 6. Mechanical Joint Ends: Mechanical joint ends complete with all joint accessories including rubber gaskets.
 - 7. Painting: The body and bonnet shall be coated with a fusion coating both interior and exterior to meet AWWA Standard C550-05.
 - 8. Markings: Markings shall be cast on the bonnet or body of each valve, and shall show the manufacturer's name or mark, the year the valve casting was made, the size of the valve, and the designation of working water pressure for 4 to 12-inch valves.
- D. All butterfly valves shall conform to AWWA Specification C504-06 or latest revision, and shall be specified as follows:
 - 1. Material: Iron body, bronze mounted.
 - 2. Pressure: 200 psi minimum working pressure.
 - 3. Shaft: The valve shaft shall be a one-piece unit extending through the valve bearings into the valve disc. The shaft shall be 18-8 stainless steel, Type 302, 303, 304, and 316 or if carbon steel, with 18-8 stainless steel journals.
 - 4. The disc movement shall be 90 degrees open to shut. Discs shall be of cast iron conforming to ASTM A48, Class 40, or if alloy cast iron, conforming to ASTM A436, Type 1 or 2. Disc edge shall have Type 316 stainless steel seating surface.

5. Valve seats shall provide tight shutoff 200 psi upstream, zero psi downstream pressure differential. Rubber seats mounted on the disc and shall be retained without metal hardware. Rubber seats mounts on valve bodies shall be cemented and clamped, bonded or vulcanized to the valve body. Rubber seats shall be of new natural or synthetic rubber.
6. Valves shall be fitted with sleeve type bearings contained in the hubs of the valve body. 3.02 - BEDDING

- A. Hand trim excavation for accurate placement of pipe to elevations indicated.
- B. Place bedding material at trench bottom; level fill materials in one continuous layer not exceeding 6 inches in compacted depth; compact to 95 percent maximum dry density.
- C. Backfill around sides and to top of pipe with fill, tamped in place and compacted to 95 percent maximum dry density.

- A. Maintain a 10 foot (3 m) horizontal separation and an 18 inch (460 mm) vertical separation of water main from all storm and sanitary sewer facilities. The Contractor shall install the water main with the minimum cover indicated in the Contract Documents. The Contractor shall verify the depth of any existing service laterals to the structures prior to crossing of same. In the event the minimum cover cannot be maintained with an 18-inch clearance between the top of the lateral and the water main due to the slope of the existing service lateral, the Contractor shall either (a) reduce the cover ONLY at the sewer lateral crossing to an absolute minimum of four feet, or (b) cross under the existing sewer lateral with a minimum clearance of 18-inches.
- B. Pipe trenches shall be of minimum width and allow six (6) inches on each side of the bell with sufficient width to allow straight alignment of pipe and provide sufficient room for jointing as required and to allow the backfill to be placed as specified.

C. Trench widths shall not exceed the following authorized widths:

- i. Less than 12-inches diameter mains: 30 inches
- ii. 12-inch & 16-inch diameter mains: 42 inches

D. Pavement removal shall be kept to a minimum and not exceed the preceding authorized widths. Sawing, drilling or chipping shall be used to ensure the breakage of pavement along straight lines. Final restoration limits shall not exceed the specified widths

E. Install pipe to indicated elevation to within tolerance of 1/2 inch (13 mm).

F. The Contractor must have experienced personnel in his employ to perform the cut-ins and connections to the existing water mains and have available equipment necessary for cutting ductile iron, cast iron, asbestos cement and miscellaneous piping in the existing distribution system.

G. Install and test ductile iron piping and fittings to ANSI/AWWA C600.

H. Route pipe in straight line where possible. Joint deflections are permitted as outlined in ANSI/AWWA C600 or latest revision.

I. At each joint, two (2) serrated silicon bronze wedges shall be driven into the rubber gasket after the pipe is pushed into place. The wedges shall be installed on opposite sides of the joint on a horizontal plane. Both wedges shall be started in together and driven with a hammer with blows on alternate sides so as not to displace the spigot end to one side of the pipe.

J. Establish elevations of buried piping to ensure not less than 4 feet of cover.

K. Form and place concrete for thrust blocks at each elbow or change of direction of pipe.

- L. The Contractor shall restore, replace and/or reposition all decorative lawn ornaments, and miscellaneous items disturbed during water main installation including but not limited to the following: boulders, brick driveway pavers, fences, signs, irrigation sprinklers, shrubs and trees.

3.04 – PRESSURE TESTING

- A. Expel all air from piping system, including pipe, valves and appurtenances. All new water mains shall be pressure tested at 150 psi or 1.5 times line pressure, whichever is greater. The pressure test shall be held for a minimum of two hours with no signs of leakage.
- B. Remove and replace any defective pipe, fittings, valves, and appurtenances. Repeat pressure test until satisfactory to District.

3.05 - INSTALLATION - VALVES

- A. Set valves on solid bearing.
- B. Contractor is responsible for ensuring that all valve boxes are plumb and centered over the operating nut until after final asphalt restoration is complete.

3.06 - DISINFECTION OF DOMESTIC WATER PIPING SYSTEM

- A. Flush and disinfect system in accordance with Section 331300.
- B. Two consecutive negative sets of bacteriological samples are required. Following the "COOK" period, the main shall be blown-off or flushed prior to bacteriological testing. The mains shall be flushed again following satisfactory completion of the pressure test(s). The first sample(s) shall be taken a minimum of 24 hours after flushing operations are completed. The second sample(s) shall be taken at least 24 hours after the first, and shall be representative of the water that has been in the pipe for 24 hours.

3.07 - NOTIFICATIONS

- A. The District shall be notified at least 24 hours in advance and immediately prior to any of the following:
 1. Commencing work or starting again after more than a 72-hour shutdown.
 2. Admitting water to a new section.

3. Flushing or blowing off water mains.
4. Chlorination of water mains.
5. Shutting down water mains or service to consumers. Consumers should also be informed at least 24 hours in advance and immediately prior to shutting down service.
6. Disinfection and reconnection of house services.
7. The permanent shutting down of existing water mains or house services.

3.08 - FIELD QUALITY CONTROL

- A. Field inspection and testing will be performed in accordance with District requirements.
- B. Leakage testing shall be in accordance with ANSI/AWWA C600.
- C. Compaction testing will be performed in accordance with ANSI/ASTM D1557.
- D. If tests indicate work does not meet specified requirements, remove work, replace and retest at no cost to Owner.

2.02 - HYDRANTS

- A. Hydrant: ANSI/AWWA C502, dry barrel type, inside dimension of 6 inches) minimum, with minimum 4.75 inch diameter valve seat opening; minimum net water area of barrel not less than 190% of valve opening; 6 inch mechanical joint inlet connection with accessories, gland bolts and rubber gaskets.
- B. Hydrant Extensions: Fabricate in multiples of 6 inches with rod and coupling to increase barrel length. Where the District specifically authorizes the use of hydrant extensions in lieu of bends, the Contractor shall furnish and install a hydrant extension of proper length including drip rod and stem section.
- C. Hose and Steamer Connection: Two 2-1/2 inch diameter hose nozzles conforming to NATIONAL STANDARD dimensions (7-1/2 threads per inch) and one 4-1/2 inch pumper nozzle conforming to NATIONAL STANDARD dimensions (4 threads per inch).
- D. Operating and outlet nozzle caps shall be square (4 sided) in shape, 1-1/2 inches flat to flat dimension at the base and open to the left or counterclockwise within the Riverhead or Jamesport Fire District; pentagonal (5 sided) in shape, 1-1/2 inches point to flat at the base and open to the left or counterclockwise in the Manorville or Wading River Fire District. A clearly visible arrow and the word "OPEN" shall be cast in relief on the top of the hydrant. Nozzle caps shall be attached with non-kinking chains.
- E. The Contractor shall review the specifications regarding hydrant requirements with the various Fire Districts (Riverhead, Jamesport, Manorville or Wading River) prior to performing any hydrant repair or replacement.
- F. Where hydrant assemblies are required to be relocated, the work includes tunneling or restoring existing curb and relocating entire assembly to location indicated on Contract plans.
- G. The Contractor shall excavate and remove existing hydrant, branch, valve and tee. All hydrants removed shall be delivered to the District. The Contractor shall use extreme care so as not to crack the hydrant or hydrant shoe.
- H. Finish: One coat of primer and two coats of enamel shall be applied to all hydrants. All dirt, grease, rust or other contaminants shall be removed from the hydrant surface prior to painting. Colors shall be orange barrel with reflective tops and caps.

- A. Set hydrants plumb and locate pumper nozzle perpendicular to roadway.
- B. Set hydrants to grade, with nozzles at least 17 inches aboveground.

- D. Provide a drainage pit surrounding the hydrant 36 inches square by 24 inches deep filled with 1 inch diameter washed gravel. The stone shall be placed to a point 1 foot above the bottom flange.
- E. Brace elbow of hydrant with 4,000 psi minimum concrete having a minimum bearing area of 3 sq ft against unexcavated earth.

PART 3 - DISINFECTION & TESTING

3.01 - EXAMINATION

- A. Verify that all piping systems have been cleaned, inspected and pressure tested.

3.02 - EXECUTION

- A. Provide required equipment to perform the work of this Section. The Owner will provide the water required for the initial disinfection and filling of the piping, and valves, etc. The Contractor shall pay for the water required for any subsequent filling of these systems based on the Owner's retail water rate.
- B. The preferred method of chlorinating the new water mains is the continuous feed method using calcium hypochlorite granules in accordance with Section 4.4.3 of AWWA C651-05. Granules shall be placed at a minimum in accordance with Table 1 of the applicable Section. The slug method of chlorination is also acceptable and shall be performed in accordance with Section 4.4.4 of AWWA C651-05. The use of tablets for disinfection is prohibited.
- C. The use of calcium hypochlorite granules specifically intended for swimming pool use is prohibited. The Contractor shall utilize only those chemicals which are NSF 60/AWWA approved for disinfection.
- D. The newly laid main shall be properly chlorinated to at least 200 ppm (mg/l) for a minimum of 24 hours, to ensure the chlorine residual at the pipe extremities and at other representative points after the retention period, is at least 200 ppm (mg/l). Treated water shall be retained in the pipe long enough to destroy all non-spore-forming bacteria.
- E. After completion of retention period, new mains shall be flushed in order to eliminate residual chlorine with a suitable quantity of sodium bisulfite, sodium sulfide or sodium thiosulfate prior to disposal. Bacteria samples may not be collected until a chlorine residual representative of the existing Riverhead Water District distribution system is achieved. New mains shall be flushed at a velocity of no less than 2.5 ft/sec.

- F. Collect samples 24 & 48-hours after flushing disinfectant and refilling with potable water. Samples shall not be collected if a chlorine residual inconsistent with that of the existing distribution system is present. Any portion of the sample set which tests positive for total coliform and/or e-coli bacteria constitutes failure of the entire set with no exceptions.
- G. The Contractor shall collect water samples from each dead-end and at a frequency of one sample per every thousand feet of water main installed.
- H. Fire hydrants are not an acceptable sampling point. Where possible, the Contractor shall utilize sampling taps for the reconnection of the existing or installation of new service lines.

- I. If water quality in system does not meet the requirements of the Suffolk County Department of Health Services for potable water, the Contractor shall re-chlorinate or take other steps necessary to provide acceptable water quality. Samples shall be collected and analyzed after each attempt.

3.03 - QUALITY CONTROL

- A. Test samples in accordance with ANSI/AWWA C651-05 and Suffolk County Department of Health requirements. Minimum sampling frequency shall be as described in Section 3.02-G.
- B. Should positive bacteria sample results be obtained, the section of test main shall be thoroughly flushed, re-chlorinated and left to stand for a minimum of 24-hours. The main shall again be flushed to clear the chlorinating water and left to stand a minimum of four (4) hours prior to re-sampling for bacteria.
