**Weather and Travel Advisory**

The National Weather Service has issued a Winter Weather Advisory for our area until 7 pm tomorrow, Friday, February 19, 2021. Total snow accumulations of 2 to 4 inches are expected during the day today before changing to a wintry mix overnight with an additional 1 to 2 inches of snow forecasted. Snow will continue tomorrow with less than 1 inch predicted. Temperatures should remain around 30 degrees and increase to the mid 30's tomorrow. Winds will be below 15 mph with wind chills in the low 20's. If you go outside, use caution. Hazardous weather conditions will impact the morning and evening commute. If you must travel, give yourself plenty of time and **REDUCE YOUR SPEED**. In case of an emergency, dial 911 or call the Riverhead Police Department at 631-727-4500.

**A SNOW EMERGENCY IS DECLARED IN RIVERHEAD TOWN AT 9 AM THIS MORNING. DO NOT PARK YOUR VEHICLES ON THE STREET.**

- ALL RESIDENTS ARE REQUIRED TO REMOVE THEIR VEHICLES FROM THE STREET TO INCREASE THE EFFECTIVENESS OF SNOWPLOWING OPERATIONS. CHAPTER 289-50.1 AUTHORIZES THE RIVERHEAD POLICE DEPARTMENT TO IMPOUND PARKED OR ABANDONED VEHICLES THAT AFFECT THE ROADWAYS DURING A SNOWSTORM.
