Supervisor Cardinale: "Okay, we are here gathered together on July 7th, a few short days after July 4th to begin the meeting of the town board and we are blessed, not only by John Dunleavy's presence, but also by the presence of Warren McKnight, banjo player (inaudible) and Harriet Haas, vocalist who are going to— Warren got her here and I thank you for that and Harriet is going to sing a few patriotic songs, but she's first going to lead us in the Pledge of Allegiance."

Supervisor Cardinale: "Okay. Harriet, don't sit down. We're going to get you a microphone. I wish we had a big band to accompany you but I would say face the camera because you never know, there could be a talent scout out there looking for a new senior citizen marvel."

Councilman Dunleavy: "I offer the minutes of the June 16th meeting. So moved."

Councilwoman Blass: "Seconded."

Supervisor Cardinale: "Moved and seconded. Barbara, he was a gentleman."

Councilman Wooten: "You're welcome. A lot of work."

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Diane Wilhelm: "And as a reminder, the next town board meeting is Tuesday, July 21st here at the town hall at 7:00 p.m."

Supervisor Cardinale: "Thank you. Okay. Any announcements by board members or committee reports to the public. If there are, please step right up. If there are not, we have three hearings.

Yes, Barbara."

Councilwoman Blass: "I just want to alert you to the fact that I do have a resolution coming off the floor. I don't know, Madam Clerk, if you could give me a number for it."

Diane Wilhelm: (Inaudible)

Councilwoman Blass: "No. But I just wanted to alert everyone to the fact that there was one coming off the floor. 692, thank you."

Supervisor Cardinale: "Okay, you want to tell us what it's about so people can ask about it if they care to."

Councilwoman Blass: "Sure. This is a resolution that approves a site plan of 213 Court Street. It includes a waiver by the fire marshal for emergency access in the event of a fire, specifically, and it's important to note this, the fire marshal- the resolution states the fire marshal has no objection to the request for a waiver of the requirements of emergency vehicle access as required by Chapter 108 of the town code due to the proposed frontage of the building on Court Street and the locations of fire hydrants in proximity to the proposed structure.

The heading to this resolution does reference the waiver for emergency vehicles but I wanted to make sure that everyone understood that he feels very comfortable that they have an alternate access to which to fight the fire in that event.

So that resolution- "

Supervisor Cardinale: "Thank you."

Councilwoman Blass: "And there is a reference to a zoning board of appeal amendment- an extension, that expired on June 28, 2009 which has been extended by the ZBA and the letter attesting to that has been attached to the resolution. So it's distributed for everyone's consideration."

Supervisor Cardinale: "Thank you. Chris Kempner, there was a possible CDA resolution in regard to East End Wireless and then possibly a town resolution in regard to that. Do you know if that's

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going to be added on or not? Ask Ann Marie to let me know as soon as she knows.

So that's the one add on we know about at the moment plus what you've seen on your agendas.

We have a hearing at 2:10, another at 2:15, another at 2:25. It's 2:22 now and we can commence the first hearing."

Public hearing opened: 2:22 p.m.

Supervisor Cardinale: "Which is for the consideration of a local law to amend Chapter 108 entitled zoning, Section 108-150 purpose, Article XXXI entitled open space conservation district of the Riverhead town code.

This amends Sections 108-151 regarding uses and deletes 108-152 on special requirements.

Barbara, you're familiar with this. You want to described what we're doing?"

Councilwoman Blass: "This actually came out as a result of another amendment wherein we need to provide for the defense institutional zoning use district which still remains on the map, the official zoning map, but the text no longer is contained in our code book.

So in trying to determine where the appropriate zone is to place those other lands currently in the defense institutional district, we looked to the open space conservation district and in doing so realized that the text itself left much to be desired.

There are no new uses necessarily proposed. It's just the organization of the uses and it does provide for basically uses that are currently in that district by special permit.

We did, however, need to amend the dimensional chart and that's the unfortunate part of this hearing in that the dimensional chart changes were not in the notice to the public.

So I think we're going to need to have a second hearing to notice just the dimensional requirements. Those are the bulk schedules normally found at the end of Chapter 108 that's the minimum lot area. In this case, it's a four acre zone which it currently exists at the four acre zone.

It's basically a housekeeping type of an amendment. And I can show you the— the current defense institutional district is about 2300 acres and that will now be rezoned into this open space conservation district once it gets cleaned up.

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And it's primarily around the EPCAL site, outside of the fence, predominantly."

Supervisor Cardinale: "This is that open space that-- "

Councilwoman Blass: "Open space conservation district."

Supervisor Cardinale: "Yeah, right. That you can't do anything with."

Councilwoman Blass: "Primarily public properties."

Supervisor Cardinale: "Yeah, the birds can go there."

Councilwoman Blass: "The birds do to there, too. They (inaudible)."

Supervisor Cardinale: "I don't think too many human beings are going to go there with these kinds of uses. These are your uses and they have to be by special permit. Public parks, camps, single family residences on four acres, I guess-- "

Councilwoman Blass: "Yes."

Supervisor Cardinale: "-- farms or reforesting land or conservation purposes recognized and approved by local and regional activities. And that's pretty much it.

Your accessory uses are-- and this is-- bath houses, park administration buildings, camp houses, maintenance buildings and fully enclosed storage facilities. So when we say that this is open, we really mean that it's open."

Councilwoman Blass: "We also did an inventory of the current uses in the district and just to name a few there's a fishing club, a the Swan Lake Golf Course, Suffolk County public parks and recreational areas, New York State wetlands, rural vacant lands of the State of New York and the County of Suffolk and the CDA-- "

Supervisor Cardinale: "This is public land."

Councilwoman Blass: "Most of it is public property, yes."

Supervisor Cardinale: "My condolences to any private people out there."

Councilwoman Blass: "Peconic Land Trust-- wetlands owned by the Peconic Land so for the most part as I said it is primarily lands in the public domain."

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Supervisor Cardinale: "Okay. This is a technical change to that statute and if anybody has a comment, please come forth. Open space conservation- I think these properties are going to be for the birds for many years because there's so few uses. And nobody has a comment, good. No, not good, but it's okay. Don't feel compelled.

You can make a written comment any time in the next 10 days and you can do so with the town clerk up to 4:30 a week from Friday which is 8th, 9th, 10th, - the 17th."

Supervisor Cardinale: "Okay. The next hearing is scheduled for 2:15 and this is 2:26 now.

It's for the consideration of a local law amending Chapter 73 entitled Landmarks Preservation, Section 73-6 entitled application procedure of the Riverhead town code.

This is an amendment to Chapter 73 Article 4, what is it- oh, yes, okay. The significance is that it makes clear that what we received from the Landmarks Preservation Committee- Commission, are recommendations to the board which the board has- the town board then acts upon or doesn't as they see fit.

And instead of calling them decisions, we call them what they should be called from the start, recommendations and- all recommendations of the Landmarks Preservation Commission and the Architectural Review Board shall be in writing and filed with the planning department, and then we read them and disregard them. No, we don't, we take them very seriously and then we make our decisions.

Anybody have any comment on this clarification? I think the term decision was incorrect so we amended that and we've deleted another section which suggested that these were decisions not recommendations.

Any question- any statements, please come forth. Otherwise I'm going to leave this open until the 17th at 4:30, you can make a

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written statement to the town clerk and she'll be glad to get it to the file.

That's 2:29 now."

Public hearing opened: 2:29 p.m.

Supervisor Cardinale: "The third and final hearing for the day which is for consideration of a local law to amend Chapter 108 entitled zoning, Chapter 108 Section 286 Uses, Article LIII entitled Hamlet Center (HC) zoning use district of the Riverhead town code.

I wish I had Hanley in here. Come on up, Rick, I have a question and then we'll let the public comment if they have one.

Barbara and I were looking at this earlier, on Section C, we are saying that the accessory uses shall include those uses customarily incidental to any of the above permitted uses and one of the above permitted uses is now one family dwelling which is our change in the hamlet center as long as you have 80,000 square feet surrounding it."

Rick Hanley: "It says special permit- "

Supervisor Cardinale: "Specially permitted use is a single family. So I get that. But when you say accessory uses, you say they'll include those uses incidental to single family for example, or specifically permitted when located on the same lot.

Specifically permitted are bed and breakfast establishments as accessory to dwelling, one family use and structure.

Are you saying that it is specifically permitted pursuant to the provisions of the usual bed and breakfast process?"

Rick Hanley: (Inaudible)

Supervisor Cardinale: "Okay. So that means that- so that would require a hearing of the town board. I would suggest that after we say specifically permitted, we might want to add pursuant to the provisions of whatever that section is. You have it, Barbara?"

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Because that will make clear to them that it is permitted as an accessory use but you've got to get the usual application process finished."

Councilwoman Blass: "108-64.5."

Supervisor Cardinale: "108-64 sub 5, right, .5. Okay, that's all I wanted to know- "

Rick Hanley: "Also, Phil, while I'm up here, I think there was an oversight as well. If you look at prohibited uses, it calls out single family. So we're going to have to make that change as well."

Supervisor Cardinale: "Well, we did that. They got it published with two family dwelling use."

Rick Hanley: "Oh, good. Okay."

Supervisor Cardinale: "Okay."

Councilwoman Blass: "The only other thing that I would want to mention is this district then- until we change the other districts to make them conforming to the requirements held out in this district, this would be the only one that would allow for bed and breakfast in this way."

In other words, there are- the special permit- "

Rick Hanley: "This whole change was a result of an application as the board is aware of, so the test case was let's get closure on our approach in terms of public policy and I have probably about 15 other districts we have to change in the same way."

Councilwoman Blass: "My only comment would be I think it would be wise for this board not to adopt this one until the others are adopted because it has a totally different pathway at this point and I don't think it would be appropriate to adopt a particular bed and breakfast pursuant to one pathway in one district when the others are much more onerous."

That is my personal opinion."

Supervisor Cardinale: "Let me just clarify what I'm understanding here."

If we were to add at C, specifically permitted pursuant to provisions of 108.65, are bed and breakfast as accessory to a dwelling, then the person would have to come in say can I have a

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special permit for a single family in the hamlet center zone. We would have a hearing and we might well say, yeah, as long as you have 80,000 foot surrounding it, knock yourself out."

Rick Hanley: "Yes. Right."

Supervisor Cardinale: "Then he would have to come back in if he wanted to put a bed and breakfast and say, now, I would like to put a bed and breakfast here. Yeah, after all it's in the hamlet center zone. And we would have another hearing pursuant to- "

Rick Hanley: "Under 108-64."

Supervisor Cardinale: "And we would give it- give him or not give him the permission."

Rick Hanley: "Unless say we do it simultaneously, which I guess could happen."

Supervisor Cardinale: "So how- yeah, I guess you could, well, it would be two separate hearings though."

But how would that differ from anywhere else that accessory- how would that differ from anywhere else in which there is a single family use permitted by special permit or by actual use."

Councilwoman Blass: "It's as of right."

Rick Hanley: "Unless it's a special permit."

Supervisor Cardinale: "This has a double."

Rick Hanley: "Yes."

Supervisor Cardinale: "Which is intended."

Rick Hanley: "Right."

Supervisor Cardinale: "But the others have- they're either permitted or they're not permitted."

Rick Hanley: "Permitted, right, or a bed and breakfast as special permit. So- remove all the bed and breakfast by special permit and replace it with accessory to a single family. That's what I thought the board wanted to do. No more special- "

Supervisor Cardinale: "Okay. In the same manner you've done this one."

Rick Hanley: "Yes. Identical."

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Supervisor Cardinale: "That's what you were getting at?"

Rick Hanley: "Yes."

Supervisor Cardinale: "Okay. I get it. Thank you."

Councilwoman Blass: "And we just need to change the definition as well to provide for a duration of either one or two weeks which the board still has to determine in two different places- one provides for one week and one provides for two weeks. So we should clean that one up, too."

Supervisor Cardinale: "Okay. Anybody have a comment on this particular matter, Hamlet Center zoning use district amendment?"

If you do, come up. If you do not, we're going to leave this one open also to the 17th at 4:30 p.m. to the town clerk for written comment."

Public hearing closed: 2:34 p.m.
Left open for 10 days for written
comment to July 17th at 4:30 p.m.

Supervisor Cardinale: "And with that, we have with breakneck speed completed the three hearings."

We are now going to consider the resolutions. The resolutions 621 through 692, if you have a comment on then, please come up. Yes, Sal."

Sal Mastropaolo: "626."

Supervisor Cardinale: "Yes."

Sal Mastroapolo: "Second line down, you're missing the word letter."

Supervisor Cardinale: "Thank you."

Sal Mastroapolo: "628. I thought we had a hiring freeze."

Supervisor Cardinale: "We do. We have an attrition, stated objective of attritioning jobs."

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Sal Mastroapolo: "So why are we posting a notice for maintenance mechanic?"

Supervisor Cardinale: "This is, of course, someone who has resigned."

Councilman Wooten: "This isn't- this is a vacancy that just existed, it just came up actually. It's replacement of a guy who just left."

Supervisor Cardinale: "There's no question that- it's not a new employee for starters. But there's also no question that out policy that the board is trying to work with so we don't have to let go of jobs with people attached, is that when we get a vacancy we try not to fill it if at all possible."

This is one where they've begged enough that we- the board I think believes that it's necessary to replace and we then ask, well how about we pull that maintenance mechanic II from someplace else and put him in sewer if it's so necessary there.

And we try to do that from the building and grounds but apparently not only is there no additional- nobody available that's not doing anything, but they are begging us to replace two people in there that recently resigned.

So we decided to put this one on and publish and post and see if we can fill it because we need to."

Sal Mastroapolo: "Okay. 633."

Supervisor Cardinale: "Yes."

Sal Mastroapolo: "What certifications does the recreation specialist have? I noticed in some of the others, you know, it says has a teaching certification, okay. This one here is \$20.00 an hour as compared to one with a certification for teaching is only getting like 12 and change an hour. So it just gets the question-- "

Supervisor Cardinale: "That's a very good question actually."

Sal Mastroapolo: "I mean \$20.00 an hour seems like an awful lot, the recreation department for summer help."

Councilman Wooten: "Well, it's not- right, this is a program, right."

Supervisor Cardinale: "Okay. The good- the bad news is I don't think anybody here knows. The good news is somebody once actually did look at this because this title is on the civil service

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chart and you can't hire a person for doing whatever the job is that they're doing unless they are recreation specialists.

The funny thing about civil service is although that's all true, they don't care how much that you pay them. So your question is still valid, how come we're paying them 20 and other people 10, 12? Do we know?"

(Inaudible comment)

Supervisor Cardinale: "Okay. Yeah, yeah, right. I'll get you the answer. I'm going to call- I'll ask- Welsh my deputy is not in today but I'll ask Trina to call and find out.

You actually know about this, chief?"

Chief: (Inaudible)

Supervisor Cardinale: "No. It's the recreation specialist for the recreation department."

Chief: (Inaudible)

Supervisor Cardinale: "But how come she's getting \$20.00 is his question."

Chief: (Inaudible)

Supervisor Cardinale: "I still want to know why we're paying 20- could- hey, Vince, could you ask Trina to jump in here? I'll get you the answer."

Sal Mastroapolo: "No. There's another one that has-- it says teaching certification. This one doesn't have any certification."

Supervisor Cardinale: "That's No. 633. Okay, I'll ask. I'll get an answer from Coyne."

Sal Mastroapolo: "654."

Supervisor Cardinale: "Yes."

Sal Mastroapolo: "The now, therefore, be it resolved, does overtime hours imply time and a half?"

Supervisor Cardinale: "Yes. I don't know-- what do they get-
- yes, it would be overtime hours."

Sal Mastroapolo: "Okay."

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Supervisor Cardinale: "She would have to work 35 hours and then she'd have to go to these meetings at night."

Sal Mastroapolo: "My only question is-- I mean if she volunteered for this position and it's not her regular job, I don't understand why we're paying overtime."

Supervisor Cardinale: "Yeah."

Sal Mastroapolo: "We should be paying straight time because it's totally out of the realm of her regular town hall responsibilities. She's volunteering for this."

Councilman Wooten: "I think she was approached. I don't know whether she volunteered."

Supervisor Cardinale: "Well, actually-- that's an interesting question though. Your point is, do you have to pay overtime? She-- she's a legal secretary, Sal, and previously we had guys-- first of all, this is the Peconic Land-- the transfer money, the 2% money that pays her. It isn't being paid from tax funds. It's being paid from that transfer funds.

But she's a legal secretary and Peconic Land Trust used to charge us-- we can't afford them anymore, so we're asking her to serve in the capacity of secretary to those-- the open space committee, right. So actually it's going to save money but and it is the same job she does during the day so I believe you must pay her overtime. That's why.

But, in other instances what he's getting at is we have people that go down to the yard waste facility who work 35 hours for us as a account clerk typist and then they get single time for the 12 hours they work in that capacity.

I think this is different because she is working as a legal secretary and you have to pay them after they go over a certain number of hours in a given week."

Sal Mastroapolo: "I think you can make an argument though that they're two separate responsibilities. It's not-- "

Supervisor Cardinale: "I'd like to make that argument. I'll hold that out-- I'll try to make that argument if we can get away with it."

Sal Mastroapolo: "655."

Supervisor Cardianle: "Yes."

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Sal Mastroapolo: "Are we considering the purchase of an aquo aerobic MBR system?"

Supervisor Cardinale: "Yeah, if you tell me what it is."

Sal Mastroapolo: "I don't know. That's what it says in the first Whereas. The sewer district would like to send two employees to visit a wastewater treatment plant-- "

Supervisor Cardinale: "Yeah. We had a real go around on this one, too."

Sal Mastroapolo: "I mean, we can't find one closer than Winterhaven, California?"

Supervisor Cardinale: "No. The last one was to Germany. But the funny thing is, Sal, on this one that is-- what I said was we had-- are under order by the DEC within the next few years to improve our sewer district to the tune of \$17 million dollars.

As far as I know they have \$2 million dollars in grant money and-- so I said well before you go see this thing and, you know, that you say you're going to need to improve your sewer, it would be nice to know where the money is coming from to pay for the thing. Right?

It's like me going to see a, you know, as I had likened it to me going to see a, you know, a 200 foot yacht. It doesn't have any relevance unless I have the money to pay for it.

Well, they say whether we like it or not we're going to have to do this and they want to make sure that the thing that they are paying \$15 million or \$17 million dollars for works and that's why they think they have to go to California."

Sal Mastroapolo: "Well, the other thing that scares me now is you said that there's no other installation in this country?"

Supervisor Cardinale: "There's no other installation that we've been made aware of. The first one was in Germany."

Sal Mastroapolo: "That in itself would scare me. If nobody else in the United States is using this system, we're going to be the second one."

Supervisor Cardinale: "Well, that's an interesting-- "

Sal Mastroapolo: "It may be a better system that everybody else is using."

Supervisor Cardinale: "And they'll only find out if they go to see this one is their theory. If they go to see this one, then they'll see that they've got to consider another."

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Councilman Dunleavy: "Last year they wanted to go to Germany to look at this. We told them no."

Sal Mastroapolo: "So we saved money by holding off-- "

Supervisor Cardinale: "Well, you know, it's worse, because the German company wanted to pay their way but, of course, that was a tremendous conflict of interest that the legal department pointed out."

Councilman Wooten: "This is an upgrade so I think you'll see everybody changing."

Supervisor Cardinale: "I don't know."

Sal Mastroapolo: "667. I don't understand why we're posting and publishing when this thing has gotten shot down a couple of times at a vote. Why are we wasting money to post and publish?"

Supervisor Cardinale: "Because we're going to give the town an opportunity to make the decision which was a very close vote as a matter of fact the last time, 52-48, and because we have the votes to pass the law but you also have the right to reject it if you think it's a bad idea in November."

In other words, if the town board were to pass it, you still have a right to reject it if it doesn't get 50.1% of the vote in November.

So whatever we do is really not relevant."

Sal Mastroapolo: "So in other words, after this public hearing we may wind up putting it out-- putting in on for a vote?"

Supervisor Cardinale: "That's-- after the public hearing there's going to be a vote. If three of the members feel that we should let the public make this decision, it would be on the ballot in November but it would not be effective unless 50.1% of the voters make it effective."

Sal Mastroapolo: "Okay."

Councilman Dunleavy: "He's trying to wear us down. Just like the old school board budgets, just keep putting them up until you wear people down."

Supervisor Cardinale: "When it's a good idea eventually it gets passed. Just like they did for the town clerk."

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Sal Mastroapolo: "671."
Supervisor Cardinale: "Yes."

Sal Mastropaolo: "It- what's going to happen to the abstract? Is the abstract getting published because the abstract is very confusing, okay. The public referendum part was pretty clear but it scares me is the abstract is going anyplace other than this resolution."

Supervisor Cardinale: "I don't know, but I do know this has had a great deal of discussion and, in fact, I would like to announce that the CSEA has seen it and feels that the wording is fair and has signed off on the wording."

Sal Mastropaolo: "On the abstract or on what's being posted?"

Supervisor Cardinale: "On this resolution."

Councilman Wooten: "On the question."

Sal Mastropaolo: "Okay."

Councilman Dunleavy: "No. I think the only thing going on the ballot is the last-- should the town of Riverhead transfer- "

Sal Mastropaolo: "Okay. All right. That's pretty clear. 675, the second Whereas, is that the chief of the Riverhead fire or police department?"

Councilman Wooten: "I would think fire department."

Sal Mastropaolo: "That's why I asked the question. It could be either."

Supervisor Cardinale: "Approves the application for fireworks permit of Vail Leavitt music hall."

Councilwoman Blass: "Chief, do you usually approve fireworks permits? No."

The Vote: "Wooten, yes; Dunleavy, yes; Blass, yes; Cardinale, yes. The resolution is adopted."

Supervisor Cardinale: "Take it off the floor. Now we have to vote on it."

Councilwoman Blass: "I'd like to move Resolution #692 which approves the site plan of 213 Court Street."

Councilman Wooten: "Seconded."

Supervisor Cardinale: "Moved and seconded. Vote please."

The Vote: "Wooten, yes; Dunleavy, yes; Blass, yes; Cardinale, yes. The resolution is adopted."

Supervisor Cardinale: "Okay. That completes the resolutions before us. If there is anyone here who would like to make a comment on any matter within our purview, please come up."

Councilman Wooten: "We don't know about this yet, the East End Wireless."

Supervisor Cardinale: "Yeah, we're going to do this Thursday. Address your remarks to the board, please, Sean, and we know you're a candidate. This is not the forum, Sean, to have campaign discussions. We will do that in a campaign format."

It is if you're addressing the board individually. And do not expect me to answer because I'm not going to in this forum."

Sean Walter: "I don't expect you to answer. That's all the better for me."

So two weeks ago I brought to your attention that the town of Riverhead parks and recreation department had fined the Riverhead Little League \$50 for a game that was missed and not properly explained to park and rec during the appropriate time period.

Now I thank Councilman Wooten, he coordinated the resolution

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(inaudible) and the Riverhead Little League was not fined. However, in that same conversation I mentioned that you had spent \$3,000 of money to put your name on all the parks in the town of Riverhead.

And as I walked to the back of the room your comment was Sean, as with so many things, you're so wrong.

Well, I did a little research. I have before me the vouchers for the signs, the original signs were \$3,000. If the board would like, I have copies for all the board. The original signs were \$3,000. The board may be interested to know we used park and rec funds to do this, the same funds that we would normally support the Riverhead Little League with.

Now in the end still technically you were right. It wasn't \$3,000, in the end it was \$2,580 but you used park and rec funds and the question is this. I did not speak on Resolution 662 because I thought it wasn't appropriate to hold up the rest of the community.

You just adopted Resolution 662 to post signs for waterfowl. I don't know what that costs. I would imagine maybe somewhere around \$3,000. You did not request a resolution nor did you obtain any resolution to spend almost \$3,000 to put your name on all the parks.

So I just want to bring that out. If anybody is interested, I will have these vouchers available. I have your— actually I have your signature but I have the check, I have everything for the \$3,000— \$2,800 you spent. And I thank you for pointing out that I was wrong because now I have the proof to show that I was not wrong. And if the board members want them, I'll give them to you.

Thank you."

Supervisor Cardinale: "Thank you, Sean."

Councilman Wooten: "Thank you."

Supervisor Cardinale: "As usual you are uninformed and incorrect, again, on everything you just said. The town— "

Sean Walter: "I thought you weren't going to speak— "

Supervisor Cardinale: "I am responding generally as I just responded, Sean."

Sean Walter: "I have the resolution, I have the voucher, I have the check. If you'd like them, I'll present them right now to you and anybody in the audience that would like to see them. And you spent \$2,580 to have your name put on all the town parks and you used recreation funds."

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Supervisor Cardinale: "Sean, did- that is incorrect and you know it is incorrect and I would like to see those because- I would love to see that."

Sean Walter: "I'm going to- wait a minute. Let me give you- all the board members should have copies of this so they can look at it and they can tell me whether I'm wrong."

We've got the vendor number. I did (inaudible) the information from the vendor to protect them but we have the appropriation number, we have the check, we have everything (inaudible) almost \$3,000, to put your name on all the signs with park and rec funds."

Supervisor Cardinale: "Let me say the following. Number one, the practice of having the- on all parks the supervisor's name preceded me by decades in this town."

Two, up until about a year ago there were signs in this town that had the previous supervisor and the only discussion I've ever had with anybody is that we ought to have the current supervisor on signs."

These purchase orders were signed by the recreation supervisor, Mr. Coyne, who made the decision that the old supervisor's name on signs was inappropriate. And indeed it was since I've been in office around four years. So your point is not valid because it has not changed. There has been no policy change."

Sean Walter: "There's a policy in the town. You had to have seen this voucher. There's no question you saw it."

Supervisor Cardinale: "I have- "

Sean Walter: "There is a policy in the town that the town supervisor or the deputy supervisor signs off on all vouchers."

Supervisor Cardinale: "Sean, you are incorrect."

Sean Walter: "And I might add that your article last week, you mentioned you sign all checks and things of that nature. So you signed this."

Supervisor Cardinale: "I do not sign- "

Sean Walter: "This is your doing."

Supervisor Cardinale: "I do not sign all- I do not sign checks in this town as a matter of fact."

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Sean Walter: "(inaudible) on the checks."

Supervisor Cardinale: "Of course they're on the check, but I don't sign every check just as I don't sign every voucher."

Furthermore, I am very pleased to announce to the public that the correct supervisor, the one that has been in office for five and a half years, is on the signs just as it has been for three decades. So there is nothing untoward about the fact that that occurs."

Sean Walter: "(inaudible) \$3,000 for the Riverhead Little League that could use (inaudible)."

Supervisor Cardinale: "Now going to that issue, Sean, the Riverhead Little League has never been fined by this town board nor was this town board made aware of any such fines at any time."

Sean Walter: "I think Councilman Wooten- "

Councilman Wooten: "I- actually what happened was that was- that was actually an arrangement between the Little League and the recreation department. The town really didn't have that. We did question the authority, whether the recreation department had the authority to go ahead and charge any sort of fee."

Sean Walter: (Inaudible)

Councilman Wooten: "Yeah, well- "

Supervisor Cardinale: "Not only did he straighten it out, but the town supervisor's office had been speaking with Mr. Coyne, had been speaking with the Little League, and had made it very clear that we had no part in this and that it was between the Little League and the recreation department. And if the town board was- if they wished the town board to get involved, come on in, we'll sit down with them."

There are enormous benefits that the town of Riverhead gives and the Little League appreciates our giving. And if you can't find anything more substantive to discuss in this public forum than what you're bringing up, it is a tribute to your lack of imagination."

Sean Walter: "(inaudible) to your credibility, so (inaudible). You said that we were in dire financial straits and you spend \$3,000 that did not need to be spent."

Supervisor Cardinale: "The- "

Sean Walter: "You should not have done that at this time. You should have taken (inaudible). But the real issue this. If you

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had to pass a resolution 662-2009 to put up signs to not feed the waterfowl, how is it that the board did not have to pass a resolution to put your name on all the town signs?"

Supervisor Cardinale: "The board- first of all I am saying to you that there is no change in policy ever. I am very pleased that the correct supervisor's name is on the town parks and not the previous one, and in order to remove a name of a previous supervisor, you necessarily have to put up the name of the present supervisor. Even you should be able to understand that.

Furthermore, you are outright lying when you discuss this issue of Little League. Little League, if you brought them down, would tell you that this office of the supervisor has been nothing but cooperative and bent over backwards with this entire town board to provide services to the Little League who are delighted with our services.

And I am not- I am not denying that- "

Sean Walter: "I'll leave that for the Little League to determine."

Supervisor Cardinale: "Okay, they will confirm that. I would ask you to give others a chance to speak."

Councilman Wooten: "Can I just say something? In all fairness to the whole conversation, I personally don't have a problem. I think the town supervisor's name should be displayed.

But to say that your signs were replacements is absolutely- it's not entirely true. I went to engineering, I went to B&G, a lot of them are new installations."

Supervisor Cardinale: "The- on each park where they were previously, all I indicated is I thought that the supervisor's name that is the current supervisor should be shown not the past. But that hadn't been done for four and a half years- "

Councilman Wooten: "These were new installations where there was no supervisor. But I'm not saying that they shouldn't be. I'm just saying that it wasn't replacements. These were new installations on at least half of those."

Supervisor Cardinale: "Which parks were- "

Sean Walter: "(inaudible) resolution to spend \$2800 as you just did for the waterfowl- "

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Supervisor Cardinale: "The expenditure was not ours. It was the recreation department through the normal budgeting process.:"

Councilman Wooten: "I think the waterfowl signs we're getting from the DEC so I don't think (inaudible)."

Sean Walter: "I'm pointing out that we have a resolution for waterfowl signs (inaudible). Thank you for your time."

Supervisor Cardinale: "Thank you for your time, too. Yes, next comment, please."

John Stephans: "My name is John Stephans and I'd like to object strongly to a candidate using a town board meeting for blatantly political purpose. And also- "

Councilman Wooten: "Are you currently running for town board?"

John Stephans: "I (inaudible)."

Councilman Wooten: "Okay, just checking."

John Stephans: "And I am not going to use this to campaign. I think there should be some discussion amongst yourself as to what is appropriate. I mean bringing up this issue of signs is quite ridiculous.

The Little League accusation appears to me to be untrue. But in conclusion- "

Councilman Wooten: "Well, there was some validity to it but it was addressed."

John Stephans: "I would like to offer my (inaudible) to our two fine councilmen and our fine council woman for having been described as (inaudible) and recommend that- the writer recommending that they be tarred and feathered, that as you may know, was by my opponent (inaudible). I don't think you're lemons."

Councilman Wooten: "Well you would find that there is no love when it comes to politics no matter what party you're in. So, you know- "

John Stephans: (Inaudible)

Councilman Wooten: "Thank you, John."

Supervisor Cardinale: "Thank you."

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Councilman Dunleavy: "Thank you."

Supervisor Cardinale: "Any other comments that anyone would like to make, we'd be glad to hear. If there aren't, we thank you for coming today and we look forward to seeing you at the work session at 10:00 a.m. on Thursday."

Yes, it's already been announced but there will be a special meeting at 10:00 to pass some of the resolutions, three or four of them that we were unable to pass today because they weren't complete.

So thank you and look forward to seeing you on Thursday."
