

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Clerk's office Wednesday, October 1st, 1924 at 8-00 o'clock P.M.

On motion duly made seconded and carried it was resolved that Lighting District No. 1 be extended to include all real property lying within the territory bounded and described as follows:-

Beginning at a point in the northerly line of the present Lighting District No. 1, in the Town of Riverhead, Suffolk County, New York, distant twenty (20) rods westerly measured along said northerly line, from the westerly side of Roanoke Avenue; running thence northerly and parallel with the said westerly line of Roanoke Avenue, to the centre line of Middle Road; running thence easterly along the said centre line of Middle Road to a point in said line distant forty (40) rods easterly, measured at right angles to the centre line of Roanoke Avenue, from said centre line of Roanoke Avenue; running thence southerly and parallel with the said centre line of Roanoke Avenue to the present northerly line of the present Lighting District No. 1, thence easterly, southerly, westerly, northerly along the present line of the present Lighting District No. 1, as the same at present runs, winds and turns, to the point or place of beginning.

The matter of the alteration of the westerly line of Peconic Avenue at its intersection with Main Street was discussed and the Superintendent of Highways was, upon motion duly carried, requested to confer with the Riverhead Savings Bank regarding the same.

Mr. H. J. Spillman, Mr. Chas. McCabe and Mr. Robert Riley were present. Mr. Spillman addressed the Board presenting a plan by which he would establish a silk factory in the vicinity of the village which would employ a large number of people, and requested the co-operation of the Board by its moral support. The members of the Board individually expressed their willingness to give the enterprise such support.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried, the Board
adjourned to meet at the Bridge at Skillman's Creek
Aquebogue, on October 15, 1924 at 2 o'clock P.M.
