Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held at the southwest corner of Main Street and Peconic Avenue Riverhead, N.Y. on Wednesday October 15th, 1924 at 4-00 P.M.

County Superintendent of Highways, A.O.Smith was present.

Justice Corwin read the following resolution and moved its adoption which motion was duly seconded,

RESOLVED that we offer the Riverhead Savings Bank the following proposition; to give them the sum of Three hundred dollars (\$300.00) and pay all necessary repairs to highway on Main Street and Peconic Avenue, abutting property of the Riverhead Savings Bank, in changing grade of highway and laying concrete between the side of the State Road bed and the curb so as to conform with the proper side walk and curb grade, with the understanding that the Riverhead Savings Bank pay for building the side walk and curb; the side walk on Peconic Avenue to be a width of six feet and the side walk on Main Street to be a width of nine feet.

Justice Vail moved that the said resolution be amended to read as follows: which motion was duly seconded,

The Town agrees to pay for all necessary repairs to highway on Main Street and Peconic Avenue, abutting property of the Riverhead Savings Bank, in changing grade of the highway and laying concrete between the side of State Road bed and the curb so as to conform with the proper side walk and curb grade, with the understanding that the Riverhead Savings Bank pay for building the side walk and curb; the side walk on Peconic Avenue to be a width of six feet and the side walk on Main Street to be a width of nine feet.

County Engineer A.O.Smith spoke in favor of the amendment.


The resolution as amended was thereupon declared duly adopted.

On motion duly made seconded and carried the following resolution was duly adopted:

Resolved, that Lighting District No. 1, be and the same is hereby extended to include all the real property lying within the territory bounded and described as follows:

BEGINNING at a point in the westerly line of the present Lighting District No. 1 near the point of intersection of said line with the centre line of Osborne Avenue, and which point is distant three hundred feet, measured at right angles, southwesterly from the centre line of Osborne Avenue running thence northwesterly and parallel with the centre line of Osborne Avenue to the centre line of Raynor Avenue; running thence northerly along the centre line of Raynor Avenue to the centre line of Osborne Avenue; running thence in a straight line at right angles to the centre line of Roanoke Avenue to the westerly boundary line of present Lighting District No. 1; running thence southerly and westerly along the westerly and northerly line of the present Lighting District No. 1, to the point or place of beginning.

On motion duly made seconded and carried the meeting adjourned to meet at the Town Clerk's office October 29th 1924 at 2-00 P.M.
