

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Clerk's office Wednesday, Nov. 26th, 1924 at 2-00 P.M.

Minutes of the meeting held November 10th. were read and on motion adopted.

On motion duly made seconded and carried it was resolved that the Supervisor and Town Clerk be and they hereby are authorized and directed to borrow the sum of \$6365.00 in anticipation of taxes, to pay the bonds and interest of the Riverhead Water District.

On motion duly made seconded and carried it was resolved that the Assessors be authorized to employ an additional clerk for a period of four weeks at a salary of \$25.00 per week, and that the appointment of Theresa M.Smith as such clerk by the Assessors on November 10th. be and the same is hereby ratified and confirmed.

On motion duly made seconded and carried it was resolved that the Supervisor and Town Clerk be and they hereby are authorized and directed to borrow the sum of \$ 3200.00 to pay audited bills of Nov.25th,1924.

The Town Clerk read a communication from A.C.Flick State Historian requesting that the vacancy in the office of Local Historian caused by the death of David E.Gaddis be filled at an early date.

On motion duly made seconded and carried the communication was referred to the Supervisor.

The Town Clerk read a communication from Edward Regula requesting street lights on Marcy Avenue, North of Cemetery Street.

On motion duly made seconded and carried it was resolved, that whereas Marcy Avenue at the point mentioned in the said communication, was not a public highway, that the application be denied.

The Town Clerk read a communication from the Automatic Registering Machine Corporation relative to the voting machines loaned to the town.

On motion duly made seconded and carried the Town Clerk was instructed to write them in reply, stating that the operation of the machines at the last general election was satisfactory and that the Town Board would take up the matter of the disposition of the machines loaned at a early future meeting.

On motion duly made seconded and carried the Receiver of Taxes was authorized to employ a clerk for a period of six weeks at a salary of \$ 30.00 per week.

On motion duly made seconded and carried the following resolution was duly adopted:

Whereas the duties of Inspectors of Election in the use of voting machines require considerable less labor and number of hours work, than in the former method of voting by paper ballot, and

Whereas the Election Law fixes the sum of \$10.00 as the compensation for Inspectors of Election in other municipalities where voting machines are used, and

Whereas the Board or Auditors has recommended that the compensation of the Election Inspectors in the town be fixed at the sum of \$10.00 for General Election, now therefor be it

Resolved, that the compensation of Inspectors of Election of this town be and the same is hereby fixed at the sum of \$10.00 per day for General Election day.

The Superintendent of Highways requested that the sum of \$ 800.00 be transferred from the Miscellaneous Fund to the Machinery Fund.

On motion duly made seconded and carried it was resolved that the Supervisor be and he is hereby authorized and directed to transfer the sum of \$ 800.00 from the Miscellaneous Fund to the Machinery Fund.

On motion duly made seconded and carried it was resolved that a desk be purchased for the Town Office for the use of the Supervisor.

On motion duly made seconded and carried the board adjourned to meet at the Town Clerk's office on December 18th at 2-00 P.M.
