

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Hall on Wednesday, August 11, 1937 at 9:00 A. M.

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board held on July 28th, 1937 were read and on motion and vote were duly adopted.

A communication was read from the East End Surf Club, Inc. requesting the Board to appropriate the sum of \$50.00 for the purpose of publicity in connection with the Sportsman Show held each year at the Grand Central Palace, New York, stating that it would boost the Town in many ways.

On motion made by Justice Kelly and seconded by Justice Boutcher, it was RESOLVED that the communication be placed on file and that the Town Clerk is hereby directed to acknowledge letter and state that there is no money available in the Town budget this year for such a purpose, however if the matter is properly submitted to the Board at the time the tentative budget for the next fiscal year is made, the appropriation will be given due consideration. The vote, Justices Warner, Boutcher, Kelly and Luce, Yes, Supervisor Burns, Yes. Total vote, Yes 5, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Rev. James Alcock and Mr. Frank Reeve of Aquebogue addressed the Board inquiring as to the disposition of the matter of the building of sidewalks at Aquebogue. They were informed that the matter has been submitted to WPA and the Town is now waiting to hear from them.

A communication signed "High Taxpayer" in regard to the odor from ducks and advice to the Town Board as to how to handle the matter was read and ordered placed on file.

The matter of picking up stray dogs in the Town was discussed with the Dog Warden, Harold Downs. It was the consensus of the Board that owners of dogs (wishing to get rid of them and) who call upon the Dog Warden to destroy them should pay the cost and not the Town.

On motion made by Justice Luce and seconded by Justice Warner, it was RESOLVED that 500 certificates of non-ownership be printed, to be used by the Dog Warden in those cases where persons call the Warden to dispose of a dog. The vote, Justices Warner, Boutcher, Kelly and Luce, Yes, Supervisor Burns, Yes. Total vote, Yes 5, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.


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The Supervisor's report for the month of July was submitted to the Board and on motion and vote was received and ordered placed on file.

On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Luce, it was RESOLVED that the Supervisor be authorized to transfer the sum of \$4.20 from the Current Surplus Account to the Miscellaneous Peconic River Buoy Lights Account. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board.

The Town Board then convened as a Board of Audit and examined the Town bills to date.

There being no further business on motion and vote the meeting adjourned to meet on August 25, 1937 at 9:00 A. M.
