#277 RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT TO OBTAIN AN INCREASED COAST GUARD FUNDING BILL.

WHEREAS, many residents of the Town of Riverhead make their livelihood as baymen, working in the bays of Long Island, and

WHEREAS, the Town of Riverhead enjoys a substantial summer resort community and tourism, a source of income to Riverhead residents, and

WHEREAS, the Third Coast Guard District is subject to major budget cutbacks in Coast Guard operations and is presently

proposing to eliminate hundreds of navigational aids in this area used by recreational boaters, and

WHEREAS, the removal of these aids would endanger the safety of our baymen and recreational boaters and restrict their activity as well as adversely affect our economy,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED, that the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead requests the Third Coast Guard District to seriously consider the impact on Long Island tourism and the potential danger to our baymen and boaters prior to taking any action on the elimination of these navigational aids. We further urge Senator Alphonse D'Amato and Congressman William Carney to strongly support Representative Gerry Studts (Mass.) and William Hughes (N.J.) in their efforts to obtain an increased Coast Guard funding bill.

#281 CALLS LABOR AND MATERIAL BOND OF LYON AND REBOLI, INC.
RE: PARKER ROAD

WHEREAS, Lyon and Reboli, Inc. of 56 Comsegoe Road, East Setauket, New York, entered into a contract with the Town of Riverhead on October 20, 1981, for the installation of storm drainage facilities at Parker Road in the Town of Riverhead, and

WHEREAS, pursuant to this contract, a labor and material bond running to the Town of Riverhead with Fireman's Insurance Company of Newark, New Jersey, as surety, was executed October 27, 1981, and

WHEREAS, such bond provides as a condition that the Principal shall promptly make payment to all claimants as therein defined for all labor and material used or reasonably required for use in the performance of the Contract, and

WHEREAS, a notice of lien dated April 16, 1982, by Boccard Industries, Inc. has been filed with Riverhead Town claiming an amount of \$12,780 due for rings, slabs, and 9" pipe allegedly furnished to Lyon and Reboli, Inc.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED, that the labor and material bond dated October 27, 1981, between Lyon and Reboli, Inc., as principal and Fireman's Insurance Company as surety be hereby called, and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Supervisor be and is hereby authorized to execute any documents necessary to give notice to this demand.
