

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Hall on Wednesday, September 29, 1937 at 9:00 A. M.

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board held on September 22, 1937 were read and on motion and vote were duly adopted.

A communication was read from the Wading River Civic Association requesting the Town Board to adopt an ordinance forbidding trespass, pursuant to the provisions of Subdivision 14 of Section 130 of the Town Law.

On motion made by Justice Kelly and seconded by Justice Warner, it was RESOLVED that pursuant to the provisions of Subdivision 14 of Section 130 of the Town Law of the State of New York, the Town Board of Riverhead hereby enacts the following Ordinance, subject to permissive referendum:

It shall be unlawful for any person to trespass upon private property within the Town of Riverhead or upon public property of the Town of Riverhead, except such public property of the Town which shall be specifically designated for use by the public.

Every violation of this ordinance shall constitute a misdemeanor punishable by a fine of not more than fifty (\$50.00) dollars and imprisonment in the County Jail for not more than thirty (30) days, or both. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board.

A communication was read from the East End Surf Fishing Club requesting the Board to appropriate the sum of \$50.00 for publicity work in connection with their booth at the annual Sportsman's Show held in the Grand Central Palace. The matter was deferred until the next regular meeting of the Board.


A communication was read from the Suffolk County Department of Public Welfare together with a report of distributions made by the Surplus Commodities Division for the period of July 26 to August 25, 1937 for the Town of Riverhead. On motion and vote the communication and report was ordered placed on file.

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A communication was read from the Trustees of Roanoke Lodge No. 462, I.O.O.F. offering to rent a room on the second floor of the Town Hall for use of the Board of Assessors for the sum of \$35.00 per month. The communication was ordered placed on file.

The Town Board then convened as a Board of Audit and examined the bills for the month of September, 1937.

There being no further business on motion and vote the meeting adjourned to meet on Wednesday, October 6, 1937 at 9:00 A. M.
