At this point of the meeting, Supervisor Vojvoda asked if anyone wished to be heard and the following responded:

Mr. Lyndon Hallock spoke to the Board about the drainage problems of Dr. Dusselman and Mr. Aldrich, stating they are desirous of having the grade established as in its present condition it is detrimental to the practice of farming.

After discussion on the matter, Supervisor Vojvoda assigned Councilman Young, Alex E. Horton, Supt. of Highways and Lyndon Hallock on Committee to resolve the problem.

Patricia Tormey, Chairman of Zoning Board of Appeals, informed the Board that the Board of Appeals has had four appeals for variances relating to Farm Trailers and three more are scheduled.

Mrs. Tormey suggested something be worked out to enact changes in the ordinance on the "200 ft. back from the road" provision as well as other provisions relating to Farm Trailers.

The Town Board requested Mrs. Tormey to make recommendations for changes and report to the Town Board.

Mrs. Tormey asked the Town Board if something could be done to inspire Attorney Pierre Lundberg to proceed with the drawing up of the recommendations of the Zoning Committee for the revising of Zoning Ordinance No. 26.

The Town Clerk was directed to inform Mr. Lundberg of the Town Board's anxiety to enact the revision of Zoning Ordinance No. 26 in the very near future.

Town Justice Zaloga brought up the matter of designating an area at the Town Dump for junked cars.

Supervisor Vojvoda stated that an area has been designated for this purpose.

At this point, Supervisor Vojvoda recessed the meeting to hold a Public Hearing.

PUBLIC HEARING - 10:45 A. M.

The Town Clerk submitted affidavits of posting and publishing Notice of Public Hearing in the matter of a proposal to change Zoning Ordinance No. 26 and Zoning Map from Residence 3 Use District to Business 1 Use District on parcel of land at Wading River. (Scanlon Petition)
The affidavits were ordered filed.

Supervisor Vojvoda thereupon declared the Hearing open and asked if anyone wished to be heard in favor of or against proposed change to Zoning Ordinance No. 26.

No one wishing to be heard in favor of or against the proposed change to Zoning Ordinance No. 26, Supervisor Vojvoda declared the Hearing closed and re-opened the meeting.

RESOLUTIONS

Councilman Grodski offered the following resolution which was seconded by Councilman Young.

WHEREAS, The Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, Suffolk County, New York, has caused all matters and things to be done which are required by the Town Law and other statutes made and provided in order that amendments and changes to the Zoning Ordinance No. 26 of the Town of Riverhead, as Amended, more particularly to the Zoning Map incorporated therein, may be adopted for the Town,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead hereby amends the existing Ordinance No. 26, entitled, "Zoning Ordinance of the Town of Riverhead, Suffolk County, New York, as Amended, in accordance with Article V, Section 501 of said Ordinance and in accordance with the New York Town Law Section 265, by amending the "Zoning Map of the Town of Riverhead, Suffolk County, New York, as follows:

By changing from Residence III Use District to Business I Use District a parcel of land at Wading River, Town of Riverhead, Suffolk County, New York, described as a parcel having a frontage of 383.7 feet on the southerly side of North Wading River Road, and being 125 feet in depth, having as its easterly boundary the easterly side of Oak Road extended, and as its westerly boundary the easterly boundary of land of R. Aimes; including portions of lands of Scanlon, Witt, Siebrecht and Koesling.

AND the Town Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to enter the said amendment and change in the minutes of the Town Board, to publish a copy thereof, exclusive of the Zoning Map incorporated therein, once in the NEWS-REVIEW, the official newspaper published in the Town and to post a copy thereof, together with Zoning Map incorporated therein, on the signboard maintained by the Town Clerk pursuant to subdivision 6 of Section 30 of the provisions of the Town Law and to file in her office affidavits of said publication and posting.

This amendment and change to Zoning Ordinance No. 26, of the Town of Riverhead, as Amended, more particularly to the Zoning Map incorporated therein, shall take effect 10 days after such publication and posting.

NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that pursuant to Section 130 of the Town Law a Public Hearing will be held by the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead at the Town Board Room, Town Hall, 220 Roanoke Avenue, Riverhead, New York, on April 2, 1968 at 11:15 o'clock in the forenoon, in the matter of certain proposed amendments to Ordinance No. 10, "Mobil Home and Travel Trailer Parks", and the repeal of prior Ordinance No. 10, "Providing for the Regulation of Tourist Camps", by adoption of the following ordinance:

AMENDMENT TO MOBIL HOME ORDINANCE NO. 10

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD:

1) Section H, Article 1 of "Mobil Home and Travel Trailer Parks Ordinance No. 10", adopted March 5, 1968, entitled "FEES", is amended to read as follows:

"SECTION H - FEES"

Every owner or lessee of a Mobil Home Park or Travel Trailer Park shall upon the establishment or extension of an existing park pay to the Town Clerk a fee of \$2.00 per lot for each lot, both vacant and in use, shown on the filed map of the park or extension.

RESOLUTIONS continued:

Every owner or lessee of an existing Park which has been brought into compliance with the provisions of this ordinance shall be entitled to a permanent permit as to such existing park, as provided in Section G, Article 1, upon payment to the Town Clerk of a fee of \$2.00 per lot for each lot, both vacant and in use, shown on the filed map of such existing Park.

2) Section G (2) b, Article 1 of such ordinance is amended as follows:

Delete the words "notwithstanding any other permit required as to the prior established park or extensions thereto.", and substitute a period (.) for the comma (,) following the word "requirements" immediately preceding the phrase to be omitted.

3) Section 2 (G) c, Article 1 of such ordinance is repealed.

4) Prior Ordinance No. 10, "Providing for the Regulation of Tourist Camps", adopted August 21, 1956, is repealed.

5) Section F, Article 1 of such Ordinance No. 10, adopted March 5, 1968, is amended by deleting the word "building" from said section whenever it appears herein.

Any person desiring to be heard on the said proposed ordinance shall appear at the time and place above specified.

Please Take Notice that a public hearing will be held on the 2nd day of April, 1968, at 11:00 A.M. at the Town Hall, 220 Roanoke Avenue, Riverhead, New York, to consider a petition in the matter of the establishment of an extension of a lighting district to be known as Extension No. 5 of the Riverhead Lighting District in the Town of Riverhead, Suffolk County, New York, in the territory hereinafter described which is located in the Town of Riverhead, County of Suffolk and State of New York outside any incorporated village and wholly within said Town of Riverhead, and which extension is described as follows:

BEGINNING at a point formed by the intersection of the northerly line of the land of the Long Island Rail Road with the westerly line of the land now or formerly of Suffolk Cooperative G. L. F. Service, said point being in the boundary of the Riverhead Lighting District, and running thence from said point of beginning northerly along the boundary line of the Riverhead Lighting District, to a point in the westerly line of the land of the Riverhead Water District; thence northerly along the westerly line of the land of the Riverhead Water District to a point distant 600 ft. southerly of the southerly line of Old Country Road, as measured along the westerly line of the land of the Riverhead Water District; thence westerly on a line passing through a point, which is on the westerly line of the land of P. Machno distant 250.00 ft. southerly of the south line of Old Country Road as measured along the westerly line of the land of P. Machno to a point, which is distant northerly 80.00 ft. at right angles to the northerly line of Pulaski Street at a point on Pulaski Street 400.00 ft. westerly, as measured along the northerly line of Pulaski Street from the intersection of the easterly line of the land of N. Stachiw with the northerly line of Pulaski St.; thence southerly on a line at right angles to Pulaski Street for a distance of 80.00 ft. to a point in the northerly line of Pulaski Street; thence westerly along the northerly line of Pulaski Street to a point, which formed by the intersection of the prolongation northerly of the easterly line of the land of Modern Tractor Company with the northerly line of Pulaski Street; thence southerly across Pulaski Street; thence southerly along the easterly line of land of Modern Tractor Company; thence southerly, easterly and again southerly along the general easterly line of the land of Z. Supervisor Vojvoda thereupon declared the Hearing open and asked if anyone wished to be heard in favor of or against the aforesaid matter.

Town Justice Zaloga stated that it is his opinion that a section be inserted to read that the Town Board be permitted to suspend the operation of parking meters on days that the local merchants hold their annual sales.

After a discussion on the matter it was the consensus of the Board that the following changes be made:

"Section 10-Suspension" to supplant "Section 10-Repealer".

Section 10-Suspension to read:

"The Town Board may by resolution suspend the operation of parking meters on any day or days".

Thereby, "Section 10-Repealer" to become "Section 11-Repealer", and "Section 11-Partial Invalidity" to become "Section 12-Partial Invalidity".

The Town Attorney rendered opinion that the aforesaid addition and changes being in essence "less restrictive", it would not be necessary to re-advertise for another hearing on the ordinance.

No one else wishing to be heard, Supervisor Vojvoda thereupon declared the Hearing closed and re-opened the meeting.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Town Clerk is authorized and directed to publish in the March 28th, 1968 issue of the NEWS-REVIEW, the following Notice of Public Hearing:

ORDINANCE NO. 38

APPOINTING NEW YORK BOARD OF FIRE UNDERWRITERS AS
ELECTRICAL INSPECTORS IN THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD

BE IT ORDAINED by the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, as follows:

1) The Chief Inspector, and each of the duly appointed Inspectors of the New York Board of Fire Underwriters are hereby authorized and deputized as Agents of the Town of Riverhead to make inspections and reinspections of all electrical installations hereafter described, and to approve or disapprove the same. In no event, however, will the cost or expense of such inspections or reinspections be a charge against the Town.

2) It shall be the duty of the Inspector to report in writing to the Building Inspector of the Town, whose duty it shall be to enforce all provisions, violations and deviations from or omissions of the electrical provisions of the State Building Construction Code applicable to the Town, and of all local laws, ordinances and the Building Code as referred to in this ordinance insofar as any of the same pertain to electrical wiring. The Inspector shall make inspections and reinspections of electrical installations in and on the properties in the Town upon the written request of an authorized official of the Town or as herein provided. The Inspector is authorized to make inspections and reinspections of electrical wiring, installations, devices, appliances, and equipment in or on properties within the Town where he deems it necessary for the protection of life or property. In the event of emergency it is the duty of the Inspector to make electrical inspections upon the oral request of an official or officer of the Town.

It shall be the duty of the Inspector to furnish written reports to the proper officials of the Town and owners and/or lessees of property where defective electrical installations and equipment are found upon inspection. He shall authorize the issuance of a certificate of compliance when electrical installations and equipment are in conformity with the ordinance. He shall direct that a copy of the certificate of compliance be sent to the Town of Riverhead to the attention of the Building Inspector.

3) It shall be a violation of this ordinance for any person, firm or corporation to install or cause to be installed, or to alter electrical wiring for light, heat or power in or on properties in the Town until an application for inspection has been filed with the New York Board of Fire Underwriters. It shall be a violation of this ordinance for a person, firm or corporation to connect or cause to be connected electrical wiring in or on properties for light, heat or power, to any source of electrical energy supply, prior to the issuance of a temporary certificate, or certificate of compliance, by the New York Board of Fire Underwriters.

RESOLUTION continued:

4) Failure to comply with the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed a violation, and punishable by a fine of not more than \$50. or imprisonment for not more than fifteen days, or both such fine and imprisonment. Each week's failure to comply shall constitute a separate violation.

5) This ordinance shall take effect upon publication and posting as required by law.

ANY PERSON desiring to be heard on the said proposed ordinance shall appear at the time and place above specified.

The Town Attorney stated that where the words "Justices of the Peace" and "Justices" appear in the ordinance that same be changed to read "Town Justices". It was decided that these changes be made.

Police Chief Stephen Grodski called to the attention of the Board that the section of Duryea Street and Merritt's Pond Road was omitted under the "Stop and Yield Intersections".

It was decided that an amendment be enacted to correct this omission at a later date.

No one else wishing to be heard, Supervisor Vojvoda declared the Hearing closed and re-opened the meeting.

ADOPTS REVISED "TRAFFIC CONTROL AND PARKING ORDINANCE NO. 3."

WHEREAS, The Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, Suffolk County, New York, has caused all matters and things to be done which are required by the Town Law and other statutes made and provided in connection with the repeal of existing Ordinances Nos. 3, 22, 23-A, 8 and 30, known as the "Parking and Traffic Ordinance," the "Traffic Ordinance," the "Vehicle and Traffic Ordinance," the "Removal of Abandoned and Other Vehicles Ordinance," and the "Parking on Second Street Ordinance," respectively, and the adoption of the revised Ordinance No. 3, entitled

"Traffic Control and Parking Ordinance No. 3."

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, That the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead hereby repeals the existing aforesaid Ordinances Nos. 3, 22, 23-A, 8 and 30, and hereby ordains and enacts the following revised "Traffic Control and Parking Ordinance No. 3."

TRAFFIC CONTROL AND PARKING ORDINANCE NO. 3

PREAMBLE: The Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, Suffolk County, New York, pursuant to the New York Vehicle and Traffic Law does enact the following ordinance to regulate traffic and parking on the highways within the limits of the Town of Riverhead.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, as follows:

Section 1. DEFINITIONS.

(a) Vehicle and Traffic Law Applicable: The words and phrases used in this ordinance shall for the purpose of this ordinance have the meanings respectively ascribed to them by Article 1 of the Vehicle and Traffic Law.

respectively ascribed to them by Article 1 of the Vehicle and Traffic Law.

(b) Other Definitions: The following words and phrases which are not defined by Article 1 of the Vehicle and Traffic Law shall have the meanings respectively ascribed to them in this section for the purpose of this ordinance.

- 1) Holidays: New Year's Day, Lincoln's Birthday, Washington's Birthday, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Columbus Day, Election Day, Veteran's Day, Thanksgiving Day, and Christmas Day shall be considered Holidays.
- 2) Curb Line: The prolongation of the lateral line of a curb, or, in the absence of a curb, the lateral boundary line of the roadway.
- 3) Official Time Standard: Whenever certain hours are named herein or on

a traffic control device they shall mean the time standard which is in current use in this state.

4) School Days: School days shall mean days upon which children attend school in the district concerned.

Section 2. TRAFFIC VIOLATIONS BUREAU

For the purpose of assisting the Town Justices of the Town of Riverhead, who are authorized by law to hold Courts of Special Sessions therein for the disposition of offenses relating to traffic and parking, in disposing of the same, said Town Justices are authorized to establish a Traffic Violations Bureau pursuant to Article 14-B of the General Municipal Law. At the date of enactment of this ordinance, this Bureau is functioning under Town Ordinance #19.

Section 3. STOP AND YIELD INTERSECTIONS

(a) Stop Intersections: The following intersections are designated as stop intersections and stop signs shall be erected at such intersections as follows:—

Section 4. PARKING, STANDING AND STOPPING.

(a) Prohibition of Parking: The parking of vehicles is hereby prohibited in the locations as follows:

1. On the West side of Roanoke Avenue, between Main Street (Route 25) and Second Street; and on the east side of Roanoke Avenue from a point 69 feet north of Elton Street to a point 212 feet north of Elton Street; and on the east side of Roanoke Avenue from the south boundary of the right-of-way of the Long Island Rail Road to a point 100 feet south thereof.
2. On the west side of Griffing Avenue between Main Street (Route 25) and Railroad Street.
3. On the south side of Court Street between Main Street (Route 25) and Griffing Avenue.
4. On the east side of Marcy Avenue between Main Street (Route 25) and Pulaski Street.
5. On the north side of Pulaski Street between Marcy Street and Sweezy Avenue during church services at St. Isidore's Church, except funeral services.
6. On both sides of Roanoke Avenue from a point 25 feet north of the north curb line of Northville Turnpike southerly to the Long Island Rail Road line.
7. On both sides of East Avenue between Main Street (Route 25) and Northville Turnpike.
8. On the east side of Maple Avenue between Main Street (Route 25) and Second Street.
9. On the east side of Union Avenue between Main Street (Route 25) and Second Street.
10. On both sides of McDermott Avenue between Main Street (Route 25) and Peconic River.
11. On the north side of Second Street from the east curb line of Roanoke Avenue to its intersection with Ostrander Avenue.
12. On both sides of Pulaski Street immediately adjacent to Stotsky Memorial Park.
13. On the west side of South Jamesport Avenue, South Jamesport, between South Railroad Street and Front Street.
14. On the east side of Hulse Landing Road between North Wading River Road and its northerly terminus.
15. On both sides of Sound Road, between North Country Road and Creek Road.
16. On both sides of Creek Road between Sound Road and its westerly terminus.
17. On the north side of Edwards Avenue from the Southeast corner of the parking field to a point 900 feet in an easterly direction.
18. On the north side of Old Country Road, (Route 58) between Mill Road and a point 250 feet

westerly therefrom; and on the south side of Old Country Road (County Road #58) between Mill Road and a point 300 feet westerly therefrom; and on both sides of Mill Road between a point 100 feet northerly and a point 100 feet southerly of County Road 58.

19. On the south side of North Wading River Road from its intersection with Hulse Landing Road to a point 498 feet west of said intersection; and on the north side of North Wading River Road from a point 246 feet west of Hulse Landing Road to the intersection of Oak Road.

20. On the west side of Osborne Avenue between West Main Street (Route 25) and Court Street.

21. On the east side of Roanoke Avenue from the railroad right-of-way south 60 feet.

22. On the south side of Railroad Street between Roanoke Avenue and Griffing Avenue; and on the north side of Railroad Street to a point 70 feet west.

(b) Prohibition of parking, school days: The parking of vehicles between the hours of 7:30 A.M. and 3:30 P.M. on school days, is hereby prohibited in locations as follows:

1. On the north side of Pulaski Street between Osborne Avenue and Griffing Avenue.

2. On the east side of Osborne Avenue from a point 275 feet north of Pulaski Street to a point 375 feet north of Pulaski Street.

3. On the east side of Osborne Avenue between Harrison Avenue and the Riverhead High School North Driveway.

4. On both sides of Harrison Avenue between Osborne Avenue and School Street.

5. On both sides of North Griffing Avenue and School Street between Pulaski Street and Harrison Avenue.

6. On both sides of St. John's Place between Fifth Street and Northville Turnpike.

7. On the east side of South Jamesport Avenue, Jamesport, along the Jamesport School property.

(c) Prohibition of parking, roads leading to water: The parking of vehicles between the hours of 10:00 P.M. and 6:00 A.M. is hereby prohibited in locations as follows:

1. On both sides of Meeting House Creek Road in the hamlet of Aquabogue, beginning at the Harbor Road intersection and thence southerly to its southerly terminus.

2. On both sides of West Street in the hamlet of South Jamesport, beginning 126 feet south of the Second Street intersection and thence southerly to its southerly terminus.

3. On both sides of South Jamesport Avenue in the hamlet of South Jamesport, beginning at

the Front Street intersection and thence southerly to South Jamesport Avenue's southerly terminus.

4. On both sides of Edwards Avenue in the hamlet of Baiting Hollow, beginning at its northerly terminus and thence south 84 feet.

5. On both sides of Hulse Landing Road in the hamlet of Wading River from its northerly terminus to the turn-around area.

(d) Parking Time Limitations

I. Thirty Minutes: The parking of vehicles for a period of longer than thirty minutes, between the hours of 9:00 A.M. and 5:00 P.M., except on Sundays and holidays, is prohibited in the locations as follows:

On both sides of Second Street, between Roanoke Avenue and Griffing Avenue.

II. One Hour: The parking of vehicles for a period of longer than one hour, between the hours of 9:00 A.M. and 5:00 P.M., except on Sundays and Holidays, is prohibited in the locations as follows:

1. On the South side of Railroad Street, between Griffing Avenue and Osborne Avenue.

2. On both sides of Pulaski Street, between Osborne Avenue and Sweezy Avenue.

(e) Prohibition of Parking, except buses: The parking of vehicles, except buses, is hereby prohibited between the hours of 8:00 A.M. and 5:00 P.M., except on Sundays and holidays, in the locations as follows:

1. On the east side of Roanoke Avenue, commencing 117 feet north of East Main Street (Route 25) and thence northerly to a point 182 feet therefrom.

2. On the north side of East Main Street (Route 25) commencing 188 feet east of Roanoke Avenue and thence easterly to a point 222 feet from the point of beginning.

3. On the south side of East Main Street (Route 25) commencing 207 feet east of Peconic Avenue, (Route 24) and thence easterly to a point 255 feet from the point of beginning.

4. On the north side of West Main Street (Route 25) commencing 96 feet west of Griffing Avenue and thence westerly to a point 146 feet from the point of beginning.

5. On the south side of West Main Street (Route 25) commencing 231 feet west of Peconic Avenue (Route 24) and thence westerly to a point 495 feet from the point of beginning.

6. On the west side of Peconic Avenue (Route 24) beginning at a point 225 feet south of the intersection of Main Street (Route 25) and Peconic Avenue (Route 24) and thence 46 feet south from the point of beginning.

(f) Trailers: No person shall park and leave unattended any trailer on any highway or parking lot of the town, except in designated areas at a Town Boat Ramp where such trailer is of the type used for the carriage of boats. The Town Board may, by resolution, specifically designate trailer parking areas at Town Boat Ramps. No portion of any state highway shall be designated a Town Boat Ramp.

(g) Parking Fields: No person shall park a vehicle in a Town Parking Field except within the designated stalls marked on the surface of the lot. Parking in such fields is entirely at the risk of the owner of the vehicle. The Town Board may, by resolution cause proper stalls to be designated in parking lots.

Section 5. TRAFFIC CONTROL SIGNALS

Pursuant to authority granted by Section 1660 of the Vehicle and Traffic Law, traffic control signals shall be installed, maintained and operated at the following intersections and other locations:

1. Court Street and Osborne Avenue.
2. Osborne Avenue and Pulaski Street.
3. Griffing Avenue and Pulaski Street.
4. Roanoke Avenue and Pulaski Street.
5. Northville Turnpike and Elton Street.
6. South Jamesport Avenue and North Railroad Street.
7. South Jamesport Avenue and South Railroad Street.
8. Roanoke Avenue and Second Street.
9. Entrance to Billy Blake's and Route 58.
10. Entrance to Riverhead Shopping Plaza and Route 58.
11. At any other intersection or location authorized by resolution of the Town Board, but the Town Board may not authorize that any traffic control signal be located on or at an intersection with any State Highway.

Section 6. ONE WAY ROADWAYS

(a) St. John's Place is hereby designated for one way traffic in a Northerly direction between Northville Turnpike and Fifth Street.

(b) Cedar Street is hereby designated for one way traffic in a Northerly direction between Court Street and Railroad Street.

Section 7. REMOVAL AND STORAGE OF VEHICLES

(a) Authority to Impound Vehicles:

1. When any vehicle is parked or abandoned on any highway within this Town during a snow-storm, flood, fire or other public emergency which affects that portion of the public highway upon

RESOLUTION

When any vehicle is found abandoned on any highway within this town where said vehicle constitutes an obstruction to traffic, such vehicle may be removed by the Riverhead Town Police.

When any vehicle is parked or abandoned on any highway within this town where stopping, standing or parking is prohibited, such vehicle may be removed by the Riverhead Town Police.

(b) Storage and Charges: After removal of any vehicle as provided in this section, the Riverhead Town Police may store such vehicle in a suitable place at the expense of the owner. Such owner, or person in charge of such vehicle, may redeem the same upon payment to the Town Clerk of the amount of all expenses actually and necessarily incurred in effecting such removal, such removal charges not to exceed \$10., together with any charges for storage at a rate not to exceed \$2 per day or fraction thereof.

(c) Notice of Removal: The Riverhead Town Police shall without delay record the removal and

disposition of any vehicle removed as provided in this section. It shall be the duty of the Town Police to ascertain, if possible, the owner of the vehicle, or person having charge thereof, and notify him of the removal and disposition, and the amount required to redeem the same.

Section 8. PENALTIES.

(a) Every person convicted of a traffic infraction for a violation of any provision of this ordinance which is a violation of any provision of the Vehicle and Traffic Law of the State of New York, shall, for a first conviction thereof, be punished by a fine of not less than one dollar and not more than fifty dollars or by imprisonment for not more than fifteen days, or by both such fine and imprisonment and shall be deemed a violation; for a second conviction within eighteen months thereafter, such person shall be punished by a fine of not less than one dollar and not more than one hundred dollars or by imprisonment for not more than twenty days, or by both such fine and imprisonment, upon a third or subsequent conviction within eighteen months after the first conviction such person shall be

punished by a fine of not more than two hundred fifty dollars or by imprisonment for not more than thirty days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

(b) The registered owner of any vehicle found to be in violation of the provisions of section 4 of this ordinance respecting parking is liable, together with the actual operator, for any fine or penalty prescribed herein.

Section 9. REPEALER

Town Ordinance No. 3, Adopted June 18, 1963; Town Ordinance No. 22, Adopted March 19, 1963; Town Ordinance No. 23-A, adopted August 5, 1958; Town Ordinance No. 8, Adopted September 2, 1958 and Town Ordinance No. 30 Adopted December 19, 1961, and all amendments thereto, are hereby repealed, but the repeal by this ordinance of any of such ordinances shall not serve to revive any ordinance repealed by any such ordinance, nor shall this repeal affect prosecutions pending on the effective date hereof.

All other ordinances, or parts of ordinances, inconsistent herewith, are repealed, but only to the extent of such inconsistency. It is intended that this ordinance constitute a general ordinance regu-

lating all traffic and parking in the town, and all ordinances or parts of ordinances regulating traffic and parking in the town, other than Town Ordinance No. 13, regulating Parking Meters, and Town Ordinance No. 19, regulating a Traffic Violations Bureau, are hereby repealed, and if the provisions of this ordinance conflict in any particular with the provisions of Town Ordinance No. 13 regulating Parking Meters, then the provisions of this ordinance shall prevail.

Section 10. SEVERABILITY

If any part of this ordinance is declared invalid, such declaration shall not affect the remaining parts.

The adoption of the aforesaid Ordinance, entitled Traffic Control and Parking Ordinance No. 3, shall take effect ten (10) days after such publication and posting.

RESOLUTION

REPEALS EXISTING ORDINANCE NO. 13. ADOPTS REVISED ORDINANCE NO. 13

WHEREAS The Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, Suffolk County, New York, has caused all matters and things to be done which are required by the Town Law and other statutes made and provided in connection with the repeal of the existing Ordinance No. 13, known as the "Parking Meter Ordinance," and the adoption of the revised Ordinance No. 13 entitled "Parking Meter Ordinance."

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, That the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead hereby repeals the existing Ordinance No. 13, known as the "Parking Meter Ordinance," and hereby ordains and enacts the following revised Ordinance No. 13, entitled "Parking Meter Ordinance."

PARKING METER ORDINANCE NO. 13

PREAMBLE. The Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, Suffolk County, New York, pursuant

to the New York Vehicle and Traffic Law, does enact the following ordinance relating to parking meters, parking meter zones, the parking of vehicles, and related subjects.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, as follows:

Section 1. DEFINITIONS

(a) Vehicle and Traffic Law applicable. The words and phrases used in this ordinance shall for the purpose of this ordinance have the meanings respectively ascribed to them by Article 1 of the Vehicle and Traffic Law.

(b) Other Definitions: The following words and phrases which are not defined by Article 1 of the Vehicle and Traffic Law shall have the meanings respectively ascribed to them in this section for the purposes of this ordinance.

1) Holidays: New Year's Day, Lincoln's Birthday, Washington's Birthday, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Columbus Day, Election Day, Veteran's Day, Thanksgiving Day and Christmas Day shall be con-

sidered Holidays.

2) Official Time Standard: Whenever certain hours are named herein or on traffic control devices, signs or parking meters, they shall mean the time standard which is in current use in this state.

3) Parking meter: Any mechanical device or meter operated by coin placed or erected for the regulation and measurement of parking and parking time by authority of this ordinance of any prior ordinance of this town.

4) Parking Meter Zone: Highways or portions thereof designated by this ordinance, or pursuant to authority granted by this ordinance, for the installation and operation of parking meters.

5) Parking Meter Space: Any space within a parking meter zone adjacent to a parking meter which is duly designated for the parking of a single vehicle by lines or marking firmly and durably marked upon the curb or surface of the highway adjacent to such meter.

Section 2. PARKING METER ZONES

(a) Creation of zones: Parking METER ZONES

(a) Creation of zones: Parking meter zones are hereby established on highways, as follows:

1) Both sides of Main Street (Route 25) between its intersection with Osborne Avenue and its intersection with Union Avenue, except where parking, standing or stopping is prohibited by State Traffic Commission orders.

2) Both sides of Peconic Avenue (Route 24) between its intersection with Main Street (Route 25) and the Riverhead-Southampton Town Line.

3) On the east side of Roanoke Avenue between its intersection with Main Street (Route 25) and its intersection with Third Street.

4) On the East side of Griffing Avenue between its intersection with Main Street (Route 25) and its intersection with Railroad Street.

5) On the north side of Court Street between its intersection with Griffing Avenue and its

intersection with Osborne Avenue.

(b) On the west side of Roanoke Avenue between its intersection with Second Street and its intersection with Third Street.

(b) Authority of Town Board: Creation of New Zones:

The Town Board, by resolution, may designate additional parking meter zones or discontinue any such zone or portion thereof. Resolutions hereunder shall be published once in the official town newspaper, and such publication, together with subsequent installation of, or removal of, meters shall constitute public notice thereof.

Section 3. PARKING TIME LIMITS

The parking of vehicles is hereby prohibited for a period of longer than one hour, from 9:00 A.M. to 5:30 P.M., except Sundays and Holidays, in all parking meter zones.

Section 4. HOURS OF METER OPERATION

Parking meters shall be in operation from 9:00 A.M. to 5:30 P.M., except Sundays and Holidays.

Section 5. FEES

A fee of five cents per hour, a portion thereof is hereby established for parking in all parking meter zones.

Section 6. PARKING METERS

(a) General: The Town Board shall be responsible for the purchase, acquisition, installation, operation, maintenance, policing and supervision of parking meters in this town. The Town Board may act by resolution in performing its duties under this section and may, by resolution, delegate such duties to appropriate officers or employees of the town.

(b) Installation: In respect to the installation of parking meters,

1) Pavement markings shall be applied, where practicable, outlining parking meter spaces in all parking meter zones.

2) Parking meters shall be installed immediately adjacent to all parking meter spaces.

3) No parking meter spaces shall be applied at, nor meters installed adjacent to locations where parking, standing or stopping is prohibited by Section 1202 of the Vehicle and Traffic Law, or by this or other ordinance.

4) Each parking meter shall indicate by appropriate legend the legal parking time for its space as established herein; the hours the meter is in operation; the maximum parking time allowed, and days not in operation.

(c) Operation: In respect to the operation of parking meters,

1) Each parking meter shall operate so as to indicate that the appropriate fee has or has not been deposited in such meter, and that the space adjacent to such meter is or is not legally occupied.

2) Each parking meter shall indicate the balance of the parking time for which the fee has been paid, and shall display a signal indicating the expiration of the time period associated with the deposit of fees.

(d) Collections: In respect to the collection of fees deposited in meters, it shall be the duty of the Police Department to make regular collections of such fees and deposit the same as required by law, giving receipts for such deposits to the Supervisor.

Section 7. VIOLATIONS

(a) Specific violations: No person shall

1) Park a vehicle across a parking space pavement marking, or in a position so that it not be entirely within the area designated by such markings; or

2) Park a vehicle in a parking meter space during the hours of parking meter operation without immediately placing the appropriate fee in the adjacent meter.

3) Park a vehicle, or suffer or permit a vehicle of which such person is the owner to remain parked, or suffer or permit a vehicle of which such person is the operator to remain parked, in a parking space of any parking meter zone during the hours of parking meter operation while the adjacent meter is displaying a signal indicating the expiration of time associated with the deposit of fees; or

4) Deposit, or attempt to deposit, any slug or thing other than a United States coin in a parking meter; or

5) Deface, injure, tamper with, open, or wilfully break, destroy or impair the usefulness of any parking meter.

(b) Registered owner liable: The registered owner of any vehicle found to be parked in violation of this ordinance is liable, together with the actual operator, for any fine or penalty prescribed herein.

Section 8. PENALTIES

Every person convicted of a traffic infraction for a violation of any provision of this ordinance which is not a violation of any provision of the Vehicle and Traffic Law of the State of New York shall, for a first conviction thereof, be punished by a fine of not less than one dollar and not more than fifty dollars or by imprisonment for not more than fifteen days, or by both such fine and imprisonment; for a second conviction within eighteen months thereafter, such person shall be punished by a fine of not more than one hundred dollars or by imprisonment for not more than twenty days, or by both such fine and imprisonment; upon a third or subsequent conviction within eighteen months after the first conviction such person shall be

punished by a fine of not more than two hundred fifty dollars or by imprisonment for not more than thirty days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Section 9. ENFORCEMENT: Duties

(a) Generally: It shall be the duty of the Meter Officer of the Town of Riverhead to enforce the provisions of this ordinance, under such procedure as may from time to time be prescribed by resolution of the Town Board.

(b) Violation reports: The Meter Officer shall report to the Town Board all apparent violations of this ordinance, and such report shall include the registration plate number of the vehicle involved, the number or exact location of the parking meter involved, the date and time of the violation, the exact nature of the offense, the name of the operator, if possible, together with other pertinent facts.

(c) Notice to Offenders: An officer noting an apparent violation of this ordinance shall attach to the vehicle parked in violation a notice to that effect in such manner as makes the notice likely to be observed by the owner or operator of the vehicle, instructing the owner or operator to report to the Justice Court with respect to such alleged violation. The Notice shall contain a reference to the offense charged and shall have printed thereon the provisions of subsection (b) of Section 8 of this ordinance.

Section 10—SUSPENSION

The Town Board may by resolution suspend the operation of parking meters on any day or days.

Section 11—REPEALER

Town Ordinance No. 13 adopted April 7, 1948, and amended September 21, 1949 and December 9, 1960, with all amendments thereto, is hereby repealed, but this repeal shall not affect prosecutions pending on the effective date hereof.

All other ordinances, or parts of ordinances, inconsistent with this ordinance are repealed, but only to the extent of such inconsistency. It is intended that this ordinance shall constitute a general ordinance pertaining to parking meters in parking meter zones, and that specific ordinances regulating parking in such zones, shall have precedence over this ordinance.

Section 12—PARTIAL INVALIDITY

If any part of this ordinance is declared invalid, such declaration shall not affect the remaining parts.

The adoption of the aforesaid Parking Meter Ordinance No. 13, shall take effect ten (10) days after such publication and posting.

NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING
PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that pursuant to Section 130 of the New York Town Law a Public Hearing will be held by the Riverview Town Board at the Town Hall, 220 Roanoke Avenue, Riverview, Suffolk County, New York, on the 2nd day of April, 1968, at 11:30 a.m. on the following proposals to repeal the existing Ordinance No. 7, entitled "Peddlers' Ordinance", and to adopt a revised Ordinance No. 7, entitled "Ordinance Regulating Peddlers and Solicitors", which provides as follows:

ORDINANCE NO. 7
AN ORDINANCE REGULATING PEDDLERS AND SOLICITORS AND PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF, repealing existing Ordinance No. 7.

SECTION 1. DEFINITIONS: As used herein, the following words shall have the following meanings:

(a) Peddler: The term "peddler" shall mean and include any person, whether as owner, agent, salesman, consignee or employee, who goes from house to house, or from place to place, or from street to street, conveying or transporting goods, wares or merchandise and offering or exposing the same for sale, or making sales and delivering the articles sold to purchasers, or who without traveling from house to house, place to place or street to street offers goods, wares or merchandise for sale from any place not a permanent building.

The term "Peddler" shall not be construed to include vendors of milk, bakery products, groceries, ice, coal, oil or gas who distribute their products to regular customers on established routes.

(b) Solicitor: The term "solicitor" shall mean and include any person, whether as owner, agent, salesman, consignee or employee, who travels from house to house or from place to place, or from street to street, talking or attempting to take orders for the sale of goods, wares, merchandise, or other personal property, for future delivery, or for services to be furnished or performed in the future, by himself or others. The term "solicitor" shall also include any person who uses or occupies

any building, structure, room, shop, conveyance or other place, other than a permanent, regularly established store building, for the purpose of exhibiting samples and taking orders for future delivery.

SECTION 2. EXEMPTIONS:

(a) The terms "solicitor" or "peddler" shall not be deemed to include selling or soliciting orders for the sale of personal property at wholesale to dealers in such articles, nor to newsboys, nor to the acts of merchants or their employees in delivering goods in the regular course of business, nor shall this ordinance apply to any farmer or truck gardener who shall sell or offer to sell the products of the farm or garden occurred and cultivated by him, unless other goods not products not of his own farm or garden are also sold or offered for sale.

Nothing herein shall be deemed to affect any sale required by law or order of any court, nor to any bona fide auction sale pursuant to law or court order.

(b) Any person representing any organization, society, association or corporation which desires to solicit or have solicited in its name money, donations of money or of property, or financial assistance of any kind, or desiring to sell or distribute any item of literature or merchandise, including advertising space in a journal, for which a fee is charged or solicited from persons other than members of such organization, upon the streets, in office or business buildings, or by house to house canvass, or in public places, for bona fide charitable, religious, patriotic or philanthropic purposes shall not be required to pay any fee to obtain a license hereunder, provided application to the Town Clerk for such license is made in proper form, together with proof satisfactory to the Town Clerk that such organization is a bona fide charitable, religious, patriotic or philanthropic organization and that the applicant is a bona fide representative thereof.

(c) Any honorably discharged veteran of the Armed Forces of the United States, holding a license pursuant to section 32 of the General Business Law must file a further application with the Town Clerk as required for other

peddlers and solicitors, but no fee for such license shall be required, except that if any conveyance not owned by the veteran shall be charged at the usual fee.

SECTION 3. APPLICATION FOR LICENSE

Applicants for a license hereunder must file with the Town Clerk a sworn application, on a form to be provided by the Town Clerk, giving the following information, and such other information as the Town Clerk shall deem necessary for the proper administration of this ordinance:

1. Name of applicant.
2. Applicant's full street and mailing home and business address and telephone number, and to which notice hereunder shall be given.
3. Name and permanent address of applicants employer, or other firm for whom the peddling or solicitation is to be carried on.
4. A brief description of the nature of the business and of the product or service sought to be peddled or solicited.
5. If farm products are to be peddled, whether such products are grown by applicant; and if not, by whom, or the source of supply.
6. The length of time for which the license is sought.
7. The description, including registration number, of any vehicle to be used.
8. A statement whether the applicant has ever been convicted of any crime, and if so, the nature thereof, the date of conviction, the court in which convicted and the penalty therefor.
9. A statement whether the applicant has ever been convicted of any violation of this ordinance, or of the ordinance or statute of any other jurisdiction regulating the matters covered hereby, and if so, full details of such conviction, and the penalty imposed.

SECTION 4. ISSUANCE OF LICENSE

Upon receipt of the application required by Section 3 of this ordinance, duly sworn, and upon payment of the appropriate fee required herein, the Town Clerk shall forthwith issue a Peddler's or Solicitor's License, as the case may be. Such license shall contain the information set forth in response to sub-paragraphs 1 thru 7, in-

clusive, of Section 3 hereof, and shall state the period for which issued and the expiration date thereof. Such license shall have affixed at the time of issue a clear photograph of applicant supplied by him.

In no event shall the Town Clerk issue a license to any applicant where the application sets forth facts sufficient to constitute grounds for revocation of such license as hereinafter set forth, unless by order of the Town Board.

SECTION 5. LICENSE REQUIRED

It shall be a violation of this ordinance for any person to act as a peddler or solicitor without first obtaining the license required by this ordinance.

SECTION 6. REVOCATION OF LICENSES

Licenses issued hereunder may be revoked by the Town Board, after Public Hearing and opportunity to be heard, on the following grounds:

1. Fraud, misrepresentation or incorrect statement contained in the application.
 2. Conviction of any crime, or violation hereof.
 3. Conducting the business or peddling or soliciting in an unlawful manner, or in such a manner as to constitute a breach of the peace, or to constitute a menace to the health, safety or general welfare.
 4. The commission of any act, or the making of any statement or representation in the course of business as a solicitor or peddler, which misleads or tends to mislead the person to whom the statement or representation is made as to the nature or quality of the goods sold or offered for sale, or the terms of the agreement to sell, or as to any material element of the sale or offer to sell.
- In the event of the actual conviction by the licensee of any crime or violation hereof, such license shall be suspended pending hearing before the board.

Notice of any hearing hereunder shall be given the licensee by mailing at least two days prior to the date for hearing notice thereof to the address designated by him for that purpose in his application.

No person whose license has been revoked hereunder shall make further application for another license for at least 6 months

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from the date of such revocation.

Section 7. FEES

The license fees payable by each applicant, are as follows:
For each unit, truck, vehicle or conveyance carrying goods, wares or merchandise; or for each peddler:

Per year	\$100.00
Per six months	75.00
Per three months	50.00
For each solicitor,	
Per year	\$ 75.00
Per six months	50.00
Per three months	25.00

Annual license issued hereunder expire at midnite December 31st of the year within which they were issued. Other license expire as specified on the license.

Section 8. LICENSE NOT TO BE USED BY ANOTHER

No license hereunder shall be used by any person other than the person to whom issued. Peddlers and Solicitors are required to exhibit their licenses at the request of any citizen. Failure to exhibit such license shall constitute presumptive evidence that such person is not duly licensed hereunder.

Section 9. OTHER PROHIBITIONS

1) No person shall solicit or peddle at any premises posted with a clearly visible sign reading "No Peddlers" or "No Solicitors," or similar words to the same intent.

2) No person shall shout, cry out, blow a horn, ring a bell or use any sound amplifying device on the streets or public places in the Town, or on private property where sounds can be heard in the public places, for the purpose of attracting attention to goods, wares or merchandise offered for sale.

3) No person shall have any exclusive right to any location in any public place to operate as a peddler or solicitor, nor to, operate where such operation causes or tends to cause public congestion or inconvenience. The judgment of a police officer as to whether the public is congested or inconvenienced shall be presumed accurate. No person shall continue to peddle or solicit in a place after a police officer has told him that his operation is

causing congestion or public inconvenience.

4) No person shall stand in or use any street for the purpose of soliciting from or selling to the occupants of any vehicle.

5) No person, firm or corporation shall, by himself or by agent or employee, solicit orders for the sale of goods from any person within the Town of Riverhead by telephone, nor shall any person sell any goods or services to any person within the Town of Riverhead where the order therefor was given in a telephone conversation initiated by the seller.

Section 10. PENALTIES

1) Nothing contained in this ordinance shall be deemed to affect the validity of any sale or agreement to sell, effected in violation hereof, but persons violating this ordinance shall be subjected solely to the penalties provided herein.

2) Any person violating any provision of this ordinance shall be guilty of a violation and upon conviction shall be punished by a fine not exceeding \$50 or by imprisonment

not exceeding 15 days, or both such fine and imprisonment.

Section 11. SEVERABILITY OF PROVISIONS

If any part of this ordinance be declared invalid, such declaration shall not affect the remaining parts.

Section 12. REPEALER

Prior ordinance No. 7, entitled "peddler's Ordinance", adopted October 16, 1956, as amended, is hereby repealed.

Section 13. EFFECTIVE DATE

This ordinance shall take effect upon publication and posting as required by law.

Any person desiring to be heard on the proposal to repeal the existing Ordinance No. 7, entitled "Ordinance Regulating Peddlers and Solicitors", shall appear at the time and place above specified.
