

MINUTES OF A MEETING OF THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD HELD IN THE TOWN HALL ON TUESDAY, MARCH 17, 1959 AT 9:30 A.M.

MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE TOWN BOARD HELD ON MARCH 3, 1959, WERE SUBMITTED TO THE BOARD AND ON MOTION MADE BY COUNCILMAN BENEDICT AND SECONDED BY COUNCILMAN STOTZKY, IT WAS RESOLVED THAT THE MINUTES BE APPROVED AS SUBMITTED. THE VOTE---COUNCILMAN STOTZKY, YES, COUNCILMAN BENEDICT, YES, JUSTICE PIKE, YES, JUSTICE ZALOGA, YES AND SUPERVISOR LEONARD, YES. THE RESOLUTION WAS THEREUPON DECLARED DULY ADOPTED.

MR. PETER SILVA, RIVERHEAD, N.Y., APPEARED BEFORE THE BOARD IN PROTEST TO THE PROPOSED PURCHASE OF THE WOODSON PARCEL ON PARKWAY STREET AS A DRAINAGE AREA. HE STATED THAT THIS PARCEL WAS TOO LARGE FOR THE AMOUNT OF WATER THAT WOULD BE DRAINED INTO IT, AND THAT THERE WAS A POSSIBILITY THAT ADJACENT CELLARS WOULD BE FLOODED BY THE ACCUMULATION OF WATER IN THIS DRAINAGE AREA. HE FURTHER STATED THAT THE CONSTRUCTION OF A 6' X 8' CATCH BASIN WOULD BE SUFFICIENT TO TAKE CARE OF THE WATER THAT ACCUMULATED ON PARKWAY STREET AT THIS LOCATION.

THE BOARD THANKED MR. SILVA FOR HIS INTEREST IN THIS MATTER AND THE MATTER WAS REFERRED TO ALDEN YOUNG, ENGINEER AND JACOB HARDING, TOWN ATTORNEY.

SUPERVISOR'S REPORT FOR THE MONTH OF FEBRUARY, 1959 WAS SUBMITTED TO THE BOARD AND ORDERED PLACED ON FILE.

JUSTICE ZALOGA PRESENTED COPIES OF SPECIFICATIONS AND PLANS FOR THE PROPOSED POLICE LOCK-UP TO BE SITUATE IN THE SUFFOLK COUNTY NATIONAL BANK BUILDING ON MAIN STREET, AS PREPARED BY CHARLES A. WOOD, WADING RIVER. HE WAS DIRECTED TO FORWARD A COPY OF THESE SPECIFICATIONS AND PLANS TO THE STATE OF NEW YORK, STATE COMMISSION OF CORRECTION FOR ITS APPROVAL.

A LETTER FROM MRS. KATHRYN M. MCCOLLOM, WAS READ TO THE BOARD AS FOLLOWS:

"ON AND AFTER MAY 1, 1959, THE RENTAL OF MY PROPERTY, USED BY RIVERHEAD TOWN FOR PARKING PURPOSES SHALL BE INCREASED TO \$35 PER MONTH. IF THE TOWN WISHES TO BUY THIS PROPERTY AND THE PROPERTY ADJOURNING WITH THE BUILDING, COST WILL BE \$15,000." END.

MATTER TABLED UNTIL NEXT MEETING.

COUNCILMAN BENEDICT OFFERED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WHICH WAS SECONDED BY JUSTICE PIKE.

RESOLVED THAT THE BID FOR APPROXIMATELY 592' OF SIX FOOT (6') HIGH CHAIN LINK FENCE INCLUDING TWO 16' DOUBLE DRIVE GATES, TO BE INSTALLED AT THE TOWN HIGHWAY GARAGE, BE AND IT IS HEREBY AWARDED TO ANVIL BELL FENCE COMPANY, INC., 192 WAVERLY AVENUE, PATCHOGUE, N.Y., FENCE TO BE INSTALLED WITH THREE ROWS OF BARBED WIRE AT \$2.56½ PER LINEAL FOOT AS PER THEIR BID AND SPECIFICATION FORM SUBMITTED DATED MARCH 16, 1959.

THE VOTE---COUNCILMAN STOTZKY, YES, COUNCILMAN BENEDICT, YES, JUSTICE PIKE, YES, JUSTICE ZALOGA, YES, AND SUPERVISOR LEONARD, YES. THE RESOLUTION WAS THERE UPON DECLARED DULY ADOPTED.

A LETTER DATED MARCH 5, 1959 FROM THE SUFFOLK COUNTY NATIONAL BANK WAS READ TO THE BOARD AS FOLLOWS:

"THANK YOU VERY MUCH FOR YOUR LETTER OF THE 3RD REGARDING THE RENTAL OF THE EASTERLY OFFICE IN OUR OLD BANK BUILDING TO THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD FOR THEIR POLICE HEADQUARTERS. I HAVE TAKEN THIS MATTER UP WITH OUR BUILDING COMMITTEE AND THEY HAVE AUTHORIZED ME TO INFORM YOU THAT WE WILL HOLD THE OFFICE OPEN FOR A PERIOD OF 60 DAYS. AS MENTIONED TO YOUR COMMITTEE, THE RENTAL IF \$300.00 PER MONTH AND IT IS AGREEABLE TO US TO FINANCE THE COST OF ANY NECESSARY REPAIRS AND AMORTIZE THE AMOUNT OVER A PERIOD OF FIVE YEARS." END.
LETTER ORDERED FILED.

A LETTER FROM THE STATE TRAFFIC COMMISSION DATED MARCH 3, 1959 RELATIVE TO THE USE OF PORTABLE SCHOOL SIGNS AT THE AQUEBOGUE SCHOOL WAS READ TO THE BOARD AND ORDERED FILED.

A LETTER DATED MARCH 11, 1959 FROM THE LONG ISLAND LIGHTING COMPANY WAS READ TO THE BOARD RELATIVE TO THE RENEWAL OF THE STREET LIGHTING CONTRACT FOR THE LAUREL LIGHTING DISTRICT.

LETTER ORDERED FILED.

COUNCILMAN BENEDICT OFFERED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WHICH WAS SECONDED BY COUNCILMAN STOTZKY.

RESOLVED THAT A RENEWAL STREET LIGHTING CONTRACT BE EXECUTED BY THIS BOARD WITH THE LONG ISLAND LIGHTING COMPANY FOR LAUREL LIGHTING DISTRICT, ACCORDING TO SERVICE CLASSIFICATION No. 8, TO BECOME EFFECTIVE MAY 18, 1959.

THE VOTE---COUNCILMAN STOTZKY, YES, COUNCILMAN BENEDICT, YES, JUSTICE PIKE, YES, JUSTICE ZALOGA, YES, AND SUPERVISOR LEONARD, YES. THE RESOLUTION WAS THEREUPON DECLARED DULY ADOPTED.

COUNCILMAN BENEDICT OFFERED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WHICH WAS SECONDED BY JUSTICE PIKE.

WHEREAS BIDS WERE RECEIVED AND OPENED ON MARCH 3, 1959 FOR DIESEL OIL REQUIREMENTS FOR THE YEAR 1959, FOR USE BY THE TOWN HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT, AND

WHEREAS IT HAS BEEN DETERMINED THAT THE TUTHILL PETROLEUM Co., CALVERTON, N.Y., IS THE LOW BIDDER,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT THE BID FOR DIESEL OIL REQUIREMENTS FOR THE YEAR 1959, FOR USE OF THE TOWN HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT BE AND IT IS HEREBY AWARDED TO TUTHILL PETROLEUM COMPANY, CALVERTON, N.Y., AT A PRICE OF \$14.4 CENTS PER GALLON SUBJECT TO RISE OR DECLINE OF POSTED MARKET PRICE IN THIS AREA, FURTHER SUBJECT TO THEIR SPECIFICATION AND BID FORM SUBMITTED DATED MARCH 2, 1959.

THE VOTE---COUNCILMAN STOTZKY, YES, COUNCILMAN BENEDICT, YES, JUSTICE PIKE, YES, JUSTICE ZALOGA, YES, AND SUPERVISOR LEONARD, YES. THE RESOLUTION WAS THEREUPON DECLARED DULY ADOPTED.

A LETTER DATED FEBRUARY 27, 1959 FROM THE LONG ISLAND LIGHTING COMPANY WAS READ TO THE BOARD ADVISING THAT THEY HAVE INSTALLED IMPROVED STREET LIGHTING ON ROANOKE AVENUE IN THE RIVERHEAD LIGHT DISTRICT, AS PER THE REQUEST OF THE BOARD.

LETTER ORDERED FILED.

A LETTER DATED MARCH 11, 1959 FROM THE LONG ISLAND LIGHTING COMPANY WAS READ TO THE BOARD ADVISING THAT THEY HAVE INSTALLED IMPROVED STREET LIGHTING ON MANOR LANE IN THE JAMESPORT LIGHT DISTRICT, AS PER REQUEST OF THE BOARD.

LETTER ORDERED FILED.

MRS. MILES FAIRLEY, CHAIRMAN OF THE RIVERHEAD TOWN YOUTH COMMISSION, APPEARED BEFORE THE BOARD AND SUBMITTED THE FOLLOWING LETTER:

"THE RIVERHEAD TOWN YOUTH COMMISSION AFTER SCREENING SOME THIRTY APPLICATIONS AND PERSONALLY INTERVIEWING SIX OF THE CANDIDATES WHO SEEMED BEST QUALIFIED FOR RECREATION DIRECTOR OF THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD RECOMMEND THE APPOINTMENT OF MR. CHARLES S. BAYER, 506 DECATUR AVENUE, PEEKSKILL, NEW YORK.

WE FURTHER RECOMMEND THAT MR. BAYER BE OFFERED A CONTRACT TO EXPIRE NOT EARLIER THAN DECEMBER 31, 1960, AT THE RATE OF \$6,000 PER YEAR, PLUS AN ADDITIONAL CAR ALLOWANCE AT THE RATE OF \$500 PER YEAR."

LETTER ORDERED FILED.

IT WAS THE CONSENSUS OF THE BOARD THAT THEY MEET WITH MR. BAYER BEFORE ACTING ON THIS RECOMMENDATION OF THE YOUTH COMMISSION AND BEFORE ANY APPOINTMENT IS MADE.

COUNCILMAN BENEDICT OFFERED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WHICH WAS SECONDED BY COUNCILMAN STOTZKY.

RESOLVED THAT THE APPLICATION OF DR. FRANCIS E. MENENDEZ AND DR. JOHN PFLUM, OF 956-960 ROANOKE AVENUE, RIVERHEAD, N.Y., FOR THE INSTALLATION OF CURBS AND GUTTERS AT ROANOKE AVENUE (956-960), BE AND IT IS HEREBY APPROVED.

FURTHER RESOLVED THAT THE SUPERINTENDENT OF HIGHWAYS BE AUTHORIZED TO INSTALL THESE CURBS AND GUTTERS SUBJECT TO THE RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE INSTALLATION OF CURBS AND GUTTERS AS ADOPTED ON JUNE 11, 1957.

THE VOTE---COUNCILMAN BENEDICT, YES, COUNCILMAN STOTZKY, YES, JUSTICE PIKE, YES, JUSTICE ZALOGA, YES, AND SUPERVISOR LEONARD, YES. THE RESOLUTION WAS THEREUPON DECLARED DULY ADOPTED.

LEONARD GRIFFING, TOWN BUILDING INSPECTOR, REPORTED THAT HE WAS MAKING PRELIMINARY STUDIES AND SURVEYS IN CERTAIN AREAS IN THE TOWN AND WAS GOING TO PREPARE INSPECTION BLANKS AS AN AID IN HIS WORK.

A LETTER DATED MARCH 16, 1959 FROM THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD ZONING COMMISSION WAS READ TO THE BOARD AS FOLLOWS:

"WHEREAS, THIS COMMISSION WAS APPOINTED BY THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD ON DECEMBER 17, 1957, IN ACCORDANCE WITH SECTION 266 OF THE TOWN LAW TO RECOMMEND THE BOUNDARIES OF THE VARIOUS ORIGINAL ZONING USE DISTRICTS AND APPROPRIATE REGULATIONS TO BE ENFORCED THEREIN, AND

WHEREAS, THIS COMMISSION HAS MADE A COMPREHENSIVE STUDY SINCE THAT DATE BY HOLDING MANY MEETINGS FOR CONSIDERATION AND DISCUSSION OF THE MANY VARIOUS PHASES OF REGULATIONS CONTAINED IN A ZONING ORDINANCE, AND

WHEREAS, THIS COMMISSION DID HOLD PUBLIC HEARINGS AS FOLLOWS: JANUARY 21, 1959, AT WADING RIVER SCHOOL, JANUARY 28, 1959, AT JAMESPORT FIREHOUSE, FEBRUARY 4, 1959, AT RIVERHEAD ELEMENTARY SCHOOL, AND

WHEREAS, THIS COMMISSION HAS REVIEWED CRITICISMS ADVANCED AT AFORESAID HEARINGS AND HAS REVIEWED CRITICISMS IN LETTERS RECEIVED PRIOR TO FEBRUARY 17, 1959, AND

WHEREAS, THIS COMMISSION HAS NEW PREPARED A FINAL REPORT DESIGNATED "PROPOSED ZONING ORDINANCE" AND "ZONING MAP" FOR THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD, SUFFOLK COUNTY, NEW YORK, DATED MARCH 11, 1959, AND

WHEREAS, THIS COMMISSION BELIEVES THAT THIS COMPREHENSIVE PLAN WILL PROMOTE THE HEALTH, SAFETY, MORALS AND GENERAL WELFARE OF THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT THE AFORESAID "PROPOSED ZONING ORDINANCE" AND "ZONING MAP" FOR THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD, SUFFOLK COUNTY, NEW YORK, DATED MARCH 11, 1959, BE THE FINAL REPORT OF THIS COMMISSION, AND

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT THE CLERK OF THIS COMMISSION FORWARD A COPY OF THE PROPOSED ZONING ORDINANCE AND ZONING MAP, TOGETHER WITH THE MINUTES OF THE MEETINGS, MINUTES OF THE PUBLIC HEARINGS, LETTERS RECEIVED AND A COPY OF THIS RESOLUTION TO THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD."

THIS LETTER, THE FINAL REPORT OF THE ZONING COMMISSION INCLUDING THE "PROPOSED ZONING ORDINANCE", DATED MARCH 11, 1959, THE "ZONING MAP", DATED MARCH 11, 1959 AND OTHER NOTICES, MINUTES AND CORRESPONDENCE RELATIVE THERETO WAS ORDERED FILED THIS DAY BY THE TOWN CLERK IN THE TOWN CLERK'S OFFICE, SAID FINAL REPORT HAVING BEEN RECEIVED BY THE TOWN BOARD.

A PETITION SIGNED BY 17 RESIDENTS OF THE TOWN IN SUPPORT OF ZONING WAS SUBMITTED TO THE BOARD AND ORDERED PLACED ON FILE.

ATTORNEY ROBERT L. TOOKER, APPEARED BEFORE THE BOARD AND PRESENTED A PETITION SIGNED BY 57 PROFESSIONAL MEN AND CLERGYMEN OF THE TOWN. THE HEADING ON THE PETITION WAS AS FOLLOWS:

"THE UNDERSIGNED APPROVE, AND REQUEST THE ENACTMENT BY THE RIVERHEAD TOWN BOARD, OF THE ZONING ORDINANCE RECOMMENDED BY THE RIVERHEAD TOWN ZONING COMMISSION." END.

PETITION ORDERED FILED.

ATTORNEY TOOKER STATED THAT HE HAD CIRCULATED THIS PETITION. HE HAD INTERVIEWED 72 PROFESSIONAL MEN AND CLERGYMEN AND 57 SIGNED IT. OTHERS, HE SAID, GAVE REASONS WHY THEY DID NOT DESIRE TO SIGN THE PETITION, BUT ALL INDICATED THEY FAVORED ZONING.

ATTORNEY TOOKER FURTHER STATED THAT THE TOWN BOARD COULD NOW DO ONE OF THREE THINGS. (1) REJECT THE ZONING ORDINANCE AS PRESENTED BY THE ZONING COMMISSION, (2) FUMBLE WITH IT OR (3) ADOPT THE ZONING ORDINANCE AND GIVE DIRECTION TO THE GROWTH OF THIS COMMUNITY. HE EXPRESSED HOPE THAT IT WOULD RECEIVE FAVORABLE ACTION BY THE BOARD.

ATTORNEY THOMAS M. STARK APPEARED BEFORE THE BOARD AND STATED THAT HE ENDORSED THE REMARKS OF ATTORNEY TOOKER.

MRS. ROBERT TORMEY, VICE CHAIRMAN OF THE ZONING COMMISSION APPEARED BEFORE THE BOARD AND STATED THAT THE COMMISSION HAS WORKED HARD TO PRESENT A SUITABLE ORDINANCE. WE URGE THE TOWN BOARD TO GIVE SERIOUS CONSIDERATION TO THIS ORDINANCE AND ADOPT IT. SHE FURTHER STATED THAT SHE PERSONALLY WISHED TO THANK ALDEN YOUNG, FOR IT WAS DUE TO HIS KNOWLEDGE AND EFFORTS THAT THE PROPOSED ZONING ORDINANCE WAS PREPARED AND PRESENTED TO THE BOARD.

REV. HERBERT B. PERRY, JR., APPEARED BEFORE THE BOARD AND STATED THAT HE HAD CIRCULATED THE PETITION FAVORING ZONING AMONGST THE CLERGYMEN IN THE TOWN AND THAT HE MET WITH NO OPPOSITION.

JUSTICE PIKE OFFERED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WHICH WAS SECONDED BY JUSTICE ZALOGA.

WHEREAS, A ZONING COMMISSION WAS APPOINTED ON DECEMBER 17, 1957 FOR THE PURPOSE OF DRAWING UP A PROPOSED ZONING ORDINANCE AND PROPOSED ZONING MAP FOR THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD, AND

WHEREAS, SAID COMMISSION HAS WORKED SERIOUSLY AND CONSCIENTIOUSLY ON SAID PROPOSAL AND HAS DEVOTED MANY HOURS OF WORK TO THIS PROJECT AND HAS ON THIS DAY PRESENTED TO THE TOWN A PROPOSED ZONING ORDINANCE AND PROPOSED ZONING MAP,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, THAT THE TOWN BOARD EXPRESSES ITS APPRECIATION TO EACH OF THE MEMBERS OF SAID COMMISSION FOR HIS SERVICE TO THE COMMUNITY, FOR HIS PUBLIC SPIRITED APPROACH TO THE PROBLEM WHICH WAS PRESENTED TO HIM, AND FOR HIS CONSCIENTIOUS EFFORT TO RESOLVE THE SAME, AND

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT A COPY OF THIS RESOLUTION BE SENT TO EACH MEMBER OF SUCH COMMISSION.

THE VOTE---COUNCILMAN STOTZKY, YES, COUNCILMAN BENEDICT, YES, JUSTICE PIKE, YES, JUSTICE ZALOGA, YES, AND SUPERVISOR LEONARD, YES. THE RESOLUTION WAS THEREUPON DECLARED DULY ADOPTED.

JUSTICE PIKE STATED THAT HE WAS GOING TO OFFER NEXT A RESOLUTION CALLING FOR A PUBLIC HEARING ON THE PROPOSED ZONING ORDINANCE. HE STATED THAT HE WAS DOING SO WITH ENTHUSIASM. HE EXPLAINED THAT WHEN HE SPONSORED THE RESOLUTION IN DECEMBER OF 1957, FOR THE APPOINTMENT OF THE RIVERHEAD TOWN ZONING COMMISSION TO DRAFT A PROPOSED ZONING ORDINANCE, THE RESOLUTION WAS SECONDED BY ATTORNEY THOMAS M. STARK, REPUBLICAN, WHO WAS THEN SERVING ON THE TOWN BOARD AS A JUSTICE OF THE PEACE.

JUSTICE PIKE FURTHER STATED THAT IT WAS HIS DESIRE TO KEEP POLITICS OUT OF THE ZONING PROPOSITION AND REQUESTED COUNCILMAN STOTZKY, THE LONE REPUBLICAN MEMBER OF THE BOARD, TO SECOND THE MOTION CALLING FOR THE PUBLIC HEARING ON THE PROPOSED ZONING ORDINANCE. I BELIEVE, SAID JUSTICE PIKE, THAT EACH AND EVERY MEMBER OF THE TOWN BOARD DESIRES AND WISHES THAT THE PROPOSED ZONING ORDINANCE BE ADOPTED.

COUNCILMAN STOTZKY ASKED TO SEE THE SAID RESOLUTION AND AFTER READING IT, HE SAID HE WOULD SECOND IT.

JUSTICE PIKE OFFERED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WHICH WAS SECONDED BY COUNCILMAN STOTZKY.

WHEREAS THE TOWN BOARD DID, ON THE 17TH DAY OF DECEMBER, 1957, APPOINT A COMMISSION TO BE KNOWN AS THE "RIVERHEAD TOWN COMMISSION" TO RECOMMEND THE BOUNDARIES OF THE VARIOUS ORIGINAL ZONING DISTRICTS AND APPROPRIATE REGULATIONS TO BE ENFORCED THEREIN, AND

WHEREAS SAID RIVERHEAD ZONING COMMISSION DID MAKE A PRELIMINARY REPORT AND HOLD PUBLIC HEARINGS THEREON BEFORE SUBMITTING ITS FINAL REPORT, AND
