MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE TOWN BOARD HELD ON APRIL 7, 1959,
WERE SUBMITTED TO THE TOWN BOARD AND ON MOTION MADE BY COUNCILMAN
BENEDICT AND SECONDED BY COUNCILMAN STOTZKY, IT WAS RESOLVED THAT
THE MINUTES BE APPROVED AS SUBMITTED. THE VOTE---COUNCILMAN STOTZKY,
YES, COUNCILMAN BENEDICT, YES, JUSTICE PIKE, YES, JUSTICE ZALOGA, YES,
AND SUPERVISOR LEONARD, YES. THE RESOLUTION WAS THEREUPON DECLARED
DULY ADOPTED.

MR. THOMAS BARCIA OF CALVERTON APPEARED BEFORE THE BOARD TO REQUEST
PERMISSION TO SET UP A REFRESHMENT STAND AT CAMP GRANT, BAITING HOLLOW.
MATTER REFERRED TO THE BEACH COMMITTEE.

SUPERVISOR'S REPORT FOR THE MONTH OF MARCH 1959 WERE SUBMITTED TO
THE BOARD AND ORDERED PLACED ON FILE.

TAX RECEIVER'S REPORT DATED APRIL 16, 1959 WAS SUBMITTED TO THE
BOARD AND ORDERED PLACED ON FILE.

A LETTER DATED APRIL 15, 1959, WITH SURVEY MAPS ATTACHED, FROM
MRS. KATHRYN M. MCCOLLOM, WAS READ TO THE BOARD RELATIVE TO HER
REQUEST FOR AN INCREASE IN RENTAL FOR THE PUBLIC PARKING FIELD SHE
RENTS TO THE TOWN, AND ALSO CONTAINING A DESCRIPTION OF THE PARCEL
SHE OFFERED TO SELL TO THE TOWN FOR \$15,000.

IT WAS THE CONSENSUS OF THE BOARD THAT THEY WERE NOT INTERESTED IN
PURCHASING THE PARCEL OFFERED BY MRS. MCCOLLOM.

AFTER FURTHER DISCUSSION, COUNCILMAN STOTZKY OFFERED THE FOLLOWING
RESOLUTION WHICH WAS SECONDED BY JUSTICE ZALOGA.

RESOLVED, THAT THE TOWN BOARD OFFER TO PAY FOR RENTAL OF THE PARK-
ING FIELD NOW RENTED FROM MRS. KATHRYN M. MCCOLLOM, THE SUM OF \$25.00
PER MONTH AS OF MAY 1, 1959.

THE VOTE---COUNCILMAN STOTZKY, YES, COUNCILMAN BENEDICT, YES,
JUSTICE PIKE, YES, JUSTICE ZALOGA, YES, AND SUPERVISOR LEONARD, YES.
THE RESOLUTION WAS THEREUPON DECLARED DULY ADOPTED.

A COMMUNICATION DATED APRIL 13, 1959 SIGNED BY NINE RESIDENTS OF
SOUTH JAMESPORT WAS SUBMITTED TO THE BOARD, REQUESTING THAT THE STREET
TO BE USED FOR THE UNLOADING AND LAUNCHING OF OUTBOARD BOATS BE

CHANGED FROM WILLOW STREET TO WEST STREET IN SOUTH JAMESPORT.
LETTER ORDERED FILED AND MATTER REFERRED TO JUSTICE PIKE.

A COMMUNICATION FAVORING THE PASSAGE OF THE PROPOSED ZONING ORDINANCE WAS READ FROM HENRY REPPA AND GERTRUDE K. REPPA OF WADING RIVER, N.Y., AND ORDERED PLACED ON FILE.

A COMMUNICATION FROM GIDEON STIVERS OPPOSING THE PROPOSED ZONING REGULATIONS WAS READ AND ORDERED PLACED ON FILE.

ATTORNEY SYRENA H. STACKPOLE APPEARED BEFORE THE BOARD AND EXPRESSED HER VIEWS IN FAVOR OF THE PROPOSED ZONING ORDINANCE.

MR. WICKHAM TYTE APPEARED BEFORE THE BOARD STATING THAT IN HIS OPINION IT WOULD BE MORE FEASIBLE FOR THE BOARD TO DEFER DECISION ON THE PROPOSED ZONING ORDINANCE UNTIL SUCH TIME WHEN A TOWN-WIDE POLL ON THE QUESTION CAN BE MADE.

MR. DAVID SQUIRES APPEARED BEFORE THE BOARD AND VOICED HIS OBJECTIONS TO THE MEASUREMENTS FOR PLACING OF ADVERTISING SIGNS AS PRESENTLY DEFINED IN THE PROPOSED ZONING ORDINANCE. HE SUGGESTED THAT THE HEIGHT OF THE BOTTOM OF THE SIGN FROM THE GROUND BE CHANGED FROM 4' TO $2\frac{1}{2}$ '. THE BOARD DECIDED TO CONSIDER THIS REQUEST.

MR. GEORGE SCHMELZER PROTESTED THE RESTRICTIONS AS OUTLINED IN THE PROPOSED ZONING ORDINANCE.

MR. ROBERT STIVERS EXPRESSED HIS OBJECTIONS TO CERTAIN SECTIONS OF THE PROPOSED ZONING ORDINANCE AND REQUESTED PERMISSION TO SIT IN ON THE EXECUTIVE OR PRIVATE SESSION OF THE BOARD ON THE ZONING ISSUE.

RABBI ASHER SHAPIRO DELIVERED A STATEMENT MADE BY THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE OF THE SUFFOLK COUNTY COUNCIL OF CHURCHES, COMMENDING THE RIVERHEAD MINISTERIUM'S POSITION IN FAVORING THE ENACTMENT OF THE PROPOSED ZONING ORDINANCE.

A PETITION SUPPORTING THE PROPOSED ZONING ORDINANCE, SIGNED BY SEVEN PROPERTY OWNERS OF THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD WAS SUBMITTED TO THE BOARD AND ORDERED PLACED ON FILE.

JUSITCE PIKE OFFERED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WHICH WAS SECONDED BY COUNCILMAN STOTZKY,

WHEREAS, THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD HAS HERETOFORE APPOINTED A COMMITTEE ON HOUSING FOR THE TOWN, AND

WHEREAS, SAID COMMITTEE HAVING FILED ITS PRELIMINARY REPORT, AND IN SAID REPORT HAVING REQUESTED THAT THIS BOARD APPLY TO THE STATE HOUSING DIVISION FOR A SURVEY OF HOUSING CONDITIONS IN THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD, BE IT THEREFORE

RESOLVED, THAT THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD HEREBY REQUESTS THE HOUSING AUTHORITY OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK TO CONDUCT A SURVEY OF HOUSING CONDITIONS IN THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD AND REPORT THE RESULTS OF THAT SURVEY TO THIS BOARD.

THE VOTE---COUNCILMAN STOTZKY, YES, COUNCILMAN BENEDICT, YES, JUSTICE PIKE, YES, JUSTICE ZALOGA, YES, AND SUPERVISOR LEONARD, YES. THE RESOLUTION WAS THEREUPON DECLARED DULY ADOPTED.

AFTER BEING DULY ADVERTISED, SEALED BIDS FOR POLICE APPAREL FOR THE RIVERHEAD TOWN POLICE DEPARTMENT WERE SUBMITTED TO THE BOARD AND OPENED AS FOLLOWS:

JUSTICE ZALOGA OFFERED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WHICH WAS SECONDED BY JUSTICE PIKE.

RESOLVED, THAT THE BID FOR POLICE APPAREL BE AND IT IS HEREBY AWARDED TO PERKINS & COMPANY, RIVERHEAD, N.Y., AT A TOTAL BID PRICE OF \$2,117.10, AS PER THEIR BID AND SPECIFICATION FORM SUBMITTED DATED APRIL 19, 1959.

THE VOTE---COUNCILMAN STOTZKY, YES, COUNCILMAN BENEDICT, YES, JUSTICE PIKE, YES, JUSTICE ZALOGA, YES, AND SUPERVISOR LEONARD, YES. THE RESOLUTION WAS THEREUPON DECLARED DULY ADOPTED.

MR. JOHN W. THOMAS, REPRESENTATIVE FOR THE GROUP HEALTH INSURANCE INC., APPEARED BEFORE THE BOARD IN REGARD TO THE HEALTH INSURANCE PLAN FOR EMPLOYEES IN NEW YORK STATE. HE OUTLINED THE THREE OPTIONS AND SUMMARIZED BENEFITS, AND SUBMITTED COSTS INVOLVING THE TOWN, SHOULD THE BOARD ELECT TO PARTICIPATE IN THIS PLAN. THE BOARD TABLED THE MATTER FOR FURTHER STUDY.

MR. SIMON ULLIAN PRESENTED PLANS FOR HOUSING THE POLICE DEPARTMENT. HIS PLAN WAS DISCUSSED AND TABLED FOR FURTHER STUDY.

CHIEF OF POLICE STEPHEN GRODSKI INFORMED THE BOARD THAT HE AND JUSTICE ZALOGA HAVE COMPLETED THE SURVEY OF SPEED AND TRAFFIC SIGNS POSTED THROUGHOUT THE TOWN AND THAT ARRANGEMENTS HAVE BEEN MADE WITH THE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT TO REFURBISH THE OLD AND REPLACE THE MISSING SIGNS.

CHIEF GRODSKI BROUGHT UP THE MATTER OF PURCHASING A PICK-UP TRUCK TO BE USED EXCLUSIVELY FOR TRANSPORTING TRAFFIC AND SPEED SIGNS. AFTER SOME DISCUSSION, THE MATTER WAS POSTPONED WHEN IT WAS DETERMINED THAT FUNDS FOR SUCH PURCHASE WERE NOT PRESENTLY AVAILABLE.

JUSTICE ZALOGA OFFERED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WHICH WAS SECONDED BY JUSTICE PIKE.

WHEREAS, A YOUTH RECREATION COMMISSION FOR THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD HAS PREVIOUSLY BEEN APPOINTED FOR THE PURPOSE OF ORGANIZING AND COORDINATING RECREATIONAL ACTIVITY, PARTICULARLY FOR YOUTH IN THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD, AND

WHEREAS, THE SAID YOUTH RECREATION COMMISSION HAS INTERVIEWED PROSPECTS FOR THE JOB OF YOUTH DIRECTOR AND THE COMMISSION RECOMMENDS

THE APPOINTMENT OF A DIRECTOR FOR THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD, AND
WHEREAS, A PRIOR APPROPRIATION HAS BEEN MADE FOR SUCH A PURPOSE,
NOW THEREFORE BE IT

RESOLVED, THAT THE RECOMMENDATION OF THE RECREATION COMMISSION
BE FOLLOWED AND THAT COUNCILMAN BENEDICT BE AUTHORIZED TO NEGOTIATE
FOR THE EMPLOYMENT OF A YOUTH DIRECTOR AT AN ANNUAL SALARY OF \$5000,
SUBJECT TO FINAL APPROVAL OF THE TOWN BOARD.

THE VOTE---COUNCILMAN STOTZKY, YES, COUNCILMAN BENEDICT, YES,
JUSTICE PIKE, YES, JUSTICE ZALOGA, YES, AND SUPERVISOR LEONARD, YES.
THE RESOLUTION WAS THEREUPON DECLARED DULY ADOPTED.

COUNCILMAN BENEDICT OFFERED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WHICH WAS
SECONDED BY COUNCILMAN STOTZKY.

WHEREAS THE TOWN BOARD, FOR THE PURPOSE OF DRAINAGE AND TO PROTECT
A TOWN HIGHWAY AND OTHER PROPERTY WITHIN THE TOWN FROM FLOODS,
FRESHETS AND HIGH WATERS, HAS HAD STUDIES AND SURVEYS MADE OF THE
SITUATION ON MANOR LANE, VILLAGE OF JAMESPORT, TOWN OF RIVERHEAD,
AND

WHEREAS SAID BOARD HAS DETERMINED, FROM THE RESULTS OF SAID
SURVEYS, TO CONSTRUCT DRAINS, CATCH BASINS AND/OR OTHER MEANS FOR
THE PASSAGE OF WATER, ALL FOR THE PURPOSE OF PROPER DRAINAGE OF
SAID MANOR LANE, WHICH IS A TOWN HIGHWAY, AND

WHEREAS THE SAID BOARD DEEMS IT NECESSARY AND FOR THE BEST
INTERESTS OF THE TOWN TO ACQUIRE A PARCEL OF LAND ADJACENT TO SAID
MANOR LANE FOR THE ABOVE MENTIONED PURPOSES, PURSUANT TO SECTION
64, PAR. 11-A, OF THE TOWN LAW, AND

WHEREAS AN OPTION HAS BEEN TAKEN AND A TITLE SEARCH MADE FOR THE
PARCEL DESIRED, WHICH PARCEL IS KNOWN AS THE WILLIAMSON PARCEL,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT THE TOWN BOARD PURCHASE, IN
THE NAME OF THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD, FOR A SUM NOT TO EXCEED \$2,000.00,
THE FOLLOWING PARCEL OF LAND:

BEGINNING AT A POINT ON THE WESTERLY LINE OF MANOR LANE, AS
DEDICATED FOR HIGHWAY PURPOSES ON THIS DATE, WHICH POINT IS N
1 DEGREE TWELVE MINUTES 20 SECONDS W. 144.36 FT. FROM THE HIGH-
WAY ANGLE POINT DISTANT NORTHERLY ABOUT 470 FEET FROM THE MAIN
ROAD, AND RUNNING THENCE FROM SAID POINT OF BEGINNING WESTERLY
AND NORTHERLY ALONG THE LAND OF THE PARTY OF THE FIRST PART THE
FOLLOWING COURSES AND DISTANCES: (1) S. 85 DEGREES 58 MINUTES
40 SECONDS W. 153.82 FT., (2) N. 5 DEGREES 01 MINUTES 50 SECONDS
W. 102.12 FT., (3) N. 10 DEGREES 58 MINUTES 30 SECONDS W. 126.87
FT., (4) N. 34 DEGREES 17 MINUTES 00 SECONDS W. 160.32 FT. TO
THE LAND OF CONKLIN, THENCE N. 68 DEGREES 13 MINUTES 30 SECONDS
E. ALONG THE LAND OF CONKLIN 111.01 FT. TO THE WESTERLY LINE OF
MANOR LANE, THENCE S. 44 DEGREES 38 MINUTES 00 SECONDS E. ALONG
THE WESTERLY LINE OF MANOR LANE 8.31 FT., THENCE SOUTHERLY ALONG
THE WESTERLY LINE OF MANOR LANE, AS DEDICATED FOR HIGHWAY PUR-
POSES ON THIS DATE, THE FOLLOWING COURSES AND DISTANCES:

(1) S. 36 DEGREES 17 MINUTES W. 12.56 FT., (2) S. 38 DEGREES 55 MINUTES 20 SECONDS E. 123.77 FT., (3) ON A CURVE TO THE RIGHT WITH A RADIUS OF 439.16 FT. FOR A DISTANCE OF 289.09 FT., (4) S. 1 DEGREE 12 MINUTES 20 SECONDS E. 10.16 FT. TO THE POINT OR PLACE OF BEGINNING, CONTAINING AN AREA OF 1.204 ACRES.

FURTHER RESOLVED THAT THE SUPERVISOR BE AND HE IS HEREBY AUTHORIZED AND DIRECTED TO ACCEPT A DEED FOR SAID PARCEL IN THE NAME OF THE TOWN AND TO PAY THE CONSIDERATION FOR SAME OUT OF THE SUMS PREVIOUSLY BUDGETED BY THIS BOARD FOR DRAINAGE PURPOSES, AND

FURTHER RESOLVED THAT THE TOWN CLERK, WITHIN 10 DAYS HEREAFTER, SHALL POST AND PUBLISH A NOTICE WHICH SHALL SET FORTH THE DATE OF THE ADOPTION OF THIS RESOLUTION AND CONTAIN AN ABSTRACT OF SUCH ACT OR RESOLUTION CONCISELY STATING AS HEREIN THE PURPOSE THEREOF, AND THAT THE SAID RESOLUTION IS SUBJECT TO A PERMISSIVE REFERENDUM.

THE VOTE---COUNCILMAN STOTZKY, YES, COUNCILMAN BENEDICT, YES, JUSTICE PIKE, YES, JUSTICE ZALOGA, YES, AND SUPERVISOR LEONARD, YES. THE RESOLUTION WAS THEREUPON DECLARED DULY ADOPTED.

COUNCILMAN BENEDICT OFFERED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WHICH WAS SECONDED BY JUSTICE ZALOGA.

WHEREAS, THE TOWN BOARD FOR THE PURPOSE OF DRAINAGE AND TO PROTECT A TOWN HIGHWAY AND OTHER PROPERTY WITHIN THE TOWN FROM FLOODS, FRESHETS AND HIGH WATERS, HAS HAD STUDIES AND SURVEYS MADE OF THE SITUATION ON NORTH ROAD, BAITING HOLLOW, TOWN OF RIVERHEAD, AND

WHEREAS, SAID BOARD HAS DETERMINED, FROM THE RESULTS OF SAID SURVEYS, TO CONSTRUCT DRAINS, CATCH BASINS AND/OR OTHER MEANS FOR THE PASSAGE OF WATER, ALL FOR THE PURPOSE OF PROPER DRAINAGE OF SAID NORTH ROAD, WHICH IS A TOWN HIGHWAY, AND

WHEREAS, THE SAID BOARD DEEMS IT NECESSARY AND FOR THE BEST INTERESTS OF THE TOWN TO ACQUIRE PARCELS OF LAND ADJACENT TO SAID NORTH ROAD FOR THE ABOVE MENTIONED PURPOSES, PURSUANT TO SECTION 64, PAR. 11-4, OF THE TOWN LAW, AND

WHEREAS, DEEDS HAVE BEEN SECURED AND A TITLE SEARCH MADE FOR THE PARCELS DESCRIBED, WHICH PARCELS ARE KNOWN AS THE "YARZOMBEK PARCEL" AND THE "HALLOWELL PARCEL",

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT THE TOWN BOARD PURCHASE, IN THE NAME OF THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD, FOR A SUM NOT TO EXCEED \$1,500.00, THE FOLLOWING PARCEL OF LAND:

ALL THAT CERTAIN PLOT, PIECE OR PARCEL OF LAND, SITUATE, LYING AND BEING AT BAITING HOLLOW IN THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD, COUNTY OF SUFFOLK AND STATE OF NEW YORK, BOUNDED AND DESCRIBED AS FOLLOWS:

BEGINNING AT THE NORTHEASTERLY CORNER THEREOF AT THE POINT OF INTERSECTION OF THE SOUTHERLY SIDE OF NORTH ROAD WITH THE WESTERLY LINE OF LAND OF CATHERINE Y. HALLOWELL, SAID POINT OF BEGINNING BEING DISTANT NORTH 80 DEGREES 22 MINUTES EAST AS MEASURED ALONG THE SOUTHERLY SIDE OF NORTH ROAD 95.67 FEET FROM A MONUMENT SET IN AN ANGLE POINT

IN THE SOUTHERLY SIDE OF SAID ROAD APPROXIMATELY 5 FEET EASTERLY OF THE DRIVEWAY LEADING SOUTHERLY FROM SAID NORTH ROAD TO THE BARN ON THE PREMISES OF SAID LEOPOLD YARZOMBK, SAID MONUMENT BEING ALSO DISTANT EASTERLY AS MEASURED ALONG THE SOUTHERLY SIDE OF NORTH ROAD APPROXIMATELY 850 FEET MORE OR LESS FROM THE INTERSECTION OF THE EASTERLY SIDE OF TWOMEY AVENUE AND THE SOUTHERLY SIDE OF NORTH ROAD, RUNNING THENCE FROM SAID POINT OR PLACE OF BEGINNING SOUTH 34 DEGREES 12 MINUTES EAST ALONG THE AFORESAID LAND OF CATHERINE Y. HALLOWELL 250 FEET TO OTHER LAND OF LEOPOLD YARZOMBK, RUNNING THENCE SOUTH 80 DEGREES 32 MINUTES WEST ALONG SAID OTHER LAND OF LEOPOLD YARZOMBK 50 FEET TO THE SOUTHWESTERLY CORNER OF THE HEREIN DESCRIBED PREMISES, RUNNING THENCE NORTH 24 DEGREES 12 MINUTES WEST STILL ALONG OTHER LAND OF LEOPOLD YARZOMBK 250 FEET TO A POINT IN THE SOUTHERLY SIDE OF THE NORTH ROAD, RUNNING THENCE NORTH 80 DEGREES 22 MINUTES EAST ALONG THE SOUTHERLY SIDE OF SAID LAND 50 FEET TO THE POINT OR PLACE OF BEGINNING.

TOGETHER WITH ALL THE RIGHT, TITLE AND INTEREST, IF ANY, OF SAID LEOPOLD AND MARY YARZOMBK OF, IN AND TO THE NORTH ROAD LYING IN FRONT OF AND ADJOURNING THE ABOVE DESCRIBED PARCEL ON THE NORTH TO THE CENTER LINE THEREOF.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, THAT THE TOWN BOARD PURCHASE IN THE NAME OF THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD, FOR A SUM NOT TO EXCEED \$1,500.00, THE FOLLOWING PARCEL OF LAND,

ALL THAT CERTAIN PLOT, PIECE OR PARCEL OF LAND, SITUATE LYING AND BEING AT BAITING HOLLOW, TOWN OF RIVERHEAD, SUFFOLK COUNTY, STATE OF NEW YORK, BOUNDED AND DESCRIBED AS FOLLOWS:

BEGINNING AT THE NORTHWESTERLY CORNER THEREOF AT THE POINT OR INTERSECTION OF THE SOUTHERLY SIDE OF THE NORTH ROAD WITH THE EASTERLY LINE OF LAND OF LEOPOLD YARZOMBK, RUNNING THENCE SOUTH 34 DEGREES 12 MINUTES EAST ALONG THE EASTERLY LINE OF SAID LAND OF LEOPOLD YARZOMBK 250 FEET TO OTHER LAND OF THE PARTY OF THE FIRST PART, RUNNING THENCE NORTH 80 DEGREES 22 MINUTES EAST ALONG SAID OTHER LAND OF THE PARTY OF THE FIRST PART 50 FEET TO THE SOUTHEASTERLY CORNER OF THE HEREIN DESCRIBED PARCEL, RUNNING THENCE NORTH 34 DEGREES 12 MINUTES WEST STILL ALONG SAID OTHER LAND OF THE PARTY OF THE FIRST PART 250 FEET TO A POINT IN THE SOUTHERLY SIDE OF THE NORTH ROAD, RUNNING THENCE SOUTH 80 DEGREES 22 MINUTES WEST ALONG THE SOUTHERLY SIDE OF THE NORTH ROAD 50 FEET TO THE POINT OR PLACE OF BEGINNING.

TOGETHER WITH ALL THE RIGHT, TITLE AND INTEREST, IF ANY, OF THE SAID PARTY OF THE FIRST PART OF, IN AND TO THE NORTH ROAD LYING IN FRONT OF AND ADJOURNING THE ABOVE DESCRIBED PARCEL ON THE NORTH TO THE CENTER LINE THEREOF.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, THAT THE SUPERVISOR BE AND HE IS HEREBY AUTHORIZED AND DIRECTED TO ACCEPT DEEDS FOR SAID PARCELS IN THE NAME OF THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD AND TO PAY THE CONSIDERATION FOR SAME OUT OF THE SUMS PREVIOUSLY BUDGETED BY THIS BOARD FOR DRAINAGE PURPOSES, AND

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT THE TOWN CLERK, WITHIN 10 DAYS HEREAFTER, SHALL POST AND PUBLISH A NOTICE WHICH SHALL SET FORTH THE DATE OF THE ADOPTION OF THIS RESOLUTION AND CONTAIN AN ABSTRACT OF SUCH ACT OR RESOLUTION CONCISELY STATING AS HEREIN THE PURPOSE THEREOF, AND THAT THE SAID RESOLUTION IS SUBJECT TO A PERMISSIVE REFERENDUM.

THE VOTE---COUNCILMAN STOTZKY, YES, COUNCILMAN BENEDICT, YES, JUSTICE PIKE, YES, JUSTICE ZALOGA, YES, AND SUPERVISOR LEONARD, YES. THE RESOLUTION WAS THEREUPON DECLARED DULY ADOPTED.

COUNCILMAN BENEDICT REPORTED BRIEFLY ON THE MATTER OF CURBS AND GUTTERS ON HALLOCK STREET. THE DRAINAGE PROBLEM AS AFFECTS THIS SITUATION WILL BE STUDIED FURTHER.

AN APPLICATION FOR CURBS AND GUTTERS MADE BY STANLEY ZOLTOWSKI OF 314 HAMILTON AVENUE, RIVERHEAD, N.Y., WAS READ AND ORDERED PLACED ON FILE.

COUNCILMAN BENEDICT OFFERED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WHICH WAS SECONDED BY COUNCILMAN STOTZKY.

RESOLVED THAT THE APPLICATION FOR CURBS AND GUTTERS MADE BY STANLEY ZOLTOWSKI, RIVERHEAD, BE AND IT IS HEREBY APPROVED, FURTHER RESOLVED THAT THE SUPERINTENDENT OF HIGHWAYS BE AUTHORIZED TO INSTALL THESE CURBS AND GUTTERS SUBJECT TO THE RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE INSTALLATION OF CURBS AND GUTTERS AS ADOPTED ON JUNE 11, 1957.

THE VOTE---COUNCILMAN STOTZKY, YES, COUNCILMAN BENEDICT, YES, JUSTICE PIKE, YES, JUSTICE ZALOGA, YES, AND SUPERVISOR LEONARD, YES. THE RESOLUTION WAS THEREUPON DECLARED DULY ADOPTED.

JUSTICE ZALOGA REPORTED THAT COST ESTIMATES ON THE POLICE DEPARTMENT SITE WOULD BE AVAILABLE FOR THE MAY 5TH MEETING.

TOWN ATTORNEY JACOB HARDING INFORMED THE BOARD THAT A LEASE WITH THE ROANOKE LODGE No. 462 ON THE TOWN HALL RENTAL WILL BE PREPARED FOR APPROVAL OF THE BOARD.

SUPERVISOR LEONARD REPORTED THAT HE HAS DISCUSSED THE MATTER OF ADDITIONAL RENTAL FOR USE OF THE TOWN DUMP WITH SOUTHAMPTON TOWN SUPERVISOR MESCHUTT, WHO IS TO CONSULT WITH HIS TOWN BOARD AND WILL ADVISE SUPERVISOR LEONARD ON THE ACTION TAKEN.

LETTERS WERE READ FROM B.M. PATTERSON, ADMINISTRATOR OF THE CENTRAL SUFFOLK HOSPITAL ASSOCIATION AND FROM DR. PHILIP J. RAFLE, CHAIRMAN OF THE SUFFOLK COUNTY MEDICAL SOCIETY, RELATIVE TO CONFERENCE HELD ON APRIL 15TH, WITH DR. EDWIN WILSON, POLICE CHIEF GRODSKI AND SUPERVISOR LEONARD. THE LETTERS CONFIRMED A PLAN WHICH WAS DESIGNED DURING THE CONFERENCE TO MEET THE EMERGENCY ACCIDENT SITUATION WHICH CURRENTLY CONFRONTS THE POLICE DEPARTMENT.

LETTERS ORDERED PLACED ON FILE.

POLICE CHIEF GRODSKI INFORMED THE BOARD THAT JOHN ZALESKI, CHIEF OF RESCUE SQUAD HAS VOLUNTEERED TO GIVE THE POLICE DEPARTMENT MEMBERS A REFRESHER COURSE ON FIRST AID AS APPROVED BY CIVIL DEFENSE. HE FURTHER STATED THAT IT WAS FOR THE BEST INTERESTS OF THE POLICE DEPARTMENT FOR THE BOARD TO RATIFY OR REJECT THE PLAN AT THE EARLIEST POSSIBLE DATE,

THE BOARD ENTERED INTO A DISCUSSION ON THIS MATTER. JUSTICE ZALOGA VOICED HIS DISAPPROVAL TO THE PLAN, STATING HE BELIEVED THAT ONLY QUALIFIED MEDICAL MEN SHOULD BE RESPONSIBLE IN MAKING DECISIONS AT THE SCENE OF AN ACCIDENT AND THAT MEMBERS OF THE P.D. SHOULD NOT BE INVOLVED IN THE REMOVAL OF ACCIDENT VICTIMS.. HE CAUTIONED THAT EVERY PRECAUTION BE TAKEN AND LOOKED INTO BEFORE ANY ACTION IS MADE ON THE PLAN AS RECOMMENDED AND DRAWN UP AT THE CONFERENCE.

J. LEO SAXTEIN ADDRESSED THE BOARD ON THIS MATTER AND STRONGLY OPPOSED THE PLAN. HE BELIEVED THAT THE HANDLING OF ACCIDENT PATIENTS BY MEMBERS OF THE POLICE DEPARTMENT WOULD PRESENT LIABILITY HAZARDS. THE MATTER WAS DEFERRED FOR FURTHER STUDY.

THE MATTER OF AN INCREASE IN SALARY OR REIMBURSEMENT FOR ADDITIONAL EXPENSES AS HE REQUESTED BY RAYMOND NUGENT, DOG WARDEN, WAS BROUGHT TO THE ATTENTION OF THE BOARD.

DURING THE DISCUSSION ON THE QUESTION, IT WAS BROUGHT OUT THAT THE ADDITIONAL EXPENSES INCURRED IN CONSTRUCTING RUNWAYS, GAS CHAMBER REPAIRS AND OTHER NECESSARY REPAIRS JUSTIFY THE REQUEST OF MR. NUGENT FOR ADDITIONAL FUNDS.

IT WAS AGREED BY THE BOARD TO MEET THE NEED FOR ADDITIONAL FUNDS BY DEFRAYING THE MONTHLY DOG FOOD COSTS. IT WAS SUGGESTED THAT DETAILED VOUCHERS BE SUBMITTED WITH THE APRIL VOUCHER.

THE DRAINAGE PROBLEMS WERE DISCUSSED IN REGARD TO HORTON AVENUE AND DOCTOR'S PATH. THESE PROBLEMS INVOLVED PROPERTY OWNED BY FRANK TRUSKOSKI, H. ALDRICH AND HARRY RAMBO.

ATTORNEY HARDING MENTIONED THE COMPLICATIONS INVOLVED IN TRYING TO HELP WITH A PROBLEM THAT ACTUALLY AFFECTS THE PROPERTY OWNERS INVOLVED, RATHER THAN THE TOWN. THESE MATTERS WILL REQUIRE FURTHER STUDY AND WILL BE PLACED ON THE LIST OF DRAINAGE AREAS.

MR. LEO SAXTEIN SPOKE ALSO IN REGARD TO THE PROBLEM.

MYRON C. YOUNG ADDRESSED THE BOARD, STATING THAT A SCREEN DOOR WAS NEEDED FOR THE HIGHWAY GARAGE. THE TOWN BOARD AUTHORIZED THE PURCHASE, AND TOWN ATTORNEY JACOB HARDING ADVISED THAT THE COST WOULD BE A GENERAL TOWN CHARGE.

JUSTICE PIKE MADE A STATEMENT IN REGARD TO THE PROPOSED ZONING ORDINANCE. HE PROMISED THAT CONSIDERATION WOULD BE GIVEN TO THE SPEAKERS' REQUESTS AND MUCH THOUGHT TO THE LANGUAGE AND SECTIONS OF THE ZONING CODE WOULD BE GIVEN ALSO.

THE TOWN BOARD CONVENED AS A BOARD OF AUDIT AND EXAMINED ALL BILLS TO DATE, THE TOTALS OF WHICH WAS AS FOLLOWS: GENERAL TOWN---\$3,290.17 AND MACHINERY FUND---\$1,571.49. ON MOTION AND VOTE, IT WAS RESOLVED THAT THE BILLS BE APPROVED AS RENDERED.

THERE BEING NO FURTHER BUSINESS ON MOTION AND VOTE, THE MEETING ADJOURNED TO MEET ON TUESDAY, MAY 5, 1959 AT 9:30 A.M.
