

Minutes of a Meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held at
Town Hall, Riverhead, New York, on Tuesday, April 23, 1968 at 10:30 A.M.

The meeting was called to order at 10:30 A.M., by Supervisor Vojvoda.

At this point of the meeting, Supervisor Vojvoda asked if anyone wished to be heard and the following responded:

PERSONAL APPEARANCES

Mr. Walter D. Witt, North Wading River Road, Wading River, N. Y.,
came before the Board and stated his father-in-law passed away on April 17, 1968.

Mr. Witt further stated that emergency calls were made to physicians. Also
calls to the Police Department and the Wading River Fire Department who responded
immediately.

He outlined the four hour ordeal the family endured awaiting the arrival of a
medical man to make a pronouncement of death, and asked the Board if something
could be worked out with the medical profession whereby a physician would be avail-
able during situations of this nature.

After discussion, the following statement was made by the Town Board:

"The following facts have come to the attention of the Town Board:

On April 17, 1968, the Riverhead Town Police and the Wading River Fire
Department responded to an emergency call in the Wading River area of the Town.
On arrival, the Police learned that the deceased had died of natural causes. How-
ever, for more than four hours after arrival, the Police could not leave the scene
because they were unable to obtain the services of a medical doctor to pronounce
the victim dead, in spite of the fact that at least eight local physicians were called
by the Police and requested to do so. Finally a physician from a community more
than 11 miles distant was called and agreed to come. During all this time the Police
Department had to remain on the scene in the presence of the body of the victim and
his bereaved family.

In the opinion of the Police Department, this unfortunate situation arose through
the failure of the local physicians to make provision for one of their number to be avail-
able for duties of the kind required here. According to the Police Department, similar
incidents have been previously recorded locally." (End)

In view of the facts as above set forth, Councilman Grodski offered the following
resolution which was seconded and adopted unanimously by the vote of the Board present.

BE IT RESOLVED, That the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead requests the Suffolk
County Medical Association, or the appropriate body or board, to make provisions for
local physicians to be on call for duties of the type outlined above, and to advise the Town
Board of its position and plans in this matter; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Town Clerk is directed to forward a copy of this resolution to the
Suffolk County Medical Association and the Board of Central Suffolk Hospital, Riverhead,
New York.

Mr. Wickham Tyte asked Supervisor Vojvoda who voted "No" on the County
Tax Map Plan at the County Board of Supervisors.

Supervisor Vojvoda advised Mr. Tyte the three Democratic Supervisors from
the west end of the County voted against the plan.

Mr. Tyte asked about the 18-man Board of Supervisors plan and if it would be on
the ballot this Fall.

Supervisor Vojvoda advised that six plans are being considered by the Board of
Supervisors but it may be that only two plans will be placed on the ballot.

HEADS OF DEPARTMENTS

Police Chief Grodski discussed the following items with the Board:

1. The matter of people creating road hazards by putting out garbage and pieces of boards and lumber, etc., along with leaves and branches from trees on road curbs in front of their residences.
2. The matter of a new car. Authorization granted to draw up specifications.
3. The matter of additional patrolmen.
4. Requested permission to purchase five (5) carbines at \$46.00 each. Authorization granted by Board.
5. The matter of people "netting and fishing" at Grangebél Park and requested the Board to consider enacting ordinance prohibiting these practices for safety purposes. During discussion the Town Board expressed a desire to have the Police eliminate the "winos" from the Park.

HIGHWAY MATTERS:

Alex E. Horton, Supt. of Highways advised Councilman Grodski that the figure of \$1500 per year for Stanley Bokina's overtime as stated during the April 9th Meeting is in error, as \$60.00 per month would total \$720.00 and not \$1500 as so stated by the Councilman.

Mr. Horton advised that an amount of \$6,031 is needed to meet costs of snow removal purposes and requested the Town Board to authorize the borrowings for such amount on a Budget Note.

RESOLUTIONS

Councilman Young offered the following resolution which was seconded by Councilman Grodski.

BUDGET NOTE RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD,
NEW YORK, ADOPTED APRIL 23, 1968, AUTHORIZING THE
ISSUANCE OF A NOTE IN THE AMOUNT OF \$6,031.00 FOR
THE PURPOSE OF DEFRAYING COSTS OF SNOW REMOVAL.

WHEREAS, There has been no provision made in the 1968 Highway Budget for snow removal purposes, and

WHEREAS, The Superintendent of Highways has advised the Town Board that an amount of \$6,031 is needed to finance costs of snow removal, and has requested the Board to authorize borrowings of said amount of \$6,031 for snow removal purposes,

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED AS FOLLOWS:

1. That the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead for the specific purpose of providing for payment of expenses for the removal of snow and ice heretofore incurred, pursuant to Section 29.00 of the Local Finance Law, does hereby authorize the issuance of its Budget Note in the amount of \$6,031 to finance such cost and expense.

2. Such Note shall be dated May 1, 1968 and its power to fix and determine the exact date of such Note is hereby delegated to the Supervisor. Such Note shall be numbered 3 and shall mature in the year 1969. The power to fix and determine the date upon which such Note shall become due and payable is also delegated to the Supervisor.

This Note may not be converted to registered form.

This Note is the only Note of an authorized issue in the amount of SIX THOUSAND THIRTY-ONE (\$6,031) DOLLARS.

This Note is issued pursuant to the provisions of a resolution duly adopted by the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead on April 23, 1968.

The faith and credit of such Town of Riverhead are hereby irrevocably pledged for the principal payment of the principal of and interest on this Note according to its terms.

It is hereby certified and recited that all conditions, acts and things required by the Constitution and Statutes of the State of New York to exist, to have happened and to have been performed precedent to and in the issuance of this Note exist, have happened and have been performed, and that this Note, together with all other indebtedness of such Town of Riverhead is within every debt and other limit prescribed by the Constitution and Laws of such State.

Town Justice Costello offered the following resolution which was seconded by Councilman Young.

WHEREAS, The Town Planning Board of Riverhead by a Resolution dated February 7, 1968, set forth the prerequisites to the approval of the proposed subdivision known as "GREEN SLOPES, SECTION II", and

WHEREAS, One of the prerequisites to the approval of the proposed subdivision is the filing of a Performance Bond in the amount of \$19,000.00 with the Riverhead Town Board guaranteeing the faithful completion of the construction of highways within the proposed subdivision in accordance with the construction specifications in the "Rules and Regulations for the Dedication of a Public Highway in the Town of Riverhead, Suffolk County, New York, " and in accordance with the conditions set forth in the aforementioned resolution of the Town Planning Board dated February 7, 1968, and

WHEREAS, LONG ISLAND GREEN SLOPES CORP. as Principal and STEVE MITACCHIONE and JOSEPHINE MITACCHIONE as Co-Principals and REPUBLIC INSURANCE COMPANY as Surety have filed a Performance Bond in the amount of \$19,000.00 guaranteeing to the Riverhead Town Board faithful performance in the completion of the roads to be constructed in the proposed subdivision known as "GREEN SLOPES, SECTION II, " which Bond sets forth completion of the roads in a period not exceeding two years, all being pursuant to Section 277 of the Town Law, Section III, Paragraph F of the Rules and Regulations of the Planning Board for the Subdivision and Platting of Land,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the Surety Bond in the amount of \$19,000.00, naming LONG ISLAND GREEN SLOPES CORP., as Principal, STEVE MITACCHIONE and JOSEPHINE MITACCHIONE as Co-Principals, REPUBLIC INSURANCE COMPANY as Surety, and the RIVERHEAD TOWN BOARD as Obligee, for the faithful performance of all conditions set forth in the Resolution of the Town of Riverhead Planning Board, dated February 7, 1968, with reference to the proposed subdivision to be known as "GREEN SLOPES, SECTION II" in Riverhead, New York, is satisfactory to the Town Board as to form, sufficiency, manner of execution and surety, for the completion of such improvements as are not constructed.

RESOLVED, That the Supervisor be and is hereby authorized to purchase the aforementioned color film print of the Town of Riverhead 175th Anniversary Parade and Ball at a cost of \$2,700, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the amount of \$2,700 be transferred from the General Town Current Surplus Account to General Town Hall/Other Miscellaneous Expense Account to meet the costs of said color film.

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Town Justice Zaloga, Absent, Town Justice Costello, Yes, and Supervisor Vojvoda, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

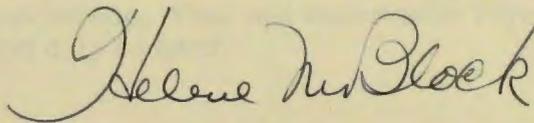
Town Justice Costello offered the following resolution which was seconded by Councilman Young.
