

Minutes of a Meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Hall, Riverhead, New York, on Tuesday, January 4, 1966 at 10:30 A. M.

Justice Costello offered the following resolution which was seconded by Councilman Young.

RESOLVED, That the minutes of the Special Meeting of the Town Board held in the Town Hall on December 29, 1965, be approved as submitted.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

The Town Board decided that the matters of the Meter Ordinance, Traffic Ordinance and Amending Public Dump Ordinance No. 15, would be assigned to a Special Attorney within the next few months.

The matter of the request of James Sauer for a limited parking area in the section of Roanoke Avenue between Second Street and Third Street was discussed by the Board and it was decided that perhaps the installation of Parking Meters would resolve the problem.

RESOLUTIONS:

Councilman Young stated that he is offering the following resolution which he believes will save the Town around \$20,000 to \$30,000 within the next few years:

RESOLVED, That the Town appoint a full time Town Attorney to execute all the Town's legal work and that he be paid an annual salary of \$10,000.

The Town Attorney pointed out to the Board that once a salary amount has been set in the Budget for a Town Attorney, that is all that can be paid to the Town Attorney, but that Special Attorneys other than the Town Attorney can or may be hired and paid.

RESOLUTIONS continued:

The resolution was not seconded and the Town Board entered into a discussion and after further deliberation, it was decided that this matter will be given serious consideration at the time of preparing next year's budget.

Councilman Grodski offered the following resolution which was seconded by Justice Zaloga.

RESOLVED, That Shepherd M. Scheinberg be and he is hereby appointed Town Attorney to serve until the first day of January next succeeding the first biennial town election held after his appointment (i. e. January, 1968) at an annual salary of \$5,000, for the year 1966, payable monthly.

The vote, Councilman Young, Not voting, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Justice Zaloga, Yes, Justice Costello, Not Voting and Supervisor Vojvoda, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Councilman Young offered the following resolution which was seconded by Councilman Grodski.

RESOLVED, That the official meetings of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead shall be held on the first and third Tuesdays of each month, commencing at 10:30 A. M.

RESOLVED, That the firm of Smith, Tasker, Finkelstein and Lundberg, be and hereby is appointed Special Counsel in the matters of Riverhead Gardens vs. The Board of Assessors of the Town of Riverhead; Brenner vs. The Board of Assessors of the Town of Riverhead; and King Kullen vs. The Board of Assessors of the Town of Riverhead, and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Town Board reserves the right to set the fee for the aforementioned actions.

BE IT RESOLVED, That Elizabeth Edwards serve as Deputy Town Clerk and Deputy Registrar of Vital Statistics, for a period of two years, effective January 1st, 1966 and ending December 31, 1967, at no additional compensation.

RESOLVED, That Florence Abrams, be and is hereby appointed as Part-time Clerk to the Zoning/Board of Appeals, effective January 1, 1966, at a salary of \$1200.00 per annum, payable monthly, and to serve at the pleasure of the Town Board.

WHEREAS, Section 29 of the Town Law, pertaining to the publishing of the Annual Financial Report has been amended to provide an alternative method of preparing and publishing the report, and

RESOLUTIONS continued:

WHEREAS, It is the intention of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead to obtain the financial advantage permitted thereunder, now, therefore, be it RESOLVED, That publication of the annual financial report be and the same is hereby authorized in summary form pursuant to Section 29, Paragraph 10-A.

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Justice Zaloga, Yes, Justice Costello, Yes, and Supervisor Vojvoda, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

RESOLVED, That Longevity Pay based upon the base annual salary be paid in a lump sum to town employees beginning with the calendar year January 1, 1966 as follows:

- Those having a tenure of ten (10) years as of January 1, 1966 to be paid 4%,
- Those having a tenure of fifteen (15) years as of January 1, 1966 to be paid 5%,
- Those having a tenure of twenty (20) years as of January 1, 1966 to be paid 6%.

RESOLVED, That the Town Clerk be and is hereby authorized to open and read aloud said bids and make a report to the Town Board on January 18, 1966.

Councilman Grodski offered the following resolution which was seconded by Justice Zaloga.

RESOLVED, That Edward J. Gadzinski, H. E. A. O., Sanitation Department, be paid the sum of \$37.60 for 16 hours overtime at the rate of \$2.35 per hour.

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Justice Zaloga, Yes, Justice Costello, Yes, and Supervisor Vojvoda, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

At this point, Supervisor Vojvoda recessed the meeting to hold a Public Hearing.

PUBLIC HEARING - 11:30 A. M.

After being duly advertised Proof of Publication of Notice of Public Hearing, Pursuant to Section 265 of the Town Law and Section 501 of Zoning Ordinance No. 26 of the Town of Riverhead on proposals to amend said Ordinance was submitted to the Board.

The Notice was ordered filed.

Supervisor Vojvoda declared the Hearing open and asked if anyone wished to be heard in favor of or in opposition to the aforesaid Notice.

No one wishing to be heard and no communications having been received thereto, Supervisor Vojvoda declared the Hearing closed at 11:35 A. M., and re-opened the meeting.

Councilman Grodski offered the following resolution which was seconded by Councilman Young.

WHEREAS, The Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, Suffolk County, New York, has caused all matters and things to be done which are required by the Town Law in order that amendments or changes to Zoning Ordinance No. 26, may be adopted by the Town,

NOW, THEREFORE, By virtue of the authority vested in it by the Town Law and other statutes made and provided, the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead hereby ordains and enacts the following amendment to Ordinance No. 26:

1. Article III-Section 303C-Parking Areas - The Second Paragraph should be deleted.
2. Article III-Section 303C-Parking Areas-Add the following Second Paragraph:

RESOLUTIONS continued:

Where a public parking district has been created within a business district, the owner of property within the district for each building, structure, or premises which would be erected, enlarged or altered for use need not provide off street parking as defined in Article 3, Section 301J-Off Street Parking.

The adoption of the aforementioned amendment to Zoning Ordinance No. 26, of the Town of Riverhead shall take effect ten (10) days after publication and posting.

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Justice Zaloga, Yes, Justice Costello, Yes, and Supervisor Vojvoda, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Justice Zaloga offered the following resolution which was seconded by Justice Costello.

RESOLVED, That the News-Review of Riverhead, New York, be and it is hereby designated the official newspaper of the Town of Riverhead, to continue as such only at the pleasure of the Riverhead Town Board.

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Justice Zaloga, Yes, Justice Costello, Yes, and Supervisor Vojvoda, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Justice Zaloga offered the following resolution which was seconded by Councilman Young.

RESOLVED, That the Supervisor be authorized to act in the capacity of Welfare Officer of the Town of Riverhead at no additional compensation.

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Justice Zaloga, Yes, Justice Costello, Yes, and Supervisor Vojvoda, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Justice Zaloga offered the following resolution which was seconded by several.

RESOLVED, That all elected officials, heads of all Town Departments, the Clerk to the Board of Assessors, the Town Attorney, Members of the Planning Board and the Zoning Board of Appeals be and they are hereby authorized to attend the Annual Meeting of the Association of Towns of the State of New York, in New York City, New York, on February 7th, 8th, and 9th, 1966, and that all necessary expenses be charged to the General Town Fund.

The resolution was unanimously adopted.

Justice Zaloga offered the following resolution which was seconded by Justice Costello.

RESOLVED, That Supervisor Vojvoda be and he is hereby designated as Delegate to the Meeting of the Association of Towns of the State of New York, and that Councilman Young, be and he is hereby designated as Alternate Delegate.

Section 4. Said Note shall contain the recital of validity prescribed by Section 52.00 of said Local Finance Law, and shall be a general obligation of the Town, payable as to both principal and interest by a general tax upon all the taxable real property within the Town, without limitation of rate or amount. 
The resolution was declared unanimously adopted.
