

Minutes of a Meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held at the Town Hall, Riverhead, New York, on Tuesday, May 7, 1968 at 10:30 A.M.

The meeting was called to order at 10:30 A.M. by Supervisor Vojvoda.

Town Justice Costello offered the following resolution which was seconded by Councilman Grodski.

Town Justice Costello offered the following resolution which was seconded by Councilman Young.  
 RESOLVED, That the Town Clerk be and is hereby authorized to publish the following Notice of Public Hearing in the May 9th, 1968 issue of the News-Review:

NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

"Pursuant to Section 265 of the New York Town Law and Section 501 of the Zoning Ordinance of the Town of Riverhead, Suffolk County, New York, Ordinance No. 26, a public hearing will be held by the Riverhead Town Board at the Town Hall, 200 Roanoke Avenue, Riverhead, New York, on the 21st day of May, 1968, at 10:45 o'clock in the forenoon of said day on the following proposal to amend said Zoning Ordinance No. 26 of the Town of Riverhead, As Amended, as follows:

1. By changing from "Farm 1" Use District to "Industrial 2" Use District, a tract of 217.498 acres more or less, situated at Manorville, Town of Riverhead, bounded and described as follows:

BEGINNING at a point on the southerly side of River Road where the same is intersected by the westerly side of land now or formerly of Jessie W. Donohue; running thence along said land, (1) South 2° 16' 40" East, 430.46 feet; (2) South 28° 25' 40" East 496.55 feet; (3) South 59° 15' 10" West, 1809.64 feet and (4) South 21° 52' 40" West, 5,045.46 feet; thence along land now or formerly of H. R. Johnson, (1) North 51° 52' 40" West, 723.22 feet; (2) North 40° 45' 40" West, 276.33 feet, (3) North 34° 21' 10" West, 194.91 feet; (4) North 19° 25' 10" West, 262.47 feet; (5) North 28° 26' 20" West, 198.83 feet; (6) North 10° 42' 20" West 527.21 feet; (7) North 1° 49' 40" East, 212.99 feet; (8) North 7° 28' 10" East, 643.63 feet, (9) North 60° 15' 00" East, 1884.50 feet; (10) North 24° 59' 10" East 240.28 feet and (11) North 36° 15' 30" West, 1017.03 feet to the southeasterly side of River Road and thence along the southeasterly, easterly and southerly side of River Road (1) North 62° 00' 10" East, 190.57 feet, (2) North 56° 08' 40" East, 142.06 feet, (3) North 52° 27' 50" East 490.24 feet, (4) North 50° 39' 50" East, 473.61 feet, (5) North 60° 27' 00" East, 481.54 feet, (6) on a curve to the left, having a radius of 288.42 feet a distance of 336.82 feet, (7) North 6° 27' 40" West, 448.52 feet, (8) North 3° 21' 20" West, 174.42 feet and (9) South 89° 25' 40" East, 1550.87 feet to the point or place of BEGINNING.

The premises proposed to be rezoned are accurately shown on map entitled "Proposed Change in Zoning Use District at Manorville, Town of Riverhead, Suffolk Co., N. Y., Applicant Wooded Hills Corp." dated March 15, 1968, is on file with the Town Clerk of the Town of Riverhead.

RESOLUTIONS

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Town Justice Zaloga, Absent, Town Justice Costello, Yes, and Supervisor Vojvoda, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Supervisor Vojvoda announced that petitioners for change of zone will henceforth be required to make full disclosure.

Councilman Grodski offered the following resolution which was seconded by Councilman Young.

RESOLVED, That Charles Van Slyke, be and is hereby appointed Part-time Assistant Recreation Supervisor, to work a 40-hour week at the rate of \$3.00 per hour, payable bi-weekly, to serve at the pleasure of the Town Board, said employment effective May 11, 1968 and ending approximately Labor Day.

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Town Justice Zaloga, Absent, Town Justice Costello, Yes, and Supervisor Vojvoda, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

BOARD OF AUDIT

The Town Board convened as a Board of Audit and examined bills submitted on Abstracts No. 8, as follows: General Town-\$19,448.82, General Repairs Highway Item 1 - \$4,237.32, Highway Item 3-Machinery-\$1651.42 and Miscellaneous Highway Item 4-\$305.63.

Councilman Grodski offered the following resolution which was seconded by Councilman Young.

RESOLVED, That General Town bills submitted in the amount of \$19,448.82 be approved for payment, and

FURTHER RESOLVED, That Highway Item 1 bills in the amount of \$4,237.32, Highway Item 3 in the amount of \$1,651.42 and Highway Item 4 in the amount of \$305.63, be approved for payment.

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Town Justice Zaloga, Absent, Town Justice Costello, <sup>Yes</sup> and Supervisor Vojvoda, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Supervisor Vojvoda asked if anyone wished to be heard and the following responded:

Messrs. Joseph Lopez and Carmine Merolla, representing the Chamber of Commerce, appeared before the Board in connection with the coming Art Exhibit to be held during the summer, requesting permission to utilize Main Street with snow fence possibly from meter to meter and also "No Parking" privileges.

After discussion, it was resolved that snow fence from meter to meter and "No Parking" privileges be granted.

Patricia Tormey, Chairman, Board of Appeals, explained to the Board, the Appeal Board's problem in the matter of Fletcher Booker.

Mr. Wickham Tyte appeared before the Board and asked questions relating to the following matters:

- Repair of roads on Roanoke Landing.
- If any land available for purchase on either side of Penny's Landing.
- The possibility of acquiring a certain section of former property of Hollis Warner for recreational purposes, or possibly getting County to open it up as a park.
- Discussed Parking District matters.
- Discussed County Apportionment plans.

#### HEADS OF DEPARTMENTS

Police Chief Grodski asked the Board about the marking of highways and parking fields.

Supervisor Vojvoda advised that he has knowledge of an outfit who is available for this type of work and who will mark the highways of the entire township within a three day period. A representative of the company will come before the Board on May 14th to discuss the matter. Also that he has conferred with the Highway Superintendent who agrees that this plan would be most acceptable.

#### HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT

Alex E. Horton, Supt. of Highways informed the Board that due to persons invading the grounds of the Highway Department during Saturdays and Sundays and leaving beer cans and bottles, it will be necessary to install a fence around the Highway Department grounds. He estimated the cost of a chain link fence with two wide gates to be \$800 and chargeable to General Town Funds.

Police Chief Grodski stated the Police Department discovered children playing on top of the snow fence piled on the Highway grounds.

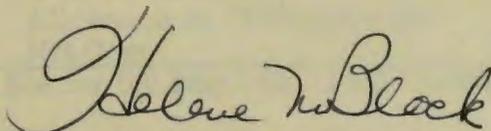
After discussion, the Town Board advised Mr. Horton to secure bids on the fence requirements.

The Town Board directed Mr. Horton to drain and clean out the twin pond in Wading River at a cost of \$125.00.

Councilman Young asked if the County is working on the traffic problem on Middle Road, Route 58 and Osborne Avenue.

Supervisor Vojvoda stated that he has filed the request with the Suffolk County Department of Public Works and has been told that designs are being prepared and is hopeful the work will commence some time during the summer.

There being no further business on motion and vote, the meeting adjourned at 11:30 A. M., to meet on Tuesday, May 14th, 1968 at 10:30 A. M.
