BENEDICT AND SECONDED BY JUSTICE PIKE, IT WAS RESOLVED THAT THE
MINUTES BE APPROVED AS SUBMITTED. THE VOTE---COUNCILMAN BENEDICT,
YES, COUNCILMAN STOTZKY, YES, JUSTICE PIKE, YES, JUSTICE ZALOGA,
YES, AND SUPERVISOR LEONARD, YES. THE RESOLUTION WAS THEREUPON
DECLARED DULY ADOPTED.

KENNETH G. ROWLAND, RECREATION DIRECTOR, PRESENTED TO THE BOARD,
A REPORT DATED SEPTEMBER 11, 1959, RELATIVE TO RECREATION ACTIVITIES
DURING THE PAST SUMMER.

REPORT ORDERED FILED. IT WAS THE CONSENSUS OF THE BOARD THAT
THE RECREATION PROGRAM UNDER THE DIRECTION OF KENNETH G. ROWLAND
WAS PROCEEDING MOST SATISFACTORILY.

NOTICE OF CLAIM, SERVED ON TOWN CLERK, IN THE MATTER OF THE
CLAIM OF RALPH W. DOMINGUEZ AGAINST THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD, DATED
SEPTEMBER 8, 1959 WAS REFERRED TO THE BOARD.

MATTER REFERRED TO THE TOWN ATTORNEY AND FRANK J. SMITH, INSUR-
ANCE AGENT FOR THE TOWN.

A COMMUNICATION DATED SEPTEMBER 9, 1959 FROM THE UTICA MUTUAL
INSURANCE COMPANY RELATIVE TO AN INJURY TO VINCENT E. REMPE, A
MEMBER OF THE RIVERHEAD FIRE DEPARTMENT, WAS SUBMITTED TO THE
BOARD. MR. REMPE WAS INJURED WHILE FIGHTING A FIRE AND THE UTICA
MUTUAL IS OF THE OPINION THAT AS THIS INJURY OCCURED WITHIN THE
BOUNDARIES OF THE CALVERTON FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT, COVERAGE FOR
THE INJURY REMAINS THE LIABILITY OF THE TOWN.

ATTORNEY.

SUPERVISOR'S REPORT FOR THE MONTH OF AUGUST, 1959 WAS SUBMITTED
TO THE BOARD AND ORDERED PLACED ON FILE.

A LETTER FROM A.R. ALLAN, JR., PRESIDENT OF FLANDERS FILTERS, WAS READ TO THE BOARD. HE STATED THAT THE TWO "MAILING ZONE, NO PARKING" AREAS IN FRONT OF THE POST OFFICE ON SECOND STREET, DID NOT PROVIDE THE EASIEST MAILING FOR THE GREATEST NUMBER OF PEOPLE. HE SUGGESTED THAT THE CAR MAILING BOXES BE RELOCATED IN ORDER TO PROVIDE MORE EFFECTIVE USE.

LETTER ORDERED FILED. MATTER REFERRED TO THE SUPERVISOR.

A LETTER DATED SEPTEMBER 10, 1959, FROM THE STATE TRAFFIC COMMISSION WAS READ TO THE BOARD DENYING THE REQUEST OF THE BOARD TO PLACE IN FULL OPERATION THE TRAFFIC SIGNAL AT THE INTERSECTION OF ROUTE 25 AND EDGAR AVENUE IN AQUEBOGUE.

LETTER ORDERED FILED.

A LETTER DATED SEPTEMBER 2, 1959 FROM SELDEN HEATLEY, PRESIDENT OF THE WADING RIVER CIVIC ASSOCIATION WAS READ TO THE BOARD, REQUESTING THE ASSISTANCE OF THE TOWN BOARD IN ELIMINATING THE DANGER OF LOW FLYING JET AIRLINERS AT CALVERTON.

LETTER ORDERED FILED.

JUSTICE PIKE OFFERED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WHICH WAS SECONDED BY COUNCILMAN BENEDICT.

WHEREAS, THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD HAS RECEIVED NUMEROUS PROTESTS FROM CIVIC GROUPS AND INDIVIDUALS OF THIS TOWN REGARDING THE USE BEING MADE BY COMMERCIAL AIRLINES OF THE NAVY'S INDUSTRIAL FACILITY AT CALVERTON, N.Y., AND

WHEREAS, THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD AGREES THAT THE USE BEING MADE BY COMMERCIAL AIRLINES OF THE NAVY'S FACILITY CONSTITUTES AN UNJUSTIFIED MENACE TO THE POPULATION OF THIS AREA, AND

WHEREAS, ONE FATAL TRAGEDY HAS ALREADY CLAIMED FIVE LIVES AS THE RESULT OF SUCH COMMERCIAL TRAINING FLIGHT FROM THE NAVY FACILITY, NOW THEREFORE

BE IT RESOLVED, THAT THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD DISAPPROVES THE USE OF THE NAVY FACILITY AT CALVERTON, N.Y., BE COMMERCIAL AIRLINES FOR THE TRAINING OF CREWS FOR SUCH COMMERCIAL AIRLINES, INASMUCH AS THE USE NECESSARILY INVOLVES TRAINING PROCEDURES HAVING INHERENTLY DANGEROUS CONDITIONS, AND

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, THAT THIS BOARD REQUESTS THAT ANY SUCH COMMERCIAL USAGE BE TRANSFERRED TO AREAS REMOTE FROM ANY POPULATION CENTERS, AND

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, THAT COPIES OF THIS RESOLUTION BE FORWARDED TO THE SECRETARY OF THE NAVY, THE CIVIL AERONAUTICS AUTHORITY, AND THE HOUSE AND SENATE ARMED SERVICES COMMITTEES.

THE VOTE---COUNCILMAN STOTZKY, YES, COUNCILMAN BENEDICT, YES, JUSTICE PIKE, YES, JUSTICE ZALOGA, YES, AND SUPERVISOR LEONARD, YES. THE RESOLUTION WAS THEREUPON DECLARED DULY ADOPTED.

COUNCILMAN BENEDICT OFFERED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WHICH WAS SECONDED BY JUSTICE PIKE.

RESOLVED THAT THE LONG ISLAND LIGHTING COMPANY BE AND THEY ARE HEREBY AUTHORIZED TO INSTALL A 100 WATT STREET LIGHT ON POLE, NYT #4, ON RIVERSIDE DRIVE IN THE RIVERHEAD LIGHT DISTRICT.

THE VOTE---COUNCILMAN STOTZKY, YES, COUNCILMAN BENEDICT, YES, JUSTICE PIKE, YES, JUSTICE ZALOGA, YES, AND SUPERVISOR LEONARD, YES. THE RESOLUTION WAS THEREUPON DECLARED DULY ADOPTED.

COUNCILMAN BENEDICT OFFERED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WHICH WAS SECONDED BY JUSTICE PIKE.

RESOLVED THAT THE LONG ISLAND LIGHTING COMPANY BE AND THEY ARE HEREBY AUTHORIZED TO MAKE A SURVEY FOR IMPROVED STREET LIGHTING IN THE AUDREY GARDENS DEVELOPMENT, SITUATE BETWEEN EAST MAIN STREET AND ROUTE 58, IN THE A UEBOGUE LIGHT DISTRICT.

THE VOTE---COUNCILMAN STOTZKY, YES, COUNCILMAN BENEDICT, YES, JUSTICE PIKE, YES, JUSTICE ZALOGA, YES, AND SUPERVISOR LEONARD, YES. THE RESOLUTION WAS THEREUPON DECLARED DULY ADOPTED.

COUNCILMAN BENEDICT OFFERED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WHICH WAS SECONDED BY JUSTICE PIKE.

RESOLVED THAT THE LONG ISLAND LIGHTING COMPANY BE AND THEY ARE HEREBY AUTHORIZED TO MAKE A SURVEY FOR IMPROVED STREET LIGHTING ON 19TH STREET IN THE WILDWOOD ACRES DEVELOPMENT IN THE WADING RIVER LIGHT DISTRICT.

THE VOTE---COUNCILMAN STOTZKY, YES, COUNCILMAN BENEDICT, YES, JUSTICE PIKE, YES, JUSTICE ZALOGA, YES, AND SUPERVISOR LEONARD, YES. THE RESOLUTION WAS THEREUPON DECLARED DULY ADOPTED.

THE TOWN BOARD CONVENEED AS A BOARD OF AUDIT AND EXAMINED ALL BILLS TO DATE, THE TOTAL OF WHICH WAS AS FOLLOWS---GENERAL TOWN---\$7,598.31 AND MACHINERY FUND---\$1,572.15. ON MOTION MADE BY COUNCILMAN BENEDICT AND SECONDED BY COUNCILMAN STOTZKY, IT WAS RESOLVED THAT THE BILLS BE APPROVED AS SUBMITTED. THE VOTE---COUNCILMAN STOTZKY, YES, COUNCILMAN BENEDICT, YES, JUSTICE PIKE, YES, JUSTICE ZALOGA, YES, AND SUPERVISOR LEONARD, YES. THE RESOLUTION WAS THEREUPON DECLARED DULY ADOPTED.

COUNCILMAN BENEDICT OFFERED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WHICH WAS SECONDED BY COUNCILMAN STOTZKY.

RESOLVED THAT THE NEXT MEETING OF THE TOWN BOARD BE HELD SEPTEMBER 21, 1959 AT 8 P.M., THEREAFTER AT THE USUAL TIME AND DATE, FURTHER

RESOLVED THAT THIS MEETING BE ADJOURNEED.
