MINUTES OF A MEETING OF THE TOWN BOARD HELD ON SEPTEMBER 21,  
1959, WERE SUBMITTED TO THE BOARD AND ON MOTION MADE BY COUNCILMAN  
BENEDICT AND SECONDED BY COUNCILMAN STOTZKY, IT WAS RESOLVED THAT  
THE MINUTES BE APPROVED AS SUBMITTED. THE VOTE---COUNCILMAN  
STOTZKY, YES, COUNCILMAN BENEDICT, YES, JUSTICE PIKE, YES, JUSTICE  
ZALOGA, YES, AND SUPERVISOR LEONARD, YES. THE RESOLUTION WAS  
THEREUPON DECLARED DULY ADOPTED.

A PETITION SIGNED BY 96 RESIDENTS OF REEVES PARK, RIVERHEAD,  
WAS SUBMITTED TO THE BOARD OPPOSING THE ERECTION OF A RECREATION  
HALL ON PARK DRIVE, ON A PARCEL OF LAND OWNED BY THE TOWN OF  
RIVERHEAD.

AS NO DEFINATE PLANS HAVE BEEN RECEIVED FROM THE GROUP FAVORING  
THE ERECTION OF SAID RECREATION HALL, PETITION WAS ORDERED FILED.

POLICE REPORT FOR THE MONTH OF SEPTEMBER 1959 WAS SUBMITTED TO  
THE BOARD AND ORDERED PLACED ON FILE.

AN APPLICATION FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF CURBS AND GUTTERS ON

WHEREAS APPLICATION FOR CONSTRUCTION OF CURBS AND GUTTERS HAS  
BEEN MADE BY LAVERE C. DOANE, HEIGHTS PLACE, RIVERHEAD, NEW YORK,  
ADJACENT PROPERTY OWNER.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT CURBS AND GUTTERS SHALL BE  
CONSTRUCTED ALONG HEIGHTS PLACE, ADJACENT TO THE PROPERTY OF LAVERE  
C. DOANE, PURSUANT TO A CONTRACT, THE FORM OF WHICH IS HERETO  
ANNEXED:

TOWN OF RIVERHEAD  
CONTRACT FOR CONSTRUCTION OF CURBS & GUTTERS

TOWN HIGHWAY

THIS AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD, A MUNICIPAL CORPORATION OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, AND LAVERE C. DOANE, HEIGHTS PLACE, RIVERHEAD, NEW YORK, ADJACENT PROPERTY OWNER.

THE TERMS OF THIS AGREEMENT ARE AS FOLLOWS:

1. THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD AGREES TO CONSTRUCT CURBS AND GUTTERS ALONG HEIGHTS PLACE, A TOWN HIGHWAY IN THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD, ADJACENT TO THE PROPERTY OF OWNER HEREIN SET FORTH.
2. THE GRADES AND LINES WILL BE ESTABLISHED BY THE SUPERINTENDENT OF HIGHWAYS.
3. THE MATERIALS WILL BE DELIVERED AND THE LABOR PERFORMED AT TIMES AND IN A FORM AND MANNER SPECIFIED BY THE SUPERINTENDENT OF HIGHWAYS.
4. THE TIME OF COMMENCEMENT AND COMPLETION OF THE WORK SHALL BE DETERMINED BY THE SUPERINTENDENT OF HIGHWAYS.
5. ALL LABOR USED AND ALL MATERIALS FURNISHED SHALL CONFORM TO NEW YORK STATE SPECIFICATIONS.
6. THE REPAIR AND MAINTENANCE OF THE CURBS AND GUTTERS SHALL BE THE OBLIGATION OF THE TOWN.
7. THE ADJACENT PROPERTY OWNER, IN CONSIDERATION OF THESE PRESENTS AND OTHER CONSIDERATIONS HEREIN PERFORMED BY THE SAID TOWN, DO HEREWITH PAY TO THE SAID TOWN THE SUM OF \$74.00, WHICH IS THE SUM TO REIMBURSE THE TOWN FOR THE COST OF THE MATERIALS.

THAT THE EXPENSE TO THE TOWH SHALL NOT EXCEED THE SUM OF \$185.00,

THAT THE SUPERVISOR BE AUTHORIZED TO SIGN THE SAID CONTRACT IN BEHALF OF THE TOWN WHEN THE MONEY TO BE PAID BY THE SAID LAVERE C. DOANE IS TURNED OVER AND THE CONTRACT HAS BEEN SIGNED BY HIM, AND THEN

THAT THE SUPERINTENDENT OF HIGHWAYS BE DIRECTED TO PERFORM THE WORK.

THE VOTE---COUNCILMAN STOTZKY, YES, COUNCILMAN BENEDICT, YES, JUSTICE PIKE, YES, JUSTICE ZALOGA, YES, AND SUPERVISOR LE NARD, YES. THE RESOLUTION WAS THEREUPON DECLARED DULY ADOPTED.

AN APPLICATION FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF CURBS AND GUTTERS AT 15 ACKERLY STREET, RIVERHEAD, N.Y., FROM ANNA L. FOX, WAS SUBMITTED TO THE BOARD.

IT WAS THE CONSENSUS OF THE BOARD THAT THIS MATTER WOULD HAVE TO BE DELAYED UNTIL 1960 AS NO FUNDS ARE AVAILABLE FOR THIS PROJECT IN THIS YEARS BUDGET.

APPLICATION ORDERED FILED.

A COMMUNICATION DATED SEPTEMBER 25, 1959 FROM JAMESPORT DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION WAS READ TO THE BOARD AS FOLLOWS:

"WE WILL MAKE THE NECESSARY CHANGES IN THE DRAINAGE DESIGN AS INSTRUCTED BY THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD PLANNING BOARD AND SUBMIT A REVISED PLAN ACCORDINGLY.

WE HAVE, HOWEVER, A PROBLEM CONCERNING THE REQUIRED 25 FOOT RADIUS ON THE NORTHWESTERLY CORNER OF JAMESPORT AVENUE AND ALSTON ROAD (PROPOSED). WE HAVE APPROACHED THE OWNERS OF THE PROPERTY WITH AN OFFER TO BUY THE LITTLE CORNER THAT WOULD BE CUT OFF BY THE 25 FOOT RADIUS, BUT THEY REFUSE TO SELL AT ANY PRICE.

OUR SURVEYORS, RICHARD WILHELM & ASSOCIATES, HAVE COME UP WITH A SOLUTION. WHILE THE PROPERTY LINE RADIUS WOULD BE 25 FEET, THE CURB RADIUS IS 34 FEET. FROM THE ATTACHED SKETCH, YOU CAN SEE THAT THE 34 FOOT RADIUS CURB WILL MISS THE CORNER OF THE PROPERTY AND STILL GIVE THE REQUIRED RADIUS FOR THE CURB. UNDER THE CIRCUMSTANCES, WE TRUST THAT THIS WILL MEET WITH YOUR APPROVAL."

COMMUNICATION ORDERED FILED AND MATTER WAS REFERRED TO COUNCILMAN BENEDICT AND ALDEN W. YOUNG.

ATTORNEY ISIDORE SCHEINBERG, IN BEHALF OF EDWIN S. LAPHAM, APPEARED BEFORE THE BOARD RELATIVE TO THE DEDICATION OF INDUSTRIAL BOULEVARD AND HINDA BOULEVARD AS PUBLIC HIGHWAYS. HE STATED THAT ALL TOWN REQUIREMENTS RELATIVE TO THE DEDICATION OF SAID HIGHWAYS HAVE BEEN COMPLETED AND THAT MR. LAPHAM HAS CERTIFIED THAT ALL LABOR AND MATERIAL HAS BEEN PAID FOR. HE REQUESTED THAT THE TOWN BOARD RELEASE THE PERFORMANCE AND LABOR AND MATERIAL BOND FILED BY MR. LAPHAM TO GUARANTEE COMPLETION OF SAID ROADS.

JUSTICE PIKE OFFERED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WHICH WAS SECONDED BY COUNCILMAN STOTZKY.

WHEREAS ON JUNE 2, 1959, EDWIN S. LAPHAM, RIVERHEAD, N.Y., FILED A PERFORMANCE AND LABOR AND MATERIAL BOND No. 1S172282, THE AETNA CASUALTY AND SURETY COMPANY IN THE AMOUNT OF TWO THOUSAND (\$2,000) DOLLARS, TO GUARANTEE THE COMPLETION OF TOWN HIGHWAYS KNOWN AS INDUSTRIAL BOULEVARD AND HINDA BOULEVARD AS PER TOWN REQUIREMENTS, AND MATERIALS AND LABOR FOR SAID JOB TO BE FULLY PAID FOR, AND WHEREAS EDWIN S. LAPHAM HAS CERTIFIED BY LETTER TO THE TOWN BOARD THAT ALL MATERIAL AND LABOR FOR SAID JOB HAVE BEEN FULLY PAID FOR, AND

WHEREAS SAID TOWN HIGHWAYS HAVE BEEN COMPLETED TO THE SATISFACTION OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF HIGHWAYS AS PER TOWN REQUIREMENTS, NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT THE CONDITIONS SET FORTH IN BOND #1S172282, THE AETNA CASUALTY AND SURETY COMPANY, BE AND THEY ARE HEREBY DECLARED FULLY SATISFIED.

THE VOTE---COUNCILMAN STOTZKY, YES, COUNCILMAN BENEDICT, YES, JUSTICE PIKE, YES, JUSTICE ZALOGA, YES, AND SUPERVISOR LEONARD, YES. THE RESOLUTION WAS THEREUPON DECLARED DULY ADOPTED.

JUSTICE ZALOGA OFFERED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WHICH WAS SECONDED BY COUNCILMAN BENEDICT.

RESOLVED THAT SGT. ROSCOE PALMER AND SGT. CHESTER ROMANSKI, BE AND THEY ARE HEREBY AUTHORIZED TO ATTEND A FIREARMS SCHOOL AT PEEKSKILL, NEW YORK, OCTOBER 5TH THROUGH 10TH, 1959.

FURTHER RESOLVED THAT ALL NECESSARY EXPENSES BE A TOWN CHARGE.

THE VOTE---COUNCILMAN STOTZKY, YES, COUNCILMAN BENEDICT, YES, JUSTICE PIKE, YES, JUSTICE ZALOGA, YES, AND SUPERVISOR LEONARD, YES. THE RESOLUTION WAS THEREUPON DECLARED DULY ADOPTED.

A LETTER DATED SEPTEMBER 14, 1959 FROM MRS. EDWARD J. KEMPF, WADING RIVER, WAS READ TO THE BOARD PROTESTING THE PARKING RESTRICTION ON THE ROAD IN FRONT OF THE WADING RIVER POST OFFICE.

LETTER ORDERED FILED. MATTER REFERRED TO THE CHIEF OF POLICE.

COUNCILMAN BENEDICT OFFERED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WHICH WAS SECONDED BY JUSTICE ZALOGA.

WHEREAS, IN THE YEAR 1959, THE STATE OF NEW YORK IS CELEBRATING IT'S YEAR OF HISTORY, AND

WHEREAS, ON SATURDAY, SEPTEMBER 26, 1959, A GREAT MANY INDIVIDUALS, CORPORATIONS AND BUSINESS CONCERNS PARTICIPATED IN AN HISTORICAL PARADE IN THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD, AND

WHEREAS, IT WAS THE CONSENSUS OF ALL WHO OBSERVED THIS PARADE THAT IT WAS THE MOST SUCCESSFUL AND IMPRESSIVE EXHIBIT OF ITS TYPE IN THE HISTORY OF THE TOWN, AND

WHEREAS IT IS OBVIOUS THAT THE TREMENDOUS SUCCESS OF THIS VENTURE COULD NOT HAVE BEEN ACHIEVED WITHOUT THE CONTINUED, CONSCIENTIOUS AND DEDICATED EFFORTS OF THE COMMITTEE WHO WORKED SO HARD ON THE PROGRAM AND ALL WHO PARTICIPATED IN IT.

NOW, THEREFORE, ON BEHALF OF THE PEOPLE OF THIS TOWN, BE IT RESOLVED THAT WE ADOPT THIS RESOLUTION OF PRAISE AND APPRECIATION FOR THEIR EFFORTS, AND

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT COPIES OF THIS RESOLUTION BE PREPARED AND FORWARDED TO MRS. JOHN D. HALLOCK, CHAIRMAN, MISS ROSE TERRY, MEMBER, MR. J. HARRY BROWN, MEMBER, MR. WILLIAM J. LEONARD, MEMBER, AND MR. GEORGE O'SIEL, GRAND MARSHAL.

THE VOTE---COUNCILMAN STOTZKY, YES, COUNCILMAN BENEDICT, YES, JUSTICE PIKE, YES, JUSTICE ZALOGA, YES, AND SUPERVISOR LEONARD, YES. THE RESOLUTION WAS THEREUPON DECLARED DULY ADOPTED.

A LETTER DATED SEPTEMBER 28, 1959 FROM THE RIVERHEAD FIRE DEPARTMENT WAS READ TO THE BOARD ADVISING THAT TIMOTHY G. GRIFFING WAS APPOINTED A FIRE COMMISSIONER TO FILL THE VACANCY CAUSED BY THE DEATH OF HUBERT CORWIN.

LETTER ORDERED FILED.

COUNCILMAN BENEDICT OFFERED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WHICH WAS SECONDED BY COUNCILMAN STOTZKY.

RESOLVED THAT RICHARD BENJAMIN, RIVERHEAD, BE AND HE IS HEREBY APPOINTED AS A "LEADER" FOR THE RECREATION DEPT., ON A PART-TIME BASIS AT THE RATE OF \$7.50 PER EVENING.

THE VOTE---COUNCILMAN STOTZKY, YES, COUNCILMAN BENEDICT, YES, JUSTICE PIKE, YES, JUSTICE ZALOGA, YES, AND SUPERVISOR LEONARD, YES. THE RESOLUTION WAS THEREUPON DECLARED DULY ADOPTED.

A NOTICE WAS RECEIVED FROM THE PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION STATING THAT A PUBLIC HEARING WOULD BE HELD ON OCTOBER 14TH, IN NEW YORK CITY, ON THE REQUEST OF THE LONG ISLAND RAIL ROAD COMPANY TO DISCONTINUE LESS-CARLOAD FREIGHT SERVICE AT 38 STATIONS ON LONG ISLAND AND ALSO TO DISCONTINUE PICK-UP AND DELIVERY SERVICE FOR LESS-THAN-CARLOAD FREIGHT AT 64 STATIONS ON LONG ISLAND.

IT WAS THE CONSENSUS OF THE BOARD THAT IF ANY OF THE STATIONS TO BE AFFECTED WERE IN OR CLOSE TO THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD, THAT THIS BOARD SHOULD HAVE A REPRESENTATIVE APPEAR AT THE HEARING AND OPPOSE THE REQUEST.

TOWN ATTORNEY HARDING WAS REQUESTED TO INVESTIGATE THE MATTER FURTHER AND TO APPEAR ON BEHALF OF THE TOWN, IF NECESSARY.

A LETTER DATED SEPTEMBER 24, 1959 FROM REV. HERBERT B PERRY, JR., WAS READ TO THE BOARD RELATIVE TO A HOUSING SURVEY UNDER STATE AUSPICES OF RIVERHEAD TOWN.

LETTER ORDERED FILED.

A LETTER DATED SEPTEMBER 30, 1959 FROM THE CONTINENTAL CASUALTY COMPANY RELATIVE TO THE BOND OF RIVERHEAD DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION TO THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD, REQUESTING A RELEASE OF SAID BOND, WAS READ TO THE BOARD.

LETTER ORDERED FILED AND MATTER WAS REFERRED TO THE TOWN ATTORNEY.

ATTORNEY SETH HUBBARD APPEARED BEFORE THE BOARD AND EXPLAINED THE RECENT SUPREME COURT DECISION AGAINST THE TOWN RELATIVE TO--- NORTHVILLE DOCK CORPORATION, PETITIONER, AGAINST BOARD OF ASSESSORS OF THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD, RESPONDENT, RELATIVE TO THE ASSESSMENT OF PROPERTY OF THE NORTHVILLE DOCK CORPORATION THAT EXTENDS OUT INTO LONG ISLAND SOUND. THE SUPREME COURT RULED THAT THE TOWN HAD NO RIGHT TO ASSESS PROPERTY ON THE SOUND BEYOND THE HIGH WATER MARK.

ATTORNEY HUBBARD WAS OF THE OPINION THAT THE PROPERTY OF THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD EXTENDED OUT TO THE MIDDLE OF THE SOUND. HE RECOMMENDED THAT THE TOWN BOARD APPEAL THE DECISION OF THE SUPREME COURT.

TOWN ASSESSOR J. WILSON STOUT STATED HE WAS ADVISED THAT DUE TO THE FACT THAT THE PROPERTY OF THE NORTHVILLE DOCK CORPORATION EXTENDED OUT INTO LONG ISLAND SOUND AND THAT THE PART EXTENDING OUT INTO LONG ISLAND SOUND BEYOND THE HIGH WATER MARK COULD NOT BE ASSESSED, THAT ADDITIONAL ASSESSED VALUE COULD BE PLACED ON THE UPLAND PROPERTY OF THE NORTHVILLE DOCK CORPORATION. HE STATED THAT IN HIS OPINION THIS WAS RIDICULOUS.

TOWN ATTORNEY HARDING MENTIONED THAT WE SHOULD JOIN WITH OTHERS TO PROPOSE LEGISLATION TO OBIVIATE THIS CASE.

IT WAS THE CONSENSUS OF THE BOARD THAT THE TOWN BOARD RETAIN ATTORNEY HUBBARD TO APPEAL THE DECISION OF THE SUPREME COURT. HE WAS REQUESTED TO LOOK INTO THIS MATTER AND REPORT TO THE BOARD THE APPROXIMATE COST OF SUCH AS APPEAL.

A COMMUNICATION DATED SEPTEMBER 24, 1959 FROM THE STATE TRAFFIC COMMISSION WAS PRESENTED TO THE BOARD TOGETHER WITH A TRAFFIC COMMISSION ORDER ESTABLISHING A 30 MPH SPEED LIMIT ON PARKER ROAD, WADING RIVER FROM MAY 1ST TO SEPTEMBER 30TH OF EACH YEAR.

COMMUNICATION AND ORDER ORDERED FILED.

COMMUNICATIONS DATED SEPTEMBER 25, 1959 AND SEPTEMBER 29, 1959 FROM THE LONG ISLAND LIGHTING COMPANY RELATIVE TO SURVEYS FOR IMPROVED STREET LIGHTING ON PULASKI STREET, PARKWAY STREET AND HAMILTON AVENUE WERE PRESENTED TO THE BOARD.

COMMUNICATIONS ORDERED FILED.

COUNCILMAN BENEDICT OFFERED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WHICH WAS SECONDED BY COUNCILMAN STOTZKY.

RESOLVED THAT THE LONG ISLAND LIGHTING COMPANY BE AND THEY ARE HEREBY AUTHORIZED TO INSTALL FOUR ADDITIONAL 100 CP AERIAL STREET LIGHTS ON HAMILTON AVENUE, SEVEN 100 CP STREET LIGHTS ON PARKWAY STREET (REMOVING ONE), SIX 250 CP STREET LIGHTS ON PULASKI STREET (REMOVING 4-100 CP), ALLIN THE RIVERHEAD LIGHT DISTRICT, AND IN ACCORDANCE WITH LONG ISLAND LIGHTING COMPANY SURVEYS DATED 9/25/59 AND 9/29/59.

THE VOTE---COUNCILMAN STOTZKY, YES, COUNCILMAN BENEDICT, YES, JUSTICE PIKE, YES, JUSTICE ZALOGA, YES, AND SUPERVISOR LEONARD, YES. THE RESOLUTION WAS THEREUPON DECLARED DULY ADOPTED.

COMMUNICATIONS DATED SEPTEMBER 18, 1959 FROM THE LONG ISLAND LIGHTING COMPANY RELATIVE TO SURVEYS FOR IMPROVED STREET LIGHTING ON SUNSET BOULEVARD & SHORT ROAD AND 19TH STREET IN WADING RIVER WERE PRESENTED TO THE BOARD.

COMMUNICATIONS ORDERED FILED.

COUNCILMAN BENEDICT OFFERED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WHICH WAS SECONDED BY COUNCILMAN STOTZKY.

RESOLVED THAT THE LONG ISLAND LIGHTING COMPANY BE AND THEY ARE HEREBY AUTHORIZED TO INSTALL ONE 100 CP AERIAL STREET LIGHT

ON 19TH STREET, AND FOUR 100 CP AERIAL STREET LIGHTS ON SUNSET BOULEVARD AND SHORT ROAD, BOTH LOCATIONS BEING IN THE WADING RIVER LIGHT DISTRICT, AND IN ACCORDANCE WITH LONG ISLAND LIGHTING COMPANY SURVEYS DATED SEPTEMBER 18, 1959.

THE VOTE---COUNCILMAN STOTZKY, YES, COUNCILMAN BENEDICT, YES, JUSTICE PIKE, YES, JUSTICE ZALOGA, YES, AND SUPERVISOR LEONARD, YES. THE RESOLUTION WAS THEREUPON DECLARED DULY ADOPTED.

COUNCILMAN STOTZKY OFFERED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION.

RESOLVED, THAT THE FOLLOWING PROPOSITION BE SUBMITTED AND VOTED UPON AT THE BIENNIAL TOWN ELECTION TO BE HELD IN THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD ON THE 3RD DAY OF NOVEMBER, 1959, FOR THE FOLLOWING PURPOSES AND IN THE FOLLOWING FORM, TO WIT:

"PROPOSITION FOR THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD TO BECOME PART OF THE SUFFOLK COUNTY POLICE DISTRICT, PURSUANT TO THE PROVISIONS OF SUBDIVISION 3 OF SECTION 1207, ARTICLE XII OF CHAPTER 278 OF THE LAWS OF 1958, AND SUBDIVISION 1 (E) OF SECTION 81 OF THE TOWN LAW:

"SHALL THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD AUTHORIZE THE TRANSFER OF ITS POLICE FUNCTIONS TO THE COUNTY POLICE DEPARTMENT OF SUFFOLK COUNTY AND SHALL SAID TOWN BECOME A PART OF THE SUFFOLK COUNTY POLICE DISTRICT?"

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, THAT THE POLLS SHALL BE OPENED AT SIX O'CLOCK IN THE FORENOON AND CLOSED AT SEVEN O'CLOCK IN THE AFTERNOON, AND THAT THE VOTING PLACES SHALL BE AS FOLLOWS:

- 1ST ELECTION DISTRICT - WADING RIVER FIRE HOUSE  
NORTH COUNTRY ROAD, WADING RIVER

FOR THE PURPOSE OF VOTING UPON, AND THAT THE FIRST PUBLICATION OF SAID NOTICE SHALL BE AT LEAST TEN DAYS PRIOR TO THE 3RD DAY OF NOVEMBER, 1959, AND IN ADDITION, THE TOWN CLERK SHALL POST OR CAUSE TO BE POSTED IN FIVE CONSPICUOUS PLACES IN THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD COPIES OF SAID NOTICE AT LEAST TEN DAYS PRIOR TO THE 3RD OF NOVEMBER, 1959.

No one seconded this motion. Councilman Stotzky requested however, that this resolution become part of the minutes for this meeting.

Town Attorney Harding rendered the following opinion relative to this matter.

"Under Section #1207 of the Suffolk County Charter (County Police District: How Established), Paragraph 1, it states as follows: If three or more contiguous towns, by a majority vote cast in each such town, elect to transfer their police functions to the county and to become a part of the County Police District, a County Police District shall thereupon be created effective on the first day of January of the second year following such election and such district shall thereupon become part of and be under the jurisdiction of the County Police Department.

Therefore the County Police District will not be created until January 1, 1960.

Under Paragraph 3 of the same section #1207, it stated as follows: Once a County Police District has been created, any town...contiguous to such County Police District may thereafter elect to become part of the County Police District and upon making such election by the majority vote of the electors of such town...the area comprising such town... shall become irrevocably a part of the County Police District on the first day of January of the second year following such election.

It is evident from the above that a town cannot make its election until the County Police District has been created. That creation does not take place, (become effective), until January 1, 1960. Thus a special town election cannot take place until after January 1, 1960." END.
