COMMUNICATION ORDERED FILED.

JUSTICE PIKE OFFERED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WHICH WAS SECONDED BY JUSTICE ZALOGA.

WHEREAS, FOR HIS ENTIRE LIFE SPAN OF 67 YEARS, DOCTOR HALLOCK LUCE HAS BEEN A RESIDENT OF THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD AND DURING THAT TIME HAS LIVED AN EXEMPLARY LIFE AND HAS BECOME ADMIRER, RESPECTED AND BELOVED BY THE RESIDENTS OF THE TOWN, AND

WHEREAS, FOR 40 YEARS, AS A GENERAL PRACTITIONER IN THE FIELD OF MEDICINE HE HAS MINISTERED WITH CARE TO THE NEEDS OF THE PEOPLE OF THIS COMMUNITY FROM THEIR BIRTHS TO THEIR DEATHS, BOTH REGARDLESS OF THEIR RACIAL AND RELIGIOUS BACKGROUNDS AND ALSO REGARDLESS OF THEIR ABILITY TO PAY FOR HIS SERVICES, AND

WHEREAS, BY BOTH HIS PERSONAL AND HIS PROFESSIONAL LIFE HE HAS BROUGHT CREDIT AND HONOR TO HIS TOWN AND HIS PROFESSION

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, THAT THIS BOARD DECLARE TUESDAY, DECEMBER 8, 1959, TO BE DOCTOR HALLOCK LUCE DAY IN THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD, AND

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, THAT THIS BOARD BY THE PASSAGE OF THIS RESOLUTION AS AN OFFICIAL ACT JOINS WITH THE THOUSANDS OF PEOPLE OF THIS COMMUNITY WHO ARE ON THAT DAY PAYING TRIBUTE TO A MAN WHO SO FULLY DESERVES THIS HONOR.

NOTICE OF CONDEMNATION, UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, PETITIONER-PLAINTIFF, VERSUS 1,108 ACRES OF LAND, MORE OR LESS, IN THE TOWNS OF RIVERHEAD AND BROOKHAVEN, COUNTY OF SUFFOLK, STATE OF NEW YORK AND CHARLES BOTTO, ET AL., WAS SUBMITTED TO THE BOARD AND ORDERED FILED.

A NOTICE OF CLAIM, IN THE MATTER OF THE CLAIM OF SHEILA MILLER, AN INFANT UNDER THE AGE OF 14 YEARS, BY IRVING MILLER, HER GUARDIAN AD LITEM, AND IRVING MILLER AGAINST THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD, COUNTY OF SUFFOLK, WAS SUBMITTED TO THE BOARD AND ORDERED PLACED ON FILE.

A COMMUNICATION DATED NOVEMBER 23, 1959 FROM CARYLE HODGKINSON, WAS SUBMITTED TO THE BOARD, RELATIVE TO THE PURCHASE OF A DRAINAGE AREA ON SOUND AVENUE AT NORTHVILLE.

THE TOWN CLERK WAS INSTRUCTED TO REPLY THAT THE PURCHASE OF SAID DRAINAGE AREA WAS NOT CONTEMPLATED AT THIS TIME NOR IN THE NEAR FUTURE.

COUNCILMAN BENEDICT OFFERED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WHICH WAS SECONDED BY COUNCILMAN STOTZKY.

WHEREAS KENNETH ROWLAND, BY PREVIOUS RESOLUTION OF THIS BOARD, WAS APPOINTED AS "RECREATION DIRECTOR OF THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD", AND

WHEREAS THE TERM OF APPOINTMENT WAS STATED TO BE FOR A PERIOD OF ONE YEAR, COMMENCING JUNE 1, 1959, AND

WHEREAS IT IS DESIRED TO MAKE THE TERM COINCIDE WITH THE FISCAL YEAR OF THE TOWNSHIP,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT THE TERM OF APPOINTMENT OF SAID KENNETH ROWLAND, AS RECREATION DIRECTOR OF THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD, BE EXTENDED TO JANUARY 1, 1961, THAT BEGINNING JANUARY 1, 1960, HIS SALARY BE AT THE RATE OF \$5500.00 PER ANNUM, AND THAT THE PROVISIONS AND DUTIES OF THE APPOINTMENT IN ALL OTHER RESPECTS REMAIN THE SAME.

A PETITION SIGNED BY OVER 200 PERSONS, WAS SUBMITTED TO THE BOARD, FOR THE INSTALLATION OF ELECTRIC FIELD LIGHTS FOR THE PURPOSE OF HAVING NIGHT SOFTBALL GAMES ON THE TOWN RECREATION FIELD ON PULASKI STREET. MATTER REFERRED TO JUSTICE PIKE.

PETITION ORDERED FILED.

SUPERVISOR LEONARD REPORTED ON THE DREDGING OF THE CREEK AT WADING RIVER AS REQUESTED BY PETITION. HE STATED THAT THE MATTER WAS DISCUSSED AT THE COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISOR'S MEETING AND THAT THE MATTER WAS REFERRED TO THE COUNTY DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS FOR SURVEY AND COST ESTIMATE.

MRS. MARY FAIRLEY APPEARED BEFORE THE BOARD AND SUBMITTED A REPORT OF THE NOMINATING COMMITTEE FOR THE RECREATION COMMISSION. NAMES SUBMITTED WERE AS FOLLOWS: LAWRENCE F. SCUDDER, JOHN BENEDICT, ROBERT BURNS, RITA SIMANDL AND MARY FAIRLEY.

SHE STATED OTHER NAMES WOULD BE WELCOME AND IF ANY, TO SUBMIT THEM BY DECEMBER 14, 1959.

COUNCILMAN BENEDICT OFFERED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WHICH WAS SECONDED BY JUSTICE PIKE.

RESOLVED THAT JAMES FEEHAN, RIVERHEAD, BE AND HE IS HEREBY APPOINTED DOG ENUMERATOR FOR THE TOWN FOR THE YEAR 1960, TO BE COMPENSATED ON A FEE BASIS, PURSUANT TO SECTION 123, AGRICULTURE AND MARKETS LAW.

THE VOTE---COUNCILMAN STOTZKY, YES, COUNCILMAN BENEDICT, YES, JUSTICE PIKE, YES, JUSTICE ZALOGA, YES, AND SUPERVISOR LEONARD, YES. THE RESOLUTION WAS THEREUPON DECLARED DULY ADOPTED.

COUNCILMAN BENEDICT OFFERED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WHICH WAS SECONDED BY JUSTICE PIKE.

RESOLVED THAT THE SUM OF \$4,000.00 BE TRANSFERRED FROM THE GENERAL TOWN CURRENT SURPLUS ACCOUNT TO ITEM No. 4, MISCELLANEOUS ACCOUNT OF THE TOWN HIGHWAY FUND.

THE VOTE---COUNCILMAN STOTZKY, YES, COUNCILMAN BENEDICT, YES, JUSTICE PIKE, YES, JUSTICE ZALOGA, YES, AND SUPERVISOR LEONARD, YES. THE RESOLUTION WAS THEREUPON DECLARED DULY ADOPTED.

ALDEN W. YOUNG REPORTED THAT HE AND THE SUPERINTENDENT OF HIGHWAYS HAD MADE AN INSPECTION AND SURVEY IN THE MATTER OF THE ROAD LINE ON SOUND ROAD, WADING RIVER, IN FRONT OF THE PROPERTY OF FRANK BOENIG AND MRS. EDWARD J. KEMPF AS PER COMPLAINT OF MRS. KEMPF ON NOVEMBER 17, 1959.

MR. YOUNG STATED THAT STAKES HAVE BEEN PLACED ON THE SIDE LINES OF THE HIGHWAY AT SAID LOCATION. AFTER STAKES WERE PLACED, FURTHER INSPECTION REVEALED THAT ON THE EAST SIDE MR. BOENIG COULD NOT PARK SCHOOL BUSES ON HIS LAND WITHOUT A PORTION OF BUS BEING WITHIN THE LIMITS OF THE HIGHWAY. ON THE WEST SIDE OF THE ROAD, A SIDEWALK, WHICH IS SURFACED WITH TAR, IS WITHIN THE LIMITS OF THE HIGHWAY. FURTHER THAT A FEW SIGNS ARE POSTED ALONG SOUND ROAD WITH THE LEGEND "NO PARKING ON THIS ROAD 10 A.M. TO 6 P.M."

A MEMORANDUM RELATIVE TO SAID INSPECTION HAS BEEN FILED WITH THE SUPERVISOR AND IT WAS THE CONSENSUS OF THE BOARD THAT A COPY OF THIS MEMORANDUM BE GIVEN TO THE POLICE DEPARTMENT FOR APPROPRIATE ACTION.

A DISCUSSION WAS HELD RELATIVE TO THE RESOLUTION SUBMITTED BY THE PLANNING BOARD TO THE TOWN BOARD ON AUGUST 18, 1959 REGARDING THE ACCEPTANCE OF STREETS AS PUBLIC HIGHWAYS. ON THAT DATE SAID RESOLUTION WAS ORDERED FILED IN THE TOWN CLERK'S OFFICE.

JUSTICE PIKE OFFERED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WHICH WAS SECONDED BY JUSTICE ZALOGA.

RESOLVED THAT THE RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE PLANNING BOARD AS OUTLINED IN A RESOLUTION DULY ADOPTED BY IT ON AUGUST 5, 1959, SUBMITTED TO THE TOWN BOARD ON AUGUST 18, 1959 AND FILED IN THE TOWN CLERK'S OFFICE REGARDING THE ACCEPTANCE OF STREETS AS PUBLIC HIGHWAYS, BE AND THEY ARE HEREBY ACCEPTED BY THIS BOARD.

THE VOTE---COUNCILMAN STOTZKY, YES, COUNCILMAN BENEDICT, YES, JUSTICE PIKE, YES, JUSTICE ZALOGA, YES, AND SUPERVISOR LEONARD, YES. THE RESOLUTION WAS THEREUPON DECLARED DULY ADOPTED.

THE TOWN BOARD CONVENED AS A BOARD OF AUDIT AND EXAMINED ALL BILLS TO DATE, THE TOTAL OF WHICH WAS AS FOLLOWS: GENERAL TOWN---\$13,662.26 AND MACHINERY FUND---\$698.03. ON MOTION MADE BY COUNCILMAN STOTZKY AND SECONDED BY COUNCILMAN BENEDICT, IT WAS RESOLVED THAT THE BILLS BE APPROVED AS RENDERED. THE VOTE---

COUNCILMAN STOTZKY, YES, COUNCILMAN BENEDICT, YES, JUSTICE PIKE,
YES, JUSTICE ZALOGA, YES, AND SUPERVISOR LEONARD, YES. THE
RESOLUTION WAS THEREUPON DECLARED DULY ADOPTED.

MEETING ADJOURNED TO MEET ON DECEMBER 15, 1959 AT 9:30 A. M.
