

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, held in the Town Office, Wednesday, February 13, 1929 at 2 P. M.

Charles O. Downs, Town Superintendent of Highways was present.

The minutes of the meeting of the Town Board held January 30, 1929 were read and on motion and vote approved.

A letter was read from the Long Island Railroad Company in regard to the procedure necessary to obtain permission to run a road drainage pipe under the railroad tracks at the Sweezy Avenue crossing and this letter was referred to the Superintendent of Highways for reply.

A communication was read from Lucas & Sanford in reference to a bill in the amount of \$108.25 for moving hydrants on Main Street. The opinion of the Board being that this was a charge against the Water District, and not against the Town, the Town Clerk was instructed to advise Lucas & Sanford accordingly.

Robert Cunningham and Edwin M. Lockwood spoke in favor of improving OLD COUNTRY ROAD and the Superintendent of Highways advised that while there was not enough money available to properly condition this road, he would take steps to improve the road to the best of his ability.

The resignation of William B. Walters, Jr. as Special Constable effective as of January 31, 1929 was presented and on motion duly made, seconded and carried it was Resolved that the resignation of William B. Walters, Jr. as Special Constable be accepted and placed on file.

A bond was presented bonding William B. Walters, Jr. as Constable and the Supervisor thereupon approved said bond and it was ordered placed on file.

A letter was read from George W. Hildreth, Attorney, requesting the consent of the Town Board for permission to connect the mains of the Riverside Water District with the

mains of the Riverhead Water District. This matter was held over until the next meeting of the Town Board.

The matter of the bill which had been presented and passed in the Assenbly and Senate at Albany, regarding the Howell M. Reeve Park was taken up and on motion duly made, seconded and carried it was Resolved That this meeting adjourn to reconvene Thursday P. M. at 8 o'clock for the purpose of considering and taking some action in regard to this bill.
