

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, held in the Town Office, Wednesday, March 13, 1929 at 2 P. M.

The minutes of the meeting of the Town Board held February 27, 1929 were read and on motion and vote approved.

THE DETERMINATION AND AGREEMENT FOR THE EXPENDITURE OF HIGHWAYS MONEYS as presented by the Superintendent of Highways was duly approved.

A petition for a street light on Parkway Street and a petition for three arc lights on West Main Street and three lights on Marcy Avenue were presented and referred to the Lighting Committee, for investigation.

The opinion of Cecil B. Tooker regarding the application of the N. Y. Telephone Company to use the highways in the Town of Riverhead, was read and ordered placed on file.

The committee appointed on locating a site for a Town Hall advised having received several offers for building sites.

A certified copy of an order of the Public Service Commission of the State of New York, was received in reference to petition of Swezey's Bus Line, Inc., and ordered placed on file.

A communication was received from the Calverton Company, Inc., in reference to a site for the Town Dump and referred to the Committee having this matter in charge.

A communication was read from the War Department advising of the application of Martin J. Vomatzski of South Jamesport for a permit to construct a removable pier at South Jamesport in the Great Peconic Bay.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was Resolved that the Town purchase the voting machine which was loaned to the Town of Riverhead for the last election, from the Automatic Registering Machine Company, Inc., of Jamestown, N.Y. and be it further

Resolved That in payment of said voting machine, the Supervisor is hereby authorized, empowered and directed to pay to the Automatic Registering Machine Company, Inc., the sum of Nine Hundred Forty (\$940.00) Dollars.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was Resolved that the Water District Election for the purpose of electing a Water Commissioner for a term of three years in the place of Ellis S. Duvall whose term will expire on the 16th day of April 1929, will be held in the Town Office on April 8, 1929 from the hours of 1 P. M. to 3 P.M.

No record of Marcy Avenue having been found in the Town Records, on motion duly made, seconded and carried it was Resolved that an opinion from counsel be obtained as to whether Marcy Avenue is a Town Highway and if not, if the Town may accept same as a Town Highway

J. Harry Brown addressed the Board advising of plans being formed to hold a Village Celebration at the time of the dedication of the County Court House and the Henry Perkins Hotel and celebrating the opening of the Middle Island State Highway and requested that the Town Board endorse the plans for the celebration.

On motion duly made, seconded and unanimously carried it was Resolved that this Board endorse the plans now being formed for holding a Village Celebration at the time of the dedication of the County Court House, the dedication of the Henry Perkins Hotel and celebrating the opening of the Middle Island State Highway.

There being no further business, on motion and vote, the meeting adjourned.
