

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, held in the Town Office, Wednesday, March 27, 1929 at 2 P. M.

Charles O. Downs, Town Superintendent of Highways was present.

The minutes of the meeting of the Town Board held March 13, 1929 were read and on motion and vote adopted.

A petition was presented by Al Trahern for a license under the provisions of Section 221 of the Town Law to conduct and operate a dramatic stock company in a chautauqua tent in the Town of Riverhead.

Mr. Trahern addressed the Board and requested that action be taken on the petition as soon as possible.

The petition of Mr. Trahern for a license was referred to a committee consisting of Justice Burnside and Justice Penny for investigation.

A communication was read from Ann G. Hill requesting the Board to issue a permit for operating and maintaining a dance hall at Calverton, N.Y.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was RESOLVED That the application of Ann G. Hill for a license to operate and maintain a dance hall at Calverton be and the same hereby is held over until the result of her trial is known.

Carl F. Peterson, Fire Chief, addressed the Board advising that he had been appointed by the Fire Commissioners to come before the Board and suggest that the proposed Town Hall be erected in conjunction with a new fire house using the site of the Second Street Fire House and land bordering on the north thereof, fronting on Third Street for the combined building. This matter was referred to the committee having the matter of a town site in charge.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was Resolved That the Supervisor and the Town Clerk be and they hereby are authorized and directed to borrow upon certificate of indebtedness, the sum of Four Thousand (\$4000)

Dollars, to pay on account of audited bills of March 26, 1929.

J. Harry Brown addressed the Board and invited the members of the Board to a Public Meeting to be held April 4, 1929 at the High School Auditorium, the purpose of the meeting being to organize for the proposed Village celebration.

The lighting committee acting on petitions, recommended that one 80 C. P. street light be installed on pole 2 on Parkway Street and two 80 C. P. street lights be installed on Marcy Avenue south of the Railroad track and that the 80 C. P. street light near the abutment of Marcy Avenue and West Main Street be replaced with a 600 C. P. street light of the arc type.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was Resolved that the Lighting Company be instructed to install one 80 C. P. street light on pole 2 on Parkway Street, two 80 C. P. street lights on Marcy Avenue, south of the L.I. Railroad tracks and to install one 600 C. P. arc light on West Main Street near the abutment of Marcy Avenue with West Main Street, replacing the 80 C. P. light now in use near this point.

Requests having been made that the street light in the South Jamesport Lighting District be moved from near the barn of Howard Downs to Point Street between Second Street and Third Street, on motion duly made, seconded and carried it was Resolved that the street light be moved from near the barn of Howard Downs, within the South Jamesport Lighting District to Point Street between Second Street and Third Street.

There being no further business, on motion and vote the meeting adjourned.
