

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, held in the Town Office, June 26, 1929 at 2 P.M.

The minutes of meetings of May 29, 1929 and June 17, 1929 were read and on motion and vote approved as read.

A communication was read from the War Department relative to application of J. T. Fanning for a permit to dredge a portion of Peconic Bay near his property at Aquebogue, N.Y.

A letter was read from the Riverhead Polish Independent Club relative to curbs and gutters, paving Marcy Avenue north of tracks to Cemetery Street, changing the name of Cemetery Street and the condition of Hamilton Avenue between Lincoln and Cemetery Streets after a heavy rain. These matters having the attention of the Board, the Town Clerk was instructed to acknowledge receipt of the letter and advise accordingly.

A letter was read from the Division of Highways, State of New York, advising that the State would accept the Coram-Middle Island East Highway No. 8291 within twenty days unless protest against the acceptance be made by the Town authorities in writing.

A petition was received and read from residents and taxpayers of Calverton calling the attention of the Board to the condition of West Middle Road, Twomey Avenue, Deep Hole Road and Reeves and said petition was referred to Charles O. Downs for investigation.

Mr. Reuben Lipetz addressed the Board and requested that the Board look into the condition of the curb line on the north side of his property on Elton Street, Riverhead.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was Resolved That the Supervisor and the Town Clerk be and they hereby are authorized to borrow upon certificates of indebtedness, the sum of Forty One Hundred (\$4100.00) to pay on account of audited bills of June 25, 1929

On motion and vote it was Resolved That the Board obtain an opinion from Attorney Cecil B. Tooker, relative to the powers of the Town Board in restricting building within the Town.

Mr. A.O. Smith, County Engineer, was present and advised the Board that the cost of the contemplated work under the Lowman Act Money within the Village of Riverhead, was in excess of the maney available because of the grading and the necessity of installing several catch basins <sup>drain</sup> <sub>pipes</sub>

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was RESOLVED That the Town Superintendent of Highways co-operate with the Town and County Engineer and build the roads, within the Village of Riverhead, designated under the Lowman Act, according to specifications and be it further Resolved That the Supervisor and the Town Clerk be and they hereby are authorized and directed to borrow upon certificates of indebtedness, a sum not to exceed \$2500.00 to pay for additional cost of said work.

On motion and vote, it was decided to hold a meeting of the Town Board on Wednesday, July 17, 1929 at 2 P.M.

There being no further business, on motion and vote, the meeting adjourned.
