Supervisor Janoski: "Under unfinished business, we have a special permit application of River Center Associates for a family recreation center which is still under consideration by the Town Board.

The special permit application of Barney's Trailer Service, expansion of an existing park which will be addressed in part this evening in resolution #607.

The special permit application of Dr. J. Franzone for a physician's office is before the Planning Board.

The special permit application of Hallandia Associates for multiple dwelling is under consideration.

Supervisor Janoski continues:  
wishes to address the Town Board at this time? Bill?"

Bill Nohejl, Wading River; "First of all, I'd like to thank the Town Board and their wives for coming and joining in the festivities in Wading River over the past weekend. We enjoyed having you.

In reference to the Farm Bureau's request to hear that the definition of agriculture be changed to coincide with the New York State. There's a small list pertaining to the horse farms. Lately here we are very disturbed about Mrs. Foley saying that can be in an agricultural zone — I mean industrial zone. We don't believe that that should be so. We believe that it should be in this farm area, the residential farm area. It doesn't necessitate being in an industrial zone.

Now recently, I understand Mr. Entenman wishes to have a place on Sound Avenue, or purchase a place on Sound Avenue. That originally was in an industrial zone. But it is now in an agricultural-residential zone. How are we going to treat this one? I think that the animals, the thoroughbreds that are taken care of on these farms are better taken care of than some of the children around town. I believe that they are one of the most clean and they require no services from the town except the highway department. They don't even need schools because they train them on sight. And I feel as though they should not be put into an industrial zone, a requirement industrial zone.

I feel as though Mrs. Foley has been harassed to the extreme. And I think that there should be some consideration given to people of this type. If these types of farms — horse farms are necessary to be in an industrial zone, why isn't some of our riding stables in an industrial zone? We have them on Sound Avenue in agricultural-residential areas. They are operating. Why are these allowed to operate, if things like this need a special area? I'm asking."

Supervisor Janoski: "Are you asking a question?"

Bill Nohejl: "Yes, I'm asking."

Supervisor Janoski: "The raising of horses for commercial purposes under the present situation does require industrial zoning. I agree with you Bill that that should not be the case. A riding stable is a permitted use under that type of zoning, and I certainly hope that in the next short period of time, that that will be addressed by the Town Board in changing that zone."

PERSONAL APPEARANCES - continued

Bill Nohejl: "Because a riding stable is commercial to an extent too. They do it for money."

Supervisor Janoski: "No argument from me, Bill. I agree with you."

Bill Nohejl: "So that's why the Farm Bureau states, I think that agriculture should be, the town should follow the law of the state on the agricultural part. I know a lot of people like to see horses. But a lot of people don't like the horse manure. But the horse manure on these places, the odor is kept to a minimum and I think that the insects are kept to a minimum. And as far as horse manure is concerned, there is a great demand for horse manure on the farms. Any farmer in the vegetable line would gladly take it and use it. So there would be no storage and collection of horse manure. I believe that we should encourage this, especially on the north shore here, keep it a rule and I think it's one of the clean types of business. It's a non-nuisance business.

Has anything more been heard from the Fire Department in Wading River?"

Supervisor Janoski: "I read in the paper that they have come back and said the 550 was all right. I have no communication."

Bill Nohejl: "You have no communication. So there's nothing. I can't make any comments on it."

Supervisor Janoski: "There's been no response to our inquiry."

Bill Nohejl: "No response to it. Was there some discussion about the old schoolhouse in Calverton being redone?"

Supervisor Janoski: "The Senior Citizens Club of Wading River has raised that as a possibility. I don't know Bill. We're trying to look at it, see what it would involve. But it's one of the things the Town Board is considering it as a possibility for a community center."

Bill Nohejl: "No that has been done and knocked to hell. It was done for a purpose there at one time and knocked to hell. I'm definitely against that place being refurbished again."

PERSONAL APPEARANCES - continued

Supervisor Janoski: "Should it become a serious consideration, Bill I'm sure you'll know about it and we'll hear from you. It is not right now being seriously considered as the site, it's one of the possibilities that was raised by the senior citizens club of Wading River so that it's an obligation that we have to look at it."

Bill Nohejl: "Okay if there's anything I think of later, I'll be back up."

Supervisor Janoski: "Thank you Bill. Is there anyone else who — Dick?"

Dick Benedict, Fanning Blvd, Riverhead; "I've been reading an awful lot about how many sumps we've got in Riverhead lately, and how expensive they are and everything. I'd just like to say that I don't believe it would be fair to have a referendum on sumps since the bond has already been floated and I don't think we have too many sumps first of all, and second of all, I don't know anybody in their right mind that would vote for sumps unless they had a problem. So to ask 90% of the people to come out to vote against the other 10%, I don't think is fair. And if you don't live in a low lying area, you're not concerned about water problems. But the Town of Riverhead has plenty of water problems. Some of the big projects that were just completed were mostly paid for by the County. And some of the other ones have been needed for years. So I don't think a referendum is the answer. And I think if we stir it up again, we're going to undo a lot of good things. Thank you."

Supervisor Janoski: "Thank you Dick. Anyone else who wishes to be heard at this time?"

No one wished to be heard at this time."

WHEREAS, the applicant has revised its environmental impact statement in response to the written comments filed, and

WHEREAS, consideration by this Board of the Draft Environmental Impact Statement, filed in support of this application, is limited to the facts and circumstances surrounding this application. Specifically, this Board notes the prior approval of the Department of Health on the question of sewerage and the ability to serve the proposed site with public water. The verbal and written comments uttered to this draft statement relate materially to the underlying issues of water and sewers. This Board finds that the amended draft statement as so qualified by its particular circumstances, fulfills the requirements of law and this Board.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it

RESOLVED, that this Board does hereby approve the amended Draft Environmental Impact Statement as filed by Barney's Trailer Service to be the Final Statement herein limited to its scope to the matters which are subject to this Board's jurisdiction and control, and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Town Clerk be and is hereby authorized to forward said statement to the appropriate agencies in accordance with Section 617.10(d) of SEQR.
