fire safety zones. You might think of these as no unloading zones, the area is directly in front of the store fronts. We do have a letter from the Riverhead Fire Department, which I'll turn over to the Town Clerk at this time, which came into our office requesting that the Harrows Shopping Center, the Woolco Shopping Plaza and the Center Country Steer Shopping Center be included with the fire and safety zones.

And a letter from the Wading River Fire Department indicating the King Kullen Plaza, Route 25A, the Village Market and Stadnicki's Plaza. These various plazas are the ones covered by the proposed code amendment. Basically, the code amendment provides that in the areas of the parking plaza contiguous to the buildings that would be the front of the buildings, if the parking plaza continues along the side and down into the back, it would also include going down the side and around to the back. There's an additional amendment to include a no parking zone along the area contiguous and in the front of the Riverhead Railroad Station. We did not need the request from the Fire Department for those and that one is merely brought forward as a recommendation."

Supervisor Janoski: "Thank you Mr. Town Attorney. Is there anyone present who wishes to address the Town Board on this matter? Mr. O'Neil."

James O'Neil, owner of general store, which is called the Village Market there. I would like to read — I have at this time, got permission to allow cars to park up to ten minutes."

Irene J. Pendzick, Town Clerk: "Excuse me Mr. O'Neil, I don't think your mike is on. If you would push the button towards you on the top up. There it is. Thank you."

James O'Neil: "Did you get what I said before. My name is O'Neil. We have permission to allow cars to park for ten minutes, and in our opinion, that's an emergency. We are not blocking traffic, because there is about a four-lane parking area right at the front of the stores and in the event of a fire, it wouldn't be like a shopping area (at this time the tape was changed & then continues) — a quart of milk or a loaf of bread, and — without leaving their children in a parking space. So we would like you to take under consideration, at this time, in our opinion, we are not causing any fire hazard or any blocking of traffic. That's all."

Supervisor Janoski: "Thank you Mr. O'Neil. Is there anyone else present who wishes to address the Town Board? Mr. Nohejl?"

Bill Nohejl, Wading River; "I think this is long overdo in the King Kullen Shopping area. It has never been enforced, I understand because of Mr. Serota's and the difficulties with the Town. Will this, by passing this ordinance, would you need Mr. Serota's permission? No? As one of my neighbors of Wading River recently stated there has been parking in the main artery coming into the shopping center. That I would like to see strictly enforced, because at 8:30, 9:00, cars park on both sides of that main artery right in front of the delicatessen, pizza place there. And a person — I saw a person just nonchalantly park in between them, figuring it was a parking place and that whole center drive was blocked up. And I am very much in favor of this ordinance in the shopping center. Thank you."

Supervisor Janoski: "Thank you Bill. Dick?"

Dick Benedict, Fanning Blvd, Riverhead; "I remember when the signs were changed in all the other parking areas in Riverhead to include no standing. They went through the trouble to take the old ones down and put up no standing, so the law could be enforced. I happen to be there one day and there were three cars parked in front of Woolco and a police officer came by and I asked him why he didn't do something. He said well I intimidate him by being in the parking lot and if I didn't like the way he was doing his job, I could see his superiors. So if we're going to make an ordinance, I wish we would enforce it because the same thing happens in front of A & P. Thank you."

Supervisor Janoski: "Thank you Dick. Is there anyone else present — Mr. Kasperovich?"

William Kasperovich: "I tried to get acquainted with what was involved in this particular item . . ."

Irene J. Pendzick, Town Clerk; "Bill, we know you, but my secretary won't."

"Excuse me. All right. My name is William Kasperovich. I live on 15th Street in Wading River. I went to the Town Clerk's Office and asked to see whatever papers were on file with regard to this item. I went down to the Wading River Fire Department, nothing.

Now when amendments of this order come up and we know once they're put on the books, they stay there for the rest of our lives, that we should get into specifics. And here, as I sit here tonight, this seems like a catchall type of thing thrown together in an all inclusive manner. I think this is not the approach. Now we're dealing with people who we need in the community to function with. But at the same time, they're a commercial enterprise and as long as they are making a profit, they don't care what's happening out at the curb. Now there's a reasonable approach to being at the curb. Different times of the year, different weather conditions, what have you. And we should have it spelled out specifically and enforced specifically. If it's a catchall inclusive type thing, what the hell. If it's raining cats and dogs, I'm not going to get my family wet. I'm going to park over and stand over there to get them with their bags coming out the door. We've got to spell these things out to the letter and enforce it in a practical sense. It's very nice to be all inclusive and save a lot of paper work and spelling out. And once it gets on the books, it's there forever. And I see this thing should be spelled out exactly and to the point such keeping in mind that we will enforce. And if we don't feel that we're going to spend the police money and the time of the police to enforce, then we should modify it to that extent. Thank you."

Bill Nohejl: "All right. Now what happens to the five years? Between '77 to '82? Is it gradus?"

Councilman Prusinowski: "They've been paying."

Bill Nohejl: "The last one ran to fifty years from '27 to '77. Now what happened to the five years? You made a new one from today — you're submitting a new one. What happened to the five years? This is my question, that time, when, when they were here."

Richard Ehlers, Town Attorney: "The fee is outside of the control of the Town Board. It's controlled by the State Public Utility Commission and it's been collected yearly and would continue to be collected regardless of whether or not the Town Board passed this resolution or not. This is merely, more or less a bookkeeping. . ."

Bill Nohejl: "Okay."

Richard Ehlers: "Purpose — the primary purpose of the agreement revolves around their duty to re-construct and maintain properly the streets when they dig them up and that's included in this agreement."

Bill Nohejl: "Well I wish they . . ."

Richard Ehlers: "The fee that they pay is controlled by state law and the Board couldn't defect it, even if they wanted to."

Bill Nohejl: "Okay."

Richard Ehlers: "We have copies of documents they've submitted substantiating their fee. I think it was in several hundreds of thousands of dollars per year."

Bill Nohejl: "Okay, I was just wondering what happened to the five years. Because that's very important."

Now, one other question. What are the five — new town employees going to be doing?"

PERSONAL APPEARANCES - continued

Supervisor Janoski: "Department of Highway work, which ranges from laborer to driving trucks to any number of things."

Bill Nohejl: "Very nice. Now, I suggest that you take the men off the private sanitation that is going around Town here, and put them onto that kind of work. The picking up of the leaves, the grass, the shrub. Now it's happening in Wading River, taking it off of one side of the street and throwing it on the other side of the street, then calling the Town to pick it up. Am I entitled to do this, throw it out in front on the street? Is anybody entitled to it? Or just certain areas?"

Supervisor Janoski: "It is against the law to put anything in the streets of the Town of Riverhead."

Bill Nohejl: "So why do it? Why not take those men that you've — I suggest that you rescind this resolution. Take those men off of that private sanitation and put them on to Highway Department work like I suggested a year ago. Now you're adding onto the Town, more expense and giving certain people privileges that other people of the Town do not have. Now if I threw all my grass clippings and garbage out in the street there, the guys around my area would hang me. But I can come down Howell Avenue here, every time I come to a Board Meeting and see one night it's cleaned up, the next night it's the same thing out there again. Naturally, the Town has to be two or three times a week coming down picking that stuff up. Those men could be doing Highway work, not private sanitation work. I suggest that you rescind that resolution, truthfully. Thank you."

Supervisor Janoski: "Thank you Bill. Bob?"

Bob Tomlinson, Wading River: "I see on the agenda that resolution 444, appoints Joseph Loughlin, the current Deputy Assessor to the position of Assessor to fill out the unexpired term left by Mr. Crump's resignation. I'm happy to see this Republican majority follow the example set last December by a Democratic Board and if you'll recall, that at that time, the Board filled the vacancy in the Tax Office by appointing the Deputy Tax Receiver, Mrs. Dottie Jermusyk to the position of Tax Receiver. The Deputy has asked at that time to publicly state that she would not run for Receiver in November, this coming November. In the pursuit of fairness, I assume that the same promise has been extracted from Mr. Loughlin. Is that so?"

Supervisor Janoski: "If you were part of the deal, Bob, to bargain away an individuals right to run for office, so be it."

Councilman Prusinowski: "At the time, we had a meeting in the Supervisor's Office and it was stated that if Dorothy Jermusyk were to assume the position of Tax Receiver to fill the unexpired term which is coming up this November for election, December 31, I asked Dottie Jermusyk and she said she would not be a candidate for either party and I said at that time, that as far as the Republican Party was concerned, we would not run her in the election, she would not run. . ."

Bob Tomlinson: "Then there is not an agreement made between yourselves and the — anybody on this Board? You, Mr. Lombardi, do you ever remember anything being entered into agreement with Dorothy Jermusyk in respect to her not running for election this year?"

Councilman Lombardi: "The only thing I remember and know of, is Dottie would not run under the Democrats or the Republicans. She would not run for office."

Bob Tomlinson: "Did anybody ask her to publicly state that?"

Councilman Prusinowski: "I did. Because when we were — sitting next to me, I turned to Dottie, Doc was on my right side, and I said Dottie, are you going to run for office — will you run for office? She said no and at that point, Doc said well we got to make sure that each party puts up their own candidate in November and I said I agree with you, and Dottie agreed to that. Councilman Artale: "I feel that if the person wants to run, that he certainly is — he's got that privilege."

Bob Tomlinson: "How about you Mr. Boschetti?"

Councilman Boschetti: "I have no problem with it. If she wants to run or anyone wants to run."

Bob Tomlinson: "And you certainly have no problem with that."

Councilman Lombardi: "I have no problem."

Bob Tomlinson: "Then — in the future, we won't restrict anybody when we name them. If we're going to make a purely political appointment and that's what it is, if I was on the Board, I'd be making mine. I don't want to enter into any agreement to disenfranchise somebody from running for election in the future."

Supervisor Janoski: "I don't see how it's possible."

Bob Tomlinson: "Well you did."

Supervisor Janoski: "I didn't."

Bob Tomlinson: "Oh I'm sure that Mrs. Jermusyk thinks so, and that she's not supposed to be running this November and I'm sure that with what Mr. Prusinowski said at one of the last Town Board Meetings in respect to the Highway Superintendent's job, that quite a few other people feel that way. Mr. Prusin — you're looking at me quizzically. Mr. Prusinowski stated that in all fairness, the Deputy would be named and take over — and the people in the Town of Riverhead would decide in November."

Councilman Prusinowski: "I did say that. And also I want to point out that there was a mechanism here to avoid having an election for this vacant post in this November by simply waiting a number of weeks. We waited exactly less than two weeks for the petitions to be filed and time could run out. Mr. Berger informed me at Bluepoint on Thursday night that he wanted the vacancy created because if we waited too long, we would miss having a special election for this position and I feel, again as I felt on the other position, that it's up to the people who should be their next assessor."

Bob Tomlinson: "How about. . ."

Councilman Prusinowski: "Mr. Loughlin is the Deputy. He's done a fine job, in fact, Mr. Stakey came around when Charlie resigned and asked both — Harold, Charlie & Leroy asked me if it would be possible to talk to the Town Board to appoint Mr. Loughlin because, we have a grievance going on now and we have other things and to keep the continuity in flow of the office going and we thought it was in our best interest to do that and for the Town."

Bob Tomlinson: "I think it is in the best interest of the Town to — it's a logical appointment to have Mr. Joe Loughlin sitting on the Board of Assessors. I'm just sorry that he's changing his registration and going with your party."

Listen, I'd also like to take this opportunity while I'm here to do a little something like my friend Bill Nohejl

does, and that is to talk about Wading River. I'd like to congratulate the Board or Jimmy DeLucca, who's ever responsible for the cleanliness of the King Kullen Shopping Center in Wading River up until about three months ago, it never was clean. And I'd like to leave at that positive note. Thank you."

Supervisor Janoski: "Thank you. Mr. — Mr. Kasperovich."

William Kasperovich: "Thank you. My name is William Kasperovich, 15th Street, Wading River. This might not seem like any big thing, but because of the time elements and I'm trying to take advantage of a point in time, and the subject is our relationship with the County Road Department. I have felt for many many years that we never get the right treatment."

Supervisor Janoski: "What relationship are you talking about Bill? There's the absence of a relationship."

William Kasperovich: "Just bear with me and I'm using Hulse Landing Road as an example because what I told you late this morning. . ."

Supervisor Janoski: "You're going to tell us all over again."

William Kasperovich: ". . . is happened and that is nothing. They came in, they did a one-shot affair and disappeared. No. So let me start for the people that don't know. Monday morning, the Suffolk County Highway Department started to repave with hot topping by paving and rolling about two inch thick through Sound Avenue to the entrance of Wildwood State Park which is designated as Route — County Road 54. It's more or less a half mile long. It starts at a Town Road and it ends at a Town Road. Now Monday morning they started and they paved the east side of the road. Today, they finished up by paving the west side of the road. Okay, well and good. However, where they meet us at Sound Avenue and we've been fighting the water puddle through many, many winters. We just, now this — have a puddle over a new paved area. They didn't engineer joining us whatsoever. The side of the Fire House Annex, apron they just went right on by. On the west side, we have roads abutting the highway. They did not go to their right-of-way. They just went down the strip on a

straight line and nothing to where the roads were abutted.

I contend that being that it is a County Road, that their paving should go to the edge of the right-of-way. Wherever there's an existing road, or apron or whatever existing facility there is, we cannot go onto the County Road to do work, but they can do it on their own work and this is within the right-of-way of the County Road. Now this is no big thing, but I feel this is an opportunity for us to get into the Suffolk County Highway Department to where they are more cooperative in joining our existing facilities where they're in the middle of us. And here we have a good example to go with them to say well how come fellows, you do down the line and you ignore our roads and you ignore our intersection and you don't engineer the puddles that you have with our roads. You just put new paving under the water.

Now I think we got to bring this to their attention. We got to get the people. I don't know whether they do this intentionally or by budget or by what have you. But all I know is that we get a half job because they don't meet the existing surfaces at the ends and at the sides. And I don't think we should let it go unnoticed. Whether we make any headway with them, it's another story. But I don't think we should let it go unnoticed and we should stay on top of this so that in the many other areas that they work, that it's not just down their strip and the hell with the Township. So the thing I bring — for that reason, I bring this to the Board's attention and ask that they get on top of the Suffolk County Highway Department because this would then be a meaningful thing for the many other places that the same kind of thing is involved. I think I've said it all."

Supervisor Janoski: "Thank you Bill. I can't resist the opportunity of pointing out that probably an action that would alleviate the problem of the County and it's performing the works within the Township. Probably one of the best actions that could be taken, would be the elimination of the Suffolk County Legislature and the return to the Supervisors because we in the ten towns recognize what problems exist and what work should be done and how it should be done and having the D.P.W. back again under the control of the Supervisors of the Towns. It'd probably go a long way towards alleviating this problem of a separate entity to which I've written about four letters this week, asking for things that — like you've mentioned, and usually I don't even get a return, an acknowledgement of the letter, but I understand the problem and I will, once again, concerning what you bring up. Is there anyone — Mrs. Tomlinson."
