

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Hall on Wednesday, August 1, 1951 at 2:00 P.M.

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board held on July 18, 1951 were read and on motion and vote were duly adopted.

A communication was read from the Riverhead Lions Club thanking the Board for its cooperation in relocating the benches on West Main Street for the convenience of the bus passengers. The communication was ordered placed on file.

A communication was read from the Long Island Lighting Company acknowledging receipt of a request for the installation of a street light on pole #2-5 on Hallett Street and also appreciating calling their attention to the trees which need trimming and that orders have already been issued to do this work. The communication was ordered placed on file.

A communication was read from the New York State Traffic Commission advising that an order prohibiting parking or standing for a distance of 525 feet along the south side of West Main Street west of Raynor Avenue has been issued to the Dept. of Public Works and that, that Department will erect the signs. The communication was ordered placed on file.

A communication to Police Chief Stephen Grodski from Mr. T. Harold Forbes, Publisher of The News-Review, stating the following complaints: 1) Beer trucks blocking entrance to parking lot on Peconic Avenue. 2) Trucks double parking on Main business streets. The communication was ordered placed on file and the matter referred to the Chief of Police.

A communication was read from Mr. George W. Hildreth calling the Board's attention to the incorrect lighting of the Peconic River Buoy lights. The communication was ordered placed on file.

A communication was read from the Board of Supervisors inclosing a resolution fixing Monday, November 26, 1951, as the date of the meeting of that Board at which taxes for the next fiscal year will be levied. The resolution was ordered placed on file.

The Police report for the month of July, 1951 was submitted to the Board and on motion and vote was accepted and ordered placed on file.

On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Yousik it was Resolved, that Norman J. Bruen be and he hereby is appointed Attendance

Supervisor for School Districts Nos. 1,2,3,4,12 and 13 in the Town of Riverhead for the year 1951-52, and further

RESOLVED, that Howard A. Wells be and he hereby is appointed Attendance Supervisor for School Districts Nos. 8,9,10 and 11 in the Town of Riverhead for the year 1951-52 and be it further

RESOLVED, that their compensation be fixed at the rate of \$250.00 per year each, payable in ten monthly payments, which compensation shall include all expenses other than those incurred when attending meetings outside of the Town of Riverhead, called by the District Superintendent of Schools, at which time actual expenses are to be paid. The Vote, Justices Warner, Yousik and Gatz Yes, Supervisor Kelly Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

The following resolution was made by Justice Yousik and seconded by Justice Warner,


WHEREAS, it has been called to the attention of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, that the users of County Highway #58 have difficulty at night in detecting the presence of the traffic circle at the intersection of County Highway 58 and Roanoke Avenue, Town of Riverhead, and

WHEREAS, this Board feels that this may be due to improper placement of the warning signs along the approaches or the lack of illumination of the traffic circle, now therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the Suffolk County Highway Department be requested to make a survey of the situation in order that it may be corrected. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board present.

The Town Board then convened as a Board of Audit and examined all town bills to date, the totals of which were as follows: General Town Fund-\$825.88, Highway Machinery Fund-\$384.13.

There being no further business on motion and vote the meeting adjourned to meet on Wednesday, August 15, 1951 at 2:00 P.M.
