

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Hall on Tuesday, July 3, 1956 at 10:00 A.M.

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board held on June 19, 1956 were submitted to the Board and on motion made by Councilman Benedict, and seconded by Justice Pike, it was Resolved that the minutes be approved as submitted. The Vote---Justices Pike, Harding and Zaloga, Yes; Councilman Benedict, Yes; Supervisor Leonard, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Mrs. Stotsky, owner of a rooming house on the north side of Court Street, Riverhead, appeared before the Board and requested that the No Parking Restriction be lifted on the south side of Court Street opposite her rooming house. A suggestion was offered limiting this No Parking restriction to the hours of 9 A.M. to 5 P.M.. The matter was referred to the Highway Committee.

Mr. Grant Adams, Osborne Avenue, Riverhead, owner of a parcel of property adjacent to property in control of Robert Harrigan, Riverhead Metals Inc., opposed the granting of a junk license to Mr. Harrigan. The matter was adjourned to July 17th to allow Mr. Adams additional time for preparation of his complaint.

Mr. William Vail of Calverton filed a plan relative to a trailer park. Mr. Vail was to refile his plan with a stamp of approval by the Suffolk County Board of Health. This matter then to be referred to the Riverhead Town Planning Board.

Mr. Michael Parisi, Calverton, N.Y., manager of a trailer park, known as "Barney's Trailer Park," appeared before the Board relative to an extension of this trailer park. Mr. Parisi was requested to submit plans as regards the park as it presently is and also show the proposed extension. Chief of Police Grodski submitted a report of an inspection that he made at this trailer park on June 28, 1956. The report was placed on file.

WHEREAS, these roads have been completed to the full satisfaction of the Superintendent of Highways of the Town of Riverhead,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that this Bond be returned to Mr. Dewey Lewin for cancellation. The Vote---Justices Pike, Harding and Zaloga, Yes; Councilman Benedict, Yes; Supervisor Leonard, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

The Police Report for the month of June 1956 was submitted to the Board and ordered placed on file.

A communication was read to the Board from the Board of Fire Commissioners, Jamesport Fire District, advising that Mr. Bruno Doroski, Main Street, Jamesport, N.Y., was appointed for the position of Inspector under the Multiple Residence Law. The communication was placed on file.

On motion made by Justice Pike and seconded by Justice Harding, it was Resolved that Mr. Bruno Doroski, Main St., Jamesport, N.Y. be appointed Inspector under the Multiple Residence Law for the Jamesport Fire District, retroactive to June 26, 1956, to be compensated at the rate of \$2.50 per hour for an inspection as directed by the Town Board. The Vote---Justices Pike, Harding and Zaloga, Yes; Councilman Benedict, Yes; Supervisor Leonard, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

The Town Board adjourned to reconvene at 2:00 P.M.

The Town Board reconvened at 2:00 P.M. with all members of the Board present.

Justice Pike made the following resolution which was seconded by Councilman Benedict:

RESOLVED, that the following be appointed custodians at the following Riverhead Town Bathing Beaches for the 1956 season, commencing on June 30th, 1956 and continuing through Labor Day at the following salaries:

Reeves Park	Perry Wiesen	\$60.00 per week
Iron Pier Beach	Robert Doroska	\$40.00 per week

The Vote---Justices Pike, Harding and Zaloga, Yes; Councilman Benedict, Yes; Supervisor Leonard, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

On motion made by Justice Pike and seconded by Justice Zaloga, it was Resolved that Charles Jehle be appointed a member of the Riverhead Town Planning Board, term to expire on January 1, 1961. The Vote---Justices Pike, Harding and Zaloga, Yes; Councilman Benedict, Yes. Supervisor Leonard, Yes. Resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Justice Harding made the following resolution which was seconded by Justice Pike:

Resolved that the hourly rate ^{of pay effective 7-1-56} ~~of~~ ^{of} Rudy Madzeian, an employee of the Riverhead Town Highway Department, be increased from \$1.50 per hour to \$1.60 per hour. The Vote---Justices Pike, Harding and Zaloga, Yes; Councilman Benedict, Yes; Supervisor Leonard, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Justice Pike made the following resolution which was seconded by Councilman Benedict:

RESOLVED that in connection with proposed extension of Riverhead Fire District, this Board meet jointly and act concurrently with the Southampton Town Board at the Riverhead Town Hall at Roanoke Avenue, Riverhead, New York, on July 17, 1956, at 11:00 o'clock in the forenoon of that day to consider and take action upon the petition presented to the Clerk of this Board on June 27, 1956, for the extension of Riverhead Fire District. The Vote---Justices Pike, Harding and Zaloga, Yes; Councilman Benedict, Yes. Supervisor Leonard, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Justice Harding made the following resolution which was seconded by Justice Zaloga:

RESOLVED that with respect to proposed extension of Riverhead Fire District, notice of hearing for the hearing scheduled to be held on July 17, 1956, at 11:00 o'clock in the forenoon at Riverhead Town Hall, Riverhead, New York, be given by publication of a notice of hearing, a copy of which is hereto annexed and made a part hereof in the News-Review of Riverhead, New York, on a publication date not less than 10 days nor more than 20 days before July 17, 1956, and that the Town Clerk shall cause 5 copies of the annexed notice of hearing to be posted conspicuously in different places within a territory affected not less than 10 nor more than 20 days before July 17, 1956. The Vote---Justices Pike, Harding and Zaloga, Yes; Councilman Benedict, Yes; Supervisor Leonard, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

The Town Board convened as a Board of Audit and examined all Town bills to date, the totals of which were as follows: General Town Fund---\$3,495.61 and Highway Machinery Fund ---\$1,151.24. On motion and vote it was Resolved that the bills be approved as rendered.

There being no further business on motion and vote the meeting adjourned to meet on Tuesday, July 17, 1956 at 10:00 A.M.
