

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Hall on Wednesday, September 5, 1951 at 2:00 P.M.

Due to the absense of Supervisor Kelly, Justice Warner was duly elected Chairman of the meeting.

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board held on August 15, 1951 were read and on motion and vote were duly adopted.

Mr. Maloney representing the Reeves Park Civic Association addressed the Board and requested more police protection in the vicinity of Reeves Park during the summer season. He called the Board's attention to the number of animals and jeeps which run along the beach and suggested that the Lifeguard be deputized in order that he may have more authority on the beach. He also inquired whether or not the use of Reeves Beach and the picnic ground could not be regulated especially where there are so many transients from out of town using them. The Board advised that it would look into the above matters.

A delegation of Business Men from East Main Street appeared before the Board and discussed the problem of loading and unloading merchandise into their places of business where they have no rear loading entrances. The Board advised that it would study the problem and try to find some solution.

A communication was read from Frank J. Smith stating that some time ago the Board authorized the preparation of a map of the Town showing the areas within three miles of the firehouse as measured along regularly travelled highways and that copies of this map were submitted to the Suburban Division of the New York Fire Insurance Rating Organization with the result that a substantial saving in insurance cost has been effected on non commercial risks lying outside the Riverhead Fire District but within three miles of a firehouse. The communication was ordered placed on file and that a letter of thanks be sent to Mr. Smith for his part in obtaining the lower rates.

A communication was read from Mr. P. J. Czaja, Financial Secretary of the Polish National Alliance requesting permission to hold a Carnival on the Fair Ground property during the week of June 10, 1952. The communication was ordered placed on file.

On motion made by Justice Leonard and seconded by Justice Gatz it was Resolved that the Polish National Alliance of Riverhead be granted permission to hold a carnival on the Fairgrounds during the week of June 10, 1952, subject to the rules and regulations governing the use of town owned and controlled property. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board present.

A petition signed by fourteen residents and taxpayers, residing on Roanoke Avenue, was submitted to the Board requesting that the speed limit on Roanoke Avenue, north of Route 58, up to approximately 1200 feet north of Middle Road be fixed at 30 miles per hour and that necessary signs be placed at appropriate positions, so that the speed limit may be observed by all motorists. The petition was ordered placed on file.


On motion made by Justice Yousik and seconded by Justice Gatz it was Resolved that the New York State Traffic Commission be requested to establish a 30 M.P.H. speed zone on Roanoke Avenue ~~for the distance~~ ~~#####~~ north of Route 58, up to approximately 1200 feet north of Middle Road in the Town of Riverhead and that Alden W. Young C.E. be authorized to prepare the necessary map. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board present.

On motion made by Justice Leonard and seconded by Justice Yousik it was Resolved that the Supt. of Highways be authorized to attend the Supt. of Highways Convention to be held at Buffalo, N.Y. on September 12, 13 and 14, 1951 and that all his necessary expenses be paid. The Vote, Justices Warner, Yousik, Gatz and Leonard Yes, Supervisor Kelly absent. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

The Police report for the month of August 1951 was submitted to the Board and on motion and vote was accepted and ordered placed on file.

The Town Board then convened as a Board of Audit and examined all town bills to date the totals of which were as follows: General Town Fund \$1,203.78, Highway Machinery Fund-\$490.75.

There being no further business on motion and vote the meeting adjourned to meet on Wednesday, September 19, 1951 at 2:00 P.M.
