AWARDS BID FOR DRAINAGE FACILITIES - OSBORN AVENUE

Councilman Lombardi offered the following resolution which was seconded by Councilman Prusinowski.

WHEREAS, the Town Clerk of the Town of Riverhead has duly advertised bids for storm drainage facilities at Osborn Avenue that were opened on November 1, 1979, and

WHEREAS, the engineering firm of Holzmacher, McLendon & Murrell, P. C. has advised the Town Board that the apparent low-bidder was Mid-Isle Excavating Co., but that due to omission of several bid prices, an error in computations, the bid of Mid-Isle Excavating Co., is technically invalid, and

WHEREAS, the engineering firm of Holzmacher, McLendon & Murrell, P. C. has recommended that the bid for the construction of storm drainage facilities at Osborn Avenue be awarded to Stetler Bros. Contracting Corp. in the amount of \$180,270.00 for the following reasons:

1. Poor references received for All-Island Drainage, Inc.
2. The superiority of reinforced concrete pipe over corrugated steel pipe.
3. The relatively minor cost difference of \$10,660.00 between the corrugated steel pipe price and the reinforced concrete pipe price.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it

RESOLVED, that the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead hereby awards the bid for storm drainage facilities at Osborn Avenue for the alternate total bid sum of all items, (except 2A, 2B, 2C, 2D\*\*, 2E\*\* and 2F) to Stetler Brothers Contracting Corp., Brentwood, New York at the bid price of \$180,270.00.

Before the Roll Call Supervisor Janoski stated:

"Before we vote on this I want to say that we did put this off from the previous meeting of the Board because we wanted to look at it more closely.

We have talked with our engineers and had some discussions about the enlarging of the present sump. It was pointed out to us that that enlargement indeed was considered in the original thoughts about this problem. Not being possible because of a number of reasons, one because the area was at one time a landfill to the North.

Supervisor Janoski continues:

Also the problem of not being able really to expand it to the extent that was necessary to carry the water that is sometimes involved there."

Councilman Lombardi stated: "I did go around today and I know the area quite well. I was checking our own sump on Youngs Avenue and to widen that either way, North or South is not going to do the job for the water that's coming off Osborne Avenue or coming off the farm lands. The only way I can see any help for the trailer park or all of Osborn Avenue is by putting this sump in."

WHEREAS, the leave of absence granted Deputy Town Clerk, Elizabeth Edwards creates the need for a clerk-typist in the office of the Town Clerk, and

WHEREAS, The Town Clerk has submitted the name of Barbara Grattan to fill the position of Clerk-Typist as a thirty (30) day temporary employee, and

WHEREAS, Barbara Grattan has submitted her letter of resignation as a part-time employee in the Assessor's Office, effective February 1, 1980,

NOW, THEREFORE, be it

RESOLVED, that this Town Board does hereby accept the resignation of Barbara Grattan as a part-time employee in the Assessor's Office, and terminates here in that position as of February 1, 1980, and

ALSO RESOLVED, that Barbara Grattan, be and is hereby appointed to the position of clerk-typist with the Town Clerk's Office as a thirty day temporary employee, effective February 4, 1980 at a salary of \$3.95 per hour.

REQUESTS COOPERATION OF STATE OFFICIAL FOR PASSAGE IN LEGISLATURE OF WADING RIVER HISTORIC CORRIDORS BILL

Supervisor Janoski offered the following resolution which was seconded by Councilman Regula.

WHEREAS, the Wading River Civic Association has petitioned this Town Board to designate North Country Road (Parker Road) from Sound Avenue to the Ponds, and Sound Road from the Ponds to the Long Island Sound and Wading River Road, from Route 25-A to its intersection with North Country Road, as a scenic and historic corridor, and

WHEREAS, the Town Board finds that such designation would be in the best interest of the Town, and

WHEREAS, such a designation requires enabling legislation,

NOW, THEREFORE, be it

RESOLVED, That this Town Board does hereby request State Senator, Kenneth LaValle to introduce and obtain passage by the New York State Legislature of a Bill authorizing this Board to designate certain areas of Wading River as Historic Corridors.

TOWN BOARD MEMORIALIZES ARMY CORPS OF ENGINEERSRE: SWAN LAKE GOLF COURSE APPLICATION

Supervisor Janoski offered the following resolution which was seconded by Councilman Regula.

WHEREAS, the Riverhead Town Board views the construction of the Swan Lake Golf Course at Manorville, New York as a project in the best interest of the people of Riverhead, and

WHEREAS, the proposed Swan Lake Golf Course, in our view, would have little impact on the environment, and would stabilize a green area into the future, and

WHEREAS, the Swan Lake Golf Course offers to Riverhead a recreational facility representing a business endeavor much needed in the economic recovery of the community, and

WHEREAS, the Town Board sees the opportunity of making Riverhead a more attractive place to work and live, and

WHEREAS, the Riverhead Planning Board and the Conservation Advisory Council have expressed favorable opinion on the project,

NOW, THEREFORE, be it

RESOLVED, that the Riverhead Town Board memorializes the Army Corps of Engineers to act favorably toward this application.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that authorization for the Town Clerk to publish said notice in Newsday on January 30, 1980, is hereby granted.
