RESOLVED, that the Board does hereby prepare and approve as the preliminary budget of this Town for the fiscal year beginning on the 1st day of January, 1957, the itemized statement of estimated revenues and expenditures hereto attached and made a part of this resolution, and be it further

RESOLVED, that such preliminary budget shall be filed in the office of the Town Clerk where it shall be available for inspection by any interested person at all reasonable hours, and be it further

RESOLVED, that this Board shall meet at 11:00 A.M. on the 7th day of November, 1956, at the Town Hall, Riverhead, New York, for the purpose of holding a public hearing upon such preliminary budget, and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Town Clerk give due notice of such public hearing in the manner provided in Section 113 of the Town Law, and that such notice be published in substantially the following form:
