

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Hall on Wednesday, October 17, 1951 at 2:00 P.M.

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board held on October 3, 1951 were read and on motion and vote were duly adopted.

Notice of Public Hearing in the matter of the petition for the establishment of an ~~#####~~ Extension of the Lighting District known as JAMESPORT LIGHTING DISTRICT NO 2 in the Town of Riverhead was read.

Proof of publication and affidavit of posting the above notice pursuant to law were submitted to the Board and on motion and vote were ordered placed on file.

Supervisor Kelly thereupon declared the hearing open and anyone who wished could be heard at that time.

No one having appeared wishing to be heard on the above petition the hearing was declared closed.

On motion made by Justice Gatz and seconded by Justice Yousik it was Resolved that the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead hereby establishes an extension of the Lighting District known as Jamesport Lighting District No 2 at Jamesport in the Town of Riverhead, pursuant to a petition for the same filed herein with the Clerk of the Town of Riverhead on September 19, 1951, this petition being duly executed and acknowledged by resident owners owning taxable property aggregating at least one-half of the assessed valuation of all the taxable property in the extension which is shown on a map filed with the petition, the said extension of said District being described as follows:-

All that certain parcel or tract of land at Jamesport, in the Town of Riverhead, County of Suffolk and State of New York, bounded and described as follows:

Southerly by the line of the Jamesport Lighting District No. 2; westerly by a line distant 300 feet west and parallel to the westerly line of Manor Lane; Northerly by the northerly line of School District No. 9 of the Town of Riverhead, commonly known as Jamesport School District; Easterly by a line distant 300 feet east and parallel to the easterly line of Manor Lane.

The Vote, Justices Warner, Yousik, Gatz and Leonard Yes, Supervisor Kelly Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Two communications/were read from the Long Island Lighting Company advising that on August 9, 1951, four 600 C.P. underground street lights were placed in operation on the Old Country Road in front of the Central Suffolk Hospital in the Riverhead Lighting District, as indicated on an inclosed sketch and that on September 26, 1951, one 100 C.P. areal street light was placed in operation on Hallett Street in the Riverhead Lighting District, as indicated on an inclosed sketch. The communications were ordered placed on file.

dated October 2, 1951

A communication/was read from the State Department of Public Works, Bureau of Town Highways and County Roads advising that the projects submitted for state aid conform with the requirements of the Town Ten-Year Highway Improvement Program and listed the accepted projects with assigned numbers for future use. The communication was ordered placed on file.


A communication was read from Mr. George K. Morell inquiring if something can be done about removing the parking meter directly north of his main entrance to his garage at 49 Peconic Avenue, Riverhead, N.Y. The communication was ordered placed on file.

On motion made by Justice Yousik and seconded by Justice Warner it was Resolved that the Town of Riverhead purchase^a triangular parcel of land at the corner of Tuthill's Path and Church Lane, Aquebogue for the sum not to exceed \$75.00. The Vote, Justices Warner, Yousik, Gatz and Leonard Yes, Supervisor Kelly Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Gatz it was Resolved that the Town of Riverhead purchase 1 Cushman Tricycle Scooter for the parking meter man for the sum not to exceed \$385.00 including the trade in value of the old scooter. The Vote, Justices Warner, Yousik, Gatz and Leonard Yes, Supervisor Kelly Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

The Town Board then convened as a Board of Audit and examined all town bills to date, the totals of which were as follows: General Town Fund-\$2005.06, Highway Machinery Fund-\$37.61.

There being no further business on motion and vote the meeting adjourned to meet on Wednesday, November 7, 1951 at 2:00 P.M.
