

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Hall on Wednesday, November 7, 1956 at 10:00 a.m.

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board held on October 16, 1956, were submitted to the Board and on motion made by Justice Pike and seconded by Councilman Benedict, it was Resolved that the minutes be approved as submitted. The Vote---Justices Pike and Zaloga, Yes; Councilman Benedict, Yes and Supervisor Leonard, Yes. The Resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Notice of Public Hearing in regard to the Repeal of certain ordinances of the Town of Riverhead was submitted to the Board and ordered placed on file.

Supervisor Leonard thereupon declared the Hearing open and anyone who wished could be heard.

No one having appeared for or against the repeal of these certain ordinances, the Hearing was then declared closed.

On motion made by Justice Pike and seconded by Councilman Benedict, it is hereby,

RESOLVED that the following ordinances are hereby repealed

as ordinances of the Town of Riverhead, New York, and that they are of no further effect or force after due publication and posting of this Resolution:

1. Repeal of an ordinance licensing and regulating the running of trailer camps, tourist camps, or other similar establishments within the Town of Riverhead, dated August 30, 1939.
2. Repeal of an ordinance regulating the operation of a junkyard, dated August 30, 1939.
3. Repeal of an ordinance regulating the hawking and peddling of goods or produce in the Town of Riverhead, dated April 13, 1938.

The Vote---Justices Pike and Zaloga, Yes; Councilman Benedict, Yes and Supervisor Leonard, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Councilman Benedict made the following resolution which was seconded by Justice Pike:

RESOLVED, that the Chief of Police be authorized to solicit sealed bids for a 1957 Police Car for the Riverhead Town Police Department. The Vote---Justices Pike and Zaloga, Yes; Councilman Benedict, Yes and Supervisor Leonard, Yes. The Resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Justice Pike made the following resolution which was seconded by Councilman Benedict:

RESOLVED that Receiver of Taxes, Charles Allen Horton, shall furnish an official undertaking in the amount of Twenty-Five

Thousand (\$25,000) Dollars, conditioned upon the faithful performance of his duties, shall be further conditioned that he will well and truly keep, pay over and account for all moneys and property coming into his hands as such receiver of taxes and assessments, including all school district taxes, as Receiver of Taxes of the Town of Riverhead, and it is further

RESOLVED, that the Town Board approves the undertaking #568480, Charles Allen Horton, Receiver of Taxes, principal, and The Travelers Indemnity Company, surety, in the sum of Twenty-Five (\$25,000) thousand Dollars.

The Vote---Justices Pike and Zaloga, Yes; Councilman Benedict, Yes and Supervisor Leonard, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

A communication was read to the Board dated October 29, 1956 from the Long Island Lighting Company relative to the installation of lights on Hallock Street and Roanoke Avenue. Councilman Benedict reported that he would like to meet with a representative from the Long Island Lighting Company to further discuss this matter and the Town Clerk was instructed to inform the Long Island Lighting Company to have their representative contact Councilman Benedict.

A communication dated October 24, 1956, was read to the Board from Constantine King of Riverhead as follows:

"In connection with a home being constructed by me on Peninsula Path, Riverhead, N.Y. , I am making application to you at this time for the dedication of the road as a town highway of the Town of Riverhead, N.Y. Hereto attached is a map showing the road which is to be dedicated to the

Town of Riverhead. I trust that this matter will be given your very earliest attention." After discussion, it was decided that this road does not conform with the requirements under road dedication regulations. The Town Clerk was instructed to write Mr. King and inform him that the road was not the proper width as shown on the map that he submitted with his letter.

Justice Pike made the following resolution which was seconded by Justice Zaloga:

RESOLVED that Mr. Philip D. Stapon, Main Road, Aquebogue, N.Y., be and he hereby is appointed as one of two Dog Enumerators for the Town of Riverhead for the year 1957 to be compensated on a fee basis for each dog enumerated as set up by the Department of Agriculture and Markets. The Vote---Justices Pike and Zaloga, Yes; Councilman Benedict, Yes and Supervisor Leonard, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Mr. Louis Dormand of Riverhead appeared before the Board. He felt that the No-Parking Restriction in front of the mail box drop on the south side of Second Street was not necessary and created a hazard in an already congested area. He further felt that some thought should be given to relocating this particular type of mailbox on a one-way street, which would be more accessible for mailing purposes from an automobile without the driver having to get out of his car. It was decided that the Supervisor discuss this matter with the Riverhead Postmaster and report back at the next meeting.

A new map of the F. & F. Trailer Park in Wading River was submitted to the Board. A map of this trailer park was previously

submitted and was turned down by the Planning Board because it was lacking in certain details as required by the Trailer Park Ordinance.

The new map was referred to the Planning Board.

The Planning Board submitted a map of a study that they have made relative to a proposed parking area for the Pulaski Street Shopping Center. Certain areas on this map were marked suitable for this proposed parking area and the Planning Board has requested real estate broker, Frank J. Smith, to furnish them with the fair market value of the desirable locations. The matter was held over to the next meeting.

A communication dated October 18, 1956 from the Corp of Engineers, U. S. Army, was read to the Board relative to the application of Thomas D. Reilly, 9000 Hollis Court Boulevard, Queens Village, N.Y., for Department of the Army approval of plans of existing jetties in Flanders Bay, about 900 yards east of Reeves Creek, at Aquebogue, Town of Riverhead, Suffolk County, New York. A map showing the location of these jetties was printed on the reverse side of this communication. No action was taken and the communication was ordered placed on file.

The Supervisor's Report for the month of October 1956 was submitted to the Board and ordered placed on file.

The Police Report for the month of October 1956 was submitted to the Board and ordered placed on file.

A communication dated October 19, 1956 from the Reeves Park Estates Civic Association was read to the Board as follows;

"This time of year we are all home in our local residence. We do enjoy our summers at Reeves Beach and this past summer has been no different we certainly enjoyed ourselves.

I am writing at this time so we could be included in your next town budget. Our problem is that the beach is loaded with rocks and we had quite a few accidents. Such as cut feet, legs and hands. Some of the rocks are large and some are sharp edged. We are asking you and your Board to take our problem up and see if you can get a bull-dozer there to clean up our beach.

The next thing is that all cars including our residents must buy a sticker for parking near the beach. This is fine we are not complaining about this, but our guests should have the right to park there without paying. We would like to have Guest Tickets or cards to give them the privileges of our beach. Please try to compromise with us and help us solve this problem."

It was the opinion of the Board that the request under Paragraph #2 would be given consideration in the spring of 1957. In regard to Paragraph #3 regarding guest beach stickers, the Board decided that no action would be given to this request.

Proof of Publication of Ordinance No.7, Peddlers Ordinance was submitted to the Board and ordered placed on file.

A petition dated October 24, 1956, bearing 198 names from the Wading River Civic Association was submitted to the Board. This petition read as follows:

"WHEREAS, the Town of Riverhead has improved for highway purposes, a portion of land opposite the public parking field at Wading River, which land is claimed to be privately owned, and

WHEREAS, parking has not been controlled due to the apparent conflict of ownership, and

WHEREAS, no municipally owned walkway is provided adjacent to the stores at this site to the end that pedestrians, and especially children, in frequenting the stores are often placed in peril by being compelled to mingle with carelessly parked automobiles,

NOW, THEREFORE, we the undersigned legal residents of the hamlet of Wading River, in the Town of Riverhead, hereby petition the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, to immediately acquire whatever additional land may be necessary, preferably by negotiation, but by condemnation if necessary, in order that the existing highway shall be municipally owned and controlled and a reasonably suitable walkway provided."

After discussion it was decided that the Board request Frank Firth, owner of a ^{property} ~~store~~ opposite the public parking field, in Wading River, to personally appear before the Board on November 20, 1956, to further discuss this matter.

A communication dated October 19, 1956, from the State Traffic Commission was read to the Board relative to a request by the Town Board to the State Traffic Commission for the establishment of a 30 m.p.h. speed restriction from County Road #58 northerly along Roanoke Avenue to Sound Avenue. It was the feeling of the State Traffic Commission that they could find no reason to create such a speed restriction within the aforementioned area. The communication was placed on file.

A communication dated October 19, 1956 from the State Traffic Commission was read to the Board stating that

the State Traffic Commission is giving consideration to a parking prohibition of 100 feet on the northerly side of Pulaski Street in the area of the school walkway as requested by the Town Board. The communication was ordered placed on file.

Justice Pike made the following resolution which was seconded by Justice Zaloga:

IN THE MATTER OF THE PETITION FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF AN EXTENSION OF A LIGHT DISTRICT IN THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD, SUFFOLK COUNTY, NEW YORK.

WHEREAS, a written petition, dated October 20, 1956, in due form and containing the required signatures has been presented to and filed with the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, Suffolk County, New York, for the establishment of an extension of a Light District in the said Town, to be bounded and described as follows:-

BEGINNING, at a point on the southerly line of a realty subdivision, known as "Mill Brook Gables", map of said subdivision being filed in the office of the Clerk of Suffolk County, distant 200 ft. westerly of the westerly line of East Main Street, and running thence from said point of beginning southerly along the boundary line of the Aquebogue Light District No. 1, said boundary line being parallel and distant 200 ft. westerly of the westerly line of East Main Street, to a point on the southerly line of the lands of H. & D. Kratoville; thence westerly along the southerly line of the lands of H. & D. Kratoville, of I. Karwaski, and of Satterly to a point in the center line of Saw Mill Brook; thence northerly along the center line of Saw Mill Brook to the northwest corner of the land of Riverhead Duck Processing Cooperative, Inc; thence easterly along the division line between the lands of Riverhead Duck Processing Cooperative, Inc. and of the lands of Riverhead Associates, Inc. and of the aforesaid realty subdivision known as "Mill Brook Gables", to the point or place of beginning.

WHEREAS, the improvements proposed consist of the establishment of an extension of a Light District to be known as Extension No. 1 of Aquebogue Light District No. 1, to include the installation of street lights in accordance with certain plans made a part of such petition and heretofore adopted by this Board and now on file in the office of the Town Clerk of the said town; and

WHEREAS, the maximum amount proposed to be expended for the improvement as stated in the said petition is the sum of \$None, it is hereby

ORDERED, that a meeting of the Town Board of the said Town of Riverhead shall be held at the Town Hall, 220 Roanoke Avenue, in the Town of Riverhead, New York, on the 20th day of November 1956, at 10:30 o'clock in the forenoon of that day, to consider the said petition and to hear all persons interested in the subject thereof, concerning the same, and for such other action on the part of said Town Board with relation to the said petition as may be required by law or proper in the premises.

The Vote --Justices Pike and Zaloga, Yes; Councilman Benedict, Yes and Supervisor Leonard, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Notice of Budget Hearing was read. Proof of Publication and Affidavit of Posting said Notice was submitted to the Board and on motion and vote were ordered placed on file.

Supervisor Leonard thereupon declared the Hearing open

and anyone who wished could be heard at that time.

No one having appeared for or against the preliminary budget, the Hearing was declared closed.

Councilman Benedict offered the following resolution which was seconded by Justice Pike:

WHEREAS, this Town Board has met at the time and place specified in the Notice of Public Hearing on the preliminary budget and heard all persons desiring to be heard thereon ,
Now, Therefore, Be It

RESOLVED, that this Town Board does hereby adopt such preliminary budget as compiled, as the annual budget of this Town for the fiscal year beginning on the 1st day of January, 1957, and that such budget as so adopted be entered in detail in the minutes of the proceedings of this Town Board, and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Town Clerk of this Town shall prepare and certify in duplicate, copies of said annual budget as adopted and deliver one copy thereof to the Supervisor to be presented by him to the Board of Supervisors of this County as follows:

The Vote--Justices Pike and Zaloga, Yes; Councilman Benedict, Yes; Supervisor Leonard, Yes. The Resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Councilman Benedict submitted a map showing a proposed extension to the Riverhead Lighting District. After discussion, Alden W. Young, was authorized to prepare a complete map and description for this extension to be known as "Extension No. 1 of the Riverhead Lighting District."

A discussion was held relative to the relocation of the Town Highway Department facilities. The Board authorized the Superintendent

of Highways to have plans prepared for presentation at the next Town Board meeting.

A communication dated Oct. 18, 1956 from the State Traffic Commission was read to the Board relative to the prohibition of parking on the west side of Peconic Avenue alongside the Riverhead Savings Bank. The Chief of Police has during peak traffic periods, placed hoods over the parking meters at this location. These hoods bear the legend, "No Parking,". This procedure has worked out satisfactory in this area although the State Traffic Commission desires to place permanent signs in this area prohibiting parking during certain hours of the day. The Board wishes to continue the present procedure under the direction of the Chief of Police. The Town Clerk was instructed to notify the State Traffic Commission of the Board's decision in this matter.

The Town Board convened as a Bd. of Audit and examined all Town bills to date, the totals of which were as follows:
General Town Fund---\$6,951.21 and Highway Machinery Fund ---\$68.01.
On motion and vote it was Resolved that the bills be approved as rendered.

There being no further business on motion and vote the meeting adjourned to meet on Tuesday, November 20, 1956 at 10:00 A.M.
