

Minutes of a Meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, held in the Town Office on December 29th. 1936 at 3 P.M.

The minutes of the Meetings of December 1st. and December 13th. were read on on motion adopted.

Mr. Warren Seaman of Jamesport and Mrs. Jones of South Jamesport appeared before the Board regarding the Town opening certain highways at South Jamesport running to Peconic Bay, and were advised by the Board that the Town would be pleased to accept said highways if they would be dedicated to the Town.

Mr. Shiebel representing Riverhead Post, American Legion addressed the Board, and presented an Ordinance regarding the regulating of Traffic near the schoolhouse on Roanoke Avenue. In the opinion of the Board this Ordinance was not in proper form and no action was taken on it.

Supervisor Howell appointed Justices Corwin and Vail, a committee, to confer with Mr. Shiebel representing the Legion and Mr. Schafer representing the School to look into the traffic condition near the school and report to the Board at its next meeting.

Mr. Julian Rubenstein representing the American Legion of Riverhead addressed the Board and advised that the American Legion of Riverhead had designated him a committee to address the Board about the traffic system at Riverhead and stated that the American Legion of Riverhead would suggest that Griffing Avenue and Roanoke Avenue south of Second Street, be made ~~A~~/one way streets.

No action was taken by the Board on this suggestion.

Mr. Horace Williamson presented his report as Town Historian which was read by the Town Clerk.

On motion and vote, the Report of the Town Historian was ordered placed on file and the Town Clerk was directed to send a letter of thanks to Mr. Williamson for same.

On motion and vote, Forrest G. Downs was authorized to employ an additional clerk to assist him with the mail for a period of two weeks, compensation of said clerk to be fixed at \$5.00 per day.

On motion duly made seconded and carried it was RESOLVED, that in view of necessary expenditures caused by weather conditions, the Supervisor and the Town Clerk be and they are hereby authorized and directed to borrow upon promissory note, the sum of (\$1500.00) Fifteen Hundred Dollars in anticipation of 1927 Tax Levy, and that same be credited to the General Fund.

On motion and vote the Supervisor was authorized and directed to transfer the sum of \$1500.00 from the General Fund to the Snow and Miscellaneous Highway Fund.

On motion, duly made, seconded and carried it was RESOLVED that the Supervisor and Town Clerk be, and they are hereby authorized and directed to borrow upon promissory note the sum of Thirty Seven Hundred Eighty One and 75/100 (\$3781.75) Dollars to pay on account of audited bills of December 28th. 1926.

There being no further business, Meeting adjourned to meet at the call of the Chair.
