

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, held in the Town Office, on Thursday, August 29, 1929 at 2 P. M.

The minutes of the meeting of the Town Board held August 14, 1929 were read and on motion and vote adopted.

A communication was read from County Superintendent of Highways A. O. Smith, requesting Supervisor Homan to deposit the sum of \$2,498.15 with the County Treasurer same being the additional amount necessary for the Town to pay for grading, installing catch basins and grain pipes in connection with work under the Lowman Act Money in the Village of Riverhead.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was Resolved That the Supervisor and the Town Clerk be and they hereby are authorized and directed to borrow upon certificates of indebtedness the sum of Two Thousand Four Hundred Ninety Eight and 15/100 (\$2,498.15) Dollars, to be deposited with the County Treasurer to pay additional cost of grading, installing catch basins and drain pipes in connection with work under the Lowman Act and be it further Resolved That this sum be included in the tax levy.

A communication was read from Karlson & Reed, Inc. relative to the necessity of regulating traffic at the abutment of Osborn Avenue with West Main Street. The Town Clerk was instructed to acknowledge receipt of this communication.

A communication was read from Samuel Alper advising the Board of damage done to his property at the corner of Railroad Street and Osborn Avenue, by the overflowing of the water from Railroad Street and said communication was referred to the Supt. of Highways.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was Resolved, That the Supervisor and the Town Clerk of the Town of Riverhead, County of Suffolk, New York, or either of them be and they hereby are authorized, empowered and directed to enter into a contract with the AUTOMATIC VOTING MACHINE CORPORATION for the purchase of one U. S. Standard Voting Machine of the 9 row, 30 candidate size, at the net price of 940- f.o.b. cars, Jamestown N.Y. and be it further RESOLVED, That in payment for said voting machine, the Supervisor is hereby authorized, empowered,

and directed upon receipt of said machine, to pay to the
