

Minutes of a Meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Hall on Tuesday, February 2, 1965 at 10:30 A. M.

Justice Costello offered the following resolution which was seconded by Councilman Grodski.

RESOLVED, That the minutes of the meeting of the Town Board held in the Town Hall on January 19th, 1965, be approved as submitted.

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Justice Zaloga, Yes, Justice Costello, Yes, and Supervisor Vojvoda, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

At this time Supervisor Vojvoda recognized a delegation from the Wading River area who appeared before the Board representing the Wading River Civic Association and the Shoreham Civic Association on the matter of the Steers Corporation proposed sand and gravel operation.

Mr. Albert Prodell addressed the Board and stated that inasmuch as the Steers Corporation has not made a formal application to operate a sand and gravel plant and the Board is not aware of the plan in detail, that it would seem premature to voice approval or objections at this time.

Mr. Prodell further stated that if the Steers Corporation is invited to present a proposal to this Board, that it is suggested the Wading River and Shoreham Civic Associations be invited to the meeting to present their views.

Supervisor Vojvoda informed the delegation that he has been advised by Supervisor Charles Dominy that no formal application by Steers Corporation has been presented to the Brookhaven Town Board and assured the delegation present that if and when a proposal is presented they will be so advised.

A copy of a letter from the International Union of Operating Engineers dated January 25, 1965 urging support of the proposal of Steers Sand and Gravel Corporation to operate a sand and gravel plant in the Wading River section of the Town of Brookhaven was submitted to the Board and ordered placed on file.

After further discussion Supervisor Vojvoda proposed that it would be advantageous for the Town of Riverhead to acquire the area involved and maintain same for parking facilities and further proposed that a meeting be called in the near future to pursue this issue.

Mr. George Haupt of Jamesport, N. Y., appeared before the Board and requested the Town Board to invoke a measure restricting residents of other townships from invading Town waters for the purpose of taking shellfish.

Supervisor Vojvoda informed the Board that Mr. Haupt was making reference to an incident that occurred on Monday whereby three commercial diggers from the Town of Southampton invaded Town waters in the Jamesport area with outboard motors and took out many bushels of clams.

Supervisor Vojvoda further informed the Board that he had discussed this matter with the Town Attorney and requested him to draw up an Ordinance restricting the Town waters to Town residents and present the same for the Board's approval at the next meeting of the Board.

Police Chief Grodski appeared before the Board and stated that a prisoner charged with Forgery has been located in Florida and it will be necessary for a member of his Department to pick up the prisoner and deliver him to Riverhead.

Chief Grodski requested that Detective Underwood be authorized to discharge this task and that expenses for food and lodging for his trip to Florida be paid by the Town.

Chief Grodski informed the Board that the County would defray the expenses of the return trip.

The request as outlined by Chief Grodski was granted by the Town Board.

Chief Grodski further requested that in the event of a similar situation where there would be a time element involved in obtaining permission from the Town Board, that he be given the authority to dispatch an Officer from his Department to complete the required mission.

The Town Board granted Chief Grodski the above request.

The Tax Receiver's Report dated February 1, 1965 was submitted to the Board and ordered filed.

The Building Inspector's Report for the month of January, 1965 was submitted to the Board and ordered filed.

The Police Department Report for the month of January, 1965 was submitted to the Board and ordered filed.

The Annual Tort Claims Report for 1964 as compiled by the Town Clerk was submitted to the Board and ordered filed.

The Recreation Department Report for the month of January, 1965 was submitted to the Board and ordered filed.

The Recreation Department's Annual Report for the year 1964 was submitted to the Board and ordered filed.

After being duly advertised, sealed bid for Grit Requirements for use of the Riverhead, Town Highway Department was opened at 10:00 A. M., February 1, 1965, by Helene M. Block, Town Clerk as follows:

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the irregularity in the bid of Ralph Gallo and Louis Gallo, Sr., be waived.

A communication from the Treasury Department, United States Coast Guard, dated January 19, 1965, submitting schedule of the 1965 Boarding Officer Training Program was submitted to the Board and ordered filed.

A communication from the Jamesport-South Jamesport Civic Association, Inc., dated January 20, 1965, making inquiry on status of the August request for removal of light in South Jamesport and requesting information as to what legal steps are necessary for the extension of the present lighting district along Laurel Lane, was submitted to the Board and ordered filed.

A communication from the Wildwood Acres Association, Inc., dated January 25, 1965, relative to opening of a new development by Jay Hulse, was submitted to the Board and ordered filed.

The aforementioned communication was referred to the Town Attorney and Building Inspector Edward R. Munson for reply.

A communication was submitted to the Board from Richard E. Brown, Cedar Court Civic Ass'n., dated January 27, 1965, expressing appreciation to the Town Highway Department for its efficient response to an appeal for snow removal on January 25th. The communication was ordered filed.

A communication was submitted to the Board from the Central Suffolk Hospital Association dated January 27, 1965, stating that while the hospital is willing to perform blood alcohol tests, its Pathologist would not have the time to meet the requirement of testifying in court.

The communication was ordered filed and referred to Police Chief Grodski for reply.

A communication dated January 29, 1965 from Emil G. Friedlander, granting extension to the Town of Riverhead until February 28, 1965 in which to submit a bid to lease a portion of the Naval Weapons Industrial Reserve Plant, Calverton, N. Y., was submitted to the Board.

The communication was ordered filed.

A communication from Jean Lapham dated January 26, 1965, protesting the Steers Sand and Gravel Corporation proposal to make a sand pit in Wading River, N. Y., was submitted to the Board.

The communication was ordered filed.

A communication was submitted to the Board from Abram Shorr, Attorney for George Jurkiewicz, Deceased, Osborne Avenue, Riverhead, N. Y., dated January 29, 1965, requesting an extension on the commencement of proceedings to remove violations now existing against property of George Jurkiewicz, Deceased, was submitted to the Board.

The communication was ordered filed.

A communication from Kenneth G. Rowland, Superintendent of Recreation, dated February 1, 1965, outlining the importance of a sound and intensive Recreation Program was submitted to the Board.

The communication was ordered filed.

A communication from the Jamesport-South Jamesport Civic Association dated January 29, 1965, making request for replacement of trash containers from locations

in front of the Jamesport Post Office, the School Grounds and the Bus Stop in front of the Church, was submitted to the Board.

The communication was ordered filed.

The Town Clerk was directed to advise the Jamesport-South Jamesport Civic Association that the trash receptacles would be replaced by the Highway Department at the earliest possible time.

Justice Costello informed the Board that the Employees Handbook will be submitted for approval of the Board on February 16, 1965.

Town Attorney Shepard M. Scheinberg advised the Board that it is necessary he be given assistance in compiling the necessary changes to be made in the Zoning Ordinance.

The Town Clerk was directed to request the Planning Board to render any assistance the Town Attorney may need in preparing the necessary changes to be made in the Zoning Ordinance.

Justice Costello made request that the tape of the January 19th, 1965 Meeting be preserved and kept intact for any future purposes and further that the Town Clerk be so directed.

The Town Clerk was so directed.

Councilman Young offered the following resolution which was seconded by Justice Zaloga.

RESOLVED, That Highway bill submitted on Warrant dated February 2, 1965, Miscellaneous Fund Item No. 4, of Eastern Asphalt, dated January 22, 1965 in the amount of \$1,033.95, be and is hereby approved.

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Justice Zaloga, Yes, Justice Costello, Yes, and Supervisor Vojvoda, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Justice Zaloga offered the following resolution which was seconded by Councilman Young.

WHEREAS, For the purpose of snow removal during the month of January of the present year, extra expenses were incurred in the Highway Department of the Town of Riverhead, and

WHEREAS, The Superintendent of Highways of the Town of Riverhead has requested the Town Board to authorize the borrowing of money to finance said extra expenses,

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED as follows:

1. That the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead for the specific purpose of providing for payment of expenses for the removal of snow and ice heretofore incurred, pursuant to Section 29.00 of the Local Finance Law, does hereby authorize the issuance of its Budget Note in the amount of \$12,000, to finance such cost and expense.

2. Such Note shall be dated _____, and its power to fix and determine the exact date of such Note is hereby delegated to the Supervisor. Such Note shall be numbered one (1) and shall mature in the year 1966. The power to fix and determine the date upon which such Note shall become due and payable is also delegated to the Supervisor.
