

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, held in the Town Office, on Wednesday, September 25, 1929 at 2 P. M.

The minutes of the meeting of the Town Board of September 11, 1929 were read and on motion and vote duly adopted.

A communication was read from the Polish Independent Club, Inc., suggesting that the Name of Cemetery Street be changed to "PULASKI STREET ". It was decided to lay this matter over until the next meeting of the Board.

A petition was received for a street light on Marcy Avenue near the Polish Hall and on ~~Hamilton~~ Avenue and said petition was referred to the Lighting Committee for investigation.

The deed for tract of land from Raymond H. Nugent and Madlyn E. Nugent to Town of Riverhead was presented and the Town Clerk was instructed to have same recorded at the County Clerk's Office prior to filing in the Town Office.

A petition was presented made by Ernest H. Conklin to the Superintendent of Highways to lay out a highway within the Town of Riverhead extending north from Franklin Street, and the land having been dedicated by the owners Jennie R. Lane and Vivian L. Hajek, on motion duly made, seconded and carried it was RESOLVED That the Town Board hereby consents to the laying out of said highway by the Town Superintendent of Highways.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was RESOLVED That the Supervisor and the Town Clerk be and they hereby are authorized and directed to borrow upon certificates of indebtedness, the sum of Eight Thousand (\$8000) Dollars to pay on account of audited bills of September 24, 1929

Fire Chief Carl F. Peterson addressed the Board and requested that the Town Board co-operate with the Fire Commissioners in any action they deem necessary to have the Long Island House ruins removed.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was
RESOLVED that this Board co-operate with and assist
in every way possible, the Fire Commissioners of the
Riverhead Fire District in any action they ^{may} deem necessary
to have the ruins of the Long Island House removed.

There being no further business, on motion and vote,
the meeting adjourned.
