

Minutes of a Meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Hall on Tuesday, March 16, 1965 at 10:30 A. M.

Justice Costello offered the following resolution which was seconded by Justice Zaloga.

RESOLVED, That the minutes of the meeting of the Town Board held in the Town Hall on March 2, 1965, be approved as submitted.

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Justice Zaloga, Yes, Justice Costello, Yes, and Supervisor Vojvoda, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Police Chief Grodski addressed the Board and rendered the following reports:

In Re: H. Fowler Migrant Camp, Calverton, N. Y.: That he had contacted responsible persons concerned with the Camp and is presently convinced that conditions are vastly improved and further, that inspections of the Camp will be continued in order that sanitary standards be maintained.

In Re: Blood Tests: That he had been informed by Administrator Blair M. Patterson that none of the Technologists employed by the Central Suffolk Hospital Association hold a degree in Chemistry and therefore are not eligible to perform the work in connection with Alcohol Blood Tests.

In Re: Parade Restrictions and Permits: That he had obtained copies of Ordinances from other Townships relating to Parades and urged the Board to consider the adoption of such an Ordinance for the Town of Riverhead.

The Board resolved to take the proposal of adopting an Ordinance relating to Parades under advisement.

Kenneth G. Rowland, Recreation Superintendent, appeared before the Board and stated that the Recreation Commission took under advisement the proposal of Joseph Brandt to consider the erection of a skating rink in the Town of Riverhead, and recommends that a skating rink would not be a practical facility for the Town of Riverhead at this time.

The Town Clerk was directed to give notice to Mr. Joseph Brandt of the Commission's recommendation.

Mr. Rowland further stated that the Commission felt that some plan be initiated in developing a priority list for recreational facilities for the entire Town so that every proposal may be handled to the satisfaction of all concerned.

Mr. Rowland petitioned the Board for its advices.

The Board discussed the matter and made suggestions that proposals be answered to the effect that such proposals be offered in the beginning of planning the Recreation Budget for a new year, as after the budget is adopted such proposals can not be acceptable for consideration as they would not be within the scope of the current year.

Irene J. Pendzick, Receiver of Taxes, appeared before the Board and made request that the position of Clerk-Typist be created for the Office of Tax Receiver.

Councilman Young offered the following resolution which was seconded by Justice Zaloga.

RESOLVED, That the Civil Service Position of Clerk-Typist be and is hereby created in the Office of the Receiver of Taxes in the Town of Riverhead.

Councilman Young offered the following resolution which was seconded by Justice Zaloga.

RESOLVED, That Dorothy Jermusyk, be and is hereby appointed from the Suffolk County Civil Service Eligibility CR2 Clerk-Typist List dated March 23, 1965, to the position of Clerk-Typist in the Office of the Receiver of Taxes, Town of Riverhead, to be compensated at the rate of \$10.00 per day.

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Justice Zaloga, Yes, Justice Costello, Yes, and Supervisor Vojvoda, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

WHEREAS, For the purpose of snow removal during the month of February of the present year, extra expenses were incurred in the Highway Department of the Town of Riverhead, and

WHEREAS, The Superintendent of Highways of the Town of Riverhead has requested the Town Board to authorize the borrowing of money to finance said extra expenses,

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED as follows:

1. That the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead for the specific purpose of providing for payment of expenses for the removal of snow and ice heretofore incurred, pursuant to Section 29.00 of the Local Finance Law, does hereby authorize the issuance of its Budget Note in the amount of \$8,000.00, to finance such cost and expense.

2. Such Note shall be dated March 19, 1965, and its power to fix and determine the exact date of such Note is hereby delegated to the Supervisor. Such Note shall be numbered two (2) and shall mature in the year 1966. The power to fix and determine the date upon which such Note shall become due and payable is also delegated to the Supervisor.

Justice Zaloga informed the Board that he accompanied Supervisor Vojvoda to Albany at a Hearing before the Finance Committee on the matter of allocation of moneys for the Proposed Desalination Plant to be located in the Town of Riverhead, and that he was justly proud of the manner in which the Supervisor handled the presentation and requested that his remarks be so noted in the Minutes of this Meeting.

North Griffing Avenue from Pulaski Street to School Street.

School Street from North Griffing Avenue to Harrison Avenue.

Cranberry Street between North Griffing Avenue and Roanoke Avenue.

Roanoke Avenue in front of St. John's Auditorium.

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Justice Zaloga, Yes, Justice Costello, Yes, and Supervisor Vojvoda, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Justice Zaloga offered the following resolution which was seconded by Justice Costello.

RESOLVED, That a Home Rule request be forwarded to the New York State Assembly and Senate to amend the town law, in relation to regulation of hunting and the discharge of firearms in towns of the County of Suffolk.

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Justice Zaloga, Yes, Justice Costello, Yes, and Supervisor Vojvoda, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Justice Zaloga offered the following resolution which was seconded by Councilman Grodski.

RESOLVED, That the Supervisor be and is hereby authorized to transfer the sum of \$150.00 from the General Town Current Surplus Account to the Enterprises/Griffing Avenue/Parking Fields Account.

Justice Zaloga offered the following resolution which was seconded by Councilman Young.

WHEREAS, Copies of the Comprehensive Plan, published in two booklets, for the Town of Riverhead will in the near future be available for private distribution, now THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, That an amount of Five (\$5.00) Dollars be charged for each report or Ten (\$10.00) Dollars for a set of two books.

FURTHER RESOLVED, That General Repairs Highway Item No. 1 bills in the amount of \$1,888.57, Machinery Highway Item No. 3 bills in the amount of \$4,789.97 and Miscellaneous Highway Item No. 4 bills in the amount of \$319.41 be approved for payment.
