UNFINISHED BUSINESS
New Town Hall - Progress

Supervisor Leonard spoke regarding the Youth Drop-In Center-Narcotics Guidance Council:

"Just for the information of the public here regarding the two people of the Narcotics Guidance Council, the State has notified Rev. Adinolfi that the State allocation of monies will run out on March 31st, 1974. The Town Board, as a whole, has considered that they have done such a good job we have decided to keep them on, even if we have to get the money out of our own budget."

PERSONAL APPEARANCES

Supervisor Leonard asked if anyone wished to be heard and the following responded:

ROBERT BREWSTER of the Cooperative Extension Service made a presentation to the Board members of a Town Legislative Guide. It has been developed at Cornell University under a special grant through the New York State Office for Local Government and is intended to be a handy reference for the Town's use. He gave a resume of Co-op Extension Services to the Town of Riverhead.

ROGER NICOSIA of Jamesport, spoke regarding Jamesport School. He wanted to know status of school property and asked to have it put on agenda for tonite.

Supervisor Leonard: "The Town has accepted the property and Mr. Ross handed me the deed this morning. We are undecided as to what we plan to do with it."
Further discussion ensued.

KENNETH ROSS, District Principal of Central School District #2 spoke:

"I believe I heard you correctly when you said you have accepted the school and under those conditions we will remove our insurance from their rolls. Will you please send confirmation in writing that the Town has accepted the property?"

Supervisor Leonard replied that as soon as our insurance has insured the property, we will notify the School Board.

STEVE GLOSS, Aquebogue, inquired as to what has happened to a petition filed to lower the speed limit on Broad Avenue in Aquebogue.

Supervisor Leonard replied that the petition was sent to the State and they in turn answered it was impossible and requested a description of the area. Chief of Police Grodski sent this request and to date we have had no reply from the State. The petition is still open.

RAYMOND MC COY, Jamesport, appeared regarding Jamesport School. Offered services of a Consulting Engineer at no charge to the Town to give a plan of what is needed to make the building usable. He is willing to help and knows he can get others who would be willing to work.

PERSONAL APPEARANCES - continued:

Supervisor Leonard thanked Mr. McCoy and assured him that the Board would give every consideration to his suggestion.

DR. ALFRED SMITH thanked the Board for their action taken today on the Narcotics Guidance Council and introduced Mrs. Scaramucci who also thanked the Board for retaining the services of Dr. Burger and herself on the Council.

JOHN RIESDORPH: "I have a little suggestion that for your evening meetings you either rent or buy extra chairs for the people attending."

LARRY SCUDDER appeared regarding property next to the State Police Barracks. Whether they are operating legally as a junk yard, used car lot or whatever.

Zoning Inspector, Edward R. Munson replied that action has been taken on this matter against the owner and lessee.

BERT RHODES, Wading River, spoke regarding street light operation and how it might be improved. He suggested when a new light is to be installed that the Lighting Committee contact the neighbors in the area and advise them to the effect.

Judge Manning replied: "This is a good point - the only thing I have been doing is checking the location where the light is to be installed. This is a good point and I will give it consideration."

BERT RHODES also spoke on equalization tax rates for the Town of Riverhead. He gave a resume of the change in the tax rate structure. Requested the Board write to N.Y.S. Equalization Board asking that the rate not be lowered.

Supervisor Leonard that the Board sent communication in yesterday regarding the lowering of the tax rate.

BUDGET NOTE RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD, NEW YORK, ADOPTED MARCH 19, 1974, AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF A NOTE IN THE AMOUNT OF \$20,000.00, FOR THE PURPOSE OF DEFRAYING COSTS OF SNOW REMOVAL.

WHEREAS, The Superintendent of Highways has advised the Town Board that an amount of \$20,000.00, is needed to finance costs of snow removal for use of the Town Highway Department, and has requested the Board to authorize borrowings of said amount of \$20,000.00, to defray the costs,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, AS FOLLOWS:

1. That the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead for the specific purpose of providing for payment of costs for snow removal, pursuant to Section 29.00 of the Local Finance Law, does hereby authorize the issuance of its Budget Note in the amount of \$20,000.00, to finance such cost.

2. Such Note shall be dated March 21, 1974, and its power to fix and determine the exact date of such Note is hereby delegated to the Supervisor. Such Note shall be numbered 2 and shall mature in the year 1975. The power to fix and determine the date upon which such Note shall become due and payable is also delegated to the Supervisor.

To install a single phase electric line extension beginning at Pole #93 on the North side of Youngs Avenue, Riverhead, New York, continuing in a general Southwesterly direction across Town property a distance of 214 feet to Pole #93-2, together with a three wire service lateral of 20 feet to a building where 120/240 volt service is desired. Electric service will be furnished in accordance with Long Island Lighting Company published rules and regulations and at standard rates and terms. The poles were installed by the New York Telephone Company for joint use with the Long Island Lighting Company and are owned and maintained by the NYTCO, and

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Town of Riverhead agrees to pay the Long Island Lighting Company the sum of \$58.24 before the commencement of work.

WHEREAS, The Town Board has sought the advise of the Planning Board which recommended denial of said application, and

WHEREAS, The Town Board has held a public hearing on said application, and

WHEREAS, The Town Board has considered said application and finds that said application is not in the best interest of the people of the Town of Riverhead,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the application of Metrohouse Associates for a change of zone be denied.

Charles Cuddy, Esq. asked for the privilege of saying a few words. Supervisor Leonard granted the privilege.

Mr. Cuddy asked for the opportunity of adjourning this matter for further discussion.

After further discussion by the Board, Mr. Cuddy withdrew the application of Metrohouse Associates.

Town Justice Leonard offered the following resolution which was seconded by Councilman Young.

RESOLVED, That the Supervisor pay to Justice Richard Manning the sum of \$187.50 for plane fare to attend the Judicial Conference classes for the Judiciary to be held at Syracuse, New York, and that Justice Manning account therefore.

The vote, Councilman Menendez, Yes, Town Justice Manning, Yes, Town Justice Leonard, Yes, Councilman Young, Yes, and Supervisor Leonard, Yes.

The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Judge Manning: "Before we adjourn, I'd like to explain the advance of monies to myself. I think it has been the custom that all new lay people as Justices were required to attend a one week Seminar and it usually was held in the city.
