

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, held in the Town Office on Wednesday, November 27, 1929 at 2 P. M.

The minutes of the meeting of the Town Board held November 19, 1929 were read and on motion and vote adopted.

A communication received from Samuel Alper, was read calling the attention of the Board to the flowing of water into the cellar of his property and same was referred to the Superintendent of Highways.

The lighting committee recommended that the petition for a street light on Millbrook Lane be granted.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was RESOLVED That the Lighting Company be notified to install one 80 C. P. street light on pole number three on Millbrook Lane.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was RESOLVED That the Supervisor and the Town Clerk be and they hereby are authorized and directed to borrow upon certificates of indebtedness, the sum of Thirty Five Hundred Dollars to pay on account of audited bills of November 26, 1929.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was RESOLVED That the Supervisor and the Town Clerk be and they hereby are authorized and directed to borrow upon certificates of indebtedness, the sum of Thirty Five Hundred Dollars, in anticipation of taxes to retire bonds of the Riverhead Water District due December 2, 1929.

Forrest G. Downs, Receiver of Taxes requested that he be allowed two clerks for a period of not exceeding six weeks each to assist him in collecting taxes.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was RESOLVED That Forrest G. Downs, Receiver of Taxes be and he hereby is authorized to employ two clerks to assist him in collecting taxes for a period not exceeding six weeks each and be it further RESOLVED That the compensation of said clerks be and the same is hereby fixed at \$5.00 per day.

The petition of the Riverhead Playhouse, Inc. requesting that this board adopt an ordinance permitting the exhibition on motion pictures on Sunday was read.

It was moved and seconded that the following ordinance be adopted by this Board:

AN ORDINANCE TO PERMIT THE EXHIBITION OF MOTION PICTURES ON SUNDAYS IN THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD, SUFFOLK COUNTY, NEW YORK.

Be it enacted by the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, Suffolk County, New York, that the exhibition of motion pictures on the first day of the week, commonly known as Sunday, shall be and hereby are permitted on said day after the hour of two o'clock in the afternoon in the duly licensed theatre or theatres in said town.
