

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, held in the Town Office on Wednesday, December 11, 1929 at 2 P. M.

The minutes of the meeting of the Town Board, held November 27, 1929 were read and on motion and vote adopted.

A communication received from Joseph J. Kreiger, advising of the need of a traffic signal light at the abuttment of Osborn Avenue and West Main Street, was read and the Town Clerk was instructed to acknowledge receipt of same and advise that this condition would be considered as soon as the contemplated widening of this corner ~~is~~ agreed upon.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was Resolved that the Town Clerk communicate with the Village Clerk of the Village of Southampton and ascertain from whom the traffic signals in Southampton were obtained.

George Benjamin and Mr. Carter of South Jamesport addressed the Board in reference to dedicating a strip of land from Third to Fourth Street as a town highway to be known as Green Street, in South Jamesport, and this matter was referred to Town Sup't. of Highways Charles O. Downs for his recommendation.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was RESOLVED That the Committee, consisting of Supervisor Homan, Justice Burnside and Justice Penny, be and it hereby is authorized and empowered to rent quarters in the new Odd Fellows' Hall for a period of years.

Charles O. Downs, Town Superintendent of Highways, addressed the Board and requested that a resolution be passed authorizing the payment of Cleeves' bill in the amount of \$1955.00 for oiling the town roads.

Supervisor Homan advised that the bill had not been paid as he did not consider it proper to pay same.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was RESOLVED That the bill of Cleeves for oiling town highways be referred to Attorney N. O. Petty for advise.

Supervisor Homan advised that the sum of \$306.98 had accumulated in the School Fund, being interest on school money and requested that a resolution be passed authorizing the transferring of this sum to the Contingent Fund.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was RESOLVED That the Supervisor be and he hereby is authorized to transfer the sum of \$306.98 from the School Fund to the Contingent Fund.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was RESOLVED That the next meeting of the Town Board be held on Monday Evening, December 23, 1929 at 7:30 o'clock.

There being no further business, on motion and vote the meeting adjourned.
