

Minutes of a Regular Meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, held in the Town Hall, Riverhead, New York, on January 4th, 1972 at 10:30 A. M.

Supervisor Leonard called the Meeting to Order at 10:30 A. M., and welcomed everyone. He expressed a hope that the people will continue to attend Board Meetings and get involved in Town government, and on behalf of the Town Board members, the Town Clerk and himself, wished everyone a healthy, happy and prosperous New Year.

Town Justice Costello offered the following resolution which was seconded by Town Justice Leonard.

BE IT RESOLVED, that Francis J. Yakaboski, be and hereby is appointed Town Attorney to serve until the 1st day of January next succeeding the 1st biennial town election, held after his appointment (i. e.) January, 1974, at an annual retainer of \$12,000.00, payable bi-weekly, effective January 1, 1972, and be it further

RESOLVED, that such Town Attorney shall, in addition to authorized mileage expense, be reimbursed for office, secretarial, and other expenses in a sum not to exceed \$2,500.00. Payments for such expenses shall be made upon submission of vouchers to the Town Clerk of the Town of Riverhead.

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Town Justice Leonard, Yes, Town Justice Costello, Yes, and Supervisor Leonard, Yes.

The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Judge Costello administered the Oath of Office and Francis J. Yakaboski was duly installed as Town Attorney.

The Town Board congratulated the Town Attorney.

Town Justice Costello offered the following resolution which was seconded by Town Justice Leonard.

RESOLVED, That the Minutes of the Town Board Meeting held on December 21st, 1971, be approved as submitted.

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Town Justice Leonard, Yes, Town Justice Costello, Yes, and Supervisor Leonard, Not Voting.

The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

PERSONAL APPEARANCES:

Supervisor Leonard asked if anyone wished to be heard and the following responded:

Jacob Harding, Esq., Riverhead: Congratulated Supervisor Leonard and the newly appointed Town Attorney.

Stated that more people than ever are becoming interested in government, particularly young people, who are asking questions as to how they can improve our town.

Mr. Harding outlined the following five proposals to improve our Town Government:

1. Streamline the Town Board to comprise of a Supervisor and four (4) Councilmen. The Justices to remain as Justices without legislative function - to no longer draw legislation such as ordinances and then try violators of that ordinance. This proposal can be enacted by resolution of the Town Board with the approval of the State Legislature. No one would be voted out of a job in our Town - the Justices would remain and two more Councilmen would be added.

Mr. Harding stressed that the judiciary has to be separated from the legislative function.

2. No Town Board is an island and should not act as though it is. Stressed the importance of the Supervisor and Councilmen to have liaison and contact with the County Legislator of our district. Further stated that he is aware that this is not being done at present and pointed out that many things being done at the County Legislative level affect our township and we should ask for help and give help and that this should also apply in our relationship with County Boards and Commissions.

3. Special Boards: Urged that the Board exercise considerable care in the selection of members and in the assignment of duties. That such Boards should have capable leadership and guidance, a neutral advisor and be capable of researching a matter and writing its own opinions and decisions. Also stressed that the appointments not be made for political reasons or for political patronage.

4. State Reports: Made recommendation that reports of State Comptroller's Office concerning the Town of Riverhead be made more available to the public.

5. Town Hall quarters: Pointed out the pressing need to improve the Town Hall quarters by either erecting a new building or adding, altering or expanding the existing facilities. Further stated that it is a shame to be so handicapped and that the cubby hole that the Supervisor has for an office is a disgrace. Also that this Board room is much too small and improvements have to be made. Expressed a hope that when improvements are eventually made that the Town Board will not be sitting way up behind a high bench looking down on the people.

Mr. Harding concluded his remarks by wishing the Town Board good health and good luck for the coming year.

Supervisor Leonard thanked Mr. Harding for his comments.

John P. Riesdorff stated that the bathroom quarters in his old home were larger than the Supervisor's office and agreed that more space is needed to house the Town offices.

PERSONAL APPEARANCES continued:

Dr. Caryl Granttham, representing the Riverhead First Committee:

Expressed good wishes to the Board for the year ahead and particularly to the new Supervisor and offered the help of the Committee and every cooperation and assistance.

Advised that an announcement will be made early in January of the Officers of the Committee and Board of Directors - that membership will be openly solicited and that while the Committee offers its help and assistance, it also intends to be a "watch dog".

Stated further that the Committee intends to act in the public interest to help educate and encourage the public to come here and be heard and hopefully make this a kind of community in which we hope to live.

Dr. Granttham applauded those who have said they would encourage citizens committees to become active in local government - the committees being Business and Industry.

Informed the Board that the Town of Southampton will be very interested in pooling efforts in this connection.

That Dick Carey on behalf of the Committee has already submitted names for the Industrial Committee.

Dr. Granttham further informed the Board that the Committee met last night and would like more specific definition of what the Board considers the responsibilities and the authority and indeed the definition of these Committees.

Further stated that the Committee is more than willing to work with a functioning Committee, but it must be an active one in this regard - that the Committee wants people that have not only the background but the time.

Consumer Interest - here again when the definition is given and the authority and its purpose - the Committee will be happy to suggest names.

Again offered the assistance of the Committee in every way possible and said that the people of the Town will never again be accused of being apathetic.

That the holding of an evening meeting is a commitment the Committee holds the Board to honor.

Dr. Granttham concluded her remarks by wishing the Board well.

Mrs. Elizabeth Richard, asked if the Board had heard from the President of Kentucky Fried Chicken. Told the Board about the removal of trees by bulldozer. Urged the Town Board to amend the Zoning laws so that another neighborhood will be spared a like situation.

Town Clerk informed Mrs. Richard that the President of the Fried Chicken outfit is in Europe and that other representatives will appear before the Board.

Judge Costello advised that the representatives are meeting with the Board at 2 P. M. this afternoon and invited anyone interested to attend.

Dr. Alfred H. Smith, Sound Shore Road, Jamesport, also representing the Riverhead First Committee, submitted suggestion that a large map of the Town be placed in the Board Room so that it can be referred to during discussions.

Also stated that of great concern to the Committee has been the Town Planning Board. Suggested that it be brought out of the shadows and into the inner circle of the Town Board. Also that their meetings be made public and also the minutes.

PERSONAL APPEARANCES continued:

Dr. Smith suggested the name of Dr. Caryl Granttham for appointment to the Planning Board, outlined her background and qualifications for such appointment and urged the Board to give her every consideration.

John P. Riesdorff suggested that the Town Board close its books on the Kentucky Chicken Franchise for the reason that this concern has conformed to all our ordinances and should be allowed to erect its business as it will give employment to Riverhead people.

Mrs. Richard Carey stated that she disagrees with Mr. Riesdorff and cannot agree that this is a desirable kind of thing to encourage for East Main Street, Riverhead - that it would be great somewhere else, but not for where it is now intended.

Judge Costello: "On behalf of the Town Board - we overlooked Thomas McKay our newly elected Assessor and also Irene Pendzick, Receiver of Taxes - a very successful year on your new job, Tom and welcome aboard our ship."

HIGHWAY MATTERS:

Alex E. Horton, Supt. of Highways reported a drainage problem on Howell Avenue - East, stating that a stream of water comes all the way from Ostrander Avenue and Merritt's Pond Road, gathers leaves and blocks up Howell Avenue-East.

During discussion Judge Costello suggested that Mr. Horton contact the County Highway Commissioner for a solution.

After further discussion, the matter was referred to the Town Attorney to look into the matter of whether it is private property or if it is the responsibility of the County Highway Commission.

COMMUNICATIONS

John J. COMMUNICATIONS continued:

Alex E. Horton, Supt. of Highways, dated 12/14, 1971, stating that a new 1970 Dump Truck with Dump Body purchased in March of 1970 for the sum of \$11,613.90, was involved in an accident on March 25, 1971, which resulted in practically a total loss of the truck. An estimate of \$6,000 to repair this truck was obtained. That he had heard that the Town had received a \$2000 check for settlement of this claim but that he has not received this check, nor has he heard what has happened to the check and that he would not have agreed to such a low settlement. Filed.

Following is reply to above communication from Insurance Broker:

Housner and Kelley, Inc., dated 1/3/72, stating that a payment in an amount exceeding \$2000 was paid to the Town on this claim (exact amount \$2033.84).

Stating further that in checking with the Claim Department of the Insurance Company it was found that the settlement of this claim was not agreed to by the Highway Supt., but it is not known if this is the agreed figure to repair the vehicle in question.

Advising that the case has been re-opened and will be reviewed with the Highway Supt. and the Town Board.

Suggesting that in cases such as this direct communication with their office be made by the Board and/or Department Heads in order to eliminate any undue delays in the settlement of claims.

Also advising that there has been a definite increase in claim frequency which adversely affects the Town's loss experience and urging that the Board institute a procedure of requiring written reports of all accidents and/or occurrences be reported within a 24 hour period so that corrective action may be taken. Filed.
