

Minutes of Regular Board Meeting held by the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, held in the Town Hall, Riverhead, New York, on Tuesday, May 21, 1996, at 7:00 p.m.

Supervisor Stark called the meeting to order at 7:00 and the Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Supervisor Stark: "Thank you. If the Board will join me down front. Gentlemen.

Ladies and gentlemen, as always it's a pleasure to welcome our Fire Department here this evening. We are going to announce a certificate of merit on behalf of the Town in appreciation of the volunteer service that they have rendered to us as a town and as residents of that town.

I can only go back over the years and just think of the many times that you have been in need of them, not only us, but the Pine Barrens. That's probably the biggest fight we've had. And without hesitation, Riverhead and Wading River and Jamesport and Manorville, which is in part of Riverhead responded along with our volunteer ambulance service and all the facilities so we're very proud of them and I had the opportunity to go to the memorial service a couple of weeks and it was very impressive to see our full (inaudible) of firement out with their white gloves and being inspected and, of course, the party afterwards was quite enjoyable.

The outgoing chief, we would like to first honor you and thank you for your term of service which I believe was two years, and the

Town Board have worked very cooperatively on our disaster program which is about to become a reality. So when it does come, I hope you come back and take some of the credit for it. So, Bill, I'm not going to read all these tonight because looks like we can get out of here-- the ballgame is starting, but on behalf of the Town Board, I would certainly like to give you this certificate of merit for your two years as a sign of our appreciation."

William Kelly: "I would just like to thank the Town Board and all the other departments that have helped us throughout the years, the Highway Department, the Water Department, Buildings & Grounds and especially the Police Department. And without their cooperation we wouldn't have been able to do the job we did.

Thank you."

Supervisor Stark: "Thank you, Bill. And it goes to say that all of our Departments have worked over the years quite well.

Also, every organization has to have that one guy who always shows up. Of course, now that he's retired he's there right on the button but I know Vince when he worked over in East Hampton and he still made all the fires. So Vincent Golemski has been named top responder for the Riverhead Fire Department for the year 1995. So, again, Vince."

Vincent Golemski: "The only thing I can say is I love to work with people and I love helping people. And this is what the thing is being a volunteer fireman."

Supervisor Stark: "Thank you, Vince.

This one and I believe we have Christian here with us tonight. Christine, Kristen, come on up here. I believe it's your birthday, isn't it? Well, come on up. You want to stand around here? How's that? Is that grandpa? Grandfather. Grandpa is going to get an award tonight, isn't he? And will you help me give this to him?

Norman, better known as Skip, Sr. was picked this year as Fireman of the Year for 1995 and this is a certificate of merit on behalf of the town and the Town Board in your honor as being picked as Fireman of the Year."

Norman Beal: "I would also like to thank the Town Board for this award. We try to do a good job and the Board is in full cooperation with the Fire Department and it was really a pleasure during this last disaster in the fall to see how fast Acting Supervisor Stark at the time and the Board mobilized the Town to help out with this disaster. It was really neat."

Supervisor Stark: "We only follow what you guys do. You mobilized a lot faster than we did and again we thank you and anything we can do to help make your life easier over at the Fire Department, don't ever heistate to call. Thank you."

EMS. We are very fortunate in this Town. Mason, would you want to-- I guess you are going to accept this on behalf of the EMS."

Mason Haas: "Yes, I am."

Supervisor Stark: "We are very fortunate in the Town of Riverhead to in fact have great volunteer organizations. You just heard Skip Beal refer to the Pine Barrens crisis, how we mobilized. We didn't mobilize down here at Town Hall, each individual department mobilized themselves as did our EMS. So this-- we have declared may 19th to May 26th Emergency Medical Services Week and all we can say is Mason, keep the troops doing the same good job."

Mason Haas: "On behalf of the Riverhead Town Ambulance Corps, we thank the Town very much for this recognition. They were at Riley Avenue School, the kindergarten class. Next week we are back at the Riley Avenue School we are working with them to bring them in and some of our nursery schools also."

Supervisor Stark: "So soon we will have our new ambulance in. So, let us continue with the Regular Town Board Meeting. Thank you, ladies and gentlemen."

Councilman Lull: "So moved."

Supervisor Stark: "Thank you, Barbara. Since there is no Public Hearings tonight, I will recognize anybody in the audience right now. Yes, sir. I would also like to publicly thank the East End Surf and Fishing Club. They cleaned up our sound beaches over this past weekend. I don't have the tonage, but it's usually six or seven tons that they-- of debris and discarded garbage that they pick

up in the winter months. So I want to recognize East End Surf."

Rolph Kestling: "Rolph Kestling, Wading River. Last year when they were developing that golf course in Wading River and all those sand and gravel trucks were pulling all the sand out of there for weeks on end, I thought there was some sort of-- something was passed that they weren't allowed to do it without (inaudible) because it was like a land mine operation, sand and gravel mine operation. There was something in the paper. I know there was something. Now I live on North Wading River Road. Last week the parade starts again with the sand and gravel trucks. The name on the trucks is Oyster Bay Sand and Gravel.

So I happen to be on the road in the car and I followed one of the trucks and I saw the way he was going in-- trailer trucks and not the one with pavement on but the one after it. An unimproved road. They are going in there and sand and gravel is going out again. I don't know if you were aware of it."

Supervisor Stark: "Yes, we are. And that is an improved subdivision that we improved many years ago. It is also approved for the I guess topography, or whatever you want to call it and according to the design of the roads and the engineering of the roads, it was known that there would be some mining would have to be done in order to because of the contour of the land."

Rolph Kestling: "Well, but I-- where all that sand is-- "

Supervisor Stark: "And that's not coming from a golf course, it's coming from the subdivision itself."

Rolph Kestling: "The subdivision itself. The way that stuff is going out of there, it costs money sand and gravel, they don't have to sell any more houses. They're making their money out of sand and gravel."

Supervisor Stark: "That probably could be the way."

Rolph Kestling: "Thank you."

Supervisor Stark: "Thank you. Is there anybody else? If not, let us take up the resolutions. I thought I could slip that one in

there. We could go right to the resolutions. We can make this a record night."

Steve Haizlip: "Steve Haizlip of Calverton. I would like to bring up that the blood drive for the Golden Donors is May the 28th from eight until two o'clock and the last-- they would like to be about 1:45. Anybody come in, want to give blood."

Supervisor Stark: "I would ask the press to take note of what Steve is saying. If you could get something in the press for him, I certainly would appreciate it. May 28th, between eight and two-- where is it? At the Ramada?"

Steve Haizlip: "At the Ramada."

Supervisor Stark: "The Ramada Inn."

Steve Haizlip: "Downstairs in the (inaudible) room and we've been pretty successful so far, around 50 to 52, 55 donors. And this here being the time of the Memorial Day weekend, according to the Director, Nancy Mittman, they really need it at those times because due to the accidents that do take place. So, we would like for everyone to come out."

(inaudible) was given unofficial highway inspector; I think it came from one of the local papers."

Supervisor Stark: "News-Review."

Steve Haizlip: "News-Review. Okay. Now, I went into the Aid Auto lot doing my scan to see how the oil can situation was and I found some nice fresh oil cans laying right out there, tops leaning towards the sump, and it was right after the rain. So I said, this time I'm going into that store. I'm going to talk to somebody. So I went in and I talked to the young fellow there at the cash register and I told him about his oil cans out there. He said we've got receptacles, they should bring it. I said, look, I don't know where it's coming from, but I have a feeling maybe the good citizens of Riverhead (inaudible). I said I don't know where it's coming from, but anyway I said, you know with all this environment going on about oil and so forth, I said I'd like you to make a point to police this litter so it don't run into the sump back there. I made my instructions

with Aid as clean as a pin and also down by Route 58 at (inaudible) store, I got tired of that bump being in that road and all that loose macadam coming up so I got that taken care of.

If possible, do we have a highway committee yet? Or is that abandoned?"

Supervisor Stark: "No, we have one."

Steve Haizlip: "Okay, good. I would like for a letter to be-- to I guess it would be Patricia Acompora. I suppose it would be best to put it to her. Down on Route 105, coming from the south-- "

Supervisor Stark: "That's a county road."

Steve Haizlip: "All right."

Supervisor Stark: "Legislator Michael Cracchiola."

Steve Haizlip: "All right."

Supervisor Stark: "Resident of Wading River."

Steve Haizlip: "All right. Now, we have two people involved, right? We've got Pataki involved on Route 25 and then we've got a county road involved. So, as I had said once before when I asked you nicely about exit 73 dumping out into 58 with no yield sign-- "

Councilman Prusinowski: "We've got a yield sign."

Steve Haizlip: "-- and I've got all kind of action and Vic and everybody-- "

Councilman Prusinowski: "We've got a yield sign there. I wrote them a letter."

Steve Haizlip: "Right. This is what I'm saying. I would like for a letter to go in and here's the reason. I've been going down on Broad Street-- "

Supervisor Stark: "Steve, Steve, whatever you need in that, certainly Victor is still on the highway committee. Just stop in and

see him tomorrow and he'll take care of it for you."

Councilman Prusinowski: "What is-- specifically, what is it?"

Supervisor Stark: "He can do that tomorrow."

Steve Haizlip: "All right. Okay. I'll leave that until tomorrow."

Supervisor Stark: "Yeah, I mean, Vic-- "

Councilman Prusinowski: "Yeah, we'll write a letter like we did with the yield sign."

Steve Haizlip: "Yeah. Now, I'll try to be as quick as possible. In the News-Review, I'm going to say that Mr. (inaudible), he's coming up with (inaudible). In other words, a good inventive story man. You know, that's kid's stories. So-- to be a good inventive story man. And, also, he's a very good word arranger. In this write up here about my complaint about (inaudible), he's making it sound like the expansion that he had in the beginning, he didn't. And also it's just like (inaudible) an extension approved to my application. It wasn't there. All that was there was park and ride. It ain't there. So, I just want to bring that up that he's a very good story man. Thank you, I've finished."

Supervisor Stark: "Thank you. Is there anybody else? If not-- come on. I think we'll break a record tonight."

Tim Yousik: "You will because I'll make this quick. I would like to encourage the Town Board to reconsider taking the (inaudible) on the movie theatre and using it in the meantime until it's open to support anything that's positive in Riverhead, whether a school-- the high school wins a game or anything positive that happens in Riverhead I would like the Town Board to consider using that in the meantime to support whatever is going on."

Supervisor Stark: "Thank you."

Tim Yousik: "Plain and simple. Thank you."

Supervisor Stark: "Let us now take up the resolutions."

Councilman Kwasna: "Okay. Barbara Grattan is-- I'm going to-- is Co-Chairman with me. Jane Stark, George Richmond, Virginia Lewin, Charles Floege, David Troyan, Patricia Devos, and Nancy Billingham. These are people that will be sitting on the Handicapped Advisory Board for the Town of Riverhead.

We've asked in the past for it; other Towns do have it and we will be working closely with these people for any recommendations they have throughout the Town about handicapped parking, handicapped access type things and anybody has any-- would like to put in any input also, you can just get a hold of me and let me know and I will let you know how it's moving along. Thanks."

This law basically will say that if we find criminal activity to be (inaudible) in a particular location or residence, either by criminal activity or drug activity, we will put the landlord on notice and if after 30 days we continue to find that or our enforcement agencies take additional arrests, we can move in Superior Court-- Supreme Court to confiscate that property. We have set our goals in this Town to clean this Town up. We will not allow our youth to be invaded by those who are going to create criminal activity or a drug abuse society. We want a healthy Town and we are going to enact any law we possibly can in order to help our law enforcement agencies do their

job to the best of their ability. So this is calling for a Public Hearing. Any other discussion?"

Councilman Lull: "Just the Public Hearing will be June 18th at 1:05 in the Town Hall, in this room."

Supervisor Stark: "Any other discussion? All in favor?"

The Vote (Collective response): "Aye."

Supervisor Stark: "Opposed? Motion carried with gusto."
