Justice Costello offered the following resolution which was seconded by Justice Zaloga.

At this point of the meeting Supervisor Vojvoda called a recess at 11:00 A. M., to hold a public hearing.

PUBLIC HEARING - 11:00 A. M.

Supervisor Vojvoda declared the Public Hearing on Bicycle Ordinance No. 36, adjourned from the November 16, 1965 meeting, open and asked if anyone wished to be heard in favor of or in opposition to the aforesaid matter.

The following communications relative to the aforesaid Proposed Ordinance were submitted to the Board:

Mrs. Virginia Barnes, dated Nov. 18, 1965, suggesting that children not be completely restricted from having bicycle privileges.

Roland O. Peterson, dated Nov. 22, 1965, suggesting that bicycles be permitted on sidewalks, but that careless riders be given a stiff fine.

Petition containing 35 signatures of boys and girls suggesting following changes in proposed ordinance as follows:

PUBLIC HEARING continued:

"We would like the zone (of no riding bikes on sidewalks) shortened to as far West on Main St. to Osborne Ave., as far East as Union Ave., South on Peconic Ave. to the traffic circle and North on Roanoke Ave. to Second St.

We would also like the bicycle racks near some of the stores that we mainly shop at such as Woolworths, McLellans, Kids Stuff. This would mean we would have a special place to park our bikes just as cars have. They would then be within eye-sight and not so apt to be stolen as in the parking lots.

We think the ordinance should state that we are to ride our bicycles on sidewalks except in the above mentioned zone. There we would be allowed to walk our bikes on the sidewalks. On the remainder of Main St. and nearby streets bikes will be rode with caution." (End).

General Organization of the Riverhead Junior High School, dated December 6, 1965 submitting the following suggestions relative to the Proposed Bicycle Ordinance:

- "1. We feel the boundaries should be as follows: Union Avenue west on Main Street to Osborn Avenue, Second Street south to the river on Peconic Avenue.
2. We feel you should place bicycle racks behind Woolworth's and the Security National Bank if the owners will grant permission.
3. We feel the fine is excessive and should be decreased from \$15.00 to \$5.00." (End).

The communications were ordered placed on file and the Town Clerk was directed to acknowledge them.

A discussion was held by the Board.

Justice Zaloga stated that he has listened to the suggestions as outlined in the communications and believes they are excellent and inasmuch as they have been submitted by a group who use bicycles that the Board should take the suggestions under consideration at the time of drawing up the final ordinance.

Justice Zaloga also stated that the suggestion of reducing the fine from \$15.00 to \$5.00 was also an excellent one.

Justice Costello suggested that the Board defer any action on the final drawing up of the proposed bicycle ordinance at this time for the reason that a lot of people would be affected by it.

Justice Costello further stated that inasmuch as one person was seriously injured on Peconic Avenue, that it is a question that should be weighed very carefully. That the members of the Board give this matter a long hard look as to whether or not the ordinance would penalize the youngsters who drive carefully as against those who are careless with their bicycles.

Police Chief Grodski suggested that the Board give the matter much study before drawing up the final ordinance as statistics show that more pedestrians have been hit by cars than by bicycles.

Police Chief Grodski further stated that bicycle racks should not be permitted on sidewalks as the law forbids it, as even the merchants are forbidden to display their wares on sidewalks.

Police Chief Grodski further added that he is considering a "Safety Course" to be given to bicycle riders.

PUBLIC HEARING continued:

Mr. Alan Shields stated that on some busy Saturday afternoons pedestrians have difficulty by-passing 20 to 30 bikes congested near the place adjacent to the Police Department and made inquiry if the Town Board will consider the placing of these bikes elsewhere when the final ordinance is drawn up.

The Board assured Mr. Shields that this matter will be given every consideration.

After further deliberation, the Board adjourned the Hearing to the January 18th, 1966 meeting of the Town Board to be heard at 11:00 A. M.

Supervisor Vojvoda re-opened the meeting.

RESOLVED, That a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead be held on December 29, 1965, at 9:30 A. M., for the purpose of the Annual Accounting by Town Officers and Employees pursuant to Section 105 of the Town Law, and for any other business to come before the Board.

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Justice Zaloga, Yes, Justice Costello, Yes, and Supervisor Vojvoda, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Justice Costello offered the following resolution which was seconded by Justice Zaloga.

RESOLVED, That the bid for one new 1966 Deluxe Sports Wagon for use of the Town of Riverhead Board of Assessors be and it is hereby awarded to O'Keefe Chevrolet-Olds, Inc., East Main Street, Route 25, Riverhead, N. Y., for one Chevrolet 1966 Deluxe Sports Wagon at a net cost of \$2,489.00,

RESOLUTIONS continued:

Councilman Grodski offered the following resolution which was seconded by Councilman Young.

WHEREAS, Chapter 714 of the Laws of 1959 reenacted Section 164 of the Social Welfare Law, effective April 22, 1959, to allow the legislative body of a County, city or town responsible for providing home relief to determine and direct that employable home relief recipients be assigned to perform work for such county, city or town as such recipients are able to perform, exclusive of any work ordinarily performed by regular employees of such county, city or town or by craft or trade in private employment; and

WHEREAS, It appears to this board to be in the best interests of both the Town of Riverhead and of employable persons receiving home relief therefrom that such persons be assigned to perform such work for such town, its departments, bureaus, divisions and other units thereof, as they are able to perform and which is not prohibited by such Section 164 of the Social Welfare Law, it is

RESOLVED, Pursuant to Section 164 of the Social Welfare Law as added by Chapter 714 of the Laws of 1959, by the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, that it is the determination and direction of this Board that employable persons in receipt of home relief shall be assigned to perform work for the Town of Riverhead, the head of any of its departments, bureaus, divisions or other units thereof whenever request is made that such persons be assigned to his unit, such request to be addressed to the public welfare official of this Town and the number of persons to be used and the character of the work to be performed indicated, and it is further

RESOLVED, That the public welfare official of the town, upon receipt of such a request shall thereupon assign such persons in receipt of home relief who, in his judgment, are able to perform the work indicated, provided he is satisfied that such persons will not be used to replace, or to perform any work ordinarily performed by regular employees of any department or other units of this Town, or to replace, or to perform any work which would ordinarily be performed by craft or trade in private employment; and, it is further

RESOLVED, That persons shall be assigned to perform only such work as they are able, in the judgment of the public welfare official, to perform, and, it is further

RESOLVED, That the number of days of work to be given each person shall be determined by the amount of the budget deficit of the recipient and his family computed on local home relief budget schedules, and no person shall be required to work for more than the number of days necessary to earn such amount, at the rate of \$1.75 per hour, or to be paid more than such amount, and no person shall be required to work more than eight hours in a day or more than forty hours in a week; and, it is further

RESOLVED, That any person who refuses to report for or to perform work to which he has been assigned by the public welfare official shall thereupon become ineligible for home relief; and, it is further

RESOLVED, That this resolution shall take effect on the 3rd day of January, 1966.

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Justice Zaloga, Yes, Justice Costello, Yes, and Supervisor Vojvoda, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

The following resolution was offered by Councilman Grodski who moved its adopted, seconded by Councilman Young, to-wit:

RESOLUTIONS continued:

BOND RESOLUTION DATED DECEMBER 7, 1965.

A RESOLUTION AMENDING A BOND RESOLUTION DATED AUGUST 17, 1965, TO AUTHORIZE THE CONDEMNATION INSTEAD OF THE PURCHASE OF LAND IN THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD, SUFFOLK COUNTY, NEW YORK, AND THE IMPROVEMENT THEREOF FOR A PARKING FIELD IN AND FOR SAID TOWN, AT AN ESTIMATED COST OF \$22,500.00.

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, Suffolk County, New York, as follows:

Section 1. Section 1 of the bond resolution dated August 17, 1965, authorizing the purchase of land in the Town of Riverhead, New York and the improvement thereof of a parking field in and for said Town at a maximum estimated cost of \$22,500, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 1. The condemnation of certain land in the Town of Riverhead, Suffolk County, New York, as heretofore authorized and the improvement thereof for a parking field in and for said Town, including incidental expenses in connection therewith, is hereby authorized."

Section 2. Section 2 of the aforesaid bond resolution dated August 17, 1965, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 2. The maximum cost of the condemnation of said land is \$15,500 and of the improvement thereof for a parking field, including incidental expenses, is \$7,000, making an entire estimated cost of \$22,500. The plan for the financing of such objects or purposes is by the issuance and sale of \$22,500 serial bonds of said Town, hereinafter authorized."

Section 3. This resolution shall take effect immediately.
