

Minutes of a Meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Hall, Riverhead, New York, on Tuesday, December 21, 1965 at 10:30 A. M.

Justice Costello offered the following resolution which was seconded by Councilman Young.

RESOLVED, That the minutes of the meeting of the Town Board held in the Town Hall on December 7th, 1965, be approved as submitted.

Supervisor Vojvoda asked if anyone wished to be heard. No one responded.

HEADS OF DEPARTMENTS

John P. Riesdorff, Water Plant Superintendent, informed the Board that the collection of water and hydrant rental revenue as of this date, has reached the all time high mark of \$101,000.

Police Chief Grodski called the Board's attention to the communication received by him from the Traffic Engineering and Safety Department of the Automobile Club of New York, Inc., and stated that a great deal of information and helpful material may be obtained from this source for a "Safety Course Program for Bicycle Riders."

The Board held a discussion on the matter and it was decided that it would be beneficial to the Board to take advantage of the material available and so offered by the Automobile Club of New York, Inc., on "Bicycling."

Notice was ordered filed.

Supervisor Vojvoda declared the Hearing open and asked if anyone wished to be heard in favor of or in opposition to the aforesaid Notice.

No one wishing to be heard and no communications having been received thereto, Supervisor Vojvoda declared the Hearing closed and re-opened the meeting.

NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

Pursuant to Section 265 of the Town Law and Section 501 of Zoning Ordinance No. 26 of the Town of Riverhead, Suffolk County, New York, a Public Hearing will be held by the Riverhead Town Board at the Town Hall, 220 Roanoke Avenue, Riverhead, Suffolk County, New York, on the 4th day of January, 1966, at 11:30 A. M., on the following proposals to amend said Zoning Ordinance No. 26 of the Town of Riverhead, as Amended, as follows:

1. Article III-Section 303C-Parking Areas-The Second Paragraph should be deleted.
2. Article III-Section 303C-Parking Areas-Add the following Second Paragraph.

"Where a public parking district has been created within a business district, the owner of property within the district for each building, structure, or premises which would be erected, enlarged or altered for use need not provide off street parking as defined in Article 3, Section 301-J-Off Street Parking."

 Upon reading and filing the Petition of Wading River Estates, Inc., dated and acknowledged the 20th day of September, 1965 and the Dedication and Release of two (2) certain proposed roads known as Leonard Street and Francis Street at Wading River in the Town of Riverhead, County of Suffolk and State of New York, dated and duly acknowledged the 4th day of October, 1965 dedicating and releasing the necessary lands for the said two proposed town highways to extend westerly from the Wading River-Manorville Road through the lands of Wading River Estates, Inc.,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that in accordance with the provisions of Section 171 of the Highway Law of the State of New York, consent being, and the same hereby is given that the Town Superintendent of Highways of the Town of Riverhead make an Order laying out the aforesaid town highways, the said town highways to consist of the lands described in the said Dedication and Release dated the 4th day of October, 1965 and to extend as delineated therein, and

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Town Clerk be, and is hereby directed to forthwith cause such release to be recorded in the office of the Clerk of the County of Suffolk and, upon its return, to attach it hereto.

WHEREAS, The Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, Suffolk County, New York has caused all matters and things to be done which are required by the Town Law in order that amendments and changes to the Zoning Ordinance No. 26, more particularly to the Zoning Map incorporated therein, may be adopted for the Town,

NOW, THEREFORE, By virtue of the authority invested in it by Law, after public hearing duly held on October 5, 1965, the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead hereby adopts the following change to the Zoning Ordinance No. 26, more particularly to the Zoning Map incorporated therein, more particularly bounded and described as follows:

North by lands of Peter and Florence Matyas; West by Meeting House Creek; South by lands of Grace Snell; and East by Meeting House Creek Road.

The following Covenants and Restrictions have hereby been imposed upon the aforesaid premises:

RESOLUTIONS continued:

1. Only those uses permitted in Residence 2 Use District as of this date and marina with full services, except that no portion of the premises will be used as a restaurant.
2. The total building area in accordance with Industrial 1 District requirements, except that no more than 10 per cent of the allowable building area may be used for buildings or structures housing machinery.
3. No building or structure shall be erected within 15 feet of the southerly property line.
4. That at least one automobile parking space shall be provided for each boat mooring space.

That the aforementioned restrictions or any of them may be cancelled in whole or in part by the Town of Riverhead and/or the Board of Zoning Appeals of the Town of Riverhead, and such power and authority is hereby granted to said Board.

The Town Board further RESOLVES and ORDAINS that the Town Clerk of the Town of Riverhead is hereby authorized and directed to enter this change in the minutes of the Town Board, to publish a copy thereof, exclusive of the changed Map incorporated therein, once in the News-Review, the official newspaper published in the Town, and to post a copy thereof, together with said changed Map, on the signboard maintained by the Town Clerk pursuant to subdivision 6 of Section 30 of the provisions of the Town Law, and to file in her office affidavit of said publication and posting, and that this change to Ordinance No. 26, more particularly to the Map incorporated therein, shall take effect 10 days after such publication and posting.

ALL as shown on map filed herewith, which map shows the changing of the property before described from Residence 2 Use District to Industrial 1 Use District.

WHEREAS, a Petition dated October 2nd, 1964 was duly filed with this Board requesting the permanent improvement of Leonard Street and Francis Street, being private roads in this Town at Wading River, New York, by certain improvements thereof in the manner hereinafter determined upon by the Board, and

WHEREAS, an Amended Petition, dated May 14th, 1965, was duly filed with this Board requesting said permanent improvement of Leonard Street and Francis Street, and

WHEREAS, a written Second Amended Petition, dated September 20th, 1965 was duly filed with this Board, requesting said permanent improvement of Leonard Street and Francis Street, and

RESOLUTIONS continued:

WHEREAS, a written Third Amended Petition, dated December 6th, 1965, was duly filed with this Board requesting said permanent improvement of Leonard Street and Francis Street, and

WHEREAS, said original Petition, Amended Petition, Second Amended Petition, and Third Amended Petition were all duly signed by owners of real estate owning all of the entire frontage or bounds on both sides of that portion of said private roads or rights of way as set out on the map filed with the Petition herein, and

WHEREAS the said Petitions were each duly acknowledged or proved as to each signer in the same manner as required of a deed to be recorded, and

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WHEREAS, sealed proposals for the construction to improve approximately 1500 feet of highways in the Terminal Park Road Improvement District at Wading River, Town of Riverhead, Suffolk County, New York, was received by the Town Clerk for the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, at 220 Roanoke Avenue, Riverhead, New York, on December 3rd, 1965, at which time and place said proposals were publicly opened and read,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that this Board find and determine, and it does hereby find and determine, that the proposal of Charles K. Martin, Inc., in the amount of \$22,426.00, for the improvement of Leonard Street and Francis Street, by constructing a pavement of bituminous stabilized soil with an oil wearing surface, concrete curbs, catch basins, leaching basins, recharge areas, storm sewers and other necessary drainage structures and to do all necessary work incidental to the above, all as set out on the amended plan of roads "Terminal Park Road Improvement District", dated September 2, 1965 and filed with the Second Amended Petition herein, in accordance with the plans and specifications therefor, is the lowest responsible proposal for the construction of said street improvement; and, be it further

The Town Attorney recommended to the Town Board that the Proposed Bicycle Ordinance be abandoned in favor of an Education Program to acquaint the people of the Town especially the youngsters, with the rules of the road and a safety program for bicycle riders.

The Town Board convened as a Board of Audit and examined all bills submitted on Warrants dated December 21, 1965, as follows: General Town - \$13,261.83, General Repairs Item No. 1 - \$22,759.52, Machinery Item No. 3-\$4,207.35, Misc. Item No. 4-\$5,257.80, Bridge Item No. 2 - \$644.00.


Councilman Grodski offered the following resolution which was seconded by Councilman Young.

RESOLVED, That the General Town Bills as submitted in the amount of \$13,261.83, be approved for payment, and

FURTHER RESOLVED, That General Repairs Highway Item No. 1 bills submitted in the amount of \$22,759.52, Bridge Highway Item No. 2 bills in the amount of \$644.00, Machinery Highway Item No. 3 bills in the amount of \$4,207.35 and Miscellaneous Highway Item No. 4 bills in the amount of \$5,257.80, be approved for payment.

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Justice Zaloga, Yes, Justice Costello, Yes, and Supervisor Vojvoda, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

There being no further business on motion and vote, the meeting adjourned at 11:30 A. M., to meet on Wednesday, December 29th, 1965 at 9:30 A. M.
