COMMUNICATIONS continued:

Peconic Bay Power Squadron, Inc., dated 6/1/72, sending reminder that the organization petitioned the Town Board last fall for a police patrol boat for the purpose of providing safe boating on Town waters, and was advised that the Town Board has taken the position to provide a boat beginning with the 1972 boating season and it will be operated by an officer. Further requesting that the Town Board provide a police boat to patrol the mouth of the Jamesport inlet from dusk to one-half hour after the fireworks display (at approximately 11:30 P. M.) scheduled for July 2nd - rain date July 3rd. Filed.

Copies to Town Board and Police Chief.
The matter was referred to Police Chief Grodski.

Riverhead Unit Chapter CSEA, dated 6/1/72, requesting the Town Board to have the Labor Commission of the Town of Riverhead set a meeting date to meet each month as required in accordance with Article VII, paragraph 3 of the Agreement between the Town and the CSEA - as soon as possible. In addition Article IX, paragraph 8 of aforesaid Agreement provides that all employees of the Town shall receive a medical examination once a year. To date this has never been provided and the employees of the Town request that this program be instituted as soon as possible. Filed.

Judge Costello suggested the Supervisor appoint a Labor Commission and hire a medical man to conduct examinations for the Town employees.

Wm. M. Saunter, dated May 30, 1972, calling attention to a body of water along the south side of River Road which is used by duck farm. The water close to the edge of River Road is foul, heavily coated with green scum and highly odorous - is a breeding spot for mosquitos, flies and other pests - wants this condition corrected either by the township or the owner of the duck farm - stating further that a letter has been sent to the Supt. of Highways several months ago about the poor condition of a street sign at Route 25 and River Road - the letter was neither acknowledged or acted upon and very recently another letter was sent. Further stating that he has noticed that the street signs in general in Riverhead are bleached out, rusted and otherwise, illegible and there is much room for improvement in this area. Filed.

The Town Board discussed the matter of the foul water and asked Robert Villa, Engineer, Suffolk County Health Department what could be done. Mr. Villa advised that matters of this nature have been transferred to the newly created Environmental Control Commission at Hauppauge, headed by James Pim.

Town Clerk was directed to send copy of Mr. Saunter's letter to James Pim, at Hauppauge.

EXECUTIVE SESSION - 10:00 A. M.

Carl B. Mortenson, Chairman, appeared before the Board with a delegation from the Fresh Pond Civic Association in connection with the Mobil Trailer Ordinance. Mr. Mortenson cited Article 1-General Provisions re safety, health and welfare of occupants and uses thereof and said that the ordinance does not insure that the owner must have reasonable grounds to evict an occupant. Requested amendment to this section to insure some degree of security to the dweller.

Mr. Mortenson was advised as follows:

That the mobile home owners obtain leases and live up to them.

That the Town Board cannot make an ordinance that will give the mobile home owners any greater rights than the State has given them.

The Town Board wants to cooperate but cannot do what is beyond its power or authority.

Form a Commission regulating all the Parks.

Write to the Attorney General for an opinion.

The Town Board cannot adopt an ordinance to restrict the landlord's rights to evict a tenant.

That State Legislators (Congressmen and State Senators) be asked to amend this law.

Mrs. Peggy Suden said that the Park owners are not favorably disposed towards a Commission. They feel the Town Board is not going to work with the Home owners and say that they don't need or want the Commission which would only be a paper commission and will carry no weight.

A copy of Florida's Mobile Trailer Ordinance was handed to the Town Attorney.

The Town Attorney said: "Do not ask the Town Board to represent the Mobile Home Owners - it is not the function of the Town Board to represent special interest groups, such as land owners, mobile park home owners or any special interest group.

An unidentified man told the Town Board that the mobile home owners bring in a large amount of revenue to the Town and urged the Board to advise them how to go about amending the law.

PERSONAL APPEARANCES

Supervisor Leonard asked if anyone wished to be heard and the following responded:

Michael Esposito appeared before the Board and read a statement answering complaint of Rubin Arnold. The statement was filed with the Town Clerk.

Mrs. Doris Pike informed the Board that Kentucky Fried Chicken has not put in the shrubbery as promised.

Supervisor Leonard advised he had made a call and was told the work would be completed this week.

Mrs. Elizabeth Richards asked about the amendments to ordinance regarding drive-ins and restaurants.

Town Attorney advised he is working on this matter.

Dr. Caryl Grantham asked if any progress has been made on the Clearview buffer-zone problem.

Town Attorney advised that he had conversation with Attorney Shep Scheinberg and he was in the process of arranging a meeting with his people and Mr. Tooker.

PERSONAL APPEARANCES continued:

John P. Riesdorff reported the following :

Talked with Robert Tooker on the matter of a new Town Hall. Mr. Tooker is anxious to meet with the Board and discuss the building of a Town Hall and perhaps leasing it.

Also saw Mr. Pollack about his property on Lincoln Street and Osborne Avenue - which would make an ideal location for a Town Hall. Mr. Pollack said he had no price on the property but will consider a price based on report from three appraisers. Mr. Riesdorff urged the Town Board to pursue this.

Reuben Ryan talked to the Board on the matter of the creation of one lighting district. He said it is unfair as people who don't want lights will be compelled to pay - rates as of now would be extremely low but this would increase enormously in years to come. Large farmers, mobile home owners are out of the lighting districts - they don't want lights - lights attract bugs and accidents are caused by people.

Mr. Ryan said the people don't need more taxes and asked the Board to reconsider this matter.

Robert C. Young, Sound Avenue, asked the Town Board what they have decided to do about the water problem on Sound Avenue - which has existed for more than four years.

Mr. Horton said that the two property owners involved raised their properties and the highway was also raised but this did not solve the problem. Negotiations were held with Pollack and the former Supervisor but nothing was settled. Alden Young has all the surveys and plans made. Mr. Pollack wants to put in about a thousand feet of pipe - the cost was prohibitive so the project was dropped. This could be picked up as Alden Young has all the information.

After more discussion, Supervisor Leonard assigned Councilman Young and Judge Leonard as a Committee to look into the matter and make report to the Board.

William Nohejl, Route 25, Wading River, asked the Town Board to hold another hearing on the matter of the creation of one lighting district.

Town Attorney replied to Mr. Nohejl, saying: "So that you are not lulled - the Hearing has been held - no one appeared in opposition and as far as the Board is concerned the matter is closed and the Board will hold no more hearings. The Board has adopted the resolution creating the District and the only way anything can be done at this point is for any interested person to prepare a petition, have it circulated and obtain proper signatures for a public referendum on the question."

Mr. Ryan: "The Town Board had the authority to pass the motion and has the authority to rescind it, and I ask the Board to re-open the matter."

Town Attorney: "No one appeared in opposition and it was taken as acquiescence, and no one has since complained except yourself and the Board feels that the bulk of the community is in favor of the proposition."

John P. Riesdorff: "There are four houses on Howell Lane who are paying sewer tax and they are not hooked up to the sewer and are not in the Sewer District. Bruce Stark is paying sewer tax and can't be hooked up to the sewer."

Councilman Young: "This Board is careful of the taxpayers money. We are sensitive to the feelings of the taxpayers on spending moneys and this Town Board will not put lights anywhere they are not needed."

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 PERSONAL APPEARANCES continued:

Hyman Block asked the Town Attorney for an explanation on what was passed and said an absence of people to a meeting does not necessarily mean an affirmative or a negative vote. It means that people at that time were not looking at the papers or did not come down to the hearing.

Town Attorney: "What was passed was a resolution consolidating and extending the lighting districts of the Town into one lighting district encompassing the entire town-ship. It will spread the present tax burden of the lighting districts to the entire town-ship - and based on last years tax rate it would be . 19 cents per \$100 assessed valuation, right now in the various lighting districts it averages . 32 cents per \$100 assessed valuation."

Judge Costello: "Mr. Block, I am Chairman of the Lighting Committee and I am in the process of contacting the County officials to light up certain roads. We have a problem on Route 58 where we drive around and come up to this huge complex, the Long Island Expressway. I talked with Mr. Strong about County moneys to light that place up so that there would be no possible accidents. I feel that if we have one light to prevent one death in the Town of Riverhead it is worth the money we have to pay. Heretofore, we have had requests for lights that we could not give as the people were not within a lighting district - and we had a lot of breaking of windows on Main Street. We put in improved lighting there - you can read a newspaper down there and since that time the number of incidents are down to practically nothing - and if a light will prevent a crime or the loss of life - I'm all for it."

Mrs. Peggy Suden asked when the Town intends to raise the road in front of the Mobile Trailer Park on Oak Ridge and Osborne Avenue - the flooding conditions have been so bad the school buses will not go through there.

Supt. of Highways Alex E. Horton assured Mrs. Suden that it will be done sometime this summer.

Mrs. Mildred Dorman called attention to Judge Costello asking Mr. Horton some three or four years ago to make a path down along one side of Park Road for the children to walk on.

Mr. Horton said he does not remember he was asked to do this.

Judge Costello said in the summer time it's a danger and so when the grass is cut and the road scrapped, a path can be made there.

Mrs. Dorman talked to the Board on the matter of the Reeve's Park Road Improvement Petition. She said the workers on the Petition have a problem - the people on the corners of Park Road have not been asked to sign the Petition but 9/10ths of them are using the side roads. She asked if new Petitions are required to change from 150 ft. to 50 ft. - these people would not have to pay for the entire footage as they are not on the road.

PERSONAL APPEARANCES continued:

Town Attorney replied saying: "In terms of assessment you are talking about State Legislation. "

Mrs. Dorman: "No, that is not what I'm interested in. I do know we are going to pay 16¢ per lineal foot of road frontage. "

Town Attorney: "I know, but the determination who is benefited, who is not benefited, how far back, that is all made by the Assessors, based on State Legislation. "

Mrs. Dorman: "I was down to the Assessors and I spoke to Alden Young yesterday and he said that they usually use this figure of 150 feet - but our little lots are only 25 footage fronts. "

Town Attorney: "What you are trying to do is to tell the people who is going to be assessed and who is not going to be assessed. Get your Petitions signed and bring them in. "

Mrs. Dorman: "These people who are signing know exactly what they are going to pay. They are going to pay \$1500 for 75 ft. over a 15 year period. We have a maximum figure. "

Town Attorney: "They think they know - the Town Board can make that higher - have you consulted with private counsel?"

Mrs. Dorman: "No. "

Town Attorney: "The Board will hold a hearing. There is no amendment to this Petition. "

Mrs. Dorman: "Has Mr. Young been in touch with you as to the wording of this Petition?"

Town Attorney: "He has been in touch, but I have given no opinion on the 150 ft. matter. "

HIGHWAY MATTERS

Supt. of Highways Alex E. Horton reported that Robert Kart, Engineer is working on the Little Bay Drainage matter.

Mr. Horton reminded the Board that it should give serious consideration to the Heating problem at the Highway Barn and this be done before the winter sets in.

The Board directed Mr. Horton to obtain estimates on the work.

Councilman Grodski volunteered to work with Mr. Horton on this matter.

Councilman Grodski pointed out that each side of Park Road is infested with an overgrowth of trees, etc. and asked Mr. Horton if it would be possible for the Highway Department to mold each side of this road.

Mr. Horton assured Councilman Grodski he would look into the matter.

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HIGHWAY MATTERS continued:Town Attorney's opinion on Asphalt Bid Award:

"We should stop for a brief period in purchasing oil. We have a contract with Welch. If he has not performed or is not delivering material which meets specification, the Town has one or two remedies. 1. To cancel the contract. 2. To accept the next lowest bid or rebid - and if we accept the next bidder or re-bid and if we are forced to pay more, we may in fact have an action against Mr. Welch."

Judge Costello asked if Mr. Welch should bring in a certificate certifying that this oil meets all specifications.

Mr. Horton said that the difference in price is only a couple of mills per gallon.

Town Attorney stated that it may not be worthwhile to take any steps against Mr. Welch, but before we cancel the contract we have a problem.

Mr. Horton: "He broke his contract when he took the oil away from us. We had it on the job and he pulled it off the job."

The matter was referred to the Town Attorney.

A discussion was held on the complaints received in connection with damages sustained by road oil (Manor Lane, Jamesport), and it was decided that all complaints be filed with the Town Clerk and reported to the Insurance Broker.

SANITATION

Supervisor Leonard announced that Robert Villa, Engineer, Suffolk County Health Department is here to talk to the Board about the Sanitary Land-fill operation.

Mr. Villa told the Board that he was at the Town Dump this morning and had noticed the improvements made and he understands the Board is considering the creation of a Sanitation Department. He said he would like the Board's decision as to whom he should work with - there are things there that should be done and he would like to make recommendations and have them carried out.

Mr. Villa also told the Board that some action should be taken on the scavenger waste system and the possibility of getting this into the sewer system. (Town Board will discuss this matter with Sam McLendon).

Mr. Villa also told the Board that Riverhead is one of the few Towns in Suffolk that has not gone into recycling. He recommended this be done. All of the Towns have paper outlets - they have paper containers which are provided free - they are picked up free and they pay \$9 to \$10 per ton for the paper. He suggested that someone be designated to supervise and set-up this system.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

Richard Carey's name was suggested for the Industrial Commission.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS continued:Clerk Hire for Assessors Office:

George Autenreith, Chairman, Board of Assessors, asked the Board what action has been taken in hiring personnel for the Assessor's Office.

Judge Costello: "We understand Harry is going to leave sometime next year and also that Susie has left - she has a right to come back - if you need someone in her place we can put in some one temporarily. "

George Autenreith: "Our problem has become critical. We are mandated by law to publish the tax roll by July 1st. The three Assessors are doing clerical work, accounting, computing, etc. We want help. We have been waiting patiently for some one to come up with a solution. This is hard work and a hard job. We need a trainee in Harry's position. It will take a year for a good intelligent person to learn a part of his job. We asked that it be done before this and to get someone now it's going to be very difficult for someone to learn the procedure by the time he leaves. "

Judge Costello: "I didn't know it was such an important job, that it will take a year to break in - however if you say so. "

George Autenreith: "We are asking and have been from April to February. "

Judge Costello: "George Young has gotten somebody coming in tomorrow morning with a computer that does everything but talks. "

George Autenreith: "That would not be the answer at this time. Computers and data processing are very fine, but what you put into them is what you get out and this machine is not the answer. We are concerned now with compiling thousands of figures to get them ready by July 1st. These figures Harry must have and make plates by the 1st day of July. We interviewed people from the Civil Service List as trainees for Harry's job and we made a recommendation and nothing has been done. We have got to have somebody. Our work has increased considerably and we will need additional help. When the County maps are ready we will need at least three additional girls. Seven years ago we had 5,000 parcels, we have twice and plus more now. "

Supervisor Leonard: "I say let's get somebody that can do this job and get the work done. "

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

Decision on Petition of Hubbard, et al: Carried over to next meeting.

Decision on Mr. Horton's request for part payment on Conveyor Screen Plant:
Carried over to afternoon session of Board.

Decision on LoBiondos request-Home for the Aged-Mercy Building: Referred to Town Attorney.

Decision on Gordon Ahlers request for Family Home-Dolega Building: Referred to Town Attorney.

On motion and vote, the meeting adjourned for lunch at 12:20 P. M. , to reconvene at 3 P. M.

The Town Board reconvened at 3:30 P. M. , with all members present and also Supt. of Highways Alex E. Horton.
Absent: Town Attorney Francis J. Yakaboski.

Re: Decision on Mr. Horton's request for part payment on Conveyor Screen

Plant:

Judge Costello said, yes, on condition that Mr. Horton will not submit any inter-departmental charges for the rest of the year.

Mr. Horton said "No" to the proposition, and added that this conveyor will be making holes for the garbage as well as for the use of the highway department.

A lengthy discussion followed on the possibility of screening fill and selling it. Mr. Horton said that a new belt is needed for the old machine which was purchased during Babe Young's time and the belt will cost \$1,000 and this machine needs constant repair.

Judge Costello said he told Mr. Horton, "Yes", and will keep his promise.

George Young: "If we can sell enough fill - we can get the \$6000 back before the end of the year. "

Councilman Grodski: "I feel differently now that it is an easier way to sell the screened sand. "

Town Clerk reminded the Board that a resolution to sell the fill would be in order as several years ago one was adopted discontinuing the sale.
The matter was tabled to the next meeting of the Board.

The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Councilman Young offered the following resolution which was seconded by Councilman Grodski.

RESOLVED, That the Superintendent of Highways be and is hereby authorized to hire Irving T. Downs as Temporary Laborer at the hourly salary of \$2.35, payable bi-weekly, effective May 10, 1972, to serve as required by the Supt. of Highways.

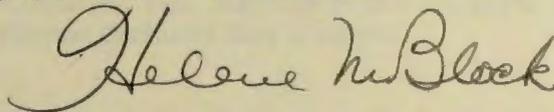
