

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Hall at Riverhead on Wednesday, January 8, 1936 at 9:00 A.M.

Roger M. Wiley, Town Attorney and Supt. of Highways Clark were present.

Minutes of meetings held on December 28, 1935 and January 1, 1936 were read and on motion and vote were duly adopted.

A communication from Irving H. Hulse in regard to a part of his land used for highway purposes was read and referred to the Town Attorney.

A communication from the Association of Towns of the State of New York in regard to again joining the Association was read.

On motion duly made by Justice Kelly and seconded by Justice Luce it was RESOLVED that the Supervisor be and he hereby is authorized to pay the sum of \$35.00 to the Association of Towns of the State of New York, for the annual dues of the Town of Riverhead as a member of the Association for the year beginning January 1, 1936. The vote, Justices Warner, Boutcher, Kelly and Luce, Yes, Supervisor Burns, Yes. Total vote, Yes 5, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

A communication from the Suffolk Daily Island News soliciting the designation as the official paper for the Town of Riverhead was read and ordered placed on file.

A communication was read from the State Department of Agriculture and Markets in regard to the appointment of a dog enumerator for the year 1936.

On motion duly made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Boutcher it was RESOLVED that the employment of Frank Konchalski as Dog Warden for the Town of Riverhead be terminated as of this date. The vote, Justices Warner and Boutcher, Yes, Justices Kelly and Luce, No, Supervisor Burns, Yes. Total vote Yes 3, No 2. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

On motion duly made by Justice Boutcher and seconded by Justice Warner it was RESOLVED that Louis Fitz of Aquebogue, N. Y. be and he hereby is appointed Dog Enumerator and Dog Warden for the Town of River-

ad for the year 1936, and it is further

RESOLVED that siad Louis Fitz, serve at the pleasure of the Board, salary fixed by the Agriculture and Markets Law. The vote, Justices Warner and Boutcher, Yes, Justices Kelly and Luce, No, Supervisor Burns, Yes. Total vote, Yes 3, No 2. The resolution was declared duly adopted.

Mr. Fred E. Barth addressed the Board in regard to the parking of cars in front of the driveway into his home on Second Street. The matter was referred to the Police Department for investigation.

A communication from Herhert L. Snell applying for the position of Special Constable to serve Civil processes for the Justices of the Peace was read and ordered placed on file.

A communication was read from Forrest G. Downs, Receiver of Taxes advising the Board that he has appointed Sadie Goldberg, Louise E. Downs, Ida Vail and Helen Maks, as his special clerks pursuant to Section 20 Chapter 311 of the Laws of 1920. The communication was ordered placed on file.

Supervisor Burns presented his report for the month of December, 1935 pursuant to law and on motion and vote the report was ordered placed on file.

On motion duly made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Boutcher, it was RESOLVED by unanimous consent that the Supervisor be and hereby is authorized to deposit the Town Funds in the following banks, The Suffolk County Trust Company, The Suffolk County National Bank and the Long Island State Bank and Trust Company.

On motion duly made by Justice Kelly and seconded by Justice Boutcher, it was RESOLVED by unanimous consent that the Supervisor be and hereby is authorized to accept from each of the banks designated as depositories, securities in the amount of \$20,000 and such securities be bonds or certificates of the United States, the State of New York, or any County, City, Town or School District of the State of New York.

On motion duly made by Justice Luce and seconded by Justice Warner, it was RESOLVED by unanimous consent that the Riverhead News, Inc., be and it hereby is designated as the official newspaper of and for the Town of Riverhead for the year 1936.

Mrs Anna Ostrander recommended to the Board that a traffic signal light be placed at the intersection of Second Street and Griffing Avenue. The matter was referred to the Street Lighting Committee.

The matter of the road drain through the leased land of Dan Danielowidh was brought to the attention of the Board. The Town Board recommended that a bill for damages be submitted and that it be referred to the Road Committee.

Supt. of Highways, William H. Clark presented his determination

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and agreement for the year 1936 pursuant to Section 105 of the Highway Law and was signed by the members of the Town Board.

On motion duly made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Kelly it was RESOLVED, that Special Policeman George W. Cooper be constituted the person to execute and serve civil processes of the Justices of the Peace, and be it further

RESOLVED that said Special Policeman serve at the pleasure of the Town Board, salary fixed at the rate of \$20.00 per month and that his bond be fixed at \$500.00. The vote, Justices Warner, Boutcher, Kelly and Luce, Yes, Supervisor Burns, Yes. Total vote, Yes, 5, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

The following standing Committees were appointed to act with the Supervisor.

Highway Committee: Justices Kelly and Boutcher.

Street Lighting Committee: Justices Warner and Luce.


Water District Committee: Justices Boutcher and Luce.

Police Committee: Justices Warner and Kelly.

The Town Board then convened as a Board of Audit and examined the Welfare bills for the month of December, 1935.

On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Kelly it was RESOLVED that the Supervisor be and he hereby is authorized to pay the welfare bills for the month of December, 1935 as approved by the Welfare Officer. The vote, Justices Warner, Boutcher, Kelly and Luce, ^{Yes} Supervisor Burns, Yes. Total vote, Yes 5, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

There being no further business on motion made by Justice Boutcher and seconded by Justice Warner it was RESOLVED by unanimous consent that the meeting adjourn till Wednesday, January 29, 1936, at 9:00 A.M.
