

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of
Riverhead held in the Town Hall on Wednesday, February 26, 1936 at 9:00 A.M.

Present:

Fred H. Boutcher
Joseph V. Kelly

Town Attorney Roger M. Wiley and Supt. of Highways Clark
are present.

Supervisor Burns being absent, on motion made by Justice
Warner and seconded by Justice Kelly it was RESOLVED by unanimous consent
that Justice Luce be Chairman of the meeting.

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board held on February 11,
1936 and a special meeting held on February 17, 1936 were read and on motion
and vote were duly adopted.

A communication from Joseph E. Walsh, Deputy Chief of the
Riverhead Fire Department in regard to a contribution in the form of an ad-
vertisement in the program for the 48th Annual Tournament of the Suffolk
County Volunteer Firemen's Association. The communication was ordered placed
in file.

A communication was read from ^{the} Wading River Civic Associa-
tion in regard to snow removal in Wading River. The communication was order-
ed placed on file.

Mr. Hugh L. Burns, Chairman, Roads Committee, Wading River
Civic Association addressed the Board in connection with the above communi-
cation, stating that if snow removal is retarded in the vicinity of Wading
River by the lack of equipment, it is their recommendation that the Town
Board appropriate sufficient funds for the purchase of a snow plow to be
used in Wading River.

The above matter was deferred until the next budget hear-
ing.

A communication was read from Frank Markvart, County Clerk
in regard to a bill for Abstracts of Deeds furnished to the Board of Assessors
for the years 1934 and 1935.

Town Attorney Wiley submitted a written opinion upon the
matter stating therein that there is no legal warrant for this charge and
advised that the Town is not liable therefor. The opinion was ordered
placed on file.

On motion made by Justice Kelly and seconded by Justice
Warner it was RESOLVED by unanimous consent that the Supervisor take up the
above matter with the Board of Supervisors and further

RESOLVED that the Town Attorney send a copy of his

opinion to the County Clerk.

The matter of parking ordinances on Main Street was discussed and referred to the Police Committee for investigation and report.

The Police Committee reporting upon the matter of the purchase of uniforms for the members of the Police Department advised the Board that they have looked into the matter very carefully and after taking everything into consideration recommended that the Town purchase uniforms for the Police. The matter was held over for the next Town Board meeting.

The Police Committee further recommended that a Special Policeman be employed for school duty at the Riverhead School, thus relieving a regular policeman and making it possible to have a policeman on duty at all times during the day, to enforce traffic and parking regulations. The matter was held over to the next meeting of the Board.

William H. Clark, Supt. of Highways advised the Board that the sum of \$2500.00 is needed for the snow removal fund to meet his pay-rolls.


The following motion was offered by Justice Kelly and seconded by Justice Boutcher

WHEREAS the Town Board has determined that the amount levied and collected for the expenditure actually necessary for the removal of obstructions caused by snow are insufficient to pay expenses necessarily incurred, now therefore be it

RESOLVED that the Supervisor be and he hereby is authorized to borrow on Certificates of Indebtedness the sum of \$2500.00, to be used for the removal of snow. The vote, Justices Warner, Boutcher, Kelly and Luce, Yes, Supervisor Burns, absent. Total vote, Yes 4, Absent 1. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

The Town Board then convened as a Board of Audit and examined the Town bills for the month of February.

There being no further business on motion and vote, the meeting adjourned to meet on March 11, 1936 at 9:00 A.M.
