

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Hall on Wednesday, March 25, 1936 at 9:00 A.M.

Roger M. Wiley, Town Attorney and William H. Clark, Supt. of Highways were present.

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board held on March 11, 1936 and a special meeting held on March 20, 1936 were read and on motion and vote were duly adopted.

A communication was read from the Long Island Tercentenary Committee acknowledging receipt of the resolution in support of the Organization and was ordered placed on file.

A petition signed by several taxpayers in the vicinity of Strander Avenue requesting two additional street lights was presented to the Board and was referred to the Lighting Committee for investigation and report.

The Highway Committee reporting upon the application of Mrs. Lester Crowley to operate the refreshment stand at Howell M. Reeve Park recommended that she be awarded the right to operate the stand.

Justice Kelly offered the following resolution which was seconded by Justice Boutcher:

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, deems it expedient and desirable and for the good management of the Howell M. Reeve Park and the Town of Riverhead, the protection of its properties, safety and health of its inhabitants and the protection of their property preservation of peace and good order to award an exclusive right of franchise to erect a confectionery stand and storage room and to sell, candy, soda, ice cream, tobacco, refreshments, confectionery, to rent row boats, beach umbrellas, chairs and similar articles", within the limits of the Howell M. Reeve Park, at Sound Avenue, Riverhead, New York and

WHEREAS, the offer of Mrs. Lester Crowley of Riverhead, New York, most adequately fitted the needs and requirements of the Howell M. Reeve Park and the Town of Riverhead.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that Mrs. Lester Crowley of Riverhead, New York, be and she hereby is given and granted the exclusive right of franchise to erect a confectionery stand and storage room and to sell, candy, soda, tobacco, ice cream, refreshments, confectionery, to rent boats, beach umbrellas, chairs and similar articles at the Howell M. Reeve Park at Sound Avenue, Riverhead, New York, and that said exclusive right or franchise

shall commence on the 1st day of May, 1936, and end on the 1st day of October, 1936.

PROVIDED, HOWEVER, the said Mrs. Lester Crowley shall during the term hereinbefore defined (keep the beach clean, supply free drinking water, give first aid and maintain a free comfort station) and

PROVIDED FURTHER that all charges made to the persons entering Howell M. Reeve Park for merchandise and services rendered by the said Mrs. Lester Crowley shall be reasonable in amount and be it further

RESOLVED that no confectionery stand, storage room or any other obstruction be placed in the highway and be it further

RESOLVED that the said franchise be not assigned except upon written consent of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead but may be cancelled by said Board at any time for any repeated violation of the terms thereof and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Town Clerk be and he hereby is authorized and directed to issue said franchise in the name of the Town of Riverhead. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous consent of the Board.

On motion made by Justice Luce and seconded by Justice Warner it was RESOLVED that the Supervisor be and he hereby is authorized upon the recommendation of the Board of Assessors to pay to Daniel R. Young, Engineer, the sum of \$60.00 for a map of the eastern part of the Village of Riverhead, Money to be taken from the Assessor's expense account. The vote, Justices Warner, Boutcher, Kelly and Luce, Yes, Supervisor Burns, Yes. Total vote, Yes 5, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

The Highway Committee reporting upon Willow Street, South Jamesport, advised the Board that they have taken up the matter with Mr. Frank Haupt of South Jamesport and that he will sell his rights in Willow Street and Third Street for the sum of \$250.00. The matter was held over till ^{the} next meeting.

Supervisor Burns and Justice Kelly, the Committee, reporting upon the matter of a public landing on Peconic River advised the Board that the Property now leased by the Town for a public parking place and which abuts the Peconic River can be leased for a period of five (5) years with the privilege of buying.

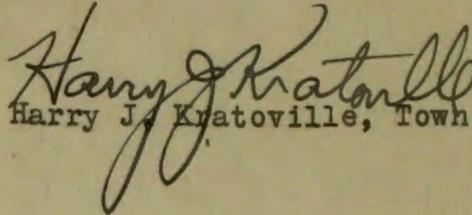
On motion made By Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Kelly, it was RESOLVED that Roswell C. Homan be and he hereby is appointed a special policeman for the Town of Riverhead to serve for the period of one month from April 1, 1936, at a salary at the base rate of \$1650 per annum. Said salary to be paid semi-monthly during said period. The vote, Justices Warner, Boutcher, Kelly and Luce, Yes, Supervisor Burns, Yes. Total vote, Yes, 5, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

The matter of a storm sewer on Pulaski Street near Claus Avenue was brought to the attention of the Board. The matter was referred to the Highway Committee for investigation and report.

The matter of a new tractor for the Highway Department was discussed and referred to the Highway Committee.

The Town Board then convened as a Board of Audit and examined the Town bills for the month of March, 1936.

There being no further business on motion and vote the meeting adjourned till April 8, 1936 at 9:00 A. M.
