

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Hall on Wednesday, March 5, 1941 at 2:00 P. M.

Solomon Raffe, Town Attorney and Myron C. Young, Supt. of Highways, were present.

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board held on February 18, 1941, were read and on motion and vote were duly adopted.

Due to the absence of Supervisor Sawyer on account of illness, Justice Warner was duly elected Chairman of the meeting.

A communication was read from Mr. Edward P. Pyle in regard to the bill introduced in Albany to make Labor Day the second Monday in September rather than the first. He stated that the change would be of great assistance to business on all Long Island and urged the Board to give all the aid possible to have this bill become a law. The communication was ordered placed on file.

On motion made by Justice Zaleski and seconded by Justice Boutcher, it was RESOLVED that this Board go on record as favoring the bill introduced in the State Assembly by Assemblyman John H. Ferril, to make Labor Day the second Monday in September rather than the first and further

RESOLVED that a copy of this resolution be sent to Senator Thompson and Assemblyman Lupton. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board present.

Mr. Alden W. Young reporting on the matter of the boundary line between the Towns of Brookhaven and Riverhead advised the Board of the progress that has been made by the Surveyors of the two towns in definitely determining the authentic boundary. He stated that he will have definite data to present at a later date.

The report of Supervisor Sawyer for the month of February, 1941 was submitted to the Board and on motion and vote was accepted and ordered placed on file.

The report of Tax Receiver Downs as of March 1, 1941 was submitted to the Board and on motion and vote was accepted and ordered placed on file.

The Town Board then convened as a Board of Audit and examined all town bills to date.

There being no further business on motion and vote the meeting adjourned to meet on Wednesday, March 19, 1941 at 2:00 P. M.
