

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Hall on Wednesday, April 8, 1936 at 9:00 A.M.

Roger M. Wiley, Town Attorney and William H. Clark, Supt. of Highways were present.

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board held on March 25, 1936 were read and on motion and vote were duly adopted.

A communication was read from the Brooklyn Times Union in regard to the Long Island Tercentenary Celebration and ordered placed on file.

A communication was read from Mr. Samuel Harding requesting the Board to permit him to have a private parking section definitely marked off in front of his furniture store on Roanoke Avenue. The matter was referred to the Police Committee.

A communication was read from Mr. Raymond Benjamin making application to again serve as Life Guard at the Howell M. Reeve Park for the season of 1936. The communication was ordered placed on file.

The Lighting Committee reporting upon the matter of a petition for two additional lights on Ostrander Avenue advised the Board that many new residences have been built in that vicinity and recommended that two additional lights be placed on that Avenue.

On motion duly made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Kelly, it was RESOLVED that the Town Clerk be and he hereby is authorized to order the Long Island Lighting Company to place two additional 80 C.P. Street lamps on Ostrander Avenue, said lamps to be placed between the last lamp on said Avenue and Northville Turnpike and charge to the account of the Riverhead Lighting District. The vote, Justices Warner, Boutcher, Kelly and Luce, Yes, Supervisor Burns, Yes. Total vote, Yes 5, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

The Highway Committee reporting upon the matter of a new tractor for the Highway Department advised the Board that they had recommended the purchase of an International Tractor, Model 530, to the Supt. of Highways.

On motion made by Justice Kelly and seconded by Justice Warner, it was RESOLVED that the Supt. of Highways be and he hereby is authorized to purchase an International Tractor, Model 530, for the sum not to exceed \$1250.00. The vote, Justices Warner, Boutcher, Kelly and Luce, Yes, Supervisor Burns, Yes. Total vote Yes 5, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Mr. W. J. Prime, Special Agent of the Travelers Insurance Company addressed the Board in regard to a fleet policy for insurance on all Motor Vehicles owned by the Town of Riverhead and submitted a survey of the present automobile insurance together with recommendations for the consideration of the Board. The matter was referred to the Highway Committee, Police Committee and Supt. of Highways.


A communication was read from Mr. Ralph W. Gallagher tendering his resignation as night clerk at Police Headquarters and was ordered placed on file.

On motion made by Justice Boutcher and seconded by Justice Warner, it was RESOLVED that Special Policeman, Rudolph Hajek be employed at full time and at the base rate of \$1200.00 per year, payable semi-monthly to serve at the pleasure of the Board, effective this date. The vote, Justices Warner and Boutcher, Yes, Justice Kelly, No, Justice Luce, Not voting, Supervisor Burns, Yes. Total vote, Yes 3, No 1, Not Voting 1. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

The Supervisors report for the month of March was presented to the Board and on motion and vote was accepted and ordered placed on file.

The Town Board then convened as a Board of Audit and examined the Welfare bills for the month of March.

There being no further business on motion and vote the meeting adjourned till April 29, 1936 at 9:00 A. M.
