

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Hall on Wednesday, April 29, 1936 at 9:00 A.M.

Minutes of a meeting held on April 8, 1936 and a special meeting held on April 22, 1936 were read and on motion and vote were duly adopted.

A communication from Mrs. Robert T. Oliver in regard to the Sewing Room and the Federal Surplus Commodities Stores was read and ordered placed on file.

On motion made by Justice Kelly and seconded by Justice Warner it was RESOLVED that the resolutions concerning the use of Streets and the parking of vehicles in the Town of Riverhead, be approved, and the Public Hearing be held thereon at the Town Hall, Wednesday, May 13th, 1936 at 9:00 A.M. (Daylight Saving Time), and that the Clerk be directed to publish notice thereof according to law. The vote, Justices Warner, Boutcher, Kelly, and Luce, Yes, Supervisor Burns, Yes. Total vote, Yes 5, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

On motion made by Justice Kelly and seconded by Justice Warner, it was RESOLVED that "No Parking" signs be placed in front of the Jamesport Post Office. The vote, Justices Warner, Boutcher, Kelly and Luce, Yes, Supervisor Burns, Yes. Total vote, Yes 5, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

On motion duly made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Kelly it was RESOLVED that Henry Delaney be and he hereby is appointed Special Policeman for the Town of Riverhead, to serve on School duty at the Riverhead High School and it is further

RESOLVED that said Special Policeman serve at the pleasure of the Town Board between the hours of 8:00 A.M. and 9:00 A.M., 11:00 A.M. and 1:00 P.M. and 3:00 P.M. and 4:00 P.M., under the direction and supervision of the Special Policeman in Charge of the Police of the Town of Riverhead, salary fixed at the rate of fifty (\$.50) cents per hour and further

RESOLVED that this resolution be retroactive as of April 23, 1936. The vote, Justices Warner, Boutcher, Kelly and Luce, Yes, Supervisor Burns, Yes. Total vote, Yes 5, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Boutcher, it was RESOLVED that the Supervisor be and he hereby is authorized to transfer the sum of \$8.00 from the Surplus Account to a new Account to be known as the School Director Account, for the purpose of paying the salaries of the School Directors. The vote, Justices Warner, Boutcher, Kelly and Luce, Yes, Supervisor Burns, Yes. Total vote, Yes 5, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.


On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Boutcher it was RESOLVED that Roswell C. Homan be and he hereby is appointed a Special Policeman for the Town of Riverhead to serve for a period of fifteen days from May 1, 1936 at a salary at the base rate of \$1650.00 per annum. The vote Justices Warner, Boutcher, Kelly and Luce, Yes, Supervisor Burns, Yes. Total vote, Yes 5, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Boutcher it was RESOLVED that John Victoria be and he hereby is appointed a Special Policeman for the Town of Riverhead to serve at the pleasure of the Board at a salary at the base rate of \$1650. per annum, effective May 15th, 1936. The vote, Justices Warner and Boutcher, Yes, Justices Kelly and Luce, No, Supervisor Burns, No. Total vote, Yes 2, No 3. The resolution was thereupon declared defeated.

On motion duly made by Supervisor Burns and seconded by Justice Kelly it was RESOLVED that Frank Sowinski be and he hereby is appointed a Special Policeman for the Town of Riverhead to serve at the pleasure of the Board at a salary at the base rate of \$1650. per annum, effective May 15, 1936. The vote, Justices Warner and Boutcher, No, Justices Kelly and Luce, Yes, Supervisor Burns, Yes. Total vote, Yes 3, No 2. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

The Town Board then convened as a Board of Audit and examined the Town bills for the month of April, 1936.

There being no further business on motion and vote, the meeting adjourned to meet on Wednesday, May 13, 1936.
